FILMING ACTIVITY ON CITY STREETS ON MONDAY, JUNE 23RD

Motorists, bicyclists and residents should be aware that there is filming activity scheduled on Palos Verdes Drive South, Palos Verdes Drive West and Hawthorne Boulevard on Monday, June 23rd. A Mitsubishi commercial will be filming on these City streets and will be using Trump National Golf Club for the production's "base camp" and cast/crew parking location. Cast and crew will begin arriving and setting up at the "base camp" at 8:00 AM, but filming activity in the public right-of-way will not begin until 9:30 AM. The shoot should be complete at all locations by 3:00 PM.

For this commercial shoot, production vehicles and equipment will be using the vacant residential lots near the Trump National clubhouse for staging and parking. Los Angeles County Sheriff's deputies will be providing intermittent traffic control during filming on the City's streets, which will involve "car to car" shots with a camera car and a picture car. The City's Public Works Department will also be issuing an encroachment permit for this commercial shoot. Motorists and bicyclists should expect minor delays on the affected roadways between 9:30 AM and 3:00 PM. However, please note that no filming activity will be permitted on Palos Verdes Drive South within the active Portuguese Bend landslide area.

STATUS OF BANKING TRANSITION

Finance Staff has been diligently working to complete the City's banking services transition to Bank of the West (BOW). The process is moving along well, and our current status follows.

- All counter and mailed-in receipts are now being deposited into the BOW account.
- All electronic depositors (e.g. state, county, utility companies, etc.) have received a letter from the City with new deposit instructions. No electronic deposits have been received in the BOW account yet, but Staff will continue to monitor and follow up with the depositors.
- The City's check-writing software has been re-programmed, test checks have been printed, and we are currently waiting for the green light from BOW that the test checks are successful. Staff anticipates that the City will begin issuing accounts payable checks on the BOW account beginning July 1st.
- The June 20th payroll and associated payroll taxes will be debited from the BOW account.
- ACH template and direct debit transactions (e.g. CalPERS, postal machine, California Board of Equalization, etc.) have been set-up.
- Key Finance Department staff will be trained on June 19th for online inquiry and limited transactional capability such as stop-payment.

The City's Bank of America account will remain open until the last accounts payable checks have cleared, and all electronic depositors have completed the process to change the City's deposit information in their own systems. Staff will advise the City Council when the City is ready to close its Bank of America account.

STATUS OF ANONYMOUS FRAUD, WASTE AND ABUSE HOTLINE

The City Council directed Staff to proceed with development of a draft policy and a request for proposal ("RFP") for establishing an Anonymous Fraud, Waste and Abuse Hotline at its meeting on June 3, 2014. The draft policy is in process and Staff anticipates that the RFP will be released as early as next week. Once the RFP deadline is established, Staff will coordinate a meeting with the Audit Sub-committee of the City Council and the independent auditors to review the proposals received and provide an overview of the draft policy and processes.

MARYMOUNT UNIVERSITY – NEIGHBORHOOD ADVISORY COMMITTEE SPRING 2014 TERM MEETING (JUNE 12, 2014)

Condition No. 138 of the University's CUP established a Neighborhood Advisory Committee comprised of members from the surrounding five homeowners associations and two at-large representatives who live within 3,000 feet of the campus. The NAC is tasked to meet once during the fall term and once during the spring term, to review any campus operational and neighborhood concerns. The NAC meeting for the Spring 2014 term was held on June 12, 2014 at the Marymount campus and followed an agenda (attached) prepared by City Staff based on input from Committee representatives. The meeting was facilitated by City Staff (Ara Mihranian) and was attended by the following individuals:

Below is a summary of the discussion based on the agenda topics:

East Parking Lot

Mr. Reeves reported that since the end of the recent spring term, the east parking lot has been closed and the parking lot lights completely shut off, noting that the parking lot will not

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reopen until the beginning of the fall 2014 term in August. According to Mr. Reeves, Marymount received bids on the required screening fence installation from various contractors that seemed to be inflated in price, so Marymount reopened the bid process and signed an agreement with a contractor that afternoon. Marymount hopes to have the fence installed within the next 3 to 4 weeks and installation will take approximately 1 week to complete. It was agreed that Marymount would provide Mr. Mihranian the fence specifications for transmittal to the Committee members. In regards to the light shields, they are currently being fabricated by a vendor in San Pedro and will be installed within two weeks. Additionally, Marymount is in the process of preparing a plant palette for the 80-foot landscape buffer that will be reviewed by City Staff, as well as Mr. Harris who lives adjacent to the landscape buffer, to ensure the selected plants will not impair views from Mr. Harris' property.

Mr. Reeves reported that the "no smoking," "no littering," and "parking lot hours" signs have been installed, and that new trash receptacles have also been installed throughout the parking lot.

In response, Mr. Mihranian explained that pursuant to the Council adopted Conditions of Approval, the required improvements to the East Parking Lot are to be installed by June 15, 2014 and that Staff would be conducting a site visit on June 16th to assess condition compliance.

Staff conducted a site visit on Monday, June 16th and found that some of the required improvements to the East Parking Lot have not been completed and therefore determined that Marymount is in violation of its Conditional Use Permit and will remain so until condition compliance has been met. Mr. Reeves was verbally made aware of this determination during the June 16th site visit and will be receiving written notification.

GROW Project

Pursuant to the Council's determination at its April 1st meeting, Mr. Reeves reported that the campus garden, known as the GROW Project, is being relocated outside the 80-foot landscape buffer zone and will be contained within the site fencing once installed.

Campus Lighting

Mr. Reeves informed the Committee that existing lighting throughout the campus was refitted with LED light bulbs approximately two years ago.

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Athletic Field Reconfiguration Project

Mr. Reeves explained that talks between Marymount and the PVPUSD for the use of the athletic field at Miraleste Intermediate School continue and both parties hope to come to an agreement soon for the use of the existing school field for a period of one year. He added that Marymount will soon be submitting additional information to the City on the field netting and will soon be asking the City to resume processing its Conditional Use Permit application.

Uses on Campus for Sumer 2014

Mr. Reeves reported that a summer youth day camp occurs during the week between 9am and 3pm, as well as English language classes between 8am and 5pm Monday through Friday.

Enrollment Numbers for Spring 2014 and Fall 2014

Mr. Reeves noted that the enrollment number for the Spring 2014 term has not changed from what was reported to the City and that the Fall 2014 enrollment has not been determined yet but is projected to be similar to last year. Discussion ensued between Committee members on the enrollment reports to the City required by the Conditions of Approval and the Mitigation Measures.

May 2014 Graduation

Mr. Reeves reported that 137 students graduated in May, of which approximately 80 students received bachelor degrees. He added that no master degrees have been issued yet and that this program is still too new to have students graduating with such a degree.

Southern Slope

Committee members expressed a concern with the City's placement of sandbags along the drainage ditch paralleling Palos Verdes Drive East and wanted to know when they would be removed and what the long term solution is. Mr. Mihranian reported that the sand bags are placed by the City along the drainage ditch during the rainy season to prevent upslope slough material from clogging the City's drainage inlets. He added that Public Works was made aware of the Community's concern and request to remove the sandbags during the dry season. Mr. Reeves added that Marymount is working with the City to address this issue on a long term basis which may include landscaping, installing a slough wall or a combination of both.

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Detention Basin Vandalism

Committee members commended Marymount for the quick response to removing graffiti from its detention basin and asked if Marymount has increased its enforcement of this area. It was agreed that Mr. Reeves should be put in contact with Sergeant Rozas from the Sheriff's Department to improve campus and community security.

Opening NAC Meeting to the General Public

Some Committee members requested Marymount consider opening the meeting to members of the public similar to formats used at other universities. Mr. Reeves expressed a preference in maintaining the current meeting format for the time being in that the informal setting made for productive discussions. Mr. Mihranian requested that each HOA representative disseminate the information gleaned from the meeting to the members of their respective HOA members.

Closing Remarks

The next NAC meeting will be scheduled in November for the fall 2014 term.

June 5, 2014 Meeting Minutes

Attendance

Action Items from May 2014 Meeting

- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up** - Ara reported that draft license agreement language is being reviewed by the City Attorney and that he was waiting for her comments before contacting the respective property owners.
- **Signs:**
 - **Installation of “no trail access” signs near Vanderlip Drive** – Ara will provide Chris with the template language for similar signs used in the Preserve. Andrea added that members of the Portuguese Bend Community Association would like to meet with Staff to discuss signage. Andrea will schedule a meeting and Ara will attend.
- **East Sacred Cove Trail Closure (PVPLC)** – Danielle reported that the PVPLC will be adding signage and will be physically closing this trail within the coming week.
- **Vicente Bluffs Parking Lot Signs and Unauthorized Trails** – After further discussion on this matter, it was agreed a separate meeting between the City and the PVPLC should occur to consider creating a viewing node and to dig out the existing unauthorized trail. In the interim, the City will create a handout for the Volunteer Trail Watch members to distribute directing the public to authorized beach access trails (Pelican Cove, Lunada Bay, and Christmas Tree Cove) within the immediate area.
- **Rim Trail Closure of Duplicate Trails** – The PVPLC is preparing a plan to close the duplicate trails.
- **Installing Bike Barricades at Landslide Scarp Trail** – After further discussion, the team agreed not to install the barricade and instead will continue to post “no bicycle” signs and continue to give this area priority enforcement. The team agreed that this intersection would benefit from design improvements.

PVPLC Topics

- **Preserve Decal Replacement** – The PVPLC intends to finish this task within the coming month.
- **Volunteer Trail Watch Update** - Danielle reported that there are 34 members and the PVPLC anticipates having another training session this fall. PVPLC will prepare monthly written VTW reports to share at future team meetings. Superintendent Ortiz requested assistance with graffiti removal in the Preserve, and will distribute graffiti removal supplies to VTW volunteers and part-time City staff.
- **Rapid Response Team** – It was reported that this volunteer group continues assisting the PVPLC in closing spur trails.
- **Ladera Linda / Forrestal Unauthorized Bike Trails**- Ranger Jewel Johnson clarified that the unauthorized trails are used primarily by neighborhood dog walkers. PVPLC will work to close the unauthorized trails, and rangers will continue to monitor area.
- **Grant Contracts / Agreements**
 - **Los Angeles County** – Danielle reported that the grant paperwork has been signed for this \$80,000 grant for trail delineation and wayfinding throughout the Preserve.
 - **HCF Grant Contracts** – Joel informed the team that this grant requires a deed restriction be recorded against the properties within the Preserve that are benefiting from the grant, as described in the submitted application, and that the City Attorney is reviewing the deed restriction to ensure that the City will still be able to complete its Public Work’s projects listed in the NCCP.

City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison Litigation Update** – Joel reported that the funds received from the settlement agreement will be deposited into the City’s habitat re-vegetation fund as the City Council agreed in 2011. Furthermore, Joel asked the PVPLC to begin preparing the proposed habitat restoration plan for the burn area.

Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project Update** – Chris provided the team with an update and stated that the project is nearly complete.
- **Fuel Modification Update** – Chris indicated that the City’s fuel modification is nearly complete.
- **Preserve Gate Locks** – Chris received the specifications and will be sending it to the team to review before testing his new lock at Portuguese Bend.

- **Smuggler's Cove trail gate opening for bicyclists** – this task was completed.

RPV Planning Topics

- **RPV / PVPLC Public Forum May 28, 2014 Follow-up** – the team recapped the topics discussed at the Public Forum meeting including spur trails at Del Cerro, Toyon Trail, clarification on equestrian parking, and posting the VTW reports on the City's website.
- **NCCP/IA (Joel)** - Joel reported that conversations with the wildlife agencies continue.
- **Conservation Easement Update** – The language has been approved by the City and the PVPLC and now awaits Agency approval.
- **Malaga Canyon Reserve Update** – As previously reported, the PVPLC management of this open space will begin after conservation easements are recorded on the property.
- **Abalone Cove Park Improvement Grant Update** - Ara reported that construction is scheduled to begin any day now and that a portion of the parking lot will be closed to accommodate the staging area and project construction.
- **California Coastal Trail Update**
 - **Map Boards and Interpretive Panels** – Ara reported that the panels have been delivered to the fabricator and should be installed in a few weeks.
 - **CCT trail markers in Preserve** - Ara is coordinating with Danielle on the installation of the CCT decals on the Preserve trail markers. Ara is coordinating with Public Works to have the CCT insignia decals produced that will be affixed to the trail markers rather than the placards. He also added that he noticed some have the placards have come off the trail markers and that another adhesive should be used to secure the placards to the trail markers.
- **City wide Park Signage Inventory Update** – This month's meeting was canceled and the meetings will resume in July. Ara reported that the new Park Rules signs were ordered.
- **Agua Amarga Reserve Encroachments (Joel)** – This task is to be completed by a future intern.
