PALOS VERDES BUSINESS MAIL ENTRY UNIT FEASIBILITY STUDY

On March 28, 2014, business mail customers and bulk-mail permit holders on the Palos Verdes Peninsula (including the City of Rancho Palos Verdes) received the attached notice from the US Postal Service (USPS). USPS is preparing a feasibility study to assess the possibility of consolidating the Business Mail Entry Unit (BMEU) at the Palos Verdes Peninsula post office with the BMEU at the Torrance post office. If this consolidation does occur, it will only affect bulk-rate mailing for business customers; it will have no effect upon residential mail delivery or retail services at the Peninsula post office. Furthermore, City Staff has confirmed with USPS authorities that this proposed consolidation does not mean that the Peninsula post office would be closing.

Last week, Staff began receiving inquiries from residents expressing concern that this notice meant that the Peninsula post office would be closing. In order to dispel these concerns, Staff posted the USPS notice on the City's Facebook page and sent out a "Breaking News" item to listserv subscribers on April 10, 2014. We also forwarded a copy of the notice to the Palos Verdes Peninsula Chamber of Commerce. The attached article appeared in the *Daily Breeze* on April 13, 2014.

USPS wants to consolidate bulk mailing services

USPS wants to consolidate bulk mailing services

Feasibility study will decide the effectiveness of combining the Peninsula and Torrance units

A U.S. Postal Service proposal to close a bulk-mailing service used by only a few dozen Palos Verdes Peninsula businesses has alarmed some residents, who incorrectly believed it could affect residential mail delivery or other post office services.

The service, called the Business Mail Entry Unit, could be consolidated with another in Torrance, depending on the outcome of a feasibility study that is underway.

The city of Rancho Palos Verdes issued a statement via email Thursday reassuring residents that their mail service is unaffected by the move.

"If this consolidation does occur, it will only affect bulk-rate mailing for business customers," a city statement says. "It will have no effect upon residential mail delivery or retail services at the Peninsula Post Office. Furthermore, city staff have confirmed with USPS authorities that this proposed consolidation does not mean that the Peninsula Post Office would be closing."

Acting City Manager Carolynn Petru said the city issued the statement because municipal officials were initially confused by the notice and then discovered residents were calling postal authorities, too.

A handful of residents also called City Hall, Petru said.

"We didn't want this to spiral out of control and get rumors going," she said.

USPS has been closing lightly used post offices and consolidating other facilities to save money. The agency is running massive deficits as the Internet reduces the volume of mail it delivers.

"There are only 46 bulk business, mail-permit holders in Palos Verdes, and only about five or six bulk mailings per week are accepted there," USPS spokesman Rich Maher said. "No final decision has been made yet, but USPS is proposing that these bulk business mail customers deposit their mailings in Torrance. There would be no impact to any other customers and no changes made to any other operation at the Post Office."

USPS is taking public comment on the proposal through April 27, Rancho Palos Verdes officials said.


The City of Rancho Palos Verdes very much appreciates being provided with notification of the Palos Verdes Business Mail Entry Unit (BMEU) Feasibility Study and the possible consolidation of the Palos Verdes BMEU with the BMEU facility at Torrance. Our City is reliant upon USPS bulk-mail service as a vital means of communication with our residents, primarily through our quarterly City newsletter and also through the occasional mailing of notices for public hearings and other important City projects and business.

We understand and appreciate that USPS desires to maximize its increasingly-limited resources by consolidating operations where possible. Based upon communications with USPS staff, we also understand that the possible consolidation of the Palos Verdes BMEU with the Torrance BMEU would have very limited impacts upon the City's outgoing bulk-rate mail service.

USPS should be aware, however, this proposal has raised concerns among our residents about the possible future closure of the Palos Verdes Peninsula post office. Although such action is apparently not contemplated as a part of the Palos Verdes BMEU Feasibility Study, USPS should be aware that the residents and business owners of Rancho Palos Verdes strongly value the service and convenience to the community that is provided by the Palos Verdes Peninsula post office.

Again, thank you for advising the City of Rancho Palos Verdes of this USPS initiative. We would appreciate being kept informed of its status in the future.

STORM WATER ILLICIT DISCHARGE

In response to notification from the public of potential illicit discharges to the storm drain system, the City's stormwater quality consultant is sending the attached Stormwater Pollution Prevention Notice to homes on Via Del Cielo. The intent of the Notice is to inform the neighborhood of the observations, educate them regarding the dangers and possible effects of pollution in the storm drain system and to ask for their help in preventing future discharges.

SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE

This week the contractor is completing the closure section of pipe (see photo), which joins the tunnel section, just completed, to the cut and cover section, completed last autumn. All that remains for the storm drain to be fully functional is the completion of the inlet structure, which should occur this month. Additional activities to complete the project, such as installation of the upper access road, rebuilding the hillside just below



PVDS and installation of landscaping over the entire site are ongoing. The final activities will include repaving the areas worn by hauling trucks, restriping along PVDS and demobilization. Although the original schedule indicated these final activities would occur in April of this year, it will more likely be in June. Delays in the tunneling process and in the landscaping activities have extended the schedule. Extra construction management costs due to the delay will be borne by the contractor.

EARTH DAY/MONTH ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS ASSEMBLIES

In celebration of Earth Day, Waste Management, the PVPUSD's contracted hauler, and staff have been conducting classroom landfill related presentations at various schools. To date, presentations at Silver Spur and 2nd grades at Vista Grande Elementary are completed. Next week, presentations will be at Point Vicente and 3rd grades at Vista Grande. On the 26th, staff and EDCO will hold another paper/document shredding, e-Hazardous Waste and Electronics Waste roundup event which will cap off a month of Earth Day activities.



BRUSH CLEARING CONTINUES

EDCO's Spring brush clearing event is in process and to-date a total of 11.83 tons of brush has been collected. The tons of brush collected are as follows: 6.76 tons on the Monday route serviced on April 5, and 5.07 tons on the Tuesday route serviced on April 12th. There will be no collection this Saturday. Collection will resume Saturday April 26th.

Subject: Stormwater Pollution Prevention Notice

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes would like to remind all residents that the prevention of stormwater pollution is vital to maintaining our pristine canyons and coastline. The City recently received reports of mysterious liquid and material deposits accumulating in the gutter along Via del Cielo (see Figures below). Oftentimes residents are unaware that they may be discharging to the storm drain system, which includes our streets, sidewalks, and underground drains, and ultimately flows to the Pacific Ocean.



When untreated water is discharged into the storm drain system, pollutants such as nutrients, bacteria, oil, grease, and other materials in the water get carried out to our canyons, streams, rivers, and ultimately the ocean. These pollutants can endanger wildlife and cause human health issues, and are therefore considered illicit discharges. Illicit discharges include things like runoff resulting from inefficient landscape irrigation and chlorinated pool water/ pool filter backwash discharges. Residents must prevent illicit discharges from their properties into the storm drain system.

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes and the Los Angeles National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Stormwater permit both prohibit illicit discharges to the storm drain system.

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes' Municipal Code §13.10.040 states:

"It is prohibited to establish, use, maintain, or continue illicit connections to the municipal storm water system, or to commence or continue any illicit discharges to the municipal storm water system."

Everyone's help is needed and appreciated in the City's efforts to reduce stormwater pollution. Informational literature has been included to help resolve these issues. Follow up inspections will be conducted over the next couple of weeks to ensure that all illegal discharges have been eliminated. If

April 3, 2014 Meeting Minutes

Action Items from March 2014 Meeting

- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up (Ara)** - Ara reported that draft license agreement language was transmitted to the City Attorney for review and he was waiting for her comments before contacting the respective property owners.
- **Signs:**
 - **Barn owl trail sign replacement** – Chris reported that this sign was installed
 - **Filiorum “trail closure” signs** – The team reviewed the sign language and the sign will be installed in the coming week.
 - **Packsaddle trail “Trail Ends Sign” (Ara)** – Chris reported that this was installed.
 - **Preserve Rules Sign** - Ara provided Chris with a map identifying the locations. The following additional signs will be installed over the next few weeks
 - **Intrepid (Forrestal)**
 - **Calle Entradero (Vicente Bluffs)**
- **Sacred Cove Trail** – After discussions ensued, it was agreed that the east segment should be closed due to safety concerns while the west segment could remain open provided it was properly signed warning users of the trail condition. Based on this determination, the City agreed to install the appropriate closure and warning signs, while the PVPLC agreed to place obstacles to close access to the east segment and to install updated trail directional arrows that would direct users to the Cliffside Trail which provides coastal access.
- **Vicente Bluff and Rim Trail Site Visits** – the team will visit these two sites on April 17th. Ara will send an outlook invite.

PVPLC Topics

- **Preserve Decal Replacement** - Abalone Cove Reserve will be completed next month followed by the Vista del Norte and Alta Vicente Reserves.
- **Landslide Scarp Trail Widening** – The team explored options to prevent bicyclists from using this pedestrian trail. It was agreed that a barrier would be installed at each end of the trail that would allow hikers and equestrians to step over the barrier but would cause a cyclists to stop and carry their bike. Additional “no bicyclists” signs will be posted adjacent to the barrier.
- **Rim Trail** – See above
- **Volunteer Trail Watch Update** – It was reported that 13 new members finished training and will be joining the volunteer crew.
- **Rapid Response Team Update** - This volunteer group continues assisting the PVPLC in closing spur trails with current efforts focused at Abalone Cove. It was discussed using the volunteers at Vicente Bluffs near the parking lot to close unauthorized trails on the bluff.
- **Rolling Hills Conference Call Follow-up** – Katie and the PVPLC had a recent conversation with Kirsten Raig on Rolling Hills (RH) residents creating unauthorized trails in the Preserve. It was agreed that the City and the PVPLC will provide an article in the RH monthly magazine on unauthorized trails and its consequences on the flora and fauna.
- **Grant Contracts / Agreements**
 - **Los Angeles County** The PVPLC reported that it is the recipient of a grant in the amount of \$80,000 for trail delineation and wayfinding throughout the Preserve. The plan is still being developed by the PVPLC.
 - **2012 HCF** – The City and the PVPLC are recipients of the 2012 HCF grant for trail connectivity and signage throughout the Preserve. Ara reported that the contract was signed by the City and State Parks.
- **San Ramon Reserve** – The team discussed the future trail connection between the Preserve and Friendship Park. The team also discussed unauthorized vehicles entering the Preserve and Friendship Park via private property in the City of Los Angeles off PVDS. The PVPLC is going to contact the Park manager regarding this matter and Katie is going to reach out to the private property owner to properly gate the access.

City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison litigation status update (RPV)** – It was reported that a tentative settlement has been reached and a settlement agreement is pending.

Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project Update** - Chris reported that construction continues and is nearing completion.
- **Calwater Trail Damage on Burma Road Trail** – Chris previously reported that the trail was repaired but would have to be repaired again due to recent rain runoff damage, which is scheduled to occur later this month.
- **Preserve Gate Locks** – Chris reported that so far no additional locks have been installed since notice was given earlier this year. He added that Public Works will be testing a new lock at Portuguese Bend within the coming month.
- **Forrestal Reserve Exposed Fence Post Removal** – Chris requested site specific information regarding the exposed fence posts and Ranger Johnson agreed to assist by mapping out the exposed fence post locations.
- **PVDS Road Realignment Project Update** – The team reviewed an updated schematic that relocates the parking lot to the sandbox further away from the Portuguese Bend Club in order to address concerns expressed at the March public workshop. An alternative plan will be presented to the public at a future workshop before going to the City Council. It was discussed having this project stand on its own as a Vision Plan amendment rather than connected to the roadway realignment project.
- **Smuggler's Cove Trail Gate Opening for Bicyclists** – At the last meeting, the team discussed creating an opening in the entry gate to better accommodate cyclists. Chris is working on completing this project using a similar barrier that is being considered at the Landslide Scarp Trail which will require cyclists to dismount before entering the permitted Preserve trails.

RPV Planning Topics


