FILMING ACTIVITY IN CITY PARKS THIS WEEK

Visitors and nearby residents should be aware that there is filming activity scheduled at two (2) City parks on Friday, May 23rd. A Toyota commercial will be filming at Hesse Park and will be using the overflow parking lot at Point Vicente Park/Civic Center for the production's "base camp" and cast/crew parking. This commercial will also be filming at a private residence on Palos Verdes Drive West on the same day. Cast and crew will begin arriving and setting up at the "base camp" at 5:00 AM, but filming activity at Hesse Park and the private residence will occur during regular filming hours (i.e., 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM).

For this commercial shoot, production vehicles and equipment will be using a portion of the south end of the parking lot at Hesse Park. Filming will take place in the parking lot and at the adjacent picnic area. With the exception of brief closures of no more than ten (10) minutes to control background action, all public trails and walkways will remain open during this shoot, as will the south driveway from Locklenna Lane. A member of the City's Recreation & Parks Staff will also be on set at all times during filming activities at Hesse Park.

HOW TO TRANSFER A PRIVATE STORM DRAIN TO THE CITY FOR MAINTENANCE PURPOSES

A question regarding how a private community that was created without public right of way, would go about transferring a private storm drain in their community to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes for ongoing maintenance was raised recently. The parameters surrounding the installation of these storm drain pipes and what would be needed to transfer the private storm drain to the City as follows:

When construction of a tract with private roadways was authorized by the County prior to the City's incorporation, the county planning and development guidelines were used in establishing the building criteria for the developer. The county did not require the developer to construct the roadways or the under road drainage system within the development to county standards. Accordingly, these facilities were not accepted by the county for future maintenance which is the reason the City does not own or maintain these pipes today.

If a private community, such as the community along Rocking Horse Road, would like to transfer the existing under road drains to the City for future maintenance by the City, the drainage systems would need to be improved meeting current City requirements which, as a minimum, would include:

- Each pipe would need to be in a state of good repair with an estimated performance life of at least 30 years, and
- Each pipe would need to have a concrete inlet and outlet structure, and
- Each pipe would need to be located within an easement that would be dedicated to the City when the lines were accepted by the City. In addition, an easement for ingress/egress may be needed so maintenance vehicles can access the storm drain lines.

An HOA would that wished to pursue transferring a private storm drain line to the City would need to coordinate with the Public Works Department to determine what was required for the specific storm drain line. Requirements may include installing a liner, replacing segments of the line, having inlet and outlet structures designed and installed per City Standards depending on the need of the specific storm drain line. Costs for this work will vary depending on specific needs. **PVPLC/RPV Preserve Management Team
May 8, 2014 Meeting Minutes**

Attendance

Action Items from April 2014 Meeting

- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up** - Ara reported that draft license agreement language is being reviewed by the City Attorney and that he was waiting for her comments before contacting the respective property owners.
- **Signs:**
 - **Filiorum “trail closure” signs** – this sign was installed
 - **Packsaddle trail “Trail Ends Sign”** – This sign was installed
 - **Preserve Rules Sign** – these signs were installed
 - **Intrepid (Forrestal)**
 - **Calle Entradero (Vicente Bluffs)**
- **Sacred Cove Trail** – As a result of the safety concerns previously discussed by the team, Chris reported that a “trail closed” sign was installed at the east segment and a “proceed with caution” sign was installed at the west segment. The PVPLC will be closing off the old east segment.
- **Vicente Bluffs Follow-up** – The team toured the area of concern last month and discussed measures to prevent the public from entering this area, such as installing additional signs (the PVPLC will provide Chris with sample text), increasing ranger patrol, and asking the VTW to canvass this area particularly on weekends during the summer to educate visitors.
- **Rim Trail Follow-up** – As a result of the team hike, the PVPLC will be closing the spur trails between the Paintbrush Trail and Burma Road Trail.
- **Landslide Scarp Trail** – It was reported that the “no bikes” sign was removed and re-installed. Additionally, Chris will be installing a barrier at each end of the trail that would allow hikers and equestrians to step over the barrier.

PVPLC Topics

- **Preserve Decal Replacement** - Abalone Cove Reserve will be completed next month followed by the Vista del Norte and Alta Vicente Reserves.
- **Ladera Linda/Forrestal Unauthorized Bike Trails** – The PVPLC will add this to the project list to close unauthorized trails.
- **Rolling Hills Residents Preserve Access** – Katie and Danielle will be jointly writing an article for publication in the Rolling Hills Community Newsletter on the Preserve and trail etiquette, particularly staying on designated trails and authorized entry points into the Preserve.
- **Volunteer Trail Watch Update** – Danielle reported that there are 34 members and the PVPLC anticipates having another training session this fall.
- **Rapid Response Team** – It was reported that this volunteer group continues assisting the PVPLC in closing spur trails with current efforts focused at Abalone Cove.
- **San Ramon Reserve** - The team continued its discussion of the future trail connection between the Preserve and Friendship Park. The team also discussed unauthorized vehicles entering the Preserve and Friendship Park via private property in the City of Los Angeles off PVDS. The PVPLC is going to contact the Park manager regarding this matter and Katie is going to reach out to the private property owner to properly gate the access.
- **Grant Contracts / Agreements**
 - **Los Angeles County** The PVPLC updated the team on this grant in the amount of \$80,000 for trail delineation and wayfinding throughout the Preserve. The grant contract has not yet been received.
 - **2012 HCF** – The City and the PVPLC are recipients of the 2012 HCF grant for trail connectivity and signage throughout the Preserve. Ara reported that the contract was signed by the City and State Parks, and that before any reimbursements are processed, a deed restriction needs to be recorded against the Preserve. Joel will be talking to the City Attorney on this grant requirement.

City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison litigation status update (RPV)** - It was reported that a settlement has been reached and a settlement agreement is pending. The City Council will be asked to decide on how the distribution should be paid out based on the damages claimed.

Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project Update** – Chris reported that the project is in its final stages and that the trail and vegetation replacement are to be completed soon.
- **Calwater Trail Damage on Burma Road Trail** – Chris reported that the ruts have been repaired.
- **Abandoned Items at Gateway Park** – Public Works will be removing abandoned items within the coming weeks.
- **Forrestal Reserve Exposed Fence Post Removal Project** – The City and the PVPLC are looking to use volunteers to complete this project.
- **PVDS Road Realignment Project Update** – The team continued its discussion on the updated schematic plan that relocates the parking lot to Gateway Park further away from the Portuguese Bend Club in order to address concerns expressed at the March public workshop. An alternative plan will be presented to the public at a future workshop before going to the City Council. This project will be processed on its own by the Recreation and Parks Department and no longer connected to the roadway realignment project, which is moving forward.
- **Smuggler’s Cove Trail Gate Opening for Bicyclists** – Chris is working on completing this project using a similar barrier that is being considered at the Landslide Scarp Trail which will require cyclists to dismount before entering the permitted Preserve trails.

RPV Planning Topics

- **RPV / PVPLC Public Forum May 28, 2014** – Ara will circulate the agenda this week for comments before posting on the City’s website a week in advance of the meeting.
- **Management Agreement Amendment No. 1 Update** – The maps attached to the Management Agreement have been updated for Gateway Park and the Archery Range property based on the Council’s approval.
- **Malaga Canyon Management** – PVPLC management will begin after conservation easements are recorded on the property.
- **NCCP/IA (Joel)** – Joel reported that conversations with the wildlife agencies continue.
- **Conservation Easement Update** – The language is close to being approved by the City and the PVPLC.
- **Abalone Cove Park Improvement Grant Update** – Ara reported that construction is scheduled to begin any day now but cannot begin until the City receives the Section 106 approval from the State.
- **California Coastal Trail Update**
 - **CCT trail markers in Preserve** - Ara is coordinating with Danielle on the installation of the CCT decals on the Preserve trail markers. Ara is coordinating with Public Works to have the CCT insignia decals produced that will be affixed to the trail markers rather than the placards.
- **City wide Park Signage Inventory Update** – This month’s meeting was canceled and rescheduled for June.
- **Agua Amarga Reserve Encroachments (Joel)** – Discussion was continued.
- **Vista del Norte/Crestridge Project Trail Connection** – Ara and Danielle are working to see that the trail connection proposed by the developer aligns with the actual trail.
- **GIS overlays:** The following GIS layers will be completed by a summer intern
 - **Archaeology site**
 - **Port-o-potties**
- **“No Access” signs along PVDS at Archery Club** - Ara is working with Chris on creating the sign language

Recreation and Parks Topics

- **Enforcement Issues** - The team briefly reviewed the ranger hotline report. Rangers continue to conduct night patrols to target afterhours use.
- **Interpretive Programs**
 - **Mountain Bike Safety/Skills/Etiquette Workshop** – Katie continues to work on trail use safety and etiquette workshops to include all trail user groups, and will explore partnering with LA CORBA who routinely conducts similar workshops.
 - **Public Hike to Vanderlip Property** – Katie reviewed this public hike
 - **Junior Ranger Program** – The team reviewed the schedule for the next few months.
 - **Night Hikes** – The night hikes will resume in November 2014.
