CITY MANAGER RECRUITMENT UPDATE

The City Manager Recruitment Firm Selection Subcommittee comprised of Councilwoman Brooks and Councilman Campbell met with the Human Resources Manager on Monday, February 10, 2014. At this meeting, the recruiting memorandum for the Statement of Qualifications and Proposal was finalized and was issued to eight executive recruiting firms on February 11, 2014. The deadline for submission of the Statement of Qualifications and Proposal is scheduled for Wednesday, February 26, 2014. Upon receiving the submitted proposals, the Subcommittee will review and select the top recruiting firms and invite them for an interview.

PROPOSED FCC RULES REGARDING WIRELESS SITING

Last September, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking with respect to the siting of wireless facilities. At that time, the City Attorney's office advised Staff that proposed rule changes included:

- Interpretation and enforcement of Section 6409(a) of the Spectrum Act, which provides that a local government "may not deny, and shall approve," certain "eligible facilities request" for a modification of an existing wireless tower or base station that does not "substantially change the physical dimensions of such tower or base station"; and,
- Adoption of rules to clarify the FCC's 2009 "Shot Clock Rule," which limits the time in which cities may review and approve (or deny) a wireless facilities application under applicable Federal law. Six (6) discrete issues related to the Shot Clock Rule were identified, including such items as the definition of collocation; what constitutes a "complete" application; the amount of time needed to review applications for Distributed Antenna System facilities; and whether the FCC should adopt a "deemed granted" penalty for violations of the Shot Clock Rule.

Since learning of the proposed FCC rulemaking, Gena Stinnett, with Richards, Watson & Gershon, has been actively involved in drafting formal comments on the proposed rules as

part of a coalition effort. These comments—submitted jointly by the League of California Cities, the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) and the States of California and Nevada Chapter of National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (SCAN-NATOA)—were released on Monday, February 3rd (see attached League news article). While Ms. Stinnett is with the City Attorney's Office, she participated with drafting comments as a member of SCAN-NATOA and was not specifically representing the City in that effort.


Reply comments are due by March 5, 2014. Staff and the City Attorney's Office will continue to monitor the status of this FCC rulemaking as it relates to the City's regulation of wireless facilities. A decision by the FCC is not expected for at least a few months (or more) after the reply comment deadline, and could take much longer.

RPV AT THE MOVIES



League Submits Comments to FCC on Wireless Siting

February 4, 2014

The League submitted comments to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Monday in response to a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking that could limit local government authority over siting of wireless facilities.

The comments were submitted in conjunction with the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) and the States of California and Nevada Chapter of National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (SCAN-NATOA).

The FCC is considering rules to implement wireless facility siting provisions of the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act, federal legislation passed in 2012. While the main focus of the legislation was to extend tax cuts and unemployment benefits, it also included provisions that require local government approval of certain wireless facilities installations even if local zoning laws or policies would otherwise preclude or limit their particular placement or location.

The League's comments argue that the applicable section of law makes minimal changes and that no change in the current rules is warranted. If the FCC does not agree, the League argues the Commission should narrowly define the elements of an eligible facilities request as discussed above. Local communities should also retain their traditional land use authority to define a substantial change and develop procedures to flexibly respond to new technologies that will inevitably follow from Section 6409(a). After all, the most technologically neutral rule the Commission could adopt is no rule at all.

WELCOME NEW ACCOUNTS PAYABLE CLERK DIANE AMUNDSON

The City is proud to welcome Diane Amundson as the Finance and Information Technology Department's new Accounts Payable Clerk, replacing Gayle Van Overbeck, who retired after over twenty years of service. Diane has extensive financial and accounts payable experience. She most recently worked for the City of Redondo Beach's Finance Department.

RECRUITMENT FOR SENIOR ADMINISTRATIVE ANALYST

After 1 ½ years of service as a Senior Administrative Analyst in the Finance and Information Technology department, Ryan Mills has accepted a similar position with the Toll Roads of Orange County. In the past, Ryan assisted the department with the budget process, acted as project manager for the update of the Capital Improvement Program document, and worked on both the City's entry into the CDARS investment program and also the civil grand jury reporting that led to the on-going project to establish a fraud hotline. Although Ryan is already missed, we do wish him well in his next endeavor. Staff expects to begin the recruitment for his Senior Administrative analyst position later this week.

Director's Note: Staff expects to begin the process leading to the transfer of the Airspace Safety and Noise assignment to the Community Development Department during the next several weeks. The following two updates were authored by Matt Waters, Senior Administrative Analyst.

FAA NOTIFICATION OF SOCAL METROPLEX ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) recently sent a letter to the City regarding the FAA's intent to prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) of the implementation of the Optimization of Airspace and Procedures in the Southern California Metroplex (SoCal OAPM). The FAA's letter defines a 'Metroplex' as a "geographic area covering several airport serving major metropolitan areas." The SoCal Metroplex includes the following airports: LAX, Burbank, Long Beach, Ontario, John Wayne, Santa Monica, Van Nuys, Palm Springs, Santa Barbara and San Diego. The SoCAL OAPM is one of many Metroplexes throughout the United States. Nationwide, the FAA has 13 Metroplex projects, nine of which are currently active.

The stated purpose of the SoCal OAPM is to improve the efficiency of the SoCal Metroplex airspace by optimizing arrivals and departures at the airports listed above. This involves a shift to satellite-based instrument flight procedures (Area Navigation or RNAV) that improve and streamline existing, less-efficient ground based navigation systems. Potential benefits include reduced pilot/controller workload and reduced fuel consumption. SoCal OAPM project manager, Rob Henry made a presentation to the LAX Community Noise Round Table in January stating that in regards to noise, Metroplex procedures generally get planes higher, out over the ocean and seek to optimize the descent profile which allows pilots to reduce throttle settings to flight idle for as long as possible, which reduces both noise and fuel consumption.

According to the FAA's notification, the SoCal OAPM may lead to changes in aircraft flight paths and/or altitudes in certain areas, but would not result in changes to ground operations (e.g. runways, airport configuration) or the number of flights in the SoCal Metroplex. The FAA will be evaluating the potential environmental impacts of potential changes to aircraft routes proposed for departing aircraft 10,000 feet above ground level and arriving aircraft 7,000 above ground level. The FAA's notice states that the EA is "expected to evaluate at least two alternatives: No Action and the Proposed SoCal OAPM alternative (the Proposed Action)." The FAA has not finalized the proposed SoCal OAPM at this time.

The FAA has already begun preparation of the EA and anticipates issuing a draft in 2015. The FAA notes the following reasons for sending out this early notification letter:

- To Advise you (the City) of the initiation of the EA study
- To provide you an opportunity to provide any background information that you may have regarding the study area established for this EA
- To provide you an opportunity to advise the FAA of any issues, concerns, policies or regulations that you may have regarding the environmental analysis that will be undertaken in the EA

Cities and agencies are encouraged to provide comments and questions about the SoCal OAPM process. The FAA's letter goes on to say that public workshops will be conducted to inform the public and allow for comments. Workshop dates have not been set. City staff, who have a well-established working relationship with the FAA and the LAX Community Noise Round Table, will attend and participate in these workshops and the overall SoCal OAPM process to emphasize the importance of avoiding any increase in Peninsula overflights or reduction in altitudes that would adversely impact City residents. The City's Airspace Consultant, Tom Kamman of Williams Aviation Consulting, cautioned that the City and Peninsula should monitor this process very closely to avoid any negative impact from jet, turbo-prop or smaller visual flight rule (VFR) aircraft. Staff will contact the FAA to a) request notification of any future public meetings regarding this issue; b) indicate a desire to be a part of the process; and c) remind the FAA of the long-standing emphasis the City has placed on minimizing the impact of overflights on our residents.

Staff will continue to monitor this important community issue and will update the City

Council on any further developments. Until the Airspace Safety and Noise assignment shifts to the Community Development Department, Council members should contact Matt Waters at 310-544-5218 if they have any questions or wish to have this issue placed on a future City Council agenda. TORRANCE HELICOPTER DEVELOPMENTS

Staff is pleased to report that Torrance Airport (TOA) is developing noise testing criteria, following recent FAA approval, for new helicopter routes arriving and departing Torrance Airport, including a South Crenshaw route which follows Crenshaw Boulevard to the Ocean at an increased altitude. Public meetings about the proposed testing criteria will probably take place this spring or summer.

Background

The Torrance City Council adopted three improved helicopter routes and altitude flight minimum levels in early 2011. One of the proposed route modifications, if implemented, could have a positive impact on the City's residents by modifying the existing South Crenshaw Helicopter route and increasing the minimum height from 1,500 feet to 2,000 mean sea level (msl) along the high elevation points along the route. City staff worked closely with Torrance Airport staff and a Torrance Helicopter Subcommittee on this issue.

The proposed South Crenshaw route change, if approved by the FAA, would minimize residential impact by modifying the route to direct helicopters to fly over the eastern segment of the Portuguese Bend Nature Preserve rather than fly near Terranea Resort, Abalone Cove Shoreline Park, adjacent neighborhoods and the western segment of the Preserve. The current route ends near the intersection of Crenshaw Boulevard and Indian Peak. While the great majority of Torrance helicopter activity does not encroach upon Peninsula airspace, staff believes it is important to monitor this issue to minimize any potential negative impacts on our residents.

The FAA tentatively approved new routes and higher altitudes for the South Crenshaw route and a second route, which goes from Torrance Airport to the ocean following Pacific Coast Highway. The 2011 proposed changes to the Southeast route which links the airport and the Los Angeles Harbor would have resulted in increased hazards requiring significant mitigation measures, so the City of Torrance withdrew that particular route change and requested only an altitude increase.

The FAA convened a Safety Risk Management Panel which included fixed-wing aircraft and helicopter pilots and operators, Torrance residents, and representatives of the City of Torrance and Torrance Airport, to discuss safety concerns related to the three proposed helicopter route changes.

The Safety Risk Management Panel did include additional language allowing for lower altitudes when necessary due to safety, traffic and weather conditions. Based on the results of the Safety Risk Management Panel, the FAA recently undertook a Safety Risk

Management analysis of the three routes. The FAA has finished its safety analysis of the three routes and has approved a 180 day test of the routes, which will include noise monitoring and analysis, along with public outreach efforts.

Update

Subsequent to the FAA's approval of noise testing, TOA is now in the process of designing the test period criteria. Once that is complete, TOA will hold public meeting about the test criteria and receive input from the airplane community and the general public. No meeting dates are set, but they are anticipated to occur in spring or summer this year. If the routes are approved by the FAA after noise testing and the public outreach process is complete, the noise abatement routes would be published and available to all helicopter pilots using Torrance Airport. Staff will continue to keep the City Council informed of any significant developments.

Dear Mayor Brooks:

This notification letter is to inform you that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) intends to prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) to consider the potential environmental impacts of the implementation of the Optimization of Airspace and Procedures in the Metroplex (OAPM) in the Southern California area (SoCal OAPM). Attachment 1 is a copy of the Notice that will be published in major newspapers in the Southern California area (Los Angeles Times, San Diego Union Tribune and The Press-Enterprise) to notify the general public of the FAA's intent to prepare an EA.

A "Metroplex" is a geographic area covering several airports serving major metropolitan areas. The SoCal OAPM would improve the efficiency of the SoCal Metroplex airspace by optimizing aircraft arrival and departure procedures at a number of airports, including Los Angeles International Airport (LAX), Burbank Bob Hope Airport (BUR), Long Beach Airport (LGB), Ontario International Airport (ONT), John Wayne Airport (SNA), Santa Monica Municipal Airport (SMO), Van Nuys Airport (VNY), Palm Springs International Airport (PSP), Santa Barbara Municipal Airport (SBA), and San Diego International Airport (SAN). The project may involve changes in aircraft flight paths and/or altitudes in certain areas, but would not require any ground disturbance nor increase the number of aircraft operations within the Southern California Metroplex area.

To evaluate potential environmental impacts of the SoCal OAPM project, the FAA will establish a General Study Area (GSA) to evaluate potential impacts of changes in aircraft routing that are

proposed to occur below 10,000 feet above ground level. The GSA is subject to change and would be finalized during the environmental review process.

The FAA has begun preparation of the EA and intends to issue the Draft in 2015. We welcome your input as we prepare the EA and are sending this early notification letter for the following reasons:


- To advise you of the initiation of the EA study
- To provide you an opportunity to provide any background information that you may have regarding the study area established for this EA
- To provide you an opportunity to advise the FAA of any issues, concerns, policies or regulations that you may have regarding the environmental analysis that will be undertaken in the EA

Public participation will be a part of the EA process. Public workshops will be conducted to provide an opportunity for the public to learn about the project and to submit comments. The FAA plans to hold separate consultations with the appropriate Tribal Governments and their designated Tribal Historic Preservation Office in accordance with Executive Order 13175, if applicable. The appropriate Tribal Governments and their designated Tribal Historic Preservation Office will be determined after the GSA is finalized.

FAA is currently working on additional details related to this project, and will be coordinating with the appropriate agencies and tribes in the near future. Notice of the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) intention to prepare a Draft Environmental Assessment for the Optimization of Airspace and Procedures in the Southern California Metroplex (SoCal OAPM).

SUMMARY: The FAA is issuing this notice to advise the public it intends to prepare a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for the SoCal OAPM Metroplex, which involves flight procedure optimization at airports located within the Southern California metroplex area. These airports are called the EA Study Airports and include: Los Angeles International Airport (LAX), Burbank Bob Hope Airport (BUR), Long Beach Airport (LGB), Ontario International Airport (ONT), John Wayne Airport (SNA), Santa Monica Municipal Airport (SMO), Van Nuys Airport (VNY), Palm Springs International Airport (PSP), Santa Barbara Municipal Airport (SBA), and San Diego International Airport (SAN). The EA will be conducted pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and the implementing Regulations found at Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Sections 1500-1508.

The purpose of the proposed SoCal OAPM is to improve the efficiency of the airspace (a generic term referring to airspace where air traffic control service is provided) using more current navigation technology called Area Navigation (RNAV). The FAA has not made any decisions about the final content of the EA.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

Air traffic procedures operating in the Southern California metroplex airspace will be evaluated in the draft EA. The current procedures, which are intended to provide an orderly flow of traffic in and out of a busy metropolitan area, are outdated and not efficient. The application of RNAV technology for the SoCal Metroplex would enhance efficient use of the airspace.

A "Metroplex" is a geographic area covering several airports serving major metropolitan areas. A variety of factors reduce the efficiency of airspace within the Southern California Metroplex. The FAA proposed to optimize the efficiency of aircraft routes and the supporting airspace management system through the implementation of the SoCal OAPM Project. This would entail implementation of satellite-based instrument flight procedures that improve upon existing, but less efficient, ground-based navigation and/or radar vector procedures.

Proposed Action

The EA is expected to evaluate at least two alternatives, the No Action and the proposed SoCal OAPM alternative (the Proposed Action). The FAA has not finalized the proposed SoCal OAPM at this time. The proposed SoCal OAPM as it is currently being configured consists of optimizing aircraft arrival and departure routes within the airspace of the SoCal Metroplex.

Implementation of the proposed SoCal OAPM is not anticipated to increase the number of aircraft operations at the metroplex airports or involve ground disturbance of any facilities.

General Study Area

Using radar data and the initial proposed design changes, the FAA will identify a General Study Area in which changes to aircraft routing would occur as a result of the Proposed Action.

The General Study Area will be used to evaluate and compare the potential environmental impacts of the Proposed Action and No Action Alternative. This evaluation will occur where departing aircraft are anticipated to be at altitudes below 10,000 feet above ground level (AGL) and arriving aircraft at altitudes below 7,000 feet AGL. The FAA may also consider changes over tribal lands, national parks or national wildlife refuges below 18,000 feet AGL to evaluate and compare the potential impacts of the Proposed Action and the No Action alternative.

PUBLIC WORKSHOPS

FAA intends to hold public workshops following publication of the Draft EA. FAA will provide public notice of the public workshops and the availability of the Draft EA at a future date.

The term of the contract will begin following award by the City Council, receipt and approval of the required contract documents and will end June 30, 2017. MASTER PLAN OF DRAINAGE PROGRESS REPORT


Last autumn City Council awarded a professional services contract for development of a GIS-based Master Plan of Drainage. This effort will produce a “living document” management tool that will allow staff and policy makers to better understand current and future needs of the storm drain utility in the City. The first stage of the work, which is underway, is gathering all relevant and available data, including system drawings, video inspection records, maintenance and project data, topography, land use and base maps. The consultant will synthesize all this data onto a spatially referenced storage platform. This platform is, essentially, an interactive electronic map that will allow retrieval of information about the system with a point and click of a computer mouse. After the data gaps are filled and field verification is performed, the consultant will begin his computer modeling and analysis to determine where there are significant condition or capacity deficiencies. He will also search for opportunities to achieve storm water quality enhancements, necessary for MS4 compliance, through constructed natural treatment or retention facilities. The “living document” will allow for continuous updates as CIP and maintenance programs modify the storm drain utility. The final product, expected in draft late this year, will inform scope and prioritization discussions and integrate nicely into other infrastructure management activities in the City.

SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE

Now that the tunnel has been completed, the Contractor has begun installing the 54-inch steel carrier pipe in the tunnel. He will begin at the top, by hauling the pipe section up inside the tunnel and fitting them together. This process will be followed by welders, who will work inside the pipe to bond the pipe sections together with a permanent weld. This work is anticipated to take several weeks to complete.

Below PVDS, the Contractor is beginning to contract his staging area in preparation for restoration of the vegetation to pre-project conditions. The large crane at the beach has been de-mobilized and rough grading taking place to restore the land contours to their intended shape. Soil amendments and native vegetation species will be used to restore the affected area.


Work on the beach is now completed and the outlet structure finished. The final product, shown in this photo, bears a good resemblance to the surrounding bluffs, making it difficult to spot from afar by all but informed observers.
