CITY COMPLETES ACCEPTANCE OF DONATED LOT IN THE CHERRY HILL LANE AREA

Last October, Maureen T. Werner, the owner of a vacant lot in the active Portuguese Bend landslide area, contacted Staff to inquire about donating her 0.52-acre lot to the City. On November 19, 2013, the City Council conditionally accepted this offer, predicated upon the successful completion of several steps:

1. Planning Commission review of the consistency of the donation with the goals and policies of the City's General Plan;
2. Preparation of a Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment for the property showing no recognized environmental conditions (RECs); and,
3. Preparation of a Preliminary Title Report (PTR) showing no "clouds" or encumbrances on the title of the property.

The Planning Commission found the acceptance of the property consistent with the General Plan on December 10, 2013, and a "clean" Phase 1 report was issued by the City's environmental consultant on December 11, 2013. The City Attorney's Office commissioned a PTR for the property, which was completed on December 2, 2013. However, the PTR showed an unpaid lien on the property that had been recorded by the Portuguese Bend Community Association (PBCA) in 1994, prior to Mrs. Werner's acquisition of the property.

Staff contacted Mrs. Werner, who advised that the lien had been paid shortly after she acquired the property. Staff then made inquiries with PBCA regarding the status of the release of the lien. On January 23, 2014, PBCA acknowledged that the lien had been paid, and on April 11, 2014, PBCA recorded a lien release that was prepared by the City Attorney's Office. Staff obtained a "clean" PTR for the property on May 8, 2014, showing that the PBCA lien had been released. The purchase agreement and deeds were subsequently executed by both parties, escrow opened on May 22, 2014, and escrow closed to effectuate the transfer on July 18, 2014.

In November 2013, the City Council authorized spending \$8,100.00 to acquire this property, including a Phase 1 environmental site assessment, title report and escrow fees, and payment of past-due property taxes. Staff is pleased to report that the total cost of the acceptance of this donated property actually came to \$7,017.90 (see table below).

SALVATION ARMY TRAIL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Salvation Army Trail construction along Palos Verdes Drive South began on July 21st and is expected to be completed in early October. The proposed trail improvement is based on the City's Conceptual Trails Plan which identifies a continuous trail along Palos Verdes Drive South (PVDS) leading from the City Hall property extending eastward through the Salvation Army property and the adjacent Peninsula Pointe residential development and into the City's Nature Preserve.

The location of this public trail along PVDS will allow the trail users a view of the Rancho Palos Verdes coastline and Catalina Island. The viewing node, which will be located on the City property adjacent to the westerly edge of the Salvation Army property, will allow trail users to capture an even better view, given its high elevation relative to PVDS.

As needed for construction, one traffic lane will be closed on Palos Verdes Drive South between Albergo Court and west of Crestmont Lane from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Thank you for your patience with the inconvenience this may cause. SOLID WASTE SUBCOMMITTEE MEETING

LAWA'S PART 161 APPLICATION

Los Angeles International Airport (LAWA) submitted an application to the Federal Aviation Administration for an airport noise and access restriction at the Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). Currently, while the majority of aircrafts operating at LAX depart to the west (towards the ocean), on occasion, at the discretion of the pilot or the tower, a few aircrafts depart to the east causing severe noise disturbance to the surrounding cities. Of these easterly departures, a fraction of the flights fly over RPV during the hours when the City's residents are most sensitive to aircraft noise. The LAWA application seeks approval to adopt a new ordinance that would require all aircraft operators to comply with prevailing flows whenever LAX is in over-ocean or westerly operations from midnight to 6:30 a.m. Because of the benefits associated with limiting nighttime non-conforming departures would provide the City's residents, the attached letter, in support of LAWA's application on behalf of the City Council, was submitted as public correspondence (see attachment).

CITY'S NEW REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE LAX/COMMUNITY NOISE ROUNDTABLE

The City Council recently appointed Ms. Petra Schneider as the City's new representative on the LAX/Community Noise Roundtable with City Staff, So Kim, remaining as the alternative (see attached appointment letter). Ms. Schneider is a long-time resident who expressed to the City Council an interest in aircraft noise issues and serving the community. Congratulations, Ms. Schneider!

PV ART CENTER 5K RUN

On June 30th, the Palos Verdes Art Center submitted a Special Use Permit (SUP) application, requesting approval for a 5k run on Saturday, September 6th. The requested course of the 5k run would begin at the PV Art Center and follow Crenshaw Blvd. to the south into the City's Portuguese Bend Reserve (up to Eagle's Nest), then loop back to the

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PV Art Center. In consideration of the requested course, Staff expressed a concern to the applicant with potential impacts to the surrounding environment associated with the high volume of foot traffic, particularly on a Saturday morning, in the Preserve and requested that the applicant consider an alternate route. In response, the applicant submitted the a revised course route (see attachment) that begins at the PV Art Center and follows Crenshaw Blvd. to the south, then along Crest Rd. to the west, looping back to PV Art Center. The revised SUP is being reviewed by City Staff (including Public Works) with a Director's decision anticipated in mid-August.

**PLANNING COMMISSION APPROVAL OF GREEN HILLS MASTER PLAN CUP NO. 55
REVISION "E"**

The City originally granted Green Hills the approval of two temporary modular buildings to be used as temporary office space in 2005 for a period of two-years. Since then, the applicant has submitted numerous requests for time extensions, which were granted through approval hearings by the City Council with a final extension set to expire on December 7, 2014, at which time the modular buildings would have to be removed. The purpose of the Council's extensions were to allow the applicant enough time to either convert the temporary buildings into a permanent structure or construct a new permanent structure to accommodate the needed office space. Consistent with the City Council's intent, the applicant submitted a Conditional Use Permit revision on May 8th to allow an office addition to the existing administrative building. At last night's Planning Commission meeting, the Commission approved the applicant's request allowing the construction of office additions and covered walkway extensions, as well as the reconfiguration of the existing parking area to accommodate additional parking spaces. As part of the approval, the Planning Commission decision includes a condition of approval that allows the temporary modular buildings to remain on-site for a period of 18-months (January 22, 2016) or until the office additions are complete (Building Permit Final), whichever comes first. In the event construction of the addition is not completed within the 18-month period, a condition of approval requires the applicant to return to the Planning Commission prior to the January 22, 2016 deadline with a time extension request, at which time the Commission may consider extending the time period or requiring the removal of the temporary modular buildings.


Dear Mr. Byers:

On behalf of the City Council of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes (RPV), I would like to express the City's support for Los Angeles World Airport's (LAWA) Part 161 application, limiting nighttime non-conforming east departures from Los Angeles International Airport (LAX).

One of the long standing noise issues facing our City is aircraft overflights. Although majority of the aircraft operating at LAX depart to the west, on occasion, at the discretion of the pilot or the tower, few aircrafts depart to the east causing severe noise disturbance to the surrounding cities. Of these easterly departures, a fraction of the flights fly over RPV during the hours when the residents are most sensitive to aircraft noise. Any limitation or restriction to the easterly departures between the hours of midnight and 6:30 a.m. would mitigate the noise disturbance to our residents and provide better quality of life while having little or no impact on LAX operations. Because of the benefits that this restriction would provide to the residents, we urge the FAA to approve the LAWA Part 161 application.



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
