### 2014 MID-YEAR FILM PERMIT ACTIVITY SUMMARY

Below is a table summarizing film permit activity in Rancho Palos Verdes during the first half of the 2014 calendar year. The City continues to experience a great deal of interest in location filming, particularly at the Portuguese Bend Club, Terranea Resort and Trump National Golf Club. Several major feature films, national television shows and commercial were shot in the City during the first half of this year. To date, Staff has issued twenty-seven (27) permits for forty-two (42) shooting days in the City during the first and second quarters of 2014, and collected more than \$43,000 in related film permit and business license fees.

The table below compares film permit activity in the first half of 2014 to the full year of 2013. There was a substantial increase in the number of permits and shooting days during the first quarter of 2014, and total permit revenue to date is nearly equal to the amount collected for the entire year of 2013. Although the average length of a film shoot is down as compared to 2013, average fees per-day and per-shoot have increased in the first half of 2014.

## Best Suburbs of Los Angeles

The sprawling City of Angels is the epicenter of the entertainment industry, a creative capital and one of the most diverse cities in the nation. Those living in the area know the city's diversity firsthand and can attest to the fact that each suburb and neighborhood in the area is a distinct, unique place to live.

Many urban centers struggle with prohibitively expensive housing and developing infrastructure to keep up with city growth. Los Angeles benefits from its diversity—it consists of hundreds of distinct neighborhoods and suburbs, allowing residents to find a community that fits their needs.

NerdWallet analyzed the Los Angeles area to see which Los Angeles suburbs performed the best across various economic, social and quality of life categories.

We included all cities in the Los Angeles-Long Beach Combined Statistical Area, which includes all cities, CDP's and towns in Los Angeles, Orange, Ventura, Riverside and San Bernardino counties that were classified as a "place" by the U.S. Census. We excluded cities that were more than an hour's drive from LA. Over 150 cities were included in this analysis.

### Most Diverse Suburbs

Los Angeles is known for its ethnic diversity. We examined which suburbs have closest to an even breakdown between the four largest ethnic groups—white, black, Hispanic/Latino and Asian.

### Highest-Earning

To find the highest-earning cities, we looked at the median income for workers as well as households. To mitigate against cities with a high rate of income inequality, we included poverty rate as well to ensure that the majority of residents have an adequate standard of living.

#### 1. La Cañada Flintridge

With a median household income of almost \$150,000 per year and an extremely low poverty rate of only 1.9%, La Cañada Flintridge earned the number one spot on our list. La Cañada Unified School District is regarded as one of the best in the state, earning an API of 942. The city also houses NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (although its mailing address is in Pasadena).

## Where Women Make More Than Men

To assess the Los Angeles suburbs where women make more than men, we compared male and female median incomes for year-round, full-time workers. We used incomes for year-round, full-time workers to ensure that we were not including part-time or seasonal workers in the analysis.

### 1. Inglewood

Inglewood's diverse economy has a strong healthcare presence, with the Centinela Hospital Medical Center and Daniel Freeman Memorial Hospital in the heart of the city. The city is very ethnically diverse as well. Women earn, on average, 11.6% more than males.

## Fastest-Growing

Which suburbs of Los Angeles are thriving and attracting new residents? We looked at population growth over a two-year period.

### 1. Yorba Linda

Located in Northeastern Orange County, Yorba Linda is about 40 miles from Los Angeles. The city has grown by 3.6% over a two-year period. Yorba Linda's economy is strong in healthcare and medical technology. Popular sites in the city include a city-owned golf course and the Richard Nixon Library, located here because Yorba Linda is Nixon's birthplace.

## Most Educated

Which suburbs of LA boast the most educated residents? Because less than one-third of Americans hold a bachelor's degree, we weighted high school graduation more heavily at 75% of the overall score.

### 1. Manhattan Beach

Manhattan Beach has a top-performing school district, which is likely a large reason for the city's large percentage of high school graduates (97.1%). The area also has expensive housing—a study showed that Manhattan Beach had more million-dollar home sales in 2013 than any other California city. This coastal city offers beaches and bike paths, and surfing, swimming and volleyball are popular recreational activities there.

Data was obtained from the U.S. Census. We weighted the percentage with a high school diploma or higher at 75% and the percentage with a bachelor's degree at 25% to obtain the overall score.

### Smallest Gender Pay Gap

Women earn, on average, 77 cents for every dollar that their male counterparts earn, and this number is even lower for women of color. We compared male and female median incomes for year-round, full-time workers to ensure that we were not including part-time or seasonal workers in the analysis. The cities below had the smallest gender pay gap.

#### 1. La Habra

La Habra's gender pay gap is only .4%, well below the U.S. average of 23%. Residents also enjoy the access to nature La Habra provides. The city is within an hour of beaches and mountains, and the city is home to 20 parks.

### Highest Healthcare Coverage

Across the United States, 48 million Americans, around 15% of the population, lack health insurance. Many Los Angeles suburbs show much higher rates of health insurance coverage than other cities.

#### 1. Rancho Palos Verdes

An affluent suburb of Los Angeles, Rancho Palos Verdes offers access to the beautiful Palos Verdes Hills and expansive views of the Pacific Ocean. The Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District is known for its excellence, and the district earned an API of 925 in 2013.

#### **ADDITIONAL TRASH COLLECTION AT ABALONE COVE**

Staff has scheduled more frequent servicing of the trash bins at the Abalone Cove Shoreline Park and beach area. Additionally, additional trash cans have been placed at the beach and more are ordered. These increased efforts are due to the higher than normal demand and usage of the park and beach area during the summer months. Staff's adjustment of our maintenance efforts should help keep the shoreline and park areas clean.

#### **SCE WORK ON PVDS & SEACOVE**

Please be advised that starting Wednesday, 7/9/14, a SCE contractor, WA Rasic, will be upgrading an existing vault on PV Drive South at Seacove in the right west bound lane just at the Sanitation district pump station. The right west bound lane will be closed daily from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM Monday through Friday for about a month long project.

#### **GEARING UP FOR VOLUNTEER DAY**

Public Works staff is assisting Recreation and Parks Department in preparation of our City's first Volunteer Day. On July 26<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m.-noon, volunteers will be weeding, improving trails, and beautifying areas at Lower Hesse Park. Come get dirty and have some fun with us!

**RPV Residents-** There are various discounts available to EDCO and UWS residential customers. Customers 65 and older are eligible for a 10% senior citizen discount. If you have not applied yet, now is the time. If you already receive a senior discount, no need to reapply. If you pay for trash services a year in advance (discount available only with July invoice) you are eligible for a 5% annual pre-payment discount. Low-income customers may qualify for 5% discount (same household income criteria as public utilities/CARE). Additionally, both haulers offer backyard service at a nominal additional monthly fee. If you are frequently out of town, have physical restrictions, and/or have a steep or long driveway and find it difficult to move the trash and recycling carts, call your hauler and inquire about their backyard service.

**CITY TREE REMOVAL FOR VIEW RESTORATION ON EDDINGHILL AND LOMO DRIVES**

The City's Municipal Code (Section 17.76.100) provides residents the ability to request, through the City Tree Review Permit (CTRP) application, that the City remove or trim City-owned trees whenever City trees create a significant view impairment from a residential property. On April 15, 2014, a property owner on Leah Circle filed a CTRP application with the City requesting to restore an ocean and Channel Island view that is impaired by City trees located in the City's right-of-way on Eddinghill Drive and Lomo Drive.

After conducting a site visit to assess the view impairment, Staff determined that twelve (12) City trees significantly impair the applicant's primary view as observed from the living room. As such, the Community Development Director will be approving this week a CTRP application allowing the City to remove and replace twelve (12) City-owned trees on Eddinghill Drive and Lomo Drive.

As a requirement of the permit approval process, City Staff will be mailing the Staff Report and *Preliminary* Notice of Decision (Notice) to surrounding property owners and to the local HOA President. City Staff will also attach the Notice to the subject trees. The Notice provides a seven (7) day comment period allowing residents the ability to submit written comments to City Staff concerning the recommended tree removals. Since numerous mature street trees are involved, Staff anticipates that some notified residents will request that the trees be trimmed rather than be removed. It will be noted in the Staff Report that according to the trimming eligibility criteria provided in the City's Municipal Code, since the trees are causing damage to improvements in the public right-of-way they are not eligible to be trimmed.

After the comment period expires, the Community Development Director will consider and address the received comments and render a Final Notice of Decision. The Final Notice of




On or after October 1, 2014, "TVBe" will move from channel 1798 to channel 1794 in the FiOS® TV Channel Lineup.



### Giant Kelp Returns to Palos Verdes Restoration Sites

Giant kelp is making a comeback on the Palos Verdes Shelf thanks to MSRP, scientific divers with [The Bay Foundation](#) and Los Angeles Coastkeeper, commercial urchin divers, and many volunteers. Since last July, divers have been removing an overpopulation of urchins from “urchin barrens” where kelp forests do not have a chance to grow. These urchins are undernourished and will eat any kelp plant or alga that settles on the seafloor. In some areas, biologists were finding 300 urchins per square meter. The goal is to reduce these numbers to less than two urchins per square meter (see maps). So far divers have removed over one million urchins!

Already, giant kelp as tall as 25 feet is extending towards the surface of the ocean in areas that have been cleared of urchins. These dramatic results are a testament to how simple it can be to restore a kelp forest if ecosystem balance is achieved.

Kelp forest restoration will benefit many important invertebrate and fish species. One marine species in particular, abalone, have critically low numbers because of overharvesting, disease, and a lack of quality habitat. This project will provide one of the necessary stepping stones for the recovery of abalone species. The presence of abalone is also an indicator of a healthy kelp forest ecosystem. Scientists plan to monitor the restored sites to know how many fish, invertebrates, and kelp plants are returning.
