CITY HALL CLEAN UP DAY – FEBRUARY 17TH

There are a few holidays throughout the year when most government offices are closed, but that are not paid holidays for our City staff. One such holiday is Presidents' Day, which falls on Monday, February 17th. This holiday tends to be very quiet, because most people expect City Hall to be closed. In the past, we have used this holiday as a City Hall Clean-Up Day and I am proposing to do the same this year. On this day, City Hall offices would be closed to the public, but the staff would still report to work and use the uninterrupted time to clean and organize their files and work areas. Clean up days provide an opportunity for the staff to get to those "housekeeping" projects that we never seem to have the time to tackle during our normal workday schedule. Because it is a legal holiday as defined in the Municipal Code and no construction work is allowed to take place; however, the City will still be conducting building inspections. If any Council member has an objection to Presidents' Day being used as Clean-Up Day, please let me know by Monday, February 3rd.

2013 YEAR END CRIME RATE STATISTICS – PRELIMINARY DATA

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department released preliminary data this week regarding the 2013 year-end crime rate statistics. Attached are excerpts from the report that pertain to the communities served by the Lomita Sheriff's Station, including the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. The entire report can be found on-line at:

The preliminary data indicates that, while the Part 1 Crime Rate for the Lomita Station's territory increased 2.2% over the last year, and 4.4% compared to five years ago, the rate for Rancho Palos Verdes increased 13.74% and 22.65%, respectively. While the most violent crime rates have remained very low (homicide, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault), the change is primarily due to increases in property crimes (burglary, larceny theft, and grand theft auto). While burglary is up significantly compared to five years ago, the incidents of larceny theft and grand theft auto have shown the greatest increase, both compared to 2008 and 2012.

It is interesting to compare this data with the study recently released by the Public Policy Institute on realignment and crime rates. Since the implementation of AB 109 in

September 2011, there has been much speculation about the relationship of rising crime rates due to realignment. The study can be found on-line at:

Some thought-provoking excerpts include:

"...many factors contribute to crime trends. How do we know if realignment is the cause of the recent uptick in crime around the state? The analysis above suggests that realignment may have had an effect on property crime. The evidence with regard to violent crime is mixed, with smaller increases that do not clearly coincide with the implementation of realignment." Page 6

"On average, if realignment causes one less year of incarceration, then we see roughly two more property crimes per year, with the effect split between one motor vehicle theft and one larceny theft. In other words, a year in prison prevents about two property crimes a year. The estimates for total property crime and motor vehicle theft are both highly statistically significant, but the estimate for larceny is barely significant. We find no evidence of an effect on burglary." Page 8

"This analysis provides robust evidence that changes in incarceration caused by realignment have increased property crime, especially motor vehicle thefts." Page 9

The Regional Law Enforcement Committee will be holding its next meeting on Thursday, February 13, 2014 at 8:00 am at the City of Rolling Hills' City Hall. As always, these meeting are open to the public.

2013 GRANT ACTIVITY SUMMARY

Recently, Staff met with the City's grant consultant, Blais & Associates (B&A), to review the accomplishments of 2013 and the priorities for 2014. During the 2013 calendar year, B&A assisted Staff with the preparation of four (4) grant proposals (see attachments). The City was successful in obtaining \$495,000 in grant funding for the second phase of the Western Avenue Corridor Vision Plan (\$195,000) and the majority of the needed funding for the Sunnyside Segment Trail project (\$300,000). At this time, we await word on the status of our \$581,000 Proposition 84 storm water grant proposal for tree box filters for the Machado Lake watershed area of the City. Unfortunately, a \$1.4 million proposal for highway safety enhancements on Hawthorne Boulevard was not awarded last year. However, B&A continues to support Public Works Staff with the management and reporting for the \$9.4 million Proposition 1E grant for the San Ramon Canyon project.

In the coming year, with the City's successful recruitment of a new Recreation Services Manager in the Recreation & Parks Department, B&A plans to assist Staff with the development of grant applications for the funding of both indoor and outdoor exhibits at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center. B&A will continue to work with Public Works Staff to identify suitable and competitive funding opportunities for highway safety enhancements in the City. Staff and B&A have also developed a "wish list" of grant opportunities to watch

out for in the coming year, including solar power installations at City facilities, open space acquisition, crime prevention, and landscaping of the City's medians and parkways.

The current contract with B&A expires on June 30, 2014. Given the success that the City has enjoyed from the efforts of B&A since 2009, Staff expects to include a proposed appropriation to renew this contract in the upcoming FY 2014-15 budget.



SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE

A milestone was reached last week as the Contractor completed the 2000 foot long excavation for the rib and lag tunnel. The tunneling machine was successfully removed and hauled off site on Saturday. Crews are now working to finish off the tunnel entrance transition and prepare the remainder of the tunnel for installation of the 54-inch carrier pipe. This will be accomplished by hauling pipe sections up from the tunneling pit just below PVDS and welding them into place. The 25-foot pipe sections will be on the small diesel locomotive or "loki" that was previously used to haul out tunnel spoils and bring up the rib and lag shoring. The top photo shows the 43 ton tunneling machine being lowered onto the haul trailer.



At the beach, the contractor has completed the "structural" portion of the apron, or floor, of the outlet structure by pumping over 100 cubic yards of concrete over the bluff to the beach. When the




structural slab has had sufficient curing time, a second layer of concrete will be placed on of it to serve as the "wear" layer. The wear layer will be imbedded with beach rocks that will serve as energy dissipaters for the flow, helping to minimize scour on the beach itself. The wear layer concrete will be colored to match the stain that will be applied to the shotcrete and sculpted

wing and head walls. The middle and lower photos depict the concrete pump used to place the structural section of the apron.

PALOS VERDES DRIVE EAST ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECT



The project scope includes roadway resurfacing with asphalt rubberized hot mix overlay and microsurface seal, asphalt repairs, storm drain improvements, minor roadway widening, tree removal, tree trimming, tree root-pruning, installation of ADA compliant access ramps, asphalt concrete sidewalks, replacement of damaged and/or faded traffic signs, and replacement of striping and pavement markings along Palos Verdes Drive East from Vista Del Mar to the City's northerly limit at Conestoga Drive.

Engineer's Estimate: \$2.7M

Bid Opening: Thursday, January 23, 2014

Project Duration: 4 months

BLACKHORSE ROAD CDBG ADA COMPLIANT RAMP IMPROVEMENT PROJECT - PHASE II



This project is the second phase of the completed Blackhorse Road CDBG project that was completed in 2012 where ADA compliant ramps were installed at the intersection of Blackhorse Road and Hawthorne Blvd. The project scope includes relocation of a Metro(Line 344) bus stop and construction of an ADA accessible bus stop landing with sidewalk improvements and barrier removals.

Engineer's Estimate: \$51,000

Bid Opening: Thursday, February 6, 2014

Project Duration: 3 weeks

ABALONE COVE SHORELINE PARK IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Bid documents for Abalone Cove Shoreline Park Improvement project has been sent out for bidding and the bids are scheduled to be opened on January 28, 2014. After reviewing the bids and making certain that all the requirements of the bid documents and the Grant are met, staff will present the project's low bidder to the City Council for award of contract.

Staff gathered input from the community on concept design through a 'focus group' which consisted of representatives from the City Council, neighbors of Abalone Cove, former Public Use Master Plan (PUMP) Committee, Los Serenos de Point Vicente, PVPLC, the Library District, the School District, Terranea, and Park Rangers. The focus group was facilitated by Staff from the City Manager's Office, Community Development and Recreation and Parks Departments.

The improvements include: picnic tables and benches; shade structures; trash receptacles; mutt mitt dispensers; park benches; trailheads and rails; picnic areas ; interpretive signage along trails; viewing nodes/telescope; boulders; landscaping/irrigation and exploration play area; These park improvements will significantly improve access and the educational experience at the park.

The total budget for the proposed improvements including design and engineering is \$665,176. The Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) program grant will reimburse 50% of the project cost. The City's approved project budget for this project will cover the remaining 50% of the project cost.

January 16, 2014 Meeting Minutes**

Action Items from December 2013 Meeting

- **Jim York Permissive Use Agreement (Ara)** - It was last reported that Mr. York contacted Staff to see if talks on an agreement between the City and Mr. York can resume. However, Mr. York recently informed Staff that he does not intend to resume discussions on an agreement. Therefore, the City and the PVPLC will continue to explore an alternative trail route on City land. Additionally, a “trail closed” signs will be installed at the trail junctions near Mr. York’s property.
- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up (Ara)** - Ara will reach out to the property owners, using the Permissive Use Agreement that was originally drafted for Mr. York as the template, to resume discussions to obtain permission to allow a portion of the Peppertree Trail to traverse their private property.
- **Installation of “Walk bikes” signs at Filiorum Reserve (Ara)** – Danielle and Chris will be installing the signs within the coming two weeks.
- **Packsaddle trail “Trail Ends Sign” (Ara)** - Danielle and Chris will be installing this sign.
- **Ocean Front Estates: No wildlife feeding signs needed (Chris)** – It was recently reported that the feeding of wildlife at Ocean Front Estates has not been observed for some time now. So the team agreed not to install signs at this time and to revisit this issue if the feeding resumes.
- **Sacred Cove (East) closure** – Ara and Danielle will assess the condition of the trail for consideration at the February meeting.
- **Preserve Rules Sign** – Ara will provide Chris a map identifying where the Preserve Rules signs should be placed at the following two additional locations:
 - Intrepid (Forrestal)
 - Calle Entradero (Vicente Bluffs)
- **Barn Owl Trail Sign Replacement** – The “Trail Ends” sign was removed and needs to be replaced.

PVPLC Topics

- **Preserve decal replacement** – Danielle reported that the decals were recently completed at Vicente Bluffs Reserve and that the next location will be at Vista del Norte Reserve.
- **Volunteer Trail Watch Update** – dates are being selected for the workshops for the next recruitment of volunteers. Additionally, concerns were expressed regarding the web portal that will be discussed with IT.
- **Abalone Cove Restoration Project** – Danielle reported that the plants were recently installed and that the focus will now be on irrigation. She also mentioned that additional funding was obtained that will likely be used for the removal of invasive tree species.
- **Sacred Cove Trail** – See above discussion
- **Forrestal Gate Access** – The PVPUSD was contacted regarding the locks at the Forrestal gate to ensure AYSO are not locking other agencies out with the daisy chain system. The PVPUSD will be contacting AYSO.
- **Smuggler’s Cove** – A member of the public requested that the newly constructed Smuggler’s Cove Trail be designated to include bicyclists to provide improved access to the Olmstead Trail which is difficult for bicyclists to access because of the existing gate off PVDS. The team agreed that rather than re-designating the Smuggler’s Cove Trail, Chris would explore creating an opening to accommodate bicyclists, as well as pedestrians, in the gate off PVDS. This is to be an action item.
- **Grant Contracts / Agreements**
 - **USFWS Coastal Program Grant** - Danielle will provide Ara with a signed copy of the agreement for the City Clerk’s files.
 - **Los Angeles County** – The PVPLC reported that it is the recipient of a grant in the amount of \$80,000 for wayfinding signs throughout the Preserve.

City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison litigation status update (RPV)** – A new trial date has been set for March 12, 2014.

Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project Update** – Chris reported that construction continues and is nearing completion.
- **GIS overlays:**
 - **Dewatering wells (Public works)** - It was agreed to table this item until funding can be identified to cover the associated costs of creating a GIS layer with this information
- **Portuguese Bend Reserve Eucalyptus Trees** – It was determined that the existing trees do not need to be removed.
- **Cave Trail Railing Removal For Improved Trail Access** – this project was completed prior to the holiday break.
- **Cal Water Trail Damage on Burma Road** – Public Works is going to contact Brett Ommen with Cal Waters to see if they will repair the drainage rut in the Burma Road Trail that was caused by a water line leak.
- **PVDS Road Realignment Project Update** - It was reported that the project is being refined to address comments raised by the public during October's workshop. The next workshop is tentatively scheduled for February 2014.
- **Gateway Park Turnout** – It was reported that boulders off PVDS are missing and that unauthorized vehicles are accessing the area. Chris is going to replace and reposition the boulders to prevent access by unauthorized vehicles.

RPV Planning Topics

- **SCE pole replacement Project** – It was reported that SCE is to be contacted to confirm that the project was completed.
- **RPV / PVPLC Public Forum February 19, 2014** – Ara will post the agenda in advance of the meeting.
- **NCCP/IA (Joel)** - Discussions continue with the Wildlife Agencies.
- **Conservation Easement Update** - Joel reported that he forwarded the conservation easement language to the PVPLC for review before submitting it to the Wildlife Agencies for review and approval.
- **Ladera Linda/Forrestal Bike Riders** – The team discussed reports that cyclists coming from Forrestal are accessing the drainage swales below Ladera Linda and the School District's soccer field. The City is going to ask the School District to install a fence in the existing fence opening to prevent this unauthorized activity. Ranger Johnson noted that residents from the neighborhood use the swales to access the Preserve, which is also not permitted.
- **Malaga Purchase Agreement Update** – Disbursement of the funds is pending and escrow needs to close by February 28, 2014.
- **Abalone Cove Park Improvement Grant**
 - **Bid Documents** – Construction bids are due next week and the selected contractor will be considered by the City Council at its February 18th meeting.
 - **Section 106 Compliance** – This document was submitted to the State on Tuesday and needs to be approved before construction commences.
 - **Interpretive Panels** – Ara met with graphic designer on the three interpretive panels that will focus on the tide pools and indigenous wildlife in the area.
- **California Coastal Trail Update**
 - **CCT trail markers in Preserve** – Ara is coordinating with Danielle on the installation of the CCT decals on the Preserve trail markers. Ara is going to see if decals can be obtained rather than the placards.
- **City wide Park Signage Inventory Update** – The team is meeting on February 6th to discuss the Park Rules Signs.
- **Agua Amarga Reserve Encroachments (Joel)** - Joel will draft a letter to property owners adjacent to the Preserve who have improvements that encroach onto city property.
- **2014 Trails Conference** – The California Trails and Greenways Conference will be held April 8 to 10 in Palm Springs.
- **Vista del Norte/Crestridge Project Trail Connection** – Joel and Ara described how the Crestridge construction project will provide a trail connection from Crestridge Road to the Vista del Norte Reserve, which will eventually provide a public loop trail that encompasses the Preserve property and the private property.
- **GIS Overlays** - The following GIS layers will be completed by a future intern:
 - Archaeology site
 - Port-o-potties
- **"No Access" signs along PVDS at Archery Club** - It was agreed that the City should move forward with installing these signs in advance of the road realignment project. This will be an action item for Ara.
