UPDATE - REDEVELOPMENT DISSOLUTION

Per Redevelopment Dissolution Law, the Successor Agency is required to prepare a Long-Range Property Management Plan (LRPMP) that must be adopted by the Oversight Board by October 26, 2013. The LRPMP will include all real property parcels owned by the former Redevelopment Agency, including Abalone Cove Shoreline Park, adjacent open space that includes the archery range, and 6 parcels on Cherry Hill Lane. The purpose of the LRPMP is to outline the proposed disposition of the property, which will likely be a proposed transfer to the City. Development of the LRPMP may include appraisals and a significant amount of staff time over the next few months. Staff expects to present a proposed LRPMP to the Successor Agency Board for approval in late summer, before it is submitted to the Oversight Board for adoption.

The diligent team effort, especially Kathryn Downs and Richards, Watson & Gershon, has provided the City with its best chance to receive repayment of some of the \$19 million loan balance owed to the City by the RDA. As reported previously, the loan balance will likely be reduced to about \$12 million pursuant to the Dissolution Law. Although the City has never budgeted for repayment of the RDA loan, the City may begin receiving payments as early as 2014. The Dissolution is expected to continue to absorb a significant amount of staff time; however, the expected benefit is a significant potential economic gain in the future.

SPAM

A resident recently reported that his original email sent to the City Council alias (cc@rpv.com) on June 5th was caught by the City's Barracuda spam system, a state-of-the-art device. The Barracuda reviews (filters) approximately 20,000 emails each day. Approximately 75% of all emails received by the City are malicious spam messages.

The Barracuda detects and quarantines approximately 100-300 emails each day. The quarantined emails are reviewed by an IT Technician and determined to be either spam or false positives (valid emails). Valid emails are forwarded to the recipient. Unfortunately, a few emails are mistakenly determined to be spam, rather than a valid email during the review.

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UPDATE – IT UPGRADE

PVNET and City Staff have continued the implementation of the IT upgrade throughout the organization. Although fairly detailed updates were included in Weekly Reports dated February 13, 2013, March 20, 2013 and May 1, 2013, Staff offers this update.

Barring unforeseen surprises, Staff, PVNET and our IT advisors expects to complete the IT upgrade at the turn of the fiscal year. About 1/2 of the desktop computers have been installed. Many of the remaining Dell desktops will be installed after completion of a necessary upgrade of the Sungard server operating system and report writer that the financial system operates on, scheduled for this weekend. It is necessary to upgrade the Accela permit tracking system to the current version so that it will maintain compatibility with the Windows 7 operating system on the desktop computers. Unfortunately, Accela has been unable to schedule support staffing (for several months) reportedly due to competing projects for other agencies (that have substantially more money to spend). We expect the Accela upgrade to occur by the end of June.

While in the middle of the IT upgrade, we decided to upgrade the unified communications system from Lync 2010 to Lync 2013. Although the decision to upgrade to Lync 2013 took us off the timeline by at least several weeks, it allowed us to combine two upgrades into one and utilize our consulting resources at this time. One of the most significant aspects of the IT Upgrade – centralized management of the Dell desktop computers – will be enabled near the end of the IT Upgrade, expected in July.

Are you ready for more efficient management of emails during Public Record Act (PRA) requests? Staff is ready to make the City's Outlook Web Access available for use by the City Council. Like Staff, members of the City Council would be able to login remotely from anywhere they have Internet access to receive and send @rpv.com email. All City Council email would be archived on the MS Exchange server along with staff email and would be available for search and retrieval for PRA requests.

LOW-FLYING NASA DC-8 AIRCRAFT OVER TORRANCE AIRPORT

An unusual aircraft flew over the South Bay this Monday, generating attention and some noise complaints from residents living near Torrance Airport (TOA). A NASA Douglas DC-8, described as a flying laboratory, conducted low-altitude research flights over sections of the South Bay. NASA said the plane, which was carrying University students studying kelp beds and collecting air samples, would fly as low as 1,000 feet, although one Torrance resident estimated its altitude at below 350 feet according to the Daily Breeze article.

While the plane flew near to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, RPV City staff has not received any complaints to date. Staff contacted the Facilities Operations Manager at Torrance Airport, who stated that this was a highly-unusual occurrence- the first in his 10 years on the job- and he does not anticipate any follow-up flights. The NASA DC-8 has other scheduled flights this week outside of the South Bay.

NEXT FREE PAPER SHREDDING DAY

Mark your calendars. The next EDCO sponsored "Paper/Document Shredding Day" for RPV residents is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, October 19, 2013 from 9 am to noon at the Civic Center/City Hall parking area. Similar to last year electronics waste will also be collected at the time. Free mulch (self-serve and self-haul) will be available for residents. This event will be open and free to UWS and EDCO residential customers.

Staff will shortly begin promoting this, and the brush clearing event listed below, by various means including: list server e-mails and breaking news announcements, announcements at the City Council meetings, PSA on CH 33, PV Seniors Newsletter, EDCO Billing insert (Environmental Times), and press releases to local papers.

Dear Local Business Manager,

In an effort to reach out to local Businesses, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes has teamed with the Palos Verdes Peninsulas Chamber of Commerce to provide information on how to submit quotes/proposals for various maintenance services and supplies in accordance with City of Rancho Palos Verdes purchasing guidelines.

Annually in late May through June the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, Public Works Department solicits quotes through the City's purchasing guidelines for Non-Public Projects, which include **purchases of services, supplies, equipment, and maintenance for up to \$25,000**. These quotes may be for a one-time purchase, or at times may be used throughout one fiscal year (FY 13-14) from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

- 1.) The awarded Business/Contractor will be required to obtain a City of Rancho Palos Verdes business license. Maintenance contractors shall meet city requirements for insurance.
- 2.) All purchases of services, supplies, equipment, and maintenance work will be authorized by a Purchase Order.
- 3.) No change order is authorized until the City is provided an estimate and receives a signed request with a price mutually agreed upon by the City and the Business/Contractor.

3. Backflow testing and repairs
4. Plumbing services
5. Building pest control
6. Building scraper mat service

18. Supplemental restroom maintenance
19. Painting and graffiti abatement
