NATIONAL NIGHT OUT 2014 – EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE AND STAFF PARTICIPATION

National Night Out, “America’s Night Out Against Crime”, first began in 1984 as an effort to promote citizen involvement in crime prevention activities, police-community partnerships, neighborhood camaraderie and to send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. Although National Night Out (NNO) is primarily geared towards neighborhood watch groups, law enforcement agencies, state and regional crime prevention associations, our City thought it would be a great idea to include it’s emergency preparedness efforts in the mix. With that, on Tuesday night, August 5th, this year’s NNO, Diana Feinberg and Jennifer Bourdreau from the Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) members and City staff liaison Tracy Bonano toured four Rancho Palos Verdes neighborhood gatherings, including ones held on Oceanaire Drive, Warrior Drive, Marne Drive and Starstone Drive. During the course of the evening, Committee members and staff talked to participants about how individuals and families can be prepared for emergencies and/or disasters and emphasized a few ways to prepare for the additional element of crime that inevitably seeps into disastrous situations. In addition, takeaways were provided, such as the “How to Prepare for and Survive a Disaster in Rancho Palos Verdes,” glow sticks, survival blankets and hand sanitizer with the City’s Emergency Preparedness website address. Overall, the evening was a great success!

COMMENT PERIOD EXTENDED FOR LAUSD “SCHOOL UPGRADE PROGRAM” DRAFT PROGRAM EIR

As the City Council may recall, on July 2, 2014, we reported that the City had received the Notice of Availability (NOA) of the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report (DPEIR) for the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) “School Upgrade Program” (SUP). The DPEIR identified very few environmental impacts of the SUP that require mitigation, and no campus-specific impacts are identified. Nevertheless, those impacts that do require mitigation would all be significant and unavoidable, including:

- Construction-related air quality impacts;
- Degradation of the significance of historic resources;

- Construction-related noise impacts; and,
- Traffic impacts.

STATUS OF SB 556 (CORBETT)

Exactly a year ago, then-Mayor Brooks asked the City Council to direct Staff to prepare letters in opposition to Senate Bill No. 556 (SB 556). As the City Council may recall, SB 556, authored by Senator Ellen Corbett (D-East Bay), proposed to require that private contractors who provide services for public agencies include "conspicuous displays" of the disclosure "THE OPERATOR OF THIS VEHICLE IS NOT A GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEE" on agency vehicles and "NOT A GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEE" on employee uniforms (see attached Mayor's report of August 6, 2013). The actual effect of this bill, however, would have been to stigmatize private contractors in the eyes of the public. Opposition letters were subsequently sent to Senator Ted Lieu and Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi on August 7, 2013.

During the last few weeks of the FY 2012-13 legislative session, SB 556 was further amended in the full State Assembly to prohibit private contractors from displaying a public agency logo on vehicles or uniforms without an accompanying disclosure, which could be satisfied by a number of means, including the simple inclusion of the private contractor's logo on the vehicle or uniform. In addition, the previous font-size requirements for the disclosures were eliminated from the bill, as was its applicability to public transit services. Eventually, SB 556 was also modified to make it applicable only to the vehicles and uniforms of private contractors providing services "relating to public health or safety." However, on September 11, 2013, SB 556 was placed in the State Assembly's "inactive file," where it has languished ever since.

On August 5, 2014, the League of California Cities announced that SB 556 was expected to be removed from the inactive file and placed before the State Assembly again soon. According to the League:

[this] measure requires individuals and firms that perform contract work for public agencies to provide large letter markings on their uniforms and vehicles declaring that they are not governmental employees. This measure is in the process of being revised to supposedly narrow its scope and substitute Senator Alex Padilla (D-Pacoima) as principal author. Once the amendments are in print, the League will reevaluate the measure.

Staff will continue to monitor SB 556, and will report back to the City Council on its status in upcoming Weekly Administrative Reports.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Los Angeles Unified School District (District or LAUSD), as lead agency for the project, has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the School Upgrade Program (SUP, formerly called Districtwide Redevelopment Program) pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (California Public Resources Code [PRC], Division 13, Section 21000 et seq. [CEQA Statute] and the California Code of Regulations [CCR], Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, Section 15000 et seq. [CEQA Guidelines]). The purpose of this notice is to solicit comments regarding the content of the DEIR.

Agencies: The District requests your agency's comments on environmental information in the DEIR relevant to your statutory responsibilities in connection with the proposed program.

Organizations and Interested Parties: The District requests your comments regarding the environmental issues associated with the proposed program.

PROJECT TITLE: School Upgrade Program (SUP)

PROJECT LOCATION: The proposed SUP covers schools within the entire District, the second-largest public school district in the United States. The District covers 710 square miles and encompasses most of the city of Los Angeles, along with all or portions of 31 cities and unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The SUP is the next phase of the District's bond program to build, modernize, and repair school facilities to improve student health, safety, and educational quality. The SUP does not have specific phases; it is an ongoing program that will continue well into the future.

The SUP identifies overarching goals and principals, funding sources, and specific categories of need and spending targets. The purpose of the SUP is to reflect the intent, goals, and objectives of the four FSD programs: New School Construction Program, Repair and Modernization Program, Joint Use/Innovation Fund and Charter Facilities Program, Capital Improvement Program. Because of the extensive number of individual projects anticipated under the SUP, they have been grouped into four categories based on the amount and type of construction and on location of the project. Currently, site-specific projects at individual school campuses have not been identified.

- New Construction on New Property (adjacent to existing campus)
- New Construction on Existing Campus
- Modernization, Repair, Replacement, Upgrade, Remodel, Renovation, and Installation
- Operational and Other Campus Changes

SUP-related projects would include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Construction on an existing campus and/or property acquisition adjacent to an existing campus for a new classroom building, library/media center, performing arts, gymnasium, administration offices, stadium, athletic fields, restrooms, drop-off zones, parking, etc.
- Installation of temporary structures
- Safety, Earthquake, Emergency, Fire-Prevention (upgrade fire/life safety systems; replace pipes and plumbing system, air conditioning and ventilation filtration systems, etc.)
- Lead, Asbestos, and Other Code Compliance
- Special Education Career Transition Centers (renovate existing facilities)
- Library Upgrades (improvement and equipment for libraries and media centers)
- School Repair and Expansion (provision of furnishings and equipment, reopening closed schools, exterior repair and paint, repair and replace lockers, etc.)
- Computer and Communications (modernize classrooms, upgrades to telecommunications and video-teleconferencing systems, new hardware and software, etc.)
- Sustainable Schools (improve energy efficiency, water efficiency, and renewable energy)

- Early Childhood Education (renovate, repair, and create early education centers)
- Food Service (replace equipment, upgrade secondary school cafeterias, replace refrigeration systems, etc.)
- Temporary Classrooms (replace, upgrade, or relocate portable classrooms)

SUBJECT: SENATE BILL NO. 556 (CORBETT)

RECOMMENDATION

Take a formal City Council position opposing Senate Bill No. 556 (Corbett).

DISCUSSION

In February 2013, State Senator Ellen Corbett of San Leandro introduced Senate Bill No. 556 (SB 556). The ostensible purpose of the bill is to require that private contractors who provide services for public agencies include "conspicuous displays" of the disclosure "THE OPERATOR OF THIS VEHICLE IS NOT A GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEE" on agency vehicles and "NOT A GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEE" on employee uniforms. The actual effect of this bill, however, would be to stigmatize private contractors in the eyes of the public. In a July 18th editorial (attached), the *Sacramento Bee* stated that SB 556 would be "costly, unnecessary and meddlesome – a legislative solution in search of a problem." Closer to home, SB 556 would adversely affect our own Palos Verdes Peninsula Transit Authority (PVPTA), which uses private contractors in order to keep down costs and provide exceptional service to the Peninsula's senior citizens, school children and other residents and visitors.

I ask my City Council colleagues to join me—along with the League of California Cities, the California State Association of Counties, the California Special Districts Association and the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transit Authority—in opposing SB 556.

Editorial: A scarlet letter for private contractors?

Senate Bill 556 is another sad example of how legislative Democrats can't say no to their main benefactor, public employee unions, even at the expense of the voters they represent. This bill is costly, unnecessary and meddlesome – a legislative solution in search of a problem.

Authored by Sen. Ellen Corbett of San Leandro, SB 556 would require contract employees working for state or local governments to affix notices to their uniforms or vehicles that identify them as "not a government employee."

According to the Assembly Judiciary Committee analysis, Corbett thinks "this bill is needed to ensure that members of the public can visually distinguish between government employees and nongovernment employees who are increasingly subcontracted to perform services once exclusively the domain of true public employees."

We would be curious to know which members of the public are clamoring for more signage in their lives so they can distinguish between contractors and *true* public employees. Is there a petition drive we missed? Have there been mass rallies at the Capitol on this cause that have escaped our attention?

Clearly that's not the case. That leaves us little option but to conclude the intent of her bill is clear and simple: To stigmatize private contractors with a scarlet letter. The apparent intent is to make it more difficult for local governments to contract for services, even when it saves them money and improves efficiencies.

To be clear, this is strictly a *public* employee union ploy, with emphasis on public.

This bill would create a negative perception about union employees who happen to work for government but are not actually government employees. The Yolo County Transportation District and its nongovernment-but-unionized bus drivers are a perfect example.

The bill contains specific requirements for how agencies such as Yolo Transportation would have to add notices to district vehicles and uniforms of nongovernment employees, even down to the font size they would have to use. Yolo County Transportation, which opposes the bill, claims it would have to add notices 2 feet tall and 30 feet long on all of its Yolo buses.

Similar signage would be required on every bus, ambulance, garbage truck or other government vehicle in the state not driven by a government employee.

Despite opposition from the League of California Cities, California State Association of Counties, California Special Districts Association and a host of other local government organizations, the Corbett bill zipped out of the Senate on a largely party-line vote.

SB 556 again raises the disturbing question: Just how far are Democrats willing to go to stay in the good graces of public employee unions?

An act to add ~~Section 1771~~ to Title 18 (commencing with Section 3273) to Part 4 of Division 3 of the Civil Code, relating to agency.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 556, as amended, Corbett. Agency: ostensible: nongovernmental entities.

Existing law specifies the authority of agents in dealing with 3rd persons. Existing law states when an agency is ostensible for purposes of determining the authority of an agent. Existing law prohibits unfair methods of competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices undertaken by a person in a transaction intended to result or which results in the sale or lease of goods to any consumer.

This bill would prohibit a person, firm, corporation, or association that is a nongovernmental entity and contracts to perform labor or services for a public entity from displaying on a vehicle or uniform a seal, emblem, insignia, trade, brand name, or any other term, symbol, or content that reasonably could be interpreted as implying that the labor or services are being provided by employees of the public agency,

unless the vehicle or uniform conspicuously displays a disclosure, as specified.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no.
State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

PVDE AND MIRALESTE- BUSY WITH ROAD WORK

In anticipation of the first day of school on 8/25, Public Works' contractor is busy working on PVDE, focusing on the section between Miraleste Drive and Rockinghorse Road. The contractor should be placing crack fill between Miraleste and Rockinghorse on Saturday 8/9. The slurry sealing of that segment should start on 8/11 and will be take 3 days to complete. All walkways and asphalt curbs will be resurfaced on the first day. There will be a pilot car with flag men for all 3 days and there will be one lane from Miraleste to Rockinghorse. Delays should be expected.



There is a lot of work going on this week and next week in the school zone. The contractor has informed staff that 95% of the work will be complete in the school zone by the first day of school. All road widening, sidewalk work, crack fill and temporary striping should be completed before the first day of school in this area. Additionally, there is a meeting scheduled this week with the Miraleste Intermediate School principal to go over the schedule and to see if there are any concerns that need to be addressed. Finally, residents who front PV Drive East will receive notification (a door hanger) from the contractor prior to work.

TRASH COLLECTION ON PVDE

EDCO is working with City staff and the PVDE contractor to collect the trash, recycling and green waste early in the morning (around 7 am) in the affected work areas on Thursdays. This should help reduce traffic delays by keeping the collection trucks off of the segments that are being worked on. Staff appreciates EDCO's continued cooperation in this matter.

VOLUNTEER PROGRAM TOTALS FOR FIRST QUARTER

The Recreation and Parks Department, with lots of great support from the Public Works Department, has begun a Volunteer Program! Here are some highlights from our first quarter, which was April through June 2014.

- April 3rd-4th at Hesse Park: Eagle and Boy Scouts painted 9 grills and 34 picnic tables and benches.
- May 4th-5th at Hesse Park: Eagle and Boy Scouts prepared an herb garden for planting and prepared and planted an additional landscaping project.
- May 15th at Hesse Park: Volunteers and REACH participants, aided by staff, planted the herb garden in front of the Hesse Park Community Center which volunteers continue to maintain each week. The garden is used monthly for REACH cooking activities.
