LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES 2013 BYLAW AMENDMENTS PASS OVERWHELMINGLY

As the City Council may recall, it voted in favor of two (2) proposed amendments to the League of California Cities (League) Bylaws on April 2, 2013. These amendments proposed to:

- Require that resolutions submitted to the League for presentation to the General Assembly must be concurred in by at least five (5) or more cities or by city officials from at least five (5) or more cities; and,
- Require that the League Board may only take a position on a statewide ballot measure by a $\frac{2}{3}$ majority vote of those Directors present, rather than by a simple majority vote.

The League asked cities to return ballots on these proposals by April 19, 2013, so that they could be counted and considered by the League Board at its meeting on April 25, 2013. Staff returned the City's ballot to the League on April 3, 2013.

On May 2, 2013, the League's e-mail newsletter, *CA Cities Advocate*, reported as follows:

The board received a report from a special board ballot counting committee that was charged with reviewing and tabulating the votes of cities on two recently board proposed amendments to the League bylaws. The committee reported that with 192 of 469 eligible cities returning ballots, 185 (or 96 percent) voted in favor of Amendment 1 to require that resolutions for the League General Assembly be concurred on by five cities or by city officials from at least five or more cities. The committee reported that 177 cities (or 92 percent) voted in favor of Amendment 2 to require approval of two-thirds of the League board of directors for a position on a proposed statewide ballot measure. With both measures having received the required two-thirds

approval of those voting, the board canvassed the election results as required by the bylaws and adopted a resolution declaring the passage of the two bylaw amendments.

PURCHASE OF CHERRY HILL LANE LOT COMPLETED

On April 30, 2013, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2013-18, thereby authorizing the City Manager to complete the acquisition of a vacant, 0.92-acre lot on Cherry Hill Lane from a private property owner. The former owner, a family partnership, had approached Staff last fall about the City's interested in acquiring the property. Escrow closed and the acquisition was completed on May 7, 2013 (see attached grant deed).

With this acquisition, the City and the Successor Agency to the former Redevelopment Agency own approximately five (5) acres of land within the active Portuguese Bend landslide area in the vicinity of Cherry Hill Lane and Palos Verdes Drive South. The City is also awaiting final word from the County on the City's acquisition of a 0.39-acre, tax-defaulted lot in this same general area, which Staff hopes to complete later this year.







SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE

The contractor has installed the temporary drain through most of the canyon work area, just in time for the rain early this week. The drain functioned properly and protected the work in the canyon. The contractor worked on Saturday last week to be sure the pipe was ready. Two rain days were added to the schedule due to muddy conditions in the canyon, which prevented work on Monday and Tuesday.

Traffic control (K-rails and striping) is now set up on PVDS / 25th Street right at the City border in anticipation of work ramping up in the lower part of the project, south of PVDS. The contractor will begin clearing access to the Shoreline Park utility easment area, now fenced off from the rest of the park. He will also be moving in heavy equipment through the mobile home park early next week. The City appreciates the cooperation of the management and residents of the Palos Verdes Shores community during this process.

Motorists, cyclists and pedestrians traveling along PVDE and PVDS should continue exercise extreme caution during working hours as large trucks will be turning in and out of the roadway. Additional traffic control signs have been added along PVDE to remind motorists to proceed slowly and carefully through the construction zone. The contractor reports the dangerous practice of some motorists who are crossing the double yellow line into the oncoming traffic lane and passing haul trucks on the switchbacks, where forward visibility is very limited. The City urges all motorists to remain patient for the few minutes they may be behind a slow moving vehicle and to "arrive alive."

THE GOATS ARE BACK IN TOWN

The Public Works Department is pleased to announce that the goats are grazing their way back to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. The goat herders from Fire Grazers Inc., will begin to move these self-propelled weed eaters into the Point Vicente Park/Civic Center site as part of the City's fuel modification project.

The City's fuel modification project started on Monday, May 6, 2013 and over the next eight weeks will move to several City-owned properties, including open space near the McBride Trail, Point Vicente Interpretive Center, Vanderlip Drive, Narcissa Drive, and Forrestal Drive. The goats will be supervised 24-7, and enclosed in a solar-powered

electric fence. For your safety and the safety of the goats, please DO NOT TOUCH the fence or the goats.



Privacy groups file lawsuit over license plate scanners

Privacy rights groups on Monday filed a lawsuit against Los Angeles County's two major police departments after the agencies refused to turn over information collected by electronic license plate scanners, the suit claimed.

The Los Angeles Police Department and county Sheriff's Department have made use of the plate-reading technology for several years. Typically mounted on patrol vehicles, the small cameras continuously scan license plates and check them against criminal databases in search of stolen cars and cars registered to known fugitives.

Police and sheriff's officials have lauded the technology, saying it snares far more stolen vehicles than officers can on their own. And because the cameras record the exact time and location of a scanned car, police also see the devices as a potentially powerful tool for detectives trying to retrace the whereabouts of someone suspected of a crime -- even if it is several months or years after the car was scanned.

In filing the suit, however, the American Civil Liberties Union of Southern California and the Electronic Frontier Foundation raised concerns that the license plate information collected and stored by two departments invades people's privacy.

Peter Bibring, an attorney with the ACLU of Southern California, said his group has no objection to police using the cameras to search for stolen vehicles, but wants the LAPD and Sheriff's Department to quickly erase any data on cars and drivers not connected to any crime.

"This technology has led to police maintaining data on every resident of Los Angeles that they manage to scan ... even law-abiding residents, and that's a real concern," Bibring said in an interview with The Times.

Bibring called on the two departments, which help set standards among police agencies in Southern California because of their size, to rewrite their policies to ensure that information on law-abiding drivers is destroyed within a few weeks of its capture by the scanners.

"There is little value of keeping it for six months or a year or two years. But there are big risks to privacy," he said.

Currently, the Sheriff's Department keeps data collected by the cameras indefinitely, said spokesman Steve Whitmore. LAPD Lt. Andrew Neiman declined to comment, citing the lawsuit, but city rules on record retention indicate such information is kept for five years.

LAPD Chief Charlie Beck also declined to comment, saying he had not yet read the lawsuit. However, he has spoken out before on need to collect and store license plate data.

"As an investigative tool, it has unlimited potential," Beck said in [an article](#) published on the website Govtech.com. "That will be its strongest use ... being able to track vehicles -- where they've been and what they've been doing -- and tie that to crimes that have occurred or that will occur."

Similarly, Whitmore defended the practice, saying license plate data helped solve at least one homicide case. Months after a 2010 shooting death of a man in Long Beach, five people were arrested in connection with the killing. Detectives were able to crack the case, Whitmore said, in part because shortly after the killing a sheriff's license plate reader happened to capture a van believed to be used in the murder near to where the shooting occurred.

The Sheriff's Department has 77 vehicles outfitted with the plate readers, although only about 45 are in operation as the others undergo upgrades to improve data storage capabilities, Whitmore said. In addition, the Sheriff employs an additional 47 cameras in fixed locations throughout the county, he added. Neiman estimated that about 100 LAPD vehicles are equipped with the scanners -- a dramatic increase from 2008, when the department had only about a dozen.

The technology is used widely by police. According to a [2012 report](#) by the Police Executive Research Forum, 71% of police departments reported using the license plate scanners.

The lawsuit filed Monday stems from requests the two groups made under the state's Public Records Act for one week's worth of license plate data collected by the two agencies. Both departments refused, saying the information was investigative material and thus did not need to be released under the records act.

Bibring said attorneys for the two groups will try to convince a judge otherwise.

"Nothing will demonstrate to people the threat to their privacy as clearly as the release of this data," Bibring said.






