COASTAL COMMISSION NOTICES POSTED IN CITY PARKS FOR STATEWIDE MPA SIGN PROGRAM

The California Ocean Protection Council (COPC) has applied to the California Coastal Commission (CCC) for a master coastal development permit for a statewide network of interpretive signs for the State's Marine Protected Areas (MPAs). This includes the MPAs at Point Vicente and Abalone Cove in Rancho Palos Verdes (see attachments). The proposed signs will be slightly smaller than but similar to the recently-installed California Coastal Trail interpretive panels that have been placed in several locations along the City's coastline. There are proposed to be a total of seven (7) MPA signs at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center, Pelican Cove Park, Frank A. Vanderlip, Sr. Park and Abalone Cove Shoreline Park. See a sample of the proposed MPA signage below.

Not more than five percent by weight of any commercial coastal pelagic species or Pacific bonito catch landed or possessed shall be other incidentally taken species.
- Prohibited Species: All other living marine resources EXCEPT those listed above.

• Definitions:

- **Pelagic finfish**, for the purpose of this section, are a subset of finfish defined as: northern anchovy (*Engraulis mordax*), barracudas (*Sphyraena spp.*), billfishes* (*family Istiophoridae*), dolphinfish (*Coryphaena hippurus*), Pacific herring (*Clupea pallasii*), jack mackerel (*Trachurus symmetricus*), Pacific mackerel (*Scomber japonicus*), salmon (*Oncorhynchus spp.*), Pacific sardine (*Sardinops sagax*), blue shark (*Prionace glauca*), salmon shark (*Lamna ditropis*), shortfin mako shark (*Isurus oxyrinchus*), thresher sharks (*Alopias spp.*), swordfish (*Xiphias gladius*), tunas (*family Scombridae*) including Pacific bonito (*Sarda chiliensis*), and yellowtail (*Seriola lalandi*). *Marlin is not allowed for commercial take.
- **Coastal pelagic species** means any of the following: northern anchovy (*Engraulis mordax*), Pacific sardine (*Sardinops sagax*), Pacific mackerel (*Scomber japonicus*), jack mackerel (*Trachurus symmetricus*), and market squid (*Loligo opalescens*).







THE U.S. NAVY INVITES YOU TO AN OPEN HOUSE PUBLIC SCOPING MEETING



INSPECTIONS FOR CLEAN BAY RESTAURANT CERTIFICATION

For the past several years the City, in partnership with the Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission has participated in the prestigious Clean Bay Restaurant Certification Program. Restaurants typically handle a substantial amount of waste in the course of doing business. The improper disposal of that waste can contribute pollutants to stormwater runoff, posing a serious threat to our beaches and ocean. Thus, during the next several weeks, the City's stormwater pollution prevention inspector will be conducting inspections to certify or re-certify approximately 40 restaurants that meet a rigorous set of criteria aimed at preventing stormwater pollution.

PARKS LOCK AND UNLOCK SERVICE

On March 16, 2015, the City's security patrol vendor for Parks lock and unlock services, Southwest Patrol, notified the City by email that they will cease providing services to the City on March 17, 2015. The Maintenance Department has initiated a Request for Quotations with 3 new security vendors to establish Parks lock and unlock services for the remainder of the fiscal year. Quotes are due back from the vendors on March 20, 2015. A new vendor will be selected prior to March 31, 2015 and service is expected to be initiated on April 1, 2015.

FY12-13 & FY13-14 RESIDENTIAL STREETS REHABILITATION PROJECT, AREAS 1, 5B, & 9: CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES

The concrete and asphalt repair work continues in Areas 1 and 5B this week, such as the curb and gutter removal and replacement as shown in the photo below on the left, and the localized asphalt concrete repair shown in the photo below on the right. The asphalt concrete grindings will be hauled and stored at the City Hall City Maintenance Yard, as well as the upper parking lot at the Ladera Linda Community Center for future City use. Therefore, some trucking activity at these two City facilities should be expected over the next few weeks. The continued patience and cooperation of the public is greatly appreciated during this construction period.
