

**STATE MARINE CONSERVATION AREAS UPHELD BY STATE APPEALS COURT**

On April 19, 2013, the *Daily Breeze* reported that the State Marine Conservation Areas (SMCAs) were upheld by the 4<sup>th</sup> District Court of Appeal (see attached article). The Martinez, CA-based Coastside Fishing Club filed suit challenging the SMCAs in 2010. They had previously lost in State Superior Court in San Diego, and are reportedly weighing an appeal to the State Supreme Court.

On January 1, 2012, SMCAs were established at Point Vicente and Abalone Cove. The Point Vicente SMCA is a “no take” preserve while the Abalone Cove SMCA allows for very limited recreational and commercial fishing. The diagram below from the recent *Daily Breeze* article depicts the boundaries of these SMCAs.

## California appeals court upholds marine reserve areas

California's landmark decision to establish the nation's largest network of marine reserves did not violate state law and will be allowed to stand, a state appeals court has ruled.

In a significant victory for environmentalists and biologists who support the "no-fishing zones" designed to restore declining ocean species, the Fourth District Court of Appeal this week turned back a challenge by the Coastside Fishing Club, based in Martinez, Calif. The group had sued, arguing that the rules went too far and violated state law.

"We're very heartened. It's really good news for the future of California's coast," said Karen Garrison, co-director of ocean programs at the Natural Resources Defense Council in San Francisco.

From 2007 to 2012, the state Fish and Game Commission set up 124 new reserves along California's 1,100-mile coast from Oregon to Mexico. The reserves ban or limit fishing in roughly 16 percent of state waters from the shoreline out to three miles offshore.

A network of marine protected areas in a region stretching from Point Conception in Santa Barbara County to the Mexico border was created in December 2010 following two years of study and numerous public meetings. That network includes about 20 square miles off the coast of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, where fishing is limited.

The idea behind marine reserves, which are supported by organizations such as the Monterey Bay Aquarium and environmental advocacy groups such as Santa Monica-based Heal the Bay, is to create national forests of the ocean.

For decades, the government has set catch limits and seasons for salmon, Dungeness crab, rockfish and other species. But the reserves go much further, drawing boundaries where little or no fishing is allowed so that fish, crabs, starfish and other species can recover, then seed larger areas of the ocean with their young.

Locally, fishing is prohibited in about 15 square miles of protected ocean southwest of Point Vicente. In an adjacent area of about 5 square miles at Abalone Cove, "take" of marine life is allowed by only some fishing methods.

Fishing groups have generally opposed the rules, saying the state put too many areas off limits, particularly rocky areas along the bottom that provide the best fishing grounds.

"What they did was like saying, 'We're only going to close 8 percent of California to driving, but it's the 8 percent with roads,'" said Marc Gorelnik, an attorney for the Coastside Fishing Club.

The club, which has about 10,000 members who are recreational fishing enthusiasts, sued in 2010. It challenged the way the state Fish and Game Commission wrote the rules for the "North Central" section of the California coast, stretching from Pigeon Point in San Mateo County north about 150 miles to Point Arena near Mendocino.

In 2009, the commission approved new rules that banned or limited commercial and recreational fishing in 20 percent of state waters in the area. The rules took effect a year later.

The Coastside Fishing Club sued. It lost in Superior Court in San Diego, then fell short again on appeal Monday.

"Considering the enormous investment of time and effort by so many that went into their creation, we are loathe to hold the North Central Coast regulations invalid and undo the arduous process that resulted in their adoption absent a compelling reason to do so," Associate Justice Terry O'Rourke of the San Diego-based Fourth District Court of Appeal wrote in a published opinion.


Gorelnik said the Coastside Fishing Club has not yet decided whether to appeal to the state Supreme Court. He said the organization supports healthy oceans and plans to release 160,000 juvenile hatchery chinook salmon off Half

"The threats to the ocean are not coming from recreation hook-and-line fishermen, but we've been an easy target," he said. "We feel that the closures have not been adequately justified and effort has gone there that perhaps should have gone to more significant environmental threats, including pollution, sewage spills, agricultural runoff, and large diversions of water from the Delta. "


But Garrison, of the Natural Resources Defense Council, said marine reserves are a proven tool for restoring the health of declining fish species.

She noted that in February a group of scientists published a study showing that populations and sizes of several key species of fish, such as rockfish and lingcod, along with starfish, urchins, crabs and other sea life, have increased more in number and abundance in the protected areas established in 2007 between San Mateo and Santa Barbara counties than in unprotected ocean areas nearby.

"Protected areas are working," she said. "People are engaged and excited about them. Now the legal win makes them very solid. "


**BLUFF TOP EROSION CONTROL AT PVIC, SUB-REGION ONE & ABALONE COVE SHORELINE PARK**

Work for the bluff top erosion control project at PVIC, Sub-Region One and Abalone Cove Shoreline Park is completed. Two locations at the Abalone Cove bluff top area were added to the original scope of work and therefore the project was completed in April instead of March. The project included installation of Geotextile Fabric and Gabion Baskets at the bluff top to prevent erosion at locations of concern. Work was coordinated with the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy (PVPLC).



## SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE

After a successful groundbreaking ceremony (despite gusty conditions), the contractor has begun working in the canyon in earnest this week. Two access roads into the canyon are being graded this week. The contractor is also laying down a leveling course of crushed rock to serve as a base to the temporary bypass drain and the permanent sub drain. These two drains will be installed over the next few weeks. The permanent sub drain, known as the "burrito drain", will be surrounded by crushed rock held in place by a




drainage fabric, like a burrito. The sub drain serves to collect infiltrated water from the fill material and direct it downhill to daylight in the streambed. The temporary bypass drain is placed to handle any runoff occurring during the project before the primary tunnel drain is placed in service. It will route flows around the project during the period of construction. Once the project is complete, the temporary bypass drain will be filled with slurry and abandoned.

Motorists, cyclists and pedestrians travelling along PVDE and PVDS should exercise extreme caution during working hours as large trucks will be turning in and out of the roadway. For short periods of a few minutes traffic may be stopped when directed to do so by flaggers. As always, active construction areas should be treated with caution and for the safety of both the public and the workers. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during the implementation of this important project.

## STORM DRAIN IMPROVEMENTS AT PVDS AND TERRANEA WAY

Work began this week on a small storm drain improvement project along the westbound side of PVDS, just east of Terranea Way. The work is to replace a drain structure that directed water from the Salvation Army property into a pipe beneath PVDS. The design of that structure did not anticipate the heavy debris often accompanying



these flows during intense rainfall. As a result, during an intense storm, small rocks and mud have been thrown into the roadway, impacting traffic. The redesigned structure will collect the large debris uphill of the inlet, north of the roadway, while allowing the water to pass into the pipe going under the road. Construction is expected to last a couple of weeks and a motorist's on westbound PVDS should expect a right hand lane closure for

most of this period during working hours. The bike lane and sidewalk in this area will also be closed for the duration of the project.


As always, active construction areas should be treated with caution for the safety of both the public and the workers. We appreciate your cooperation and patience during the implementation of this important project.

### **STORM DRAIN INLET RESTORED**

The storm drain inlet near Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive East has been put back to near original condition. Graffiti and trash have been removed for the second time within 30 days, ramps that had been illegally installed were removed, the chain link fencing that was cut and removed was replaced, an area adjacent to the inlet was cordoned off and **no parking – no trespassing – no skateboarding** signs were installed. Skateboarding has not been seen or reported since these repairs/improvements have been installed.

And now for “The Rest of the Story” - Skateboarding enthusiasts modified the storm drain inlet by installing concrete ramps that allowed the inlet structure to be used as a makeshift park for their skateboards and bicycles. Those using the inlet were practicing developing their skills and would photograph and video each other performing their tricks. The young men who were using (and we presume modified) the inlet are associated with Transworld SKATEboarding (also known as TWS) which is an international magazine on skateboarding that is based in Carlsbad, California. Graffiti and trash were brought by the group using the inlet which is also unacceptable uses of the inlet. In addition to the obvious problem of trespassing on public property, the modifications to the inlet created small dams where storm water pools and mosquito larva develops. Restoring the inlet has eliminated this health threat and restored the design functionality of the inlet. Staff will continue to monitor the inlet to ensure the previous modifications do not reappear.

### **CONSTRUCTION UPDATE ON PHASE I OF THE FY11-12 RESIDENTIAL STREETS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, AREAS 3 AND 5**

Concrete repair is being performed this week at several locations on Rue Godbout, Via Borica, Via Lorado, Via Marie Celeste, Via Rivera, and Via Victoria. Localized asphalt repair is also being performed this week at several locations on Browndeer Ln, Elkridge Dr,

Flaming Arrow Dr, and Longhill Dr. An updated project schedule will be posted on the project website:



### **SHREDDING DAY POPULAR**

EDCO and the City's paper shredding event on Saturday, April 20, 2013 was a huge success. Cars were lined up as early as 8:30 am for the 9 am start time. A total of 19,900 Lbs. (9.95 tons) of paper was collected and shredded by two certified large shredding trucks "on site". A total of 547 vehicles were served. The electronic waste collection generated an estimated 4,000 Lbs. In addition, 123 vehicles took advantage of the free mulch provided by EDCO, over 30,000 Lbs. (15 tons) were distributed. During the event, staff distributed reusable grocery bags and information on the upcoming household hazardous waste on May 11th, and the City's 40th anniversary celebration. The temporary traffic control plan helped direct the cars entering and exiting City Hall and Hawthorne Boulevard. Staff and EDCO received numerous compliments from attendees about the efficiency of the event and the need for such an event. Due to the popularity of the shredding events, Staff and EDCO management will plan the next (Fall) event. Staff thanks EDCO for providing another useful and free service to the City residents.



## **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL EARTH DAY ASSEMBLIES**

In the past two weeks, Public Works in cooperation with Waste Management has held various Earth Day assemblies at local elementary schools (Soleado, Point Vicente and Mira Catalina). Waste Management is the PVPUSD's contracted waste hauler.



These assemblies were targeted to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders and taught them about recycling and preserving natural resources. The assemblies were concluded with kids receiving bags of mulch and/or flower seeds. Over 400 students so far have seen the assemblies and have promised to be the recycling ambassadors at home. Later this week Mira Catalina Satellite will also have an assembly targeted to kindergarteners. Public Works appreciates the schools teachers and principals for their continued interest in recycling.

## PVPLC/RPV Preserve Management Team Meeting April 11, 2013 Meeting Minutes

### Attendance

Carolynn Petru, Joel Rojas, Ara Mihanian, Danielle LeFer, Katie Howe, Andrea Vona, Bindu Vaish, and Emilio Blanca

### Action Items from March 7, 2013 Meeting

- **Finalize PUMP document (PVPLC to review)** – Ara reported that the City Council approved the PUMP document at its April 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting. The approved document is available on the City's website.
- **Port-o-potty mapping (Emilio/Joel)** - Emilio is to provide Joel with the information so that GIS layers can be created.
- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up (Ara)** - Ara previously met with the property owners to discuss a possible License Agreement to allow the public to use the segment of the Peppertree Trail that traverses private property. The property owners indicated an interest in such a License Agreement, but wanted to review it first after the City enters into a similar agreement with Jim York for a trail that traverses his property.
- **San Ramon bike jump removal (Emilio)** – This task has been completed.
- **Unauthorized trail connection between Fire Station and Rim Trails (Ara)** – Ara reported that he recently spoke to Cathy Nichols who informed him that the trail closure is finally being adhered to and that she is pleased with the City's and the PVPLC's efforts to notify trail users that a public access through her property does not exist. She suggested that the City install signs at the bottom of the trail indicating that there is no through trail. She also stated her lack of interest in dedicating a different trail easement that follows the trail. As such, Ara suggested added a trail connection through the Preserve be identified as a future trail project.

### PVPLC Topics

- **Ongoing trail project update:**
  - **Coastal trail connector with PV Drive (Smuggler's Cove)** – This project hasn't started yet, but the PVPLC hopes to complete this project this fall.
- **Narcissa Fire Update (Danielle)** – The PVPLC is waiting to hear back from the Wildlife Agencies.
- **Agua Amarga Reserve Encroachments (Danielle/Joel)** - Danielle and Joel will schedule a site visit in the next weeks to inspect the identified encroachments.
- **Alta Vicente North Spur trailhead and trail work** – The PVPLC reported that as part of an Eagle Scout project, this trail and trailhead will be improved. The team agreed on locating the trailhead where the old asphalt road meets up with the City Hall parking lot between the two palm trees (not to be located behind parking spaces).
- **Walk bike signage at Filiorum** – The PVPLC will create a sign to post at the three locations in the Filiorum Reserve recommended by the City Council.
- **Ladera Linda staging area for Rangers** – An area in the old discovery room at Ladera Linda will be used to store some materials to be used by the rangers. Access will be provided here as a drop-in office for the Rangers and eventually the Sheriffs.
- **Fountain grass at Ladera Linda** – Emilio will see if funding is available in the fuel modification budget to remove the fountain grass located behind the yellow gate along Forrestal Drive.
- **Fossil trail docent walk site** – The PVPLC is working with the docents to identify the path being used and to properly close the remaining area off from public access.
- **Portuguese Bend Reserve Eucalyptus tree near Water Tank** – The PVPLC requested that the City remove some half burned trees from the 2009 fire near the water tank. Prior to deciding if these trees should be removed, the City Arborist will be asked to review the trees and provide a recommendation. This is an action item.
- **Annual Report Update** – The PVPLC reported that the 2012 Annual Report and three year Comprehensive Report will be submitted at the end of May for consideration by the City Council in June.

### City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison litigation status update (RPV)** - No new information to report. The tentative court date is July 15, 2013.
- **Edison Pole Inventory** – City and PVPLC Staff met with representatives from SCE at the Portuguese Bend Reserve to discuss SCE's protocol for brush maintenance around the power poles. Matt will provide a follow-up memorializing the meeting.
- **Cathy Nichols trail: sign vandalism follow-up** – See above

### Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project** – A ceremonial ground breaking ceremony is scheduled for April 16<sup>th</sup> before the City Council meeting and work is scheduled to begin in May. Shuttles will be used to access the ceremonial

event. The team reviewed the location of the staging area. Ara reported that he will be working with Ron from public works to identify a trail route to hopefully connect San Ramon to Friendship Park.

- **Vicente Bluffs Reserve Trail Drainage Issues (Bindu)** – This project was completed.
- **GIS overlays:**
  - **Dewatering wells (Public works)** - this item was tabled until funding can be identified to cover the associated costs.
- **Bollard removal at PVIC (Emilio)** – This was identified as a candidate volunteer project by Public Works and will not begin until the details have been worked out.
- **Peppertree area No Trespassing signage** – Emilio is to look at one of the signs that may need to be relocated.
- **Motorcycles in San Ramon** – The Rangers are being asked to monitor the activities and to determine where the motorcycles are accessing this Reserve so that barriers may be installed by Public Works.
- **Rusted fencing at Vicente Bluffs** – it was reported to Public Works that a good portion of the seaward side of the fencing along the bluff top trail is rusted. Public Works will explore funding opportunities to repair the existing fence.
- **Spur Trail Closure at Del Cerro** - The team discussed the on-going public use of an unauthorized trail at Del Cerro Park. Ara is going to draft language for a sign to be installed based on Section 12.16.090 of the RPVMC. This is an Action Item.
- **Alta Vicente: No trespassing sign at Prickly Pear trailhead leading to cactus farm** - This sign needs to be removed by Public Works. This is an Action Item.
- **Alta Vicente - PV Art Center Paint Out- April 19<sup>th</sup>** - Katie is coordinating with the Art Center for this event which will begin at 7:30 a.m. and end by noon. The team discussed the Art Center's request and determined that participants must stay on the trail per the City's Municipal Code.
- **Fuel Modification** – Emilio reported the fuel modification will begin along Burma Road followed by Palos Verdes Drive South. He added that the work is being conducted based on surveys and recommendations from a Biologist hired by the City.
- **Survey Project (Bindu)** – Bindu distributed a Trail Project Form for an upcoming Public works survey project that is scheduled to occur between April 15 and April 19<sup>th</sup> at Portuguese Bend Reserve and Abalone Cove Reserve. The team requested that the survey points be shown on an aerial map that Bindu will provide before reviewing the request.

### RPV Planning Topics

- **March 19 and April 2, 2013 City Council Meeting Update** – As previously reported the Council adopted the PUMP Document. The City Council also directed that Staff conduct four public forum meetings for a one year trail period. The first focus group meeting will be in May. A final date will need to be determined.
- **NCCP/IA (Joel)** - The City and the PVPLC continue to review the comments received from the Wildlife Agencies. There is a conference call scheduled for Monday with the Wildlife Agencies.
- **Conservation Easement Update** – There is a conference call scheduled to discuss the proposed edits.
- **Malaga and Windport Canyon Purchase Agreement update** – Joel reported that the appraiser will be sending over the appraisals for these two properties within the next few weeks and will then follow-up with the WCB.
- **Jim York Permissive Use Agreement** – Ara reported that the draft License Agreement is being reviewed by Jim York's attorney. Once finalized it will be given to the PVPLC. He added that this item is now tentatively scheduled to be considered by the Council on April 16<sup>th</sup>.
- **Abalone Cove Park Improvement Grant** - Ara updated the team on the Focus Group's February 25<sup>th</sup> meeting, and noted that the second meeting is scheduled for March 25<sup>th</sup>. He added that the City Council received a status update at its April 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting and that the Successor Agency will be asked to accept the terms of the grant at its May 7<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- **California Coastal Trail Update** - Ara reported that the grant deadline has been extended to December 31, 2013. Bindu reported that the bids were received on April 1<sup>st</sup> and that the contract award will be on the April 16<sup>th</sup> Council agenda.
  - **Gateway Parking Lot** – Ara reported that there is a change being considered to the location of the Gateway Parking Lot due to a road alignment matter. He noted that the parking lot will be located behind the chain link fence and will still include the same improvements but will no longer be funded as part of the CCT project. This project is being identified as a funded CIP project for Council consideration. This possible change is acceptable with the Coastal Conservancy provided that the funds are reallocated to completing the gap in the CCT.
- **City wide Park Signage Inventory Update (Planning)** - Ara updated the team on the progress of the City Park and Preserve Sign Master Plan. The team reviewed the Preserve Rules Sign to be posted at all the entry points to the Preserve.
  - **Pelican Cove** – Ara reported that the signs at the trailhead have been updated including the MPA signage provided by Heal the Bay.

- **Preserve Kiosk Sign** – Ara reported to the team that he has received a few inquiries regarding moving forward with constructing kiosks at certain trailheads and that a final design, similar but larger to the kiosk at Portuguese Bend Reserve should be finalized.
- **GIS overlays:**
  - **Archaeology site (planning)** - Joel is working with the City's GIS Staff to create a GIS layer.
- **Water Department habitat impact at Portuguese Bend follow-up** - Joel is researching this matter before drafting a letter.

**Recreation and Parks Topics**

- **Park Ranger update** – Katie distributed the latest Ranger Hotline Report and reviewed some of the items with the team. She reported that there have been numerous calls regarding on-shore seal pups and noted that a list-serve message and website update was provided explaining what to do when the seals pups are encountered by the public.
- **Volunteer Trail Patrol Update** – Katie reported that the team is still reviewing some suggested edits in light of the liability issues identified and hopes to take this matter back to the Council in May.
- **Hike handout** - An update hike scheduled will be emailed to the team.
- **Junior Ranger Program** - An update was provided at the team meeting regarding the schedule for 2013, and that the last event involved 35 participants.


