PONTE VISTA PROJECT UPDATE

On July 11, 2014, Staff received the attached e-mail update regarding the *Ponte Vista* project at the former San Pedro Navy housing complex on Western Avenue. Demolition and site grading are expected to continue through the summer. Nearby residents are encouraged to contact Elizabeth Brazil or Sarojini Lall of the *Ponte Vista* Community Outreach Team with project questions and/or construction-related complaints at info@pontevista.com or (310) 241-0699.

Staff will continue to provide periodic updates on the status of this project in future Weekly Administrative Reports.

PEAFOWL SURVEY SAYS

No questions about peafowl income levels or number of dependents were included, but Chino-based Animal Pest Management Services did conduct a two-day census of peafowl in the City on Thursday, June 5 and Friday, June 6. Animal Pest Management Services is experienced in this field, having regularly performed peafowl censuses for other cities including Palos Verdes Estates. Animal Pest Management previously conducted two 2-day censuses in Rancho Palos Verdes in November 2011 and April 2012.

The June 2014 census focused on five Rancho Palos Verdes neighborhoods: Portuguese Bend, Vista Grande, Crestridge, Sunnyside Ridge, and Grandview. The first four areas were also studied in Rancho Palos Verdes' 2011-2012 peafowl censuses, while Grandview was added because of a number of recent reports/complaints received by staff. The Monte Verde area was removed from the list, due to the fact that only three peafowl were counted there in the 2011/12 censuses and staff has not received any reports since that time. The highest peafowl total observed on either of the census days was selected as the total for each of the five locations.

Overall, there was a decrease of 37 peafowl from 2011-12 to 2014, a 23% reduction. Compared to 2011-12 census totals, peafowl populations are down 26% in Portuguese Bend, 8% in Vista Grande, 37% in Crestridge, and 24% in Sunnyside Ridge.

*Increase/decrease columns do not include Monte Verde and Grandview totals because those areas were not included in both the 2011-12 and 2014 censuses.

Due to the overall 23% decrease in peafowl numbers from 2012 to 2014, as well as decreases in all four area that were studied in both the 2011/12 and June 2014 censuses, staff is not recommending City-sponsored trapping at this time.

Staff also did not recommend trapping after the 2011-12 censuses which demonstrated an overall 21% decrease in population compared to the prior 2008 Census total. Comparatively, the 2008 census demonstrated a 53% increase from the first census that was conducted in 2000. Based on those findings, Council authorized staff to implement a trap and relocate program in Vista Grande which resulted in the relocation of 71 peafowl in 2009.

It is important to note that the 2011-12 censuses consisted of two 2-day observations while the April 2014 census consisted of a single 2-day observation. To ensure a consistent comparison, staff intends to schedule a second census in September or October 2014 which is the time frame recommended by Animal Pest Management Services. Based upon the results of that census, Staff may bring forward a recommendation for targeted trapping and re-location of peafowl for Council consideration.

In the meantime, staff is referring residents to Mike Maxcy, who performed the peafowl trapping and relocation for the City in 2009. Mr. Maxcy has been willing to continue to offer his services to individual property owners who wish to trap and remove individual peafowl. Trapping is limited to the individual's private property and is at their expense.

Peafowl-related issues, which were previously overseen by the City's Manager's Office, are now being handled by Code Enforcement, which is responsible for all other animal control issues. City Councilmembers should contact Code Enforcement Officer Daniel Pitts at 310-544-5233 with any questions or contact Community Development Director Joel Rojas to have this issue placed on a future City Council agenda.

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Hello Friends,

Since Councilmember Buscaino kicked off demolition at the Ponte Vista groundbreaking on May 8, work has quickly gotten underway to demolish the remaining houses and structures. To date, nearly all the houses have been removed and the development team anticipates that demolition of the structures should be complete by August.

A demolition project of this scale requires careful oversight, and one of the main concerns of the construction team has been managing dust on the site. As you drive or walk by you may notice large hoses and water trucks spraying water to control any potential dust during demolition.

Once the structures are demolished, the development team will begin demolition of the existing roadway system and begin grading the site. The concrete and asphalt from the existing roads and sidewalks will be crushed, stored and re-used in the new Ponte Vista, saving tons of waste from going to the landfill.

The grading plans do not call for the importation of dirt. Rather, the site will use existing dirt to "balance" the site. This will significantly reduce hauling to and from Ponte Vista. The next

phase of demolition will also include removal of the obsolete in-ground infrastructure, such as old pipes.

As always, the highest priority of the project team is safety-the safety of our on-site crew and our neighbors. A lot of heavy demolition work is currently taking place at the site and as construction begins, safety will remain our top priority.

RE: Peafowl Census Monitoring – June 2014

Dear Mr. Waters:

Animal Pest Management Services, Inc. performed a two (2) day peafowl census on June 5 and 6, 2014 in designated areas in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, specifically Crestridge, Grandview, Portuguese Bend, Sunnyside Ridge and Vista Grande.

The census was performed in the early morning hours at sunrise. The peafowl were counted as they roosted in the trees, on top of roofs and along the street. In order to avoid duplicate counting of the peafowl, as soon as they left their original roosting location the counting stopped. The peafowl were observed roosting in the pine trees, sitting on roofs, walking along the streets and foraging on the lawns.

In each area of the city, there were streets that showed concentrated populations of peafowl. The streets listed below in the tables represent only the streets where peafowl were counted. The areas of highest concentrations were observed in the Portuguese Bend, Sunnyridge, and Vista Grande areas. The areas of highest population in Portuguese Bend were found on Sweetbay, and Tangerine/Lime Tree, and in the Vista Grande area, Trailriders showed the highest density of peafowl. The Sunnyridge area peafowl were spread out on Sunnyside Ridge, Headland, and Bronco.

The first trapping period, March – April, is the most optimal time as the peafowl are migrating in from the surrounding areas.

CALPERS INVESTMENT RETURNS

On Monday July 14th, CalPERS reported an 18.4% investment return for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2014. It should be noted that this is a preliminary estimate that may change slightly after records are finalized. CalPERS 2013-14 fiscal year investment performance will be calculated based upon audited financial statements and will be used to set the City's contribution rate in fiscal year 2016-17.

We have provided a history of CalPERS investment returns in the following chart. CalPERS assumes a 7.5% investment return when calculating employer contributions.




Balanced Budget






Challenges

- ▶ Public confidence in government is low
- ▶ Significant infrastructure needs
 - ▶ Dedicated fee for storm drain repairs sunsets in 2016
 - ▶ Insufficient dedicated funding for street repair, subsidies compete with other services for General Fund money
 - ▶ Landslide stabilization
 - ▶ Aged public facilities
 - ▶ At least \$28 million of infrastructure projects not funded
- ▶ Unfunded employee pension obligation
 - ▶ \$7.9 million market value at June 30, 2012



Solutions

- ▶ Public outreach
- ▶ Smart infrastructure planning
 - ▶ Obtain input from newly formed Infrastructure Management Advisory Committee
 - ▶ Prepare long-term Infrastructure Management Plan
 - Proactive projects are less expensive than Reactive projects
 - Looks for ways to bundle projects to improve economies of scale
 - ▶ Ask voters to extend storm drain user fee?

SAN RAMON PROJECT UPDATE

The San Ramon Project work continues this week with a newly added scope to improve storm drains along the switchbacks. Crews will be rehabilitating storm drain inlets and installing new pipe over the next couple of weeks. Traffic along the switchbacks will be impacted. Beginning Wednesday, July 16 through Friday August 1st, lane closures controlled by flagmen, should be expected between 8 AM and 4 PM. After that, intermittent lane closures should be expected through August 22nd. As always, motorists and cyclists are urged to exercise caution and obey all traffic signs and construction personnel for the safety of all concerned. A traffic advisory message was sent out by list serve and included on the City's Facebook page this week.
