

PROPOSED DRONE USE FOR FILMING ACTIVITY

Staff has received an application for a film permit for a television show to be filmed at the Catalina View Garden (AKA Point View) property at 6001 Palos Verdes Drive South on Tuesday, February 3rd and Wednesday, February 4th. The production company has asked for permission to use a drone for the shoot. The drone would be used for aerial shots of the vineyard and event garden area of the property, where the filming will be taking place (see aerial photo below).



It would not be flown within three hundred feet (300') of nearby homes or over other public or private properties. The drone would be operated by one of a handful of companies that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has licensed for such use (see attached Los Angeles *Times* article and California Film Commission press release). The drone would only be used for filming during daylight hours on Wednesday, February 4th.

Given that the production will employ an FAA-licensed drone operator and that it will only be flown over the filming location on private property, Staff is inclined to permit the use of a drone as a part of this film permit. However, Staff appreciates that residents and members of the City Council have expressed concern in the past about the use of drones and helicopters within City limits. Therefore, if any member of the City Council objects to the use of a drone for this film permit, please contact Staff by Monday, January 26th so that we can advise the production company in time for them to make alternate arrangements. Staff intends to issue the film permit for this production—with or without the inclusion of a drone—on or before the close of business on Monday, February 2nd.

Production Alert: Seven Companies Allowed To Operate Small UAS (Drones) Following FAA-Approved Safety Procedures

The Federal Aviation Administration has granted regulatory exemptions to seven aerial photo and video production companies, the first step in allowing the film and television industry the use of unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) in the National Airspace System.

Currently, these are the **only** seven firms allowed to operate UAS:

- Astraeus Aerial
- Aerial MOB, LLC
- Flying-Cam, Inc.
- HekiVideo Productions, LLC
- Pictorvision Inc.
- RC Pro Productions Consulting, LLC dba Vortex Aerial
- Snaproll Media, LLC

In the agreement with the FAA, these seven firms agreed to guidelines that include the following:

- UAS operators must hold private pilot certificates and current third-class medical certificates.
- The UAS must be kept within the line of sight of the pilot at all times.
- The UAS must weigh less than 55 pounds.
- Flights will be restricted to the "sterile area" on the set.
- Aircraft must be inspected before each flight.
- Operations at night are prohibited.
- The UAS may not be flown at a speed exceeding 50 knots.
- Flights must be operated at an altitude of no more than 400 feet above ground level.
- All operations must utilize a visual observer.
- During training, proficiency and experience-building flights, all persons not essential for flight operations are considered non-participants and the UAS must be operated with appropriate distance from non-participants.

- The operator must ensure that no persons are allowed within 500 feet of the area except those consenting to be involved and necessary for the film production. This provision may be reduced to no less than 200 feet if it would not adversely affect safety.
- Each UAS operation must be completed within 30 minutes flight time or with 25% battery power remaining, whichever occurs first.
- The operator must obtain an Air Traffic Organization (ATO) issued Certificate of Waiver or Authorization (COA) prior to conducting any operations under this grant of exemption. This COA will also require the operator to request a Notice to Airman (NOTAM) not more than 72 hours in advance, but not less than 48 hours prior to the operation.
- At least three days before scheduled filming, the UAS operator must submit a written Plan of Activities.
- The UAS must remain clear and yield the right of way to all other manned operations and activities at all times.
- The UAS cannot be operated from any moving device or vehicle.
- The UAS may not be operated less than 500 feet below or less than 2,000 feet horizontally from a cloud or when visibility is less than 3 statute miles from the operator.

FAA clears way for drones to be used on film sets

Hollywood will soon have a new angle on capturing aerial footage.

The Federal Aviation Administration announced Thursday that it approved exemptions that would for the first time allow aerial photo and video production companies to use drones on film sets.

U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx also determined that drones used for such operations do not need an FAA-issued certificate of airworthiness, based on a finding they do not pose a threat to the national airspace or national security.

The FAA was responding to a request filed this year by seven companies seeking permission to use "unmanned aircraft systems" for filming television shows and films on sets that are closed to the public.

"Today's announcement is a significant milestone in broadening commercial [unmanned aircraft systems] use while ensuring we maintain our world-class safety record in all forms of flight," Foxx said in a statement.

The decision could pave the way for the mining, agriculture, oil and other industries to seek commercial use of the technology.

"It's a landmark decision for the film industry," said Paul Fraidenburgh, a Los Angeles attorney with Buchalter Nemer who represents Hollywood clients seeking use of drones. "It just levels the playing field between major motion picture companies and independent filmmakers. You're talking about shots you couldn't get before because you can't afford to hire a helicopter."

The agency already allows law enforcement agencies, fire departments and other public agencies to use drones but has mostly banned their use for commercial purposes since 2007.

Drones are allowed in other countries and have been used in such films as the James Bond movie "Skyfall" and "Transformers: Age of Extinction."

The FAA has put off issuing regulations on commercial use out of concern that doing so could create safety hazards for conventional commercial aircraft.

The decision was hailed by the entertainment industry and the Motion Picture Assn. of America, which sponsored the companies seeking the drone waiver.

They argued that permitting filmmakers to use drones would allow for more nimble and creative filmmaking and minimize the use of helicopters, which can be dangerous. Last year, three people were killed when a helicopter crashed in Acton during the filming of a reality TV show for Discovery Channel.

"Today's announcement is a victory for audiences everywhere as it gives filmmakers yet another way to push creative boundaries and create the kinds of scenes and shots we could only imagine just a few years ago," MPAA Chairman Chris Dodd said in a statement.

The FAA decision would bolster U.S. jobs, he added at a Washington news conference to announce the decision.

"Now we're going to be able to do this at home," Dodd said. "It's going to bring a lot of business back to the U.S."

The FAA approved waiver requests from Astraesus Aerial, Aerial MOB, HeliVideo Productions, Pictorvision Inc., RC Pro Productions Consulting and Snaproll Media. The FAA said it was still reviewing a request from a seventh company, Flying-Cam Inc.

To receive the exemptions, the firms had to show their drone operations would not pose a public safety threat.

"We are thoroughly satisfied these operations will not pose a hazard to other aircraft or to people and property on the ground," FAA Administrator Michael Huerta said in a statement.

The companies will have to comply with specific safety conditions, including requirements that drones be inspected by the FAA before use. Drones can be used only on sets that are closed to the public and cannot be operated at night. Operators must have private pilot certificates, keep the drones within their line of sight and below an altitude of 400 feet.

The agency said it is considering 40 requests for exemptions for other commercial uses of drones.

"I want to stress that we are open to receiving petitions from anyone," Huerta told reporters. "This process opens up a whole new avenue for companies wishing to introduce unmanned aircraft into their businesses."

PAYING DOWN THE CITY'S UNFUNDED PENSION LIABILITY

On December 10th, Staff provided the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) with an update of the City's employee pension plan, the June 30, 2013 Actuarial Valuation Report (AVR), and information about options for paying down the City's unfunded pension liability. Based on the FY15-16 contribution rates set by CalPERS, the calculated FY15-16 pension cost estimate is about \$839,000, which is less than Staff's previous estimate of about \$887,000 included in the 2014 Five-Year Financial Model. The City's unfunded pension liability decreased from \$7.9 million at June 30, 2012 to \$7.2 million at June 30, 2013. Staff recommended that the FAC work with Staff during the 2015 budget process to develop alternatives and a recommendation to the City Council for paying down the unfunded liability. After receiving the report and discussing, the FAC unanimously agreed with Staff's recommendation.

Staff expects the alternatives to be delivered as part of the 2015 budget process may include:

- Making lump-sum prepayments of the unfunded pension liability;
- Selecting a shorter amortization period used to calculate the City's annual payment on its unfunded liability; and/or
- Options for refinancing the unfunded liability.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS UTILITY USER TAX (UUT) REFUNDS

The City received what is expected to be the final UUT collected by telecomm providers. Eleven telecomm providers remitted a total tax of \$776 collected for the month of December 2014, which was due to the City by January 20th. Through June 30, 2014, the City's UUT Claim Account had accumulated \$593,301 (see Notes to Financial Statements in the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, page 55). With the December 2014 remittances, the City has collected an additional \$119,855 of telecomm UUT during FY14-

15, for a grand total of \$713,156 in the UUT Claim Account for the claim period.

Staff is currently working with the Claims Administrator to finalize the claim notices for mailing; which includes obtaining translation into multiple languages, and finalization of the claim website. Staff will provide another update as soon as the mailing date is identified.

VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR RECOGNIZED BY EAGLE SCOUTS
