TAXICAB ORDINANCE GOES INTO EFFECT ON APRIL 16TH

The City Council adopted the new taxicab ordinance (Ordinance No. 564) on March 17, 2015. The ordinance, which addresses taxicab parking on City streets and prohibits false advertising using the City's logo, will become effective on April 16, 2015. On March 30, 2015, Staff sent the attached letter to the registered owner of a taxicab (which displayed a large emblem of the City's logo) that was observed by *Seabluff* neighborhood residents parked near the Terranea Resort. A copy of this letter was also provided to the Lomita Sheriff's Station and the Terranea Resort.

COMMENTS ON PALOS VERDES RESERVOIR UPGRADES PROJECT

On April 10, 2015, Staff transmitted the attached comments on the proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the Palos Verdes Reservoir Upgrades Project. Our comments focused upon:

- Clarifications and corrections in the project description, including the inclusion of an emergency back-up generator for the reservoir;
- Revised assessment of the flood risk posed by the upgraded reservoir upon downstream properties and residents in Rancho Palos Verdes; and,
- Traffic safety impacts upon commuters along Palos Verdes Dr. N. and Palos Verdes Dr. E.

Staff will continue to monitor and report on this proposed project as a part of the Border Issues Status Report.

2015 LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES HOT AND PRIORITY BILLS

In past years, the League of California Cities (League) has typically issued a voluminous list of "Hot Bills" to be tracked during the current legislative session in late March or early April of each year. However, for the second consecutive year, the League released a more focused and abbreviated list of bills it is following on April 8, 2015 (see attachment). As it did in 2014, the League appears to be focusing its attention on a small number of critical

bills or other legislative activities this year.

If the City Council desires more information regarding any of these bills, Staff will be pleased to provide it, either in a future Weekly Administrative Report or as an agenda item at a future City Council meeting.

SUBJECT: City of Rancho Palos Verdes Taxicab Ordinance

Dear Sir/Madam:

On 17 March 2015, the Rancho Palos Verdes City Council adopted Ordinance No. 564 and Resolution No. 2015-20, establishing (respectively) regulations regarding the parking of taxicabs on City streets and unauthorized use of the City's logo on taxicabs; and a schedule of fines and fees for violations of these regulations. Copies of this ordinance and resolution are enclosed for your reference. Ordinance No. 564 will become effective on 16 April 2015.

It has come to the City's attention that a taxicab registered to you and/or your company (CA license 8V38398) has been observed on City streets near the Terranea Resort. It has also been observed that this taxicab displays an emblem with the City's logo and the words "City of Rancho Palos Verdes," which would give a reasonable person the impression that your taxicab service is affiliated with or endorsed by the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. Copies of recent photos of this vehicle parked on a City street are enclosed for your reference.

You and/or your company are hereby notified that, effective 16 April 2015, the parking of this or any other taxicab registered to you and/or your company on a City street shall be in violation of Section 10.04.100(c) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code (Taxicab Parking), unless actively loading passengers and their possessions or waiting to receive payment of a fare. Furthermore, any taxicab registered to you and/or your company that is observed within the City of Rancho Palos Verdes displaying the City's logo or similar signage shall be in violation of Section 10.04.100(d) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code (False Advertising Prohibited).

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes respectfully requests that you and/or your company immediately cease and desist all activities that would violate the provisions of Sections 10.04.100(c) and (d) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code. Please be advised

ORDINANCE NO. 564

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RANCHO PALOS VERDES ESTABLISHING TAXICAB PARKING RESTRICTIONS AND PROHIBITING FALSE ADVERTISING ON TAXICABS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO PALOS VERDES ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 10.04 of Title 10 of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding new Section 10.04.100 thereto to read as follows:

10.04.100 Taxicabs

(a) Taxicab means any motor-propelled vehicle which is designed to carry not more than eight persons, excluding the driver, and is either equipped with a taximeter or a top light or has the words "taxi," "cab" or "taxicab" displayed on the exterior of the vehicle, and is used for the transportation of passengers for hire within and without the boundaries of the City, for which a fee is charged and that does not operate over a defined route.

(b) Taxicab Zone or Hack Stand means an area on private property (such as a hotel) designated by the property owner for parking taxicabs while waiting for passengers.

(c) Taxicab Parking: Taxicabs may only park in a taxicab zone or hack stand on private property while waiting for passengers. A taxicab may only be parked on City streets or alleys when actively loading or unloading passengers and their possessions and when the taxi driver is waiting to receive his/her fare. A taxi driver shall not park, stop, or stage a taxicab, or take breaks, on any street or alley in the City or on any property that is owned by the City.

(d) False advertising prohibited. No taxicab shall display the City's logo or any other signage that could lead a reasonable person to believe that the taxicab is affiliated with or endorsed by the City.

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO PALOS VERDES ESTABLISHING FINES FOR THE VIOLATION OF MUNICIPAL CODE PROVISIONS REGARDING TAXICABS OPERATING WITHIN THE CITY.

WHEREAS, in response to concerns raised by residents regarding taxicabs operating within the City, the City Council introduced an ordinance (Ordinance No. 564) that will prevent taxicab drivers from parking on City streets, alleys and properties except when they are loading and unloading passengers and their possessions or waiting to collect their fares, and from displaying City's logo or using any other sign or advertisement that would cause a member of the public to believe that the taxicab is affiliated with or endorsed by the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to impose fines and penalties for the violation of the new provisions of the Municipal Code, which will be set forth in Section 10.04.100 of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO PALOS VERDES DOES HEREBY FIND, RESOLVE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Resolution No. 2010-20, which establishes the City's bail schedule, is hereby amended by amending Attachment A thereto to add bail amounts for violations of Section 10.04.100 of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code, which shall be categorized as infractions on said Attachment:

Bail: First offense: \$50.00; Second offense: \$100; Third Offense: \$150.

Section 2: Resolution No. 2008-44, Resolution No. 2008-92 and Resolution No. 2010-065, which establish administrative citation penalties, are hereby amended by adding the following penalties for violations of Section 10.04.100 of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code:

~~10.04.100~~ Parking taxicabs illegally or improper display of the City logo or other advertisement on a taxicab that would mislead the public to believe that the taxicab is affiliated with or endorsed by the City:

First Offense: \$50.00; Second Offense within 12 months: \$100; Third and Each Additional Offense Within 12 months: \$150.

Section 3: Resolution No. 2003-62, which establishes civil penalties for parking violations in the City, is hereby amended by amending Exhibit C thereto to add the following penalty for a taxicab parking in violation of Section 10.04.100 of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code:

SUBJECT: Comments in Response to the Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Palos Verdes Reservoir Upgrades Project

Dear Ms. Stalvey:

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes appreciates the opportunity to comment upon the proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the above-mentioned project. We have reviewed the MND, and offer the following comments:

1. The Project Description in the Initial Study (pp. 1-16) raises several questions:
 - a. What are the two (2) MWD member agencies that will be reconnected to the reservoir after the upgrades are complete?
 - b. What will be the new maximum capacity of the reservoir after the upgrades are complete?
 - c. Is a back-up generator or other emergency power supply for the reservoir proposed as a part of the upgrade project? If not, why not?
 - d. It is our understanding that the Chandler Quarry in Rolling Hills Estates no longer accepts construction and demolition material. If this is the case, what will be the destination for this material?

2. The discussion of Hydrology and Water Quality impacts in the Initial Study (pp. 50-53) concludes that impacts related to the exposure of people and structures to risk of loss, injury or death due to flooding resulting from a failure of the reservoir will be less than significant, and no mitigation measures are recommended. However, the inundation map for the Palos Verdes Reservoir prepared by MWD in the 1970s (see enclosure) clearly shows that portions of Green Hills Memorial Park and the *Rolling Hills Riviera* neighborhood in Rancho Palos Verdes could be flooded to depths of up to ten feet (10') in the event of a catastrophic failure of the reservoir. We understand that part of the purpose of the proposed project is to upgrade the

reservoir to current safety standards. Nevertheless, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes respectfully requests the inclusion of the following mitigation measures as a part of the MND:

- a. MWD shall prepare an updated inundation map for the Palos Verdes Reservoir, based upon its expected maximum capacity after the completion of upgrades. A copy of this map shall be provided to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and first responders (i.e., Los Angeles County Sheriff and Los Angeles County Fire) for emergency preparation, planning and response purposes.
 - b. MWD shall develop, in conjunction with the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and first responders, a system for emergency public notification of downstream residents in the event that an imminent failure of the reservoir is observed, either as a result of routine inspection or an unusual event (e.g., earthquake, etc.).
3. The discussion of Transportation/Traffic in the Initial Study (pp. 67-71) concludes that construction traffic entering and exiting the project site could have a significant impact upon the safety of recreational trail users along Palos Verdes Drive North and Palos Verdes Drive East, and recommends the use of flagmen and guards as a mitigation measure. The City concurs with this assessment, but would also point out that the segments of Palos Verdes Drive North and Palos Verdes Drive East adjacent to the reservoir are a part of a major commuter route for Palos Verdes Peninsula residents. The City of Rancho Palos Verdes respectfully suggests that the use of flagging operations should be expanded to include motorists as well, particularly during peak morning and evening commute hours.





2015 League Hot and Priority Bill List – April 8

April 8, 2015

With the 2015 Legislative Session underway, the League has sifted through hundreds of bills and is working on those of most import to cities.

The following is a list reflecting bills of current priority interest to the League. These are bills that the League has taken an official position on by writing a letter. This is only a preliminary list; many bills are being amended; others will be reviewed later this week by League policy committees. Cities should expect this list to be updated frequently in the coming weeks of heavy legislative action. Positions are subject to change as bills do while winding their way through the legislative process.

Titles are linked to more information about a bill's status, as well as to sample letters that cities can use.

SUPPORT

HOT [AB 2 \(Alejo\): Community revitalization authority.](#)

This bill authorizes the creation of a new entity at the local level called a Community Revitalization Investment Authority (CRIA) that would provide a redevelopment option for the most disadvantaged and poorest areas of our state.

HOT [AB 35 \(Chiu\): Income taxes: credits: low-income housing: allocation increase.](#)

This bill would increase the state's Low Income Housing Tax Credit by \$300 million to build and rehabilitate affordable housing.

HOT [AB 185 \(Garcia, Eduardo\): Income taxation: insurance taxation: credits: California New Markets Tax Credit.](#)

AB 185 creates the California New Markets Tax Credit Program, with the goal of stimulating private sector investments into lower income communities by providing a tax incentive to qualified entities.

HOT AB 266 (Cooley) Medical marijuana.

This bill provides a framework for medical marijuana distribution that upholds local control, addresses public safety concerns, and includes important health and safety requirements. The League is a co-sponsor of this measure with the California Police Chiefs Association.

AB 323 (Olsen) California Environmental Quality Act: exemption: roadway improvement.

AB 323 would extend the sunset date for current law that exempts city roadway improvement projects from California Environmental Quality Act requirements if the project is within the existing right-of-way, improves safety and is within a jurisdiction with a population of less than 100,000 people.

AB 327 (Gordon) Public works: volunteers.

This bill would eliminate the sunset date on Labor Code Section 1720.4, permanently enabling local governments to use volunteer labor on public works projects. Examples include tree planting, park maintenance and playground construction.

HOT AB 1335 (Atkins) Building Homes and Jobs Act.

AB 1335 would generate up to \$700 million per year for affordable rental or ownership housing, supportive housing, emergency shelters, transitional housing and other housing needs via a \$75 recordation fee on real estate transactions. This fee would not apply to home sales.

HOT ACA 4 (Frazier) Local government transportation projects: special taxes: voter approval.

This bill would lower the voter threshold requirements for special taxes by a local government for the purpose of providing funding for transportation projects from 2/3rds approval to 55 percent approval.

HOT SB 321 (Beall) Motor vehicle fuel taxes: rates: adjustments.

This bill would infuse more stability into the variable gas tax rate set by the Board of Equalization by taking into account fuel prices of the previous four years in addition to the estimated fuel price of the current year.

OPPOSE**HOT AB 278 (Hernandez): District-based municipal elections.**

This measure would require that a city, with a population of 100,000 or more, switch to a by-district election system.

HOT AB 1220 (Harper): Transient occupancy taxes: residential short-term rentals units.


This bill would prohibit cities, counties, or a city and county from levying a transient occupancy tax (TOT) on residential short-term rental units, including single family homes, apartments, condos or other residential real estate in which the public pays for accommodations for less than 90 days.

HOT AB 1347 (Chiu) Public contracts: claims.

AB 1347 would mandate a new claims resolution process on all public contracts. It would require payment due on any undisputed portion of the claim to be made within seven days after the public agency issues its written response to a written demand or assertion. By comparison, current prompt payment law requires public agencies to make progress payments within 30 days after receipt of an undisputed and properly submitted payment request. Under AB 1347, if a public agency failed to respond to a written demand, a 10 percent per annum would be applied.

HOT AB 1301 (Jones-Sawyer): Voting rights: preclearance.

AB 1301 creates a statewide pre-clearance system requiring that all changes to an election system within a qualifying jurisdiction obtain approval by the Secretary of State before implementation.



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


SIDEWALK PANEL LEVELING

The Maintenance Department is testing a new process for sidewalk repairs at a number of locations throughout the City. The process involves pumping a urethane polymer under the sidewalk to fill voids and lift the panel. The system has the following benefits:

- Less repair time
- No mismatched color of sidewalk

FY12-13 & FY13-14 RESIDENTIAL STREETS REHABILITATION PROJECT, AREAS 1, 5B, & 9: CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES

The asphalt repair work is being performed in Areas 1 and 5B this week, including the localized asphalt concrete repair shown in the photo on the left below, and concrete repair work continues in Area 9. The asphalt concrete grindings generated by this work are being hauled and stored for future City use at the City Hall City Maintenance Yard, as well as the upper parking lot at the Ladera Linda Community Center. Therefore, some trucking activity at these two City facilities should be expected to continue over the next few weeks. Crack sealing, which is one of the additional preparatory steps before the actual street resurfacing, is also being performed in Area 1 this week, as shown in the photo on the right below. The traffic engineering consultant that prepared the original traffic study report will be compiling all of the comments obtained at all three workshops, which will be presented to the Traffic Safety Committee at a future meeting. 



TRUMP NATIONAL GOLF CLUB WATERFALL DEMOLITION PROJECT STATUS

On February 6, 2014, Trump National was granted conditional planning approval to demolish three of their existing waterfalls. Since that time, Staff has been assisting the Trump organization in getting all of their subsequent engineering, geologic and public works sign offs in order for them to be able to start the work. The permit is now ready to be issued with the last remaining hurdle involving the loss of protected habitat that will occur to remove the waterfalls.

Before the habitat can be removed, Trump National must obtain approval by U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife. Last week, Staff learned that the Wildlife Agencies had not been contacted by the Trump organization about this issue. Given the urgency of the matter and the positive working relationship that City Staff has with the Wildlife Agencies, Staff agreed to step in and speak to the Wildlife Agencies on Trump National's behalf with the goal of securing their approval to move forward with the work by April 20th. Staff has had positive conversations with the agencies thus far. Because it is the nesting season, Trump National is conducting necessary nesting surveys to ensure that there are no nests in the habitat that they intend to remove. Staff will continue to work on this last remaining issue so that the waterfall removal work can get started by April 20th.
