

UPDATE REGARDING PROPOSED CLOSURE OF DEFENSE FUEL SUPPORT POINT SAN PEDRO

On March 18, 2015, Staff attended the open house and scoping meeting for the proposed closure of the Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) San Pedro. The 330-acre project area excludes the former Navy housing sites and portions of the site that are leased for ball fields and the Los Angeles Police Department shooting range. However, the areas of the site currently used by the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy do not appear to be excluded. An overall site plan of the project area is provided below, and a complete set of the poster boards presented at the March 18th meeting are attached under the “Miscellaneous” section of this report.



All of the fuel storage tanks at DFSP San Pedro are currently empty. The Environmental Assessment (EA) that will be prepared is expected to include at last five (5) alternatives, ranging from no action to the complete closure and demolition of everything but the office and administration buildings on the site. Also among the proposed alternatives would be the partial closure of the facility, which would put the existing above- and underground steel fuel storage tanks back into service, but remove underground concrete tanks and some other existing pipelines and equipment.

The Navy and the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) are seeking comments on the scope of the EA until April 3, 2015. They anticipate that the draft EA will be released for public review and comment by this summer. Although the NEPA process only requires a 15-day public comment period for the draft EA, Staff plans to ask for a longer public comment period as a part of our scoping comments.

Notices were posted in various locations throughout the City. The deadline for applications to be filed in the City Clerk's Office is by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 24, 2015. Staff has tentatively reserved the 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. time frame prior to the May 5, 2015 meeting so that Council can conduct interviews of the applicants.

FILMING ACTIVITY AT ABALONE COVE SHORELINE PARK ON MARCH 26TH & 27TH

Nearby residents and visitors should be aware that there is filming activity scheduled at Abalone Cove Shoreline Park on Thursday, March 26th and Friday, March 27th from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM each day. On March 26th, the westerly half of the main parking lot will be used for "base camp" and cast/crew parking for a TV commercial that is being filmed at the Portuguese Bend Club. This shoot will involve a total cast and crew of 60 persons. On March 27th, there will be a still photo shoot on the beach, with cast/crew parking in the westerly half of the main parking lot. This photo shoot will involve a total cast and crew of 35 persons. On both days, public access to Abalone Cove Shoreline Park will be maintained, and members of the City's Recreation & Parks Staff will be on the site during filming activities.

Emergency Preparedness Committee

The Emergency Preparedness Committee is charged with making recommendations to the City Council to help ensure that the City of Rancho Palos Verdes develops and maintains a high state of readiness to respond to emergencies and disasters. Committee members advise the City Council on ways to develop and improve programs to communicate with and educate residents about the importance of emergency preparedness. Committee members are called upon to participate in community outreach events to encourage residents to become prepared and to participate in local volunteer disaster response organizations. Committee members are also

encouraged to become trained and registered as Disaster Service Workers, and/or receive other disaster-related training and certifications. The Committee meets on a monthly basis, typically the 3rd Thursday of the month, at 7:00 P.M. in the Community Room at City Hall, with authorization for staff to cancel unnecessary monthly meetings after conferring with the Chair.

Those interested in applying must submit an application to the City Clerk's Office by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 24, 2015. To be considered for appointment, an applicant must be a resident of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. An application for appointment can be requested from the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 30940 Hawthorne Boulevard, Rancho Palos Verdes, CA 90275, telephone number (310) 544-5217 or downloaded from the City's website at the following web address: <http://www.rpvca.gov/DocumentCenter/View/5795>. UTILITY USER TAX (UUT)

CLAIM DATA

The City's Claim Administrator provided refund claim data through March 19, 2015. As of this date, 2,790 physical claims and 833 online claims have been filed.

Additional data to note:

- The total Flat Refund amount that has been claimed so far is \$102,075
- The total Extrapolated Refund (Option 2) so far is approximately \$10,586 (avg. claim amount of \$44.11 x 240 claims)
- The total Exact Refund (Option 3) amount so far is approximately \$2,310 (avg. claim amount of \$32.22 x 72 claims)

To date, the total amount claimed is \$114,971. The City has set aside \$712,379 in a claims account to pay out all claims.

The deadline to submit a claim is August 5, 2015.

DEFICIENCY LETTER / EMAIL

The Claims Administrator will be sending out letters and/or emails to claimants alerting them of an error or incomplete information (deficiency) identified on their claims. This 'deficiency' letter (or email) process will provide claimants a chance to make corrections, clarify with additional information, or submit necessary documents to meet the requirements for an eligible claim. The claimant will be given 30 days to respond to the deficiency letter. If the claimant does not respond within the allotted time, the claim will be deemed ineligible.

MCCARRELL CANYON PIPE RELINING

A project to repair the lining of the 66-inch steel pipe that conveys drainage from McCarrell Canyon to the beach is now out to bid. Bid documents are available for potential bidders on the City's website. Although the pipe was installed only a few years ago, heavy abrasion due to rocks and debris carried by strong storm flows have damaged a considerable portion of the lining that protects the steel pipe's inner surface against corrosion. The current specification calls for a different type of liner that is more flexible and has a higher tolerance for impact and abrasion. A portion of this work will be eligible for reimbursement from the remaining unused funds awarded by the State in the grant for the San Ramon Canyon project. Bids are due by 10 AM on Thursday, April 9, 2015.

EARTH DAY/WEEK/MONTH RECYCLING OUTREACH

April will be a busy month in honor of Earth Day/Week. There are several activities planned including:


- Staff will have an environmental booth at the Whale of a Day event to educate attendees about recycling, reducing waste and reusing material.
- Staff in cooperation with Waste Management (WM), has reached out to the six (6) PVPUSD elementary schools in RPV and offered them a waste reduction presentation titled "Edible Landfill". The PVPUSD is serviced by Waste Management. The presentation is targeted to 2nd and 3rd graders and will be offered between April 13th and April 17th. Last year WM offered a similar presentation that was very popular and liked by both teachers and students. (e-mail attached)
- Staff with cooperation from EDCO, will hold its bi-annual paper shredding, electronics waste collection and mulch giveaway event on Saturday, April 18th from 8 am to 11 am.
- The City will host the County sponsored annual household hazardous waste and electronics waste roundup on Saturday, April 25th from 9 am to 3 pm.

FY12-13 & FY13-14 RESIDENTIAL STREETS REHABILITATION PROJECT, AREAS 1, 5B, & 9: CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES

The concrete and asphalt repair work continues in Areas 1 and 5B this week, including localized asphalt concrete repair as shown in the photos below, curb and gutter removal and replacement, and ADA curb ramp work. The asphalt concrete grindings will be hauled and stored at the City Hall City Maintenance Yard, as well as the upper parking lot at the Ladera Linda Community Center for future City use. Therefore, some trucking activity at these two City facilities should continue to be expected over the next few weeks. The contractor plans to move into Area 9 towards the end of this week to begin the preparations for the roadway repair work in that area. In addition, crack-sealing of the roadway will be starting in Area 1 next week, and in Area 5B the following week. The continued patience and cooperation of the public is greatly appreciated during this construction period.

TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE PUBLIC OUTREACH WORKSHOPS FOR THE PALOS VERDES DRIVE SOUTH CORRIDOR TRAFFIC STUDY REPORT - UPDATE

The Traffic Safety Committee held the second of three public outreach workshops to obtain public comments on the Palos Verdes Drive South Corridor Traffic Study Report last Monday night, March 23rd, at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center. This traffic study report was originally presented to the Committee at its meeting held last November, and so the Committee recommended that three public outreach workshops be held to obtain public input from the community on the proposed improvements included in the report. Several members of the community attended the meeting on Monday night and provided their comments to the Traffic Safety Committee. The third workshop will be held on Saturday, April 11th, at noon at the Ladera Linda Community Center.

Each workshop focuses on a different segment of the Palos Verdes Drive South corridor. The first workshop focused on the western segment of the corridor, from the intersection with the Point Vicente Interpretive Center entrance/exit to just west of the landslide area, and the second workshop focused on the segment of the corridor within the landslide area. While the third workshop will focus on the segment of the corridor from just east of the landslide area to the City border with San Pedro, comments and input from the public regarding any parts of the corridor are welcome at the upcoming workshop in April, in case any interested members of the public were not able to attend the two previous workshops. The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Community Involvement




The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 requires United States (U.S.) federal agencies to consider the potential environmental impacts of their actions before making decisions. In compliance with NEPA, the U.S. Navy is preparing an Environmental Assessment (EA) to analyze the potential environmental impacts that may result from the proposed partial or complete closure of Defense Fuel Support Point San Pedro, CA.

NEPA PROCESS

The purpose of an EA is to determine whether a proposed action or its alternatives would have potentially significant impacts to the human or natural environment. In preparing the EA, the Navy will develop, describe, and study a reasonable range of alternatives in support of the Proposed Action.

The Navy will use the findings of the analysis to determine the next steps in the NEPA process. If the findings indicate environmental impacts would be significant, the Navy would prepare an Environmental Impact Statement and conduct additional analyses. If the findings indicate environmental impacts would not be significant, the Navy would prepare a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI). The FONSI would describe how the Navy determined the Proposed Action would have no significant impacts. The Navy would then proceed with the Proposed Action.

The NEPA process provides opportunities for public input during both the Public Scoping period and the EA development. The public participates in the process by helping to identify environmental issues and potential alternatives, and by evaluating the analysis of the Proposed Action and alternatives. The Navy will consider all relevant comments received.

When the Draft EA is made available for public review, the public will be notified and will have the opportunity to provide comments. 

Purpose and Need, Proposed Action, and Alternatives



PURPOSE AND NEED

The purpose of the Proposed Action is to partially or completely close the Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) San Pedro fuel facility. This includes the Main Terminal, Marine Terminal, on-site and off-site pipelines, and associated infrastructure.

The project is needed to close aging infrastructure and/or upgrade infrastructure as needed, limit environmental risk, and generate cost savings for the Department of Defense.

PROPOSED ACTION

Under the Proposed Action:

- DFSP San Pedro fuel facility would be partially or completely closed in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- The existing Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) and Navy Host-Tenant Real Estate Agreement would be terminated.
- The Navy would continue to own DFSP San Pedro.

NOT PART OF THE PROPOSED ACTION

The following items are not included as part of the Proposed Action:

- The Environmental Assessment (EA) does not evaluate property disposal issues such as potential community reuse.
- No changes are proposed with respect to the ball fields or the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) Shooting Range; these areas would remain in their current condition and would continue to be available for public and LAPD use.
- Pier 12 would not be demolished under any of the proposed alternatives considered in the EA.

ALTERNATIVES

The Navy has identified four action alternatives (Alternatives 1, 2, 3, and 4) for the Proposed Action. In addition to these four action alternatives, the No Action Alternative will be analyzed in this EA:

- **Alternative 1: Complete Closure with Partial Demolition**
- **Alternative 2: Complete Closure with Minimal Demolition**
- **Alternative 3: Complete Closure with Complete Demolition**
- **Alternative 4: Partial Closure with Minimal Demolition**
- **No Action Alternative: Resume Operations**

NO ACTION ALTERNATIVE

DFSP San Pedro cannot permanently or indefinitely remain in a temporary closure status, but must instead either achieve permanent regulatory closure or be returned to operational status. Therefore, while implementation of the No Action Alternative would initially leave the DFSP San Pedro facilities in their current temporary closure status, in the event of such implementation, it is assumed timely action would be taken to restore operational status.



Alternative 1: Complete Closure with Partial Demolition



Under Alternative 1, and subject to obtaining regulatory approval, the Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) Main Terminal, Marine Terminal, and off-site pipelines would be closed in accordance with Unified Facilities Code 3-460-01. The following actions would occur under Alternative 1:

- The Marine Terminal would be demolished; however, Pier 12 would not be demolished.
- All aboveground storage tanks would be demolished at the terminals.
- All underground storage tanks would be filled with an inert solid material and abandoned in place.
- On-site aboveground pipelines would be demolished.
- On-site underground pipelines would be abandoned in place; except approximately 9,600 linear feet of on-site underground pipeline would be demolished.
- Off-site pipelines would be abandoned in place.
- All valve boxes, pump stations/houses, and warehouses would be demolished.
- All office and administrative buildings would be placed in long-term caretaker condition.
- A Closure Plan would be prepared to describe the work that would be performed and environmental commitments:
 - If soil or groundwater contamination is found during the closure process, a follow on site investigation and restoration project would be initiated.
 - Cleanup would be negotiated with the Certified Unified Program Agency and Regional Water Quality Control Board.



Alternative 3: Complete Closure with Complete Demolition



Alternative 3 is similar to Alternative 1, except that under Alternative 3, rather than a limited demolition plan, most of Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) San Pedro petroleum infrastructure would be demolished, subject to obtaining regulatory approval. The following actions would occur under Alternative 3:

- All DFSP San Pedro fuel facility aboveground storage tanks, underground storage tanks, on-site pipelines, pump houses, loading racks, vaults, etc. at the Main Terminal and Marine Terminal would be demolished and removed.
- Administrative and office spaces, as well as Pier 12, would not be demolished.
- Off-site pipelines would be abandoned in place.
- A Closure Plan would be prepared to describe the work that would be performed and environmental commitments:
 - If soil or groundwater contamination is found during the closure process, a follow on site investigation and restoration project would be initiated.
 - Cleanup would be negotiated with the Certified Unified Program Agency and Regional Water Quality Control Board.



Alternative 4: Partial Closure with Minimal Demolition



Under Alternative 4, and subject to obtaining regulatory approval, a portion of the Main Terminal would be permanently closed and a portion would be taken out of temporary closure status and placed into operation by the Navy. The Marine Terminal would be taken out of temporary closure status and placed into operation. Some of the off-site pipelines would be placed back into service and others would be abandoned in place. The following actions would occur as part of Alternative 4:

- The Marine Terminal (Pier 12) would be reopened and placed into operation.
- Aboveground storage tanks at both the Main Terminal and the Marine Terminal would be reopened and placed into operation.
- The concrete underground storage tanks (USTs) would be abandoned in place. The on-site pipelines associated with these concrete USTs would be abandoned in place. Approximately 9,600 linear feet of underground pipeline would be demolished along with 12 valve boxes.
- The steel USTs and their associated on-site pipelines would be reopened and placed into operation.
- Some of the previously active off-site pipelines would be reopened. These include the JP-5 and JP-8 pipelines between the Main Terminal and the Marine Terminal, and the 10-inch pipeline connected to the supplier. The remaining off-site pipelines would be abandoned in place.

Coastal California gnatcatcher (*Poliotila californica californica*). The coastal California gnatcatcher is a federally threatened species that has been observed in the coastal sage scrub plant community at Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) San Pedro.




