NEW REGION COMMANDER FOR LOMITA SHERIFF'S STATION

Sheriff Lee Baca recently promoted Oceal Victory, a 34-year veteran of the Sheriff's Department, to the rank of Commander and assigned her to Field Operations Region II, which includes the Lomita Sheriff's Station. Captain Bolin has invited Commander Victory to attend the next Peninsula Regional Law Enforcement Committee meeting scheduled for February 14, 2013. A brief biography of Commander Victory is provided below.

Commander Victory's career with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department began in 1978 as a Sheriff's Station Clerk. In 1981, she attended the Sheriff's Training Academy and upon graduation was assigned to the Sybil Brand Institute for Women. As a Deputy Sheriff, she held assignments at Lennox Station, Court Services East Bureau, Recruit Training Bureau, SANE Unit, Lennox Station Detective Bureau, and Commercial Crimes Bureau. Commander Victory was promoted to Sergeant in February of 1998 and was assigned to Carson Station working as a Patrol, Detective and Operations Sergeant. Commander Victory was promoted to Lieutenant in 2003 and was assigned to Marina del Rey Station as a Patrol Lieutenant and later assigned to Carson Station as the Operations Lieutenant. Commander Victory was promoted to Captain in 2008 and assumed command of Marina del Rey Station. Commander Victory holds a Master of Arts Degree in Organizational Leadership from Woodbury University; two Bachelor of Arts Degrees, one in Theology from the Southern California School of Ministry and one in Criminal Justice Administration from Chapman University; and an Associate of Arts Degree in Communication from Los Angeles Harbor College.

SCAG LEGISLATIVE UPDATE AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) has provided the attached legislative update and Executive Director's report for January 2013. These items contain a good deal of useful information to assist the City Council and Staff in monitoring legislation in the upcoming year.

2012 FILM PERMIT ACTIVITY SUMMARY

Attached is a table summarizing film permit activity in Rancho Palos Verdes during the 2012 calendar year. The City continues to experience a great deal of interest in location filming, particularly at Abalone Cove Shoreline Park, the Portuguese Bend Club, Terranea Resort and Trump National Golf Club. Two (2) independent feature films were shot in the City late last year, and several national television shows and commercials were filmed at various locations throughout the year. We also continued to support students in local film programs at USC, Loyola Marymount and The Los Angeles Film School by waiving most or all permit fees for student productions; nine (9) of these were shot in the City during 2012. In total, Staff issued forty-eight (48) permits for seventy-two (72) shooting days in the City during 2012, and collected more than \$46,000 in related permit and business license fees.

The table below compares film permit activity in 2012 and 2011. Although there was a substantial increase in the number of permits and shooting days in 2012, both permit revenue and the average length of a film shoot was down as compared to 2011. Staff believes that this was attributable to the higher percentage of student productions (19% in 2012 versus 12% in 2011) and a reduction in the overall size of most productions in 2012, as compared to 2011.

During 2012, Staff sought to more actively promote filming activity in the City by creating a dedicated film permit page on the City's website; by reporting film permit data to the Los Angeles *Times*; and by reaching out to the California Film Commission and major Los Angeles-based film permit companies. Staff is optimistic that Rancho Palos Verdes will remain a competitive and attractive option for location filming in Los Angeles County in the coming year. Although Staff encourages location film production as a source of revenue and in support of an important regional industry, Staff's first priority is the protection of the quiet enjoyment of residents' homes and neighborhoods.

RANCHO PALOS VERDES AT THE MOVIES

In a related matter, the new Judd Apatow comedy "This is 40"—which is now playing in theatres nationwide—was filmed in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes in the late summer of 2011. Filming locations included the Terranea Resort and driving shots along Palos Verdes Drive West/Palos Verdes Drive South between Hawthorne Boulevard and Narcissa Drive. The City's Pelican Cove Park and the Trump National Golf Club were used for production staging and cast/crew parking, respectively.

Fiscal Cliff Summary of Actions to Date

On January 1, the House approved H.R. 8 (American Tax Relief Act), a compromise measure to end the “fiscal cliff” stalemate which will let taxes rise on the most affluent households. Less than 24 hours after the Senate overwhelmingly approved the legislation by vote of 89-8, the House approved the bill by vote of 257-167, which included votes in support from 172 Democrats and 85 Republicans. The President signed the legislation last night.

Major provisions of H. R. 8 include:

- Tax rates will permanently rise to the levels prior to the President Bush tax cut for families with income above \$450,000 and individuals above \$400,000 (\$450,000/\$400,000 threshold). All income below the threshold will permanently be taxed at Bush-era rates.
- The tax on capital gains and dividends will be permanently set at 20 percent for those with income above the \$450,000/\$400,000 threshold. It will remain at 15 percent for everyone else. (Clinton-era rates were 20 percent for capital gains and taxed dividends as ordinary income, with a top rate of 39.6 percent.)
- A new 3.8 percent tax is being imposed on investment income for individuals making more than \$200,000 a year and couples making more than \$250,000.

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- The estate tax will be set at 40 percent (up from 35%) for those at the \$450,000/\$400,000 threshold, with a \$5 million exemption. That threshold will be indexed to inflation.
- The pay freeze on members of Congress, which President Obama had lifted this week, will be re-imposed.
- The 2009 expansion of tax breaks for low-income Americans: the Earned Income Tax Credit, the Child Tax Credit, and the American Opportunity Tax Credit will be extended for five years.
- The Alternative Minimum Tax will be permanently patched to avoid raising taxes on the middle-class.
- The payroll tax holiday will be allowed to expire. This means that the increase in payroll taxes will hit nearly every wage earner. Social Security is financed by a 12.4 percent tax on wages up to \$113,700, with employers paying half and workers paying the other half. President Obama and Congress reduced the share paid by workers from 6.2 percent to 4.2 percent for 2011 and 2012, saving a typical family about \$1,000 a year. President Obama pushed hard to enact the payroll tax cut for 2011 and to extend it through 2012. However, the payroll tax reduction holiday was never fully embraced by either party and there was general agreement to let it expire.
- The personal exemptions and itemized deductions phase-out is reinstated at a higher threshold of \$250,000 for single taxpayers, \$275,000 for heads of household, and \$300,000 for married taxpayers filing jointly.
- The threshold for the itemized deduction for unreimbursed medical expenses has increased from 7.5% of AGI to 10% of AGI for regular income tax purposes. This is effective for all individuals, except, in the years 2013–2016, if either the taxpayer or the taxpayer’s spouse has turned 65 before the end of the tax year, the increased threshold does not apply and the threshold remains at 7.5% of AGI.
- Effective for cafeteria plan years beginning after Dec. 31, 2012, the maximum amount of salary reduction contributions that an employee may elect to have made to a flexible spending arrangement for any plan year is \$2,500.
- The full package of temporary business tax breaks benefiting a wide range of industries and uses such as alternative fuel and electric plug-in vehicles, wind energy, research and development, and others, will be extended for another year. Specifically, the act also extends through 2013, and in some cases modifies, a number of energy credits and provisions that expired at the end of 2011:
 - ✓ Credit for energy-efficient existing homes (Sec. 25C);
 - ✓ Credit for alternative fuel vehicle refueling property (Sec. 30C);
 - ✓ Credit for two- or three-wheeled plug-in electric vehicles (Sec. 30D);
 - ✓ Cellulosic biofuel producer credit (Sec. 40(b), as modified);
 - ✓ Incentives for biodiesel and renewable diesel (Sec. 40A);
 - ✓ Production credit for Indian coal facilities placed in service before 2009 (Sec. 45(e)) (extended to an eight-year period);
 - ✓ Credits with respect to facilities producing energy from certain renewable resources (Sec. 45(d), as modified);
 - ✓ Credit for energy-efficient new homes (Sec. 45L);
 - ✓ Credit for energy-efficient appliances (Sec. 45M);
 - ✓ Special allowance for cellulosic biofuel plant property (Sec. 168(l), as modified);
 - ✓ Special rule for sales or dispositions to implement Federal Energy
 - ✓ Regulatory Commission or state electric restructuring policy for qualified electric utilities (Sec. 451); and
 - ✓ Alternative fuels excise tax credits (Sec. 6426).

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- Scheduled cuts to doctors under Medicare, a 27% reduction in Medicare reimbursement rates, are avoided for a year through spending cuts that haven't been specified.
- Federal unemployment insurance will be extended for another year, benefiting those unemployed for longer than 26 weeks. This \$30 billion provision will not be offset by spending cuts.

The sequester cuts will be delayed for two months and expires the same day as the FY 13 Appropriations Continuing Resolution on March 27th, 2013. Half of the delay will be offset by discretionary cuts, split between defense and non-defense. The other half will be offset by revenue raised by the voluntary transfer of traditional IRAs to Roth IRAs, which would tax retirement savings when they're moved over. The \$16.4 Trillion debt ceiling limit was reached December 31st. If Congress fails to act, the White House would be required to release its sequester report and order the cuts on March 1. The total automatic cut for FY 2013 is \$109 billion (this bill offsets the reduction by \$24 billion thereby reducing the automatic sequester cuts to \$65 billion).

Senate Confirms Yvonne Burke for Amtrak Board

The Senate has confirmed President Obama's nomination of former Los Angeles County Supervisor, California Transportation Commissioner, and SCAG Regional Council Past President Yvonne Burke to serve on the Board of Directors of AMTRAK. Commissioner Burke will join the Board of Directors that oversees AMTRAK, the informal name for the National Railroad Passenger Corporation. SCAG wishes to congratulate Commissioner Burke on the Senate's action to confirm her nomination and offers its support to her as she begins her efforts as a member of the AMTRAK Board of Directors.

January 2nd Message from New House Chair of Transportation & Infrastructure (T & I) Committee

It is important to note that on Wednesday, January 3rd, the Congressional Record published a message from the new Chair of the House T & I Committee since he will oversee the House 5-year transportation funding bill expected to begin their work in February.

Shuster: Strengthen Our Transportation Network: An efficient infrastructure allows U.S. businesses to be competitive in the global marketplace

"I am honored that my colleagues selected me to serve as chairman of the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. I thank them for the confidence they have placed in me and will work hard to be worthy of their trust.

Transportation is important. It's about people and how they live their lives. How they get to work; get their children to school; go to stores to buy food, clothing and other necessities; and how they visit family and friends.

It's also about business. Transportation is a critical part of how the supply chain functions, how raw materials get to factories, how finished products get to markets, how food gets from farms to our kitchens and how energy products move from production areas to consuming areas. An efficient national transportation network allows businesses to lower transportation costs, which lowers production costs and enhances productivity and profits. It allows American businesses to be competitive in the global marketplace and for our economy to prosper and grow. One need only to look at our Interstate Highway System to see how investment in our national transportation network has benefited our nation and spawned tremendous economic growth.

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And it is about America. Our national transportation system binds us together. As President Dwight D. Eisenhower observed, without the unifying force of transportation, “we would be a mere alliance of many separate parts.” Working together in the 113th Congress, the committee will focus on strengthening America’s national transportation network to make us more efficient, more competitive and more prosperous. This is an important responsibility of government — especially the federal government.

Adam Smith, the 18th-century economist who developed the underlying principles of a capitalistic market economy, recognized the need for government to erect and maintain public works to facilitate commerce. And our Founding Fathers understood the important role of the national government in carrying out this responsibility.

The Articles of Confederation failed in large part because of barriers erected by the states. The Founders remedied this in the Constitution by clearly tasking the national government with facilitating the free flow of commerce throughout our nation. Proudly, it has long been a Republican tradition to take this obligation seriously — from President Abraham Lincoln’s support for the transcontinental railroad to President Theodore Roosevelt’s construction of the Panama Canal to President Eisenhower’s establishment of the Interstate Highway System.

Our committee will continue that work in the 113th Congress. Reauthorization of the Water Resources Development Act will be a top priority. Inland waterways and seaports link our nation directly to the global economy and our country’s export potential directly depends on the ability to get goods to market.

Federal passenger and freight rail safety programs expire in 2013. This reauthorization will provide an opportunity to look for more cost-effective and innovative approaches to delivering modern and efficient passenger rail service. Our success will require Amtrak, labor and Congress — Republicans and Democrats — coming to the table and working together. If done right, what has been a liability in the past can become an asset generating American jobs and economic development in the future.

Additionally, the committee will pursue an aggressive oversight agenda. Oversight of the recently enacted MAP-21 will be critical to ensure its major reforms, including the streamlining of the bureaucratic approval process for transportation projects, are implemented in accordance with congressional intent. Ensuring we move forward with important aviation modernization reforms is also essential to reduce air traffic delays, cut down on emissions and pollution, and lower costs for consumers. We will also focus on holding federal agencies accountable to ensure common-sense regulations and to restore regulatory balance to provide the certainty necessary to create jobs.

Finally, preparing for the reauthorization of surface transportation programs, which expire on Sept. 30, 2014, will be a priority of the committee. Our national surface transportation network is the foundation on which our economy and our way of life are built. Without significant improvements to this network, and additional reforms to federal programs, transportation will become increasingly inefficient and unreliable, will be a drag on our economy, and will hurt the ability of our businesses to remain competitive in the global economy. We cannot let this happen and must modernize our national transportation systems.

Key to that effort will be paying for the investments responsibly. With the Highway Trust Fund facing its own version of a fiscal cliff in the coming years, we must find a way to pay for transportation improvements without borrowing from our children. We cannot borrow our way to a better future. We must work together, listen to all ideas and opinions, and build a consensus on what is best for America and our future prosperity. I am committed to this effort and to working with my colleagues to make it happen.”

SCAG Sacramento Legislative Reception

SCAG will also host an evening reception in Sacramento on Wednesday, February 20th for invited state lawmakers, Administration/agency officials, and key stakeholders from business, labor and environmental groups. This reception will provide an excellent opportunity for SCAG Regional Council members, as well as local business and transportation stakeholder partners, to meet state lawmakers at the beginning of the 2013-14 legislative session to discuss legislative priorities adopted by the Regional Council and the input received at SCAG's December Economic Summit.

President Becerra will be providing Regional Council members with more information regarding trip activities in the near future. Regional Council members are encouraged to clear their calendars during this time period to join our President and leadership in communicating approved state legislative priorities to state lawmakers for the next session.

MAP-21 Implementation

On January 28, 2013, the National Association of Regional Councils (NARC), as part of its national outreach efforts, will hold an all-day meeting in Sacramento to address from the perspective of metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) and regional councils of government how to implement MAP-21 within California. MAP-21 changed the structure of the federal surface transportation program and integrates performance based planning into the transportation planning process on the state and regional levels. The California Councils of Government (CALCOG) will co-host, and SCAG will be represented at the event. Additionally, SCAG is participating in a statewide MAP-21 Working Group to develop agreement on statewide principles to guide the distribution of MAP-21 funds for FY 2014 as well develop specific guidance on how the new programs will be implemented within the state. The application of these principles will be embodied in state legislation developed by Caltrans and stakeholder groups for introduction early in the 2013 legislative session.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MONTHLY REPORT

JANUARY 2013

2012 Economic Summit Recap

California State Controller John Chiang was among the nearly 300 business leaders, elected officials and dignitaries attending the Third Annual Economic Summit: Accelerating Southern California's Economic Recovery, co-hosted by SCAG and the Southern California Leadership Council on December 6, 2012. In his keynote address, Controller Chiang outlined the state's budget and current fiscal challenges. Joining him on stage to present opening remarks were several state legislators, including Assemblymember Mike Morrell, District 40; Assemblymember Donald P. Wagner, District 68; and Senator Roderick Wright, District 35.

Additionally, prominent economists led a review of economic data presented at the inaugural 2010 Economic Summit and compared it with the current state of the economy in the six-county SCAG region. The Southern California job recovery information is still behind schedule for all counties where some counties are not expected to recover job losses until 2020. Details by county can be found at www.scag.ca.gov/economicsummit.

The economists also unveiled a new study on the costs of transportation project delay. Expediting project delivery and regulation streamlining has been a high priority for SCAG, labor and business within Southern California in order to avoid additional companies moving out of California and attracting further business reinvestment in our communities. By moving projects in the adopted 2012-2035 RTP/SCS forward five years, the independent economists analysis concluded that 102,143 additional construction jobs would be brought forward per year, created sooner in an industry crucial to Southern California's recovery. Infrastructure enhancement leads to an expeditious and enhanced economic competitiveness with 120,639 jobs created per year. The reduction in travel time, emissions, fuel consumption and vehicle operating costs will lead to an additional 83,654 jobs per year. Advancing five years of projects would result in a decrease in construction costs by \$1.25–1.95 Billion (or 5–9% of construction costs).

The session led to an open discussion with legislators and leaders regarding high priority legislative goals for the next state legislative session. The discussion was moderated by Frank Mottek, anchor of KNX 1070 Newsradio's "The Business Hour," where local leaders expressed agreement on advancing economic recovery priorities. 2013 Federal Transportation Improvement Program Approved

On December 14, 2012, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) received notification of approval of the 2013 Federal State Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP). The approval of the FSTIP includes the approval of SCAG's 2013 Federal Transportation Improvement Program that the Regional Council approved in September 2012. In a separate letter dated December 14, 2012, the FHWA and FTA found that SCAG's 2013 FTIP and 2012 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy conform to the applicable state implementation plan in accordance with the provisions of 40 CFR Parts 51 and 93.

Imperial County Sanctions Will Be Lifted

On December 17, 2012, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) signed approval of the Imperial County Air Pollution Control District's (ICAPCD) revised fugitive dust rules that regulate emissions of inhalable particulate matter. In July 2010, the EPA partially disapproved ICAPCD's rules to control fugitive dust from local sources and a highway sanction has been in effect in the County since August 2012. The removal of the sanction will result in no job loss and no impact on transportation projects.

Workshop on CalEnviroScreen Draft Tool and Follow-up

SCAG co-hosted a workshop to discuss the California Communities Environmental Health Screening Draft Tool (CalEnviroScreen) currently being developed by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) of the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal/EPA). The purpose of this tool is to screen the environmental health of California's communities based on cumulative environmental impacts. At the workshop, Arsenio Mataka, Assistant Director at Cal/EPA and George Alexeeff, Director at OEHHA provided a PowerPoint presentation on the draft tool followed by active discussion from participants including Regional Council and Policy Committee members, other representatives from local jurisdictions and interested stakeholders. The Revised Draft Tool of CalEnviroScreen will be presented at the Cal/EPA's Cumulative Impact Precautionary Approach (CIPA) Workgroup on January 11, followed by a public comment period through January. Cal/EPA staff will also be available to meet with SCAG to discuss and review tool specifics, such as data and indicator weighting. Another stakeholder meeting at SCAG is also anticipated to receive comments on the revised draft tool.

2013 SCAG Scholarship Program Applications Available

Applications for the 2013 SCAG Scholarship Program are now available. The Scholarship Program, now in its fourth year, is designed to provide seven high school or community college students a scholarship award of \$2,000 each and a two-week internship with a local planning agency, council of governments, or SCAG. Recipients will also have an opportunity to meet with their local government representatives and practicing planners to discuss the importance of urban planning and a future career in public service. A total of seven students (one student each from Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino and Ventura Counties, and two from Los Angeles County) will be recommended for the scholarship award to the Regional Council. Scholarship information has been sent to all of the high schools and community colleges in the SCAG region. Applications for the SCAG Scholarship Program must be postmarked by Friday, March 8, 2013. High-Speed Passenger Rail: GAO Preliminary Assessment of California's Cost Estimates

On December 6, 2012, the U.S. House of Representatives' Transportation and Infrastructure Committee held a hearing titled: "An Update on the High-Speed and Intercity Passenger Rail Program: Mistakes Made and Lessons Learned." Susan A. Fleming, Director of Physical Infrastructure for the Government Accounting Office (GAO), provided testimony based upon a GAO report called: "High-Speed Passenger Rail: Preliminary Assessment of California's Cost Estimates and Other Challenges." The GAO found that the California High-Speed Rail Authority followed some best practices in developing its cost estimates, but also needed additional work with respect to detailing out the operating costs, describing underlying assumptions for the cost estimates and conducting sensitivity/risk and uncertainty analyses. Among the challenges identified by the GAO was future funding prospects, ridership estimates and right-of-way (ROW) acquisition. The GAO report is available at: www.gao.gov/assets/660/650608.pdf.

International Collaboration

On December 10, 2012, SCAG hosted a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signing ceremony with the Chinese Academy of Science, Institute of Policy and Management (IPM). The MOU is for SCAG and IPM to collaborate on areas of common interest in planning. The IPM is a top Chinese think-tank for macro-level decision-making on sustainable development and policy strategies. It publishes annually the "China Sustainable Development." During the visit, SCAG and IPM exchanged planning ideas regarding low-carbon sustainable socioeconomic development and strategic policy formation, greenhouse gas emission reduction strategies through local policies on sustainable transportation and land use planning and environmental preservation.

In addition, SCAG signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Korea Research Institute for Human Settlements (KRIHS) which is an official research agency for the government of the Republic of Korea. The mission of KRIHS is to provide the Korean government with long-term and short-term plans and policies to lead to more efficient use of land resources and to improve the balance of development between urban and rural areas.

Transportation Research Board Presentation

An Environmental Justice Goods Movement paper prepared by SCAG has been accepted for presentation at the 14th Transportation Research Board National Transportation Planning Applications Conference to be held in Columbus, Ohio, May 5-9, 2013. This is in addition to the two previously accepted presentations for the national TRB conference to be held in Washington, DC this month.

SCAG Personnel Changes

SCAG lost three valued personnel at the end of the year due to retirement: Debra Salcido, Clerk of the Board; Sylvia Patsouras, Acting Director of Strategy, Policy and Public Affairs; and Mike Armstrong, Senior Aviation Planner. These three valued retirees were all long-time employees with significant experience and greatly contributed to the success of SCAG. They will be missed.

In the meantime, I am pleased to announce that Lillian Harris-Neal has replaced Deby as the SCAG Clerk of the Board in the Office of Regional Council Support of the Strategy, Policy and Public Affairs Division. Lillian comes to SCAG with a wealth of clerk experience. Lillian has over 20 years clerical experience, which includes almost 10 years' experience as a Deputy City Clerk with the City of Newport Beach. Lillian has previously served in the positions of Account Clerk and Senior Office Specialist for the City of Riverside. She received her Bachelor's degree in Sociology from National University, and an AA in Administration of Justice from Riverside Community College. Lillian also holds a Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC) certification. Please welcome Lillian.

In addition, I am pleased to announce that Darin Chidsey will replace Sylvia as the Acting Director of Policy, Strategy and Public Affairs. Pre-Bid Meeting:

Tuesday, January 8, 2013 at 10am Public Works Staff conducted a pre-bid meeting for the San Ramon Canyon Storm Drain Project. Twenty-two representatives from nine of the contractors that are pre-qualified to submit proposals for the construction of the project were in attendance. During the office portion of the meeting, staff discussed the scope of the project, construction site access, permit requirements, and contract requirements before continuing the meeting in the field. The contractors in attendance were driven to view and discuss the inlet structure area at the Switchbacks, the cut and cover section within Shoreline Park and ended the tour at the outlet site on the beach. The unusually warm January day and the hiking required to view the sites resulted in all those attending the field trip requesting the bus driver to turn on the Air Conditioning! The field trip concluded around 2:30 in the afternoon. Public Works Staff would like to thank Mona Dill (Recreation and Parks) our bus driver for the afternoon for her excellent bus driving skills. Contractor proposals (bids) are due to the City January 24, 2013; Staff anticipates bringing the bid results to the City Council February 19, 2013 requesting an award of a construction contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

Second Story Windows at 6530 La Garita

On November 1, 2011, the City Council approved an appeal submitted by the property owner (Mr. Magalnic) at 6530 La Garita and overturned the Planning Commission's decision to deny a project, thereby approving construction of a one-story addition and a new second story (Case No. ZON2010-00331). The approval included a number of second story windows that were designed to eliminate potential privacy impacts to the easterly and westerly neighbors. In order to meet the requirements of the California Building Code (CBC) for egress from a bedroom, the applicant provided two egress windows that were set in from the second story.

At the time of building permit issuance, the Applicant's representative requested that the sliding portion of the egress windows be clear. Given that the sliding portion of the window could be opened or closed at any time by the homeowner, and no privacy impact from these windows was identified by the City Council during the public hearing, Staff agreed that the sliding portion of the window could be clear. Staff required that the fixed portion of the window remain translucent.

After installation of the windows, the adjacent neighbors raised concerns with the clear sliding portion of the windows citing privacy concerns and stating that the entire window should be opaque. Staff visited the property to look out of the windows and confirmed that there are no privacy impacts to the neighboring properties from the windows. Since requiring the sliding portion of the windows to be opaque would have no benefit, Staff has notified the applicant and neighbors that the windows can stay as they are.


