PURCHASE OF CHERRY HILL LANE TAX-DEFAULT LOT COMPLETED

On August 2, 2011, the City Council authorized Staff to pursue the acquisition of a 0.390-acre tax-defaulted property on Cherry Hill Lane within the active Portuguese Bend landslide area (Assessor's Parcel No. 7572-004-032). At that time, the estimated purchase price of the lot was \$15,913.00 plus fees. The Planning Commission subsequently issued a finding that this acquisition would be consistent with the City's General Plan on August 9, 2011.

Staff filed the necessary application to purchase the property with the Los Angeles County Treasurer and Tax Collector (TTC) on December 7, 2011. A Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment completed for the property on December 27, 2011, found no recognized environmental conditions (REC) present. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors subsequently approved the agreement to sell the property to the City on March 20, 2012. However, it took more than a year for TTC to complete the notification process to advise the property owner of the pending sale, and to give them the opportunity to redeem the property by paying the back taxes owed. According to TTC, the May 30, 2013, deadline for the back taxes to be paid passed without a response from the property owner.

On June 27, 2013, Staff received a phone call from TTC advising us that the attached letter would be issued the following day, giving the City until July 12, 2013, to remit payment of the final purchase price (plus fees) and an executed Certificate of Acceptance. The final purchase price for the lot was \$16,944.35 plus \$916.09 in fees, for a grand total of \$17,860.44. Staff remitted payment and the Certificate of Acceptance to TTC on July 5, 2013, and we expect to receive the Tax Deed to Purchaser of Tax-Defaulted Property within the next few weeks. With this acquisition, the City and the Successor Agency to the City's former Redevelopment Agency now own over five (5) acres of land within the active Portuguese Bend landslide area in the vicinity of Cherry Hill Lane and Palos Verdes Drive South.

In a related matter, Staff expects to receive notification from TTC of the upcoming 2013 Sale of Tax-Defaulted Properties within the next few weeks. If suitable opportunities for

City acquisition are identified in the 2013 tax sale, Staff will be presenting them for the City Council's consideration later this summer.

REVISED HEARING DATE AND LOCATION FOR *PONTE VISTA* PROJECT

Last week, we reported on the release of the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the *Ponte Vista* project. At that time, the public notice indicated that a hearing before the Deputy Advisory Agency and the City Planning Commission Hearing Officer would be held on Wednesday, July 24, 2013, at 10:00 AM at Los Angeles City Hall in Downtown Los Angeles. Mayor Brooks subsequently reached out to Los Angeles 15th District City Councilman Joe Buscaino to ask for a change of venue for the public hearing, as had been done for the previous 2,300-unit *Ponte Vista* proposal in 2008 and 2009.

We were pleased to learn from Councilman Buscaino last Wednesday afternoon that the *Ponte Vista* hearing has been moved to the Port of Los Angeles Administration Building in Downtown San Pedro at 10:00 AM on Tuesday, July 30, 2013 (see attached revised notice). Staff immediately notified subscribers to our Border Issues listserve group of these changes.





PROJECT LOCATION: 26900 South Western Avenue

PROPOSED PROJECT IN EIR: The Project consists of the development of a residential community comprised of 1,135 dwelling units featuring a combination of single-family homes, duplexes, townhomes, and flats. The Project would be comprised of a combination of dwelling units within the following categories:

- Two- and three-story detached single-family homes with alley-loaded private garages
- Three-story buildings containing townhomes and flats with elevators and motor-court private garages
- Two- and three-story townhome duplexes with alley-loaded private garages
- Three-story buildings containing townhomes and flats with alley-loaded private garages
- Three-story townhomes in row house buildings with alley-loaded private garages
- Four-story buildings containing flats with elevators and secured common garages
- Four-story buildings with elevators over a secured common basement garage containing apartments

As part of the Project, all existing improvements would be removed from the site, including 245 residential dwelling units, a community center, and a retail convenience facility that were constructed in approximately 1962 by the U.S. Navy for the purpose of housing personnel stationed at the Long Beach Naval Shipyard. All of these buildings and uses are vacant.

The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Project evaluated the following alternatives to the proposed Project, which could be considered:

Alternative A: No Project Alternative/No Development; Alternative B: No Project Alternative/Single-Family Homes; Alternative C: Staff Recommendation/Reduced Density (Environmentally Superior Alternative); and Alternative D: Revised Site Plan.

Alternative C – Staff Recommendation/Reduced Density, as described in the EIR, would develop the site at a Low Medium I Residential density and would add 830 residential dwelling units, comprised of 208 single-family dwellings, 404 residential townhomes and row houses and 218 apartment units, to the site. No public park would be developed. The amount of publicly-accessible open space associated with Alternative C would be less than that associated with the Proposed Project due to the elimination of the public park component, but would include access to the trail and landscaped open space area surrounding the perimeter of the Project Site and will also include pedestrian access to the open space areas through the Project Site. Alternative C would, however, provide a greater amount of open space for the use of Project residents. An access road from Western Avenue to Mary Star of the Sea High School would be provided in this alternative.

Alternative C would involve development of a project similar to the Proposed Project on the site, however the total number of residential units would be reduced from 1,135 to 830. A total of six different housing product types would be included under Alternative C as shown in the table below:

Alternative A would demolish and remove all existing improvements from the Project Site, but would leave the Property undeveloped. It would avoid most of the Project's impacts and would normally be identified as the Environmentally Superior Alternative. However, CEQA mandates that when a "No Project" alternative is identified as environmentally superior, an additional development alternative should also be identified as "environmentally superior". Alternative C is also deemed the Environmentally Superior alternative in the EIR. The Applicant has accepted Alternative C. It is expected that the City Planning Commission will consider approval of Alternative C instead of the Proposed Project in the EIR.

REQUESTED ACTION: The Deputy Advisory Agency will consider:

1. Pursuant to Section 21082.1(c) of the California Public Resources Code, the adoption of the Certification of Environmental Impact Report, findings, Statement of Overriding Considerations and accompanying mitigation measures and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program for ENV-2005-4516-EIR, SCH No. 2010101082;
2. Pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 17.15, Vesting Tentative Tract Map 71886 for a 244-lot subdivision for 208 single family homes, 404 townhomes and row houses, and 218 apartment units with 1,642 parking spaces and 349 guest parking spaces on a 60.6 net acre site in the R1-1XL and OS-1XL zones.

The City Planning Commission Hearing Officer will consider:

1. Pursuant to Section 11.5.6 of the Municipal Code, a **General Plan Amendment** to the Wilmington-Harbor City Community Plan to change the land use designation from "Low Residential" and "Open Space" to "Low Medium I", "Low Medium II" and "Medium Residential";
2. Pursuant to Section 12.32 of the Municipal Code, a **Zone Change** from R1-1XL and OS-1XL to a Specific Plan zone to be created;
3. Pursuant to Section 11.5.7 of the Municipal Code, the establishment of the Ponte Vista at San Pedro Specific Plan to provide regulatory controls and the systematic execution of the General Plan within the Project area;

The purpose of the hearing is to obtain testimony from affected and/or interested persons regarding this project. The environmental document will be among the matters considered at the hearing. The decision maker will consider all the testimony presented at the hearing, written communication received prior to or at the hearing, and the merits of the project as it relates to existing environmental and land use regulations. After the hearing, the Hearing Officer will prepare a report, including a recommendation, which will be considered by the City Planning Commission at a later date.

EIR CERTIFICATION: An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) has been prepared for this project, as described above, to assess potential environmental impacts. An EIR is comprised of two parts, the Draft EIR and the Final EIR. A Draft EIR was made available and circulated for public review and comment, pursuant to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), for an extended 60-day public review period from November 8, 2012 to January 7, 2013. The Final EIR responds to the comments and includes text revisions to the Draft EIR in response to input received on the Draft EIR. Unlike the Draft EIR, comments on the Final EIR are not required to be responded to by the City. If written comments are received, they will be provided to the Planning Commission as part of the staff report for the project. The EIR will be submitted to the Planning Commission and City Council for requested certification and action on the Project.



SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE

Tunneling continues for the slant drain, which is the furthest downstream section of the drain running from the bluff top to the beach. The tunneling process involves forcing (called "jacking") an 80-inch steel casing into the earth and then digging out the material within the casing using a tunneling machine. Additional casing sections are pushed in behind the lead section as the digging continues towards the beach outlet. The casing will remain in the earth after the digging is complete and support the "hole" through which the 54-inch storm drain pipe will be placed. The two accompanying photos depict the working end of the tunneling machine and the casings, which are lowered into the tunneling pit by crane.



Further upstream, the canyon continues to be filled in preparation for work on the inlet structure. Once the fill material is graded to the proper elevation, large diameter piles will be installed as the foundation for the structure. Excavation for and placement of the piles is expected to begin later this week.

EDCO AND UWS ANNUAL BILLING

Starting last week, RPV residents started receiving their July trash bills. The billing includes the monthly rates and recalculated discounted amount for the annual prepayment option. Additionally, each customer will receive the Council authorized Recycling Rebate and customers are reminded of the 10% senior citizen discount. (See attached EDCO billing insert) Customers will also receive the Recyclers of the Month entry card. Finally, EDCO is pleased to report that now EDCO's on-line customers will also be able to download the entry card.

Staff has updated the PW webpage and included EDCO and UWS's FY 13-14 single and multi-family rates.

4th OF JULY CELEBRATION

The PW Environmental Booth had a steady flow of visitors (over 200 visitors). The handouts included information on storm water pollution prevention (NPDES), Clean Bay Restaurant Program, recycling, sharps/medical waste disposal, HHW/E-Waste roundups, the SAFE centers, etc. Everyone enjoyed taking the "Recycling Quiz". The quizzes were targeted for different age groups with a guarantee of winning a gardening glove, piggy bank, mini recycling bin or coloring book and crayon. Visitors were able to enhance their recycling knowledge at the same time. EDCO also had a booth next door. EDCO representatives answered questions, handed out reusable grocery bags and their mini trash truck was popular with kids.

RPV / PVPLC Receives a Grant

The City and the PVPLC were recently notified by State Parks that we are the recipients of the 2012 Habitat Conservation Fund (HCF) grant for trail and habitat restoration work at the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve. At its October 2, 2012 meeting, the City Council authorized the City and the PVPLC to jointly file the grant application. As described in the October 2nd Staff Report, this grant was originally filed for the 2011 HCF grant cycle but was not recommended for funding at that time and that the application was being resubmitted to cover costs for the following (the responsible entity follows each item):

- Improving the condition of the existing trails for access and connectivity purposes (PVPLC)
- Closing unofficial trails (PVPLC)
- Installing bicycle racks at various locations (RPV)
- Installing mutt mitt stations (RPV)
- Replacing trash bins (RPV)
- Installing, replacing and repairing trail marker signs (PVPLC)
- Installing interpretive signs (PVPLC)
- Installing Reserve gateway signs at key entry points to the Preserve (PVPLC)
- Developing brochures and trails maps for the public's use (PVPLC)
- Developing a phone application to access trail and interpretative information while on a trail (PVPLC)
- Habitat re-vegetation that consists of a combination of seeding with native plant seeds and planting container plants (PVPLC).

The HCF grant requires a 100% matching fund. The total cost for the project components listed above is valued at \$261,600. Based on the terms of the awarded grant, the PVPLC will provide \$120,000 as the matching fund for its components of the project and the City will provide \$10,800 as the matching fund for its components of the project. The City will receive 1% for administration costs totaling \$1,200.
