TRAILS NETWORK PLAN UPDATE UNDERWAY



The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is launching its much anticipated update to the City's Trails Network Plan (TNP), which has not been updated since the mid-1990s. This undertaking consists of updating and consolidating all of the existing trails plans and documents into a single, comprehensive plan. During this process, the City will revisit the trails identified in its Conceptual Trails Plan and Conceptual Bikeways Plan to consider adding, deleting, and/or modifying trails as circumstances warrant. The 2013 Palos Verdes Nature Preserve Trails Plan and trails identified in the 2008 Coast Vision Plan will be integrated into the final document to create a single source of information regarding the City's trails network.

As a part of the preparation of the update to the TNP, the City will be conducting a series of public workshops to reach out to

community stakeholders and interested persons to identify any unique trail issues that should be addressed in the TNP update. The City seeks your input during the workshops which will be scheduled throughout the coming year based on the geographic location of the trails to be discussed at the respective workshop. Notification of each workshop, including the location, date and time, will be posted on the City's website and sent to list-serve subscribers for the Trails Network Plan Update. Not a list-serve subscriber yet? Simply go to the Listserve Notification icon on the sliding bar on the City's homepage and follow the instructions. Enter your email and/or mobile phone number, select the Trails Network Plan Update topic, and then select the "submit" button.

As another way to obtain public feedback on the update, the City

is launching a new social media platform for this project, called Mindmixer, to engage and increase public involvement. Mindmixer provides opportunities for government and citizens to work together by connecting civic challenges, in this case trail routes and uses, to community based problem-solvers. Members of the community can participate and contribute to the public process from their own homes and on their own schedules.

How will Mindmixer work for this project? During the public workshop process, questions that come up related to trail connectivity, use, and location will be posted on the Mindmixer platform. Staff will send electronic messages to list-serve subscribers that will link to the questions posted online. The questions will remain open for a few weeks to garner as much input as possible. Additionally, for those who typically visit the City's website for information on City projects, a Mindmixer widget will be added to the Trails Network Plan homepage to increase public usage and effectiveness.

SAN RAMON CANYON DRAIN READY



The San Ramon Canyon drain, which is designed to divert runoff from San Ramon Canyon and deliver it to the beach via a 54-inch diameter pipe, is ready for the next storm. Completion of the inlet structure in early summer was the last piece of the storm drain needed to ensure that concentrated stormwater flows from the neighborhoods above the canyon will no longer erode the canyon walls nor cause flooding along 25th Street. Two of the major goals of the project, protecting the roadway embankment along Palos Verdes Drive East (PVDE) and eliminating the potential for flooding and mudflows along Palos Verdes Drive South (PVDS), have now been met. The drain is capable of handling a 100-year storm event,

ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECTS

Several roadway resurfacing projects throughout the City are currently being designed or are under construction. The Palos Verdes Drive East arterial roadway rehabilitation project is currently in progress and is anticipated to be completed by September 2014. The design of the City's next arterial roadway rehabilitation project, Miraleste Drive, will be starting soon. The design of the City's next residential street rehabilitation project is currently underway for neighborhoods adjacent to Silver Spur Road, Montemalaga Drive, Hawthorne Boulevard, Crest Road,



Palos Verdes Drive West, and Western Avenue. Construction is expected to begin later this year.

Residents will be notified in advance when access to their streets will be limited by road work. While every effort is being made to minimize the impact of this construction work, the Public Works Department appreciates the continued patience and cooperation of the community. FREE DOCUMENT SHREDDING, E-WASTE COLLECTION & MULCH, MULCH MORE



The City, in cooperation with EDCO, is offering RPV residents a free document-shredding event on Saturday, October 18, 2014. Certified shredding trucks will be at this event to shred your documents **on-site**. **No documents will leave the site un-shredded!** The event is at RPV Civic Center (City Hall), 30940 Hawthorne Blvd., from **8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.** Please note the new earlier start time.

Please bring proof of RPV residency such as a recent utility bill, or your driver's license. Quantity is limited to three banker (storage) size boxes. Paper clips and staples are allowed.

But wait, there's more!! EDCO will also collect your unwanted electronics including TVs, computer monitors, and printers (however, absolutely **no** household hazardous waste material will be accepted).

And here's something else to mulch over. Free mulch giveaway to residents, while supplies last. Bring your own trashcans or sturdy yard bags, and shovel, because this is a fill-it-yourself event. Limit of 3 cans or bags per vehicle. If you plan to haul your mulch in an open truck or trailer, please remember to bring a tarp to cover your material.

which exceeds the standard for this type of project.

The work below PVDS at the east edge of Shoreline Park was also completed just prior to the July 4th weekend. As part of the restoration of this 100-foot wide swath of land, which is designated as a utility corridor, a walk was installed from the sidewalk to the bottom of the road embankment. This structure will allow safer passage down the steepest part of the corridor and replaces the casual path worn into the hillside over many years. From the bottom of the walk, access may be gained to the unimproved pathways and trails in this area.

Ancillary work that is part of the project, including a maintenance access road to the inlet and habitat restoration in the canyon, is still underway but should be wrapped up by early fall. In addition, the City has instructed the contractor to repair damage done to the PVDE roadway during the project. This work will all be completed under budget. Savings will allow some "extras" including trail enhancements in the construction

area, and stormwater flow monitoring equipment to allow performance evaluation of the drain.

State grant savings will also allow for additional work along the PVDE Switchbacks to be performed by the contractor without exceeding the overall budget for the project. This includes pavement repair, limited roadway widening, pavement resurfacing and new signage and striping along PVDE between the PVDS intersection and the Vista Del Mar intersection. The City has also directed the contractor to complete a separate project to rehabilitate the storm drain system along this same section of road. This project will reduce erosion from runoff in other parts of the San Ramon Reserve, improve water collection off of PVDE and reestablish aging inlet structures along the Switchbacks. Adding this additional work to the San Ramon Project allows it to be eligible for reimbursement by the State grant. So far, the City has received a total of five reimbursement checks from the State totaling over \$7.2 million.

LOW-COST PET VACCINATION AND MICROCHIPPING CLINIC
