5th ANNUAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS EXERCISE

On October 9th, the City conducted its 5th annual Emergency Preparedness Exercise. Employees participated in an evacuation drill of City Hall, followed by "A" & "B" Shifts taking turns running the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). This year's exercise was based on an "El Nino" Storm scenario and all EOC systems were tested. I'm proud to say that all staff members, volunteers, and exercise evaluators were fully engaged. As we do every year, we all learned a lot and took lots of notes for next year. Below are some pictures of our EOC in motion:





NEW DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL AT CREST AND HIGHRIDGE ROADS IN ROLLING HILLS ESTATES

In 2004, the City of Rolling Hills Estates granted development entitlements for a small retail/office building on the site of a former gasoline service station and commercial plant nursery at 5883 Crest Road (located at the northeast corner with Highridge Road). At the time, Staff monitored this proposal in the Border Issues Status Report. In the past decade, the property owner has been unsuccessful in developing the approved project.

In July 2013, the Rolling Hills Estates City Council and Planning Commission jointly conducted a "first look" review at a proposal to subdivide this 0.52-acre parcel and allow the development of four (4) residences (i.e., "patio homes"). Staff last reported on this "first look" review in the Weekly Administrative Report of October 9, 2013, when temporary framework "silhouettes" had been erected on the property. The property owner subsequently filed the necessary applications with the City of Rolling Hills Estates for the proposed project, including a General Plan Amendment, Zone Change, Zone Text Amendment, Tentative Parcel Map, Conditional Use Permit, Grading Permit, Neighborhood Compatibility Determination and Minor Deviation.

On October 10, 2014, the City received notification that a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) has been prepared for the proposed project (see attached Notice of Intent). The complete MND may be reviewed on-line at the following link:

The public comment period for the MND will end on Monday, November 24, 2014, and a public hearing before the Rolling Hills Estates Planning Commission is scheduled for 7:00 PM on Monday, December 1, 2014, at Rolling Hills Estates City Hall, 4045 Palos Verdes Drive North, Rolling Hills Estates, CA 90274. Staff intends to comment on the MND, and will follow up on this project in the bi-monthly Border Issues Status Report.

FOLLOW-UP REGARDING TAX SALE 2014A

As a result of the City Council's action at its August 19th meeting, Staff was directed to pursue the acquisition of two (2) tax-defaulted properties in the City: the Crownview Drive flag lot in Upper Miraleste Canyon (APN 7566-015-026) and the vacant lot at 37 Cherry Hill Lane in the active Portuguese Bend landslide area (APN 7572-004-001). Staff filed the necessary preliminary application to acquire these parcels on August 22, 2014, and received confirmation from the County on September 17, 2014, that the application was received timely.

The deadline by which property owners were required to pay the outstanding taxes to remove properties from the annual tax auction was Friday, October 17, 2014. Staff at the Treasurer & Tax Collector's (TTC) office has advised Staff that owner of the Crownview Drive flag lot (APN 7566-015-026) redeemed the property prior to the October 17th deadline, so the City will not be acquiring this property.

The vacant lot at 37 Cherry Hill Lane (APN 7572-004-001) was not redeemed prior to the October 17th deadline and was removed from the tax auction on October 20, 2014. As such, the City will be receiving a Chapter 8 Agreement to complete the acquisition of this property. Staff has also learned that the George F Canyon property (APN 7568-006-008), for which the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy filed a request to purchase, was not redeemed prior to the October 17th deadline and was also removed from the tax auction.

As the City Council may be aware, the County Board of Supervisors recently appointed County Treasurer Mark Saladino to the position of County Counsel. An interim County Treasurer, Joseph Kelly, has been appointed until a new, permanent Treasurer is selected by the Board of Supervisors. TTC Staff advises that the processing of all Chapter 8 Agreements will be suspended until the new Treasurer is appointed. This includes the agreements for 37 Cherry Hill Lane from this year's tax sale and 41 Cherry Hill Lane from last year's tax sale.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON EXECUTIVE CUSTOMER BRIEFING

On October 15, 2014, Staff attended a Southern California Edison (SCE) Executive Customer Briefing, held at the City of Gardena. SCE's new president Pedro Pizarro addressed a large group of local government officials, business owners and non-profit organizations from the South Bay. His comments focused on improving the reliability, environmental sensitivity and affordability of SCE's service. He also presented a brief video that emphasizes SCE's commitment to customer and employee safety, which may be viewed at <http://youtu.be/vNY5JfBga94>.

Of particular interest to attendees, President Pizarro stated that SCE is working to improve procedures for the scheduling and notification of planned outages, as well as expanding SCE's Infrastructure Investment Program to reduce the frequency of unplanned outages. He stated that the average length of outages experienced in the South Bay had decreased from 142 minutes/year in 2013 to 90 minutes/year in 2014. SCE has also created a smartphone app with real-time information about outages, compatible with both iOS and Android devices.

5833 CREST ROAD PROJECT (PA-25-14)

Date: October 9, 2014

Project Location: The project site is located at 5833 Crest Road in Rolling Hills Estates, Los Angeles County, California. The project site is bounded by Crest Road on the south, the Seaview Villas condominiums on the north and east, and Highridge Road on the west and consists of Assessor's Parcel No. 7575-003-095. The project site is located on the Redondo Beach, California, 7.5-minute US Geological Survey (USGS) topographic quadrangle. The site was formerly developed with a gasoline service station (1966-1971) and a commercial plant nursery (1972-2003) that have since been removed.

Project Description: The proposed project consists of the construction of four two-story, detached patio homes with a shared driveway, which connects to Highridge Road. The proposed homes would be four-bedroom/four-bath units, with approximately 3,295 square feet in floor area (2,880 livable square feet plus 415 square feet of garage space). All units would have a two-car garage and one additional guest parking space for a total of 12 off-street parking spaces. The lot size is 0.51-acre (22,366 square feet), with proposed total lot coverage of 33 percent.

The proposed project would require the following discretionary approvals from the City of Rolling Hills Estates:

- Grading application
- Zone Text Amendment for development standards for lot size in the Residential Planned Development (RPD) zone
- Minor deviation for lot coverage
- Tentative Parcel Map for a one lot subdivision
- Conditional Use Permit for a Residential Planned Development
- General Plan Amendment to change the land use designations from Neighborhood Commercial to High Density Residential
- Zone change from Commercial Limited (CL) to RPD
- Neighborhood Compatibility Determination for the construction of four single-family patio homes

Presence of the Site on Hazardous Waste-Related Lists: The project site is not included on any lists of hazardous waste sites enumerated pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the California Government Code. While not listed on such sites, the site was previously occupied by a gasoline service station and a commercial plant nursery that have since been removed. Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments have been prepared for site, which conclude that there are no recognized environmental conditions on the site.

Environmental Determination: The Initial Study/Environmental Checklist that has been prepared for the project recommends that the lead agency adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project.

Date, Time, and Location of Public Meeting: The City of Rolling Hills Estates has scheduled a Public Hearing before the Planning Commission on **December 1, 2014 at 7:00 p.m.** at the Rolling Hills Estates City Council Chambers, 4045 Palos Verdes Drive North, Rolling Hills Estates, CA, 90274. The project will also require a Public Hearing before the City of Rolling Hills Estates City Council at the conclusion of the Planning Commission Public Hearing at a date to be determined.

REQUEST FOR PERMIT PARKING – SEABLUFF HOA

In September 2013, staff received several requests to evaluate the merits of establishing permit parking on various streets in the Seabluff neighborhood, located to the east of Terranea Resort and south of Palos Verdes Drive South, to alleviate impacts associated with increased on-street parking. The request letters received believe the parking impacts were associated with employees, patrons and/or visitors to Terranea Resort, beach-goers and/or individuals interested in enjoying the local public trails.

The City's consulting traffic engineer conducted an engineering study to evaluate the merits of establishing permit parking and concluded that permit parking was appropriate to implement on some of the streets and that time-limited parking was appropriate on others so as not to prevent the public from accessing and enjoying public amenities such as the beach and trails.

Subsequently, staff met with representatives of Terranea to discuss the issue of resort employees parking on neighborhood streets. It was expressed at that meeting that the resort is taking measures to reduce employee parking in the neighborhoods and that a plan is being developed to address parking on a bigger-scale.

Lastly, in light of recent coastal activities, this matter has risen to the level of the Coastal Commission and on September 11, 2014, staff met with Coastal Commission staff to discuss preferential and/or time-limited parking in the coastal zone. Based on that meeting, Coastal Commission staff expressed their concern with establishing preferential and/or time-limited parking in the coastal zone and has stated that a coastal permit will be needed if the City moves forward with the permit parking application.


The Seabluff community is very anxious for the City to render a decision regarding their permit parking request. The public works department is working with the Community Development Department and the Coastal Commission staff members to move the coastal permit application forward and will keep the public apprised of the status as the process moves along.

An update will be presented to the Traffic Safety Committee at its next meeting scheduled for Monday, October 27, 2014.

PVDS LANDSLIDE DRAINAGE NEEDS REPAIRS AGAIN

It's that time of year again. The rainy season officially begins on October 15 each year. Accordingly, staff is busily working around town to ensure last minute repairs are completed and safeguard measures are put in place to mitigate known drainage issues. Grading and drainage work in the landslide to re-establish the drainage system to the ocean was completed last week. This project re-connected the 36" and 18" storm drain lines located to the south of Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide. Moving soil associated with the continuous landslide movement in the area south and east of the Cherryhill houses is an ongoing maintenance issue which results in the need to periodically adjust the stretched, separated and generally misaligned drainage pipes.

The photos below shows separated pipes and work being performed to reconnect the pipes.




SHREDDING EVENT POPULAR AND SUCCESSFUL

EDCO and the City's paper shredding event on Saturday, October 18, 2014 was a huge success. The start time was moved to 8 am to accommodate the early risers. However, cars were lined up as early as 7:20 am. Besides the earlier start time, the mulch giveaway and the electronics waste areas were moved to the overflow parking lot to reduce traffic congestion. A total of 14,000 Lbs. (7.00 tons) of paper was collected and shredded by two certified large shredding trucks "on site". A total of 502 vehicles were served. The electronic waste collection generated an estimated 4,500 Lbs. In addition, approximately 125 vehicles took advantage of the free mulch provided by EDCO, over 38,000 Lbs. (19 tons) were distributed. The temporary traffic control plan helped direct the cars entering and exiting City Hall and Hawthorne Boulevard. Staff and EDCO received numerous compliments from attendees about the efficiency of the event and the need for having such an event. Due to the popularity of the shredding events, Staff and EDCO management will start planning ahead and advertising the next (Spring) event. Staff thanks EDCO senior management for providing another useful and free service to the City residents, and to the EDCO staff for spending their Saturday morning in RPV serving our residents with a friendly smile.

2014 PALOS VERDES HALF-MARATHON, 10K & 5K RUN/WALK

On October 15, 2014, a Special Use Permit application was approved to stage the 2014 Palos Verdes Half-Marathon, 10K and 5K Run/Walk event at the Pelican Cove Parking Lot adjacent to the Terranea Resort on Saturday, November 15, 2014. The event will occur between 5:00am and 2:00pm, with set-up beginning as early as Friday at noon and clean-up ending at 3:00pm. Barricades for the required road closures will be set-up at 3:00 am.

Many lessons have been learned since this annual event began in 2011, and many operational changes, conditions, restrictions and requirements have been imposed to reduce traffic impacts, improve access in and out of the Terranea Resort for shuttles, and minimize delays for residents entering and leaving the residential neighborhoods along the race route on the seaward side of Palos Verdes Drive South. Of the over 1,500 public notices sent to property owners and businesses along the half marathon route, Staff received one response. Although a notice of decision was sent to the interested party, no appeal was filed during the appeal period and the approval is now final. Attached is a copy of the Notice of Decision and Conditions of Approval.

WESTERN AVENUE DESIGN GUIDELINES STEERING COMMITTEE

As the Council may recall, in 2013 the City of Rancho Palos Verdes completed the draft Western Avenue Corridor Vision Plan, a plan to improve the 2-mile segment of Western Avenue between Peck Park and Palos Verdes Drive South. Also in 2013, the City Council authorized Staff to file a joint grant application with the City of Los Angeles through the Southern California Association of Governments' (SCAG) "Sustainability Program" to obtain consultant services for the second phase of the Vision Plan, which includes development of design guidelines for the Western Avenue corridor. After submittal of the

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joint application, the City was successful in obtaining a grant for consultant services to embark upon the preparation of design guidelines. Whereas the initial Vision Plan focused on the portion of Western Avenue within the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, this next phase also includes the portions of Western Avenue that are within the City of Los Angeles. The intent of this next phase is to build on the prior work and put in place standards and guidelines that will shape future improvements along the Western Avenue right-of-way, as well as on adjacent private parcels. To ensure that the design guidelines meet the expectations and needs of the corridor's stakeholders and adjoining communities, a steering committee was formed. The steering committee includes Planning Commissioners Tomblin and Cruikshank; RPV resident and Western Avenue property owner, Joe Rich; and, resident and business representatives from San Pedro.

On October 22, 2014, the City hosted a kick-off meeting of the steering committee and introduced the goals of the Design Guidelines document. The consultant will be working closely with the Committee to develop and refine the design guidelines, which will be presented to the public at a workshop in early 2015. Development of the design guidelines document will take about 9 months, and is targeted for completion and presentation to the City Council in the June 2015.

PEAFOWL CENSUS UPDATE

Since 2000, the City has conducted a peafowl census at various locations to assess the peafowl population. Over the years, this population within the City has grown and expanded its territorial boundaries. While some residents enjoy the presence of peafowl in their neighborhoods, others have reported concerns with having peafowl in their neighborhood. Common complaints reported by residents include excessive fecal matter, property damage to roofs, cars, walkways, etc., street traffic disruption, decimated flower and vegetable gardens, noise and high birth rates.

In response to the census reports, the City has taken measures to educate the public on not feeding them or leaving food out that may draw them into various neighborhoods coupled with providing a private trapper resource to residents wanting to have these removed from their property.

The most recent documented census was conducted over a two-day period in June 2014, and focused on the following five neighborhoods because these have been historically the concentrated areas these birds have thrived: Portuguese Bend, Vista Grande, Crestridge, Sunnyside Ridge, and Grandview. The first four neighborhoods have been studied in past dating as far back as 2008. The Grandview neighborhood was added to the study area in

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2011 because of the high volume of activity reported to the City.

Based on the June 2014 Census, in summary, there was a 23% decrease in peafowl numbers reported between 2012 and 2014. Thus, trapping was not recommended at the time. However, the June 2014 census recommended that an additional census be conducted twice a year, or every six months because a slight increase was observed and predicted.

In response to the June 2014 recommendation, the City hired Animal Pest Management Services Inc., who conducted a census on October 20 and 21, 2014. Similar to the June 2014 census, the neighborhoods studied included: Portuguese Bend, Vista Grande, Crestridge, Sunnyside Ridge, and Grandview. Upon the submittal of this census report, City Staff will update the City Council on the findings and recommendations. Additionally, the City's website will be updated accordingly.

In the interim, for those residents who continue to be inconvenienced by peafowl on their property, Staff is referring these residents to Mike Maxcy, who has performed peafowl trapping and relocation for the City in 2009. Mr. Maxcy offers his services to individual property owners who wish to remove individual peafowl at their expense.

Peafowl-related issues, which were previously overseen by the City's Manager's office, are now being handled by Code Enforcement, which currently handles all other animal control issues.

CURRENT ACTION

The City conducted another census during the month of October 2014. The consultants focused on the same five areas as in June 2014: Portuguese Bend, Vista Grande, Crestridge, Sunnyside Ridge, and Grandview.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on September 16, 2014 the Community Development Director for the City of Rancho Palos Verdes **approved** a Special Use Permit to allow the staging of the 2014 Palos Verdes Half-Marathon, 10K and 5K Run/Walk on certain City streets and at the Pelican Cove parking lot adjacent to the Terranea Resort on Saturday, November 15, 2014 (Planning Case No. ZON2014-00304).

Event: 2014 Palos Verdes Half-Marathon, 10K & 5K Run/Walk (Saturday, November 15, 2014)

Applicant: Kiwanis Club of Rolling Hills Estates

Location: Pelican Cove Parking Lot, PV Drive South, PV Drive West, Via Vicente and Calle Entradero

Said permit is subject to the following conditions of approval:

1. Within fifteen (15) days of this approval, the applicant shall submit a statement in writing that they have read, understand and agree to all the conditions of approval listed below. Failure to provide said written statement shall render this approval null and void.
2. The Community Development Director and/or Public Works Director is authorized to make minor modifications to the approved preliminary plans or any of the conditions, if such modifications shall achieve substantially the same results as would strict compliance with said plans and conditions.
3. The abandonment or non-use of this approval after Saturday, November 15, 2014 shall terminate the approval and any privileges granted herein shall become null and void.
4. The 2014 Palos Verdes Half-Marathon, 10K and 5K event will be held on Saturday, November 15, 2014, between the hours of 5:00 AM and 2:00 PM. The Start/Finish area will be held within the entire Pelican Cove Parking Lot, which will be closed for preparation of the event at 12:00 PM on Friday, November 14, 2014. The entire Pelican Cove parking lot will re-open by no later than 3:00 PM on Saturday, November 15, 2014. The public parking lot adjacent to Calle Entradero (in the Oceanfront Estates tract) will also be closed to vehicular access between 5:00 AM and 11:00 AM, which shall re-open by not later than 11:00 AM on Saturday, November 15, 2014.

Hours of the event may not exceed the following times:

Friday, November 14, 2014:

12:00 PM to 6:00 PM – Set-up for Start/Finish at Pelican Cove parking lot and for Expo on portion of Terranea parking lot and arrival of overnight security.
Barricades can be delivered on November 14th at locations acceptable to the Public Works Director, no later than 8:00 PM.

Saturday, November 15, 2014:

3:00 AM - Barricade company begins to install traffic cones in preparation to closing the streets along the half-marathon route
4:00 AM - Arrival of shuttle buses at the approved parking locations and "no parking" signs shall be posted along course

5:00 AM - Traffic diverted and roads shall be closed for course set up, volunteers arrive, and parking lots shall be opened to participants
5:30 AM - Registration tables shall open
6:30 AM – Roads altered to allow 2-way vehicle traffic on the landward side of Palos Verdes Dr South and Palos Verdes Dr West. Residents on seaward side of Palos Verdes Drive will have restricted access in and out of neighborhood.
6:45 AM - Terranea Way closed to traffic
7:00 AM - Start of the Half-Marathon
7:30 AM - Staff of the 5K
8:00 AM - Terranea Resort entry will be opened to traffic and participants on the road between Terranea Wall and Narcissa Drive will be asked to run on the sidewalk.
10:00 AM - Course altered to open all roads to vehicle traffic. Any remaining participants will be asked to move to the sidewalk.
3:00 PM - All equipment shall be removed from the registration and Expo sites, and the entire Pelican Cove parking lot shall re-open to the general public

Any changes to the established schedule of the event shall be subject to further review and approval by the Community Development Director and Public Works Director.

5. After the event, the Start/Finish area and Expo area shall be restored completely to its pre-event condition. All trash, debris, and remnants of the event shall be removed from the site no later than 3:00 PM on Saturday, November 15, 2014. All signage for the event located off-site shall be removed no later than 3:00 PM on Saturday, November 15, 2014.
6. No temporary lighting of any kind is approved for this event, except for lighting at the registration area between 4:00 AM and daylight on Saturday, November 15, 2014.
7. The only outdoor amplified sound that shall occur during the event shall be from the stage in the event Expo area and at the Start/Finish line. Amplified sound and all sound equipment must be directed away from residential property and towards the ocean.
8. The applicant shall provide proof of a minimum of \$3,000,000.00 single limited liability insurance, to the satisfaction and approval of the City Attorney, prior to the end of the day on Thursday, November 6, 2014.
9. The applicant shall submit a certificate naming the City as additionally insured, to the satisfaction and approval of the City Attorney, on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014.
10. The applicant shall submit a signed and notarized Hold Harmless agreement covenant, to the satisfaction and approval of the City Attorney, on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014.
11. The applicant shall submit letters of event approval from the City of Palos Verdes Estates on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014.
12. The final Traffic Control Plan must be approved (stamped and signed) by the Public Works Director on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014.
13. The Los Angeles County Fire Department shall review and approve all staging areas for the marathon event, and proof of Fire Department approval shall be submitted to the City on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014.
14. Applicant shall mail notification letters to all Rancho Palos Verdes Homeowners Associations and businesses along the route, informing them of the upcoming event and potential traffic impacts on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014.

15. Applicant shall provide proof of ABC approval to conduct the beer garden beverage area on or before Thursday, November 6, 2014. Consumption of alcohol shall be limited to the tented beer garden area only.

SIGNS

16. Subject to review and approval by the Community Development Director and/or Public Works Director, by Friday, November 7, 2014, the applicant shall install temporary signs along the course at each intersection stating "2014 Palos Verdes Half Marathon Course, Expect Traffic Delays on 11/15/14 between 5:00 AM and 11:00 AM." Said signs shall be of size and color that will make them clearly visible to motorists.

17. Subject to review and approval by the Community Development Director and/or Public Works Director, the applicant shall install no earlier than 4:00 AM on Saturday, November 16, 2013 temporary signs on the barricades stating "RESIDENT PARKING ONLY, NO EVENT PARKING PERMITTED" at the following intersections: Via Rivera at Hawthorne Boulevard, Palos Verdes Drive West at Rue Beaupre, Palos Verdes Drive West at Berryhill Drive and Palos Verdes Drive South at Albero Court. Said signs shall be of size and color that will make them clearly visible to motorists. Said signs shall be removed by 3:00 PM on Saturday, November 15, 2014.

18. Per the approved Traffic Control Plan, the applicant must provide three (3) changeable message signs to be in place on or before Friday, November 7, 2013 stating "SPECIAL EVENT, NOVEMBER 15, 2014, BETWEEN 5 AM & 11 AM, EXPECT DELAYS." The changeable message signs shall be located at the following locations: one sign shall be placed in the dirt area on the north side of Palos Verdes Drive South, just west of Schooner Drive, facing westbound traffic; one sign shall be placed in the median of Palos Verdes Drive West, just north of Marguerite Drive, facing southbound traffic; and one sign shall be placed in the median of Hawthorne Boulevard, east of Palos Verdes Drive West, facing westbound traffic. Such changeable message signs shall be removed by noon on Sunday, November 16, 2014.

PARKING AND SECURITY PERSONNEL

19. Parking of vehicles for the event shall include the following permitted lots: the Salvation Army property (90 or more cars), Palos Verdes Interpretive Center (not more than 100 cars), Golden Cove Shopping Center (80 cars), and City Hall Civic Center (600 cars). Terranea Resort employees shall use the Coast Guard dirt lot. Shuttling will be only provided from the City Hall Civic Center parking lot. The Promenade on the Peninsula Parking Structure can be used as additional event parking and carpool parking, upon approval from property management submitted to the City prior to Thursday, November 6, 2014.

20. For parking at the City Hall Civic Center and the Palos Verdes Interpretive Center, the applicant shall obtain the services of a professional parking service to stripe and manage the parking of vehicles for the entire duration of the event in accordance with the City-provided parking layout plan. Confirmation of the use of the City Hall Civic Center and Palos Verdes Interpretive Center must be approved by the City Manager's office prior to Thursday, November 6, 2014.

21. At least 2 Volunteers shall be posted at each designated parking area to assist with parking flow, with one volunteer to manage traffic and one volunteer to manage communication with the shuttles and other parking lots through the duration of the event. Deputy and volunteer hours shall coincide with the opening and closing operating hours as defined in Condition #4 above.

22. Off-site parking on public streets for this event is strictly prohibited.

23. The applicant shall pay the total estimate of \$12,000.00 for Sheriff Department services by setting up a Trust Deposit with the City submitted no later than 5:30 PM on Thursday, November 6, 2014.

24. Equipment/construction vehicles used during the event set-up and breakdown shall not be parked on City streets when not in use.
25. All coastal access trails in the area of the event and along the marathon course shall remain open throughout the duration of the event. The general public parking lot within the Terranea Resort shall remain open and available for visitors wishing to access the coastal trails during the duration of the event.
26. Approval of this Special Use Permit does not in anyway cause any changes to any of the conditions of approval or mitigation measures previously adopted for the Terranea Resort and Spa project. All previously adopted conditions of approval or mitigation measures shall remain in full force and effect and are to be complied with while this event takes place.
27. Failure to adhere to all of these conditions may result in the City's denial of a Special Use Permit for any such event in the future. City representatives will visit the site, before, on, and after the date of the event to verify compliance with these conditions.
28. The County Sheriff's Department or the Los Angeles County Fire Department may suspend the Special Use Permit and Special Roadway Event Permit at any time, if, in the opinion of either of the Departments, the event is significantly adversely affecting the public health and safety.
29. As determined by the City's Building Official, the applicant shall obtain a building permit for any temporary tents, if necessary.
30. One Emergency Management Teams/First Aid Station shall be provided on site for the duration of the event, at the Start/Finish Area.
31. The applicant shall submit proof of agreement with a City approved waste hauler, verified by the Public Works Department, for trash and recycling services associated with the event. Also, upon conclusion of the event, the applicant shall submit to the satisfaction of the Public Works Department the required Post-Event Solid Waste Management Worksheet.
32. If any natural habitat located on the Terranea property is damaged by the staging of the event, the property owner (Terranea Resort) is responsible for the replacement of lost habitat, to the satisfaction and approval of the Community Development Department.

Pursuant to the City's Municipal Code, the Director's decision on a Special Use Permit may be appealed, in writing, to the Planning Commission within five (5) calendar days of the decision. Therefore, any appeal must set forth the grounds of the appeal and any specific actions requested by the appellant, and be filed by Tuesday, October 21, 2014 and accompanied by a \$2,275.00 appeal fee. If no appeal is filed, the Director's decision will become final by the end of the day on October 21, 2014.


