2013 LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES ANNUAL CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

On July 23, 2013, Staff received advanced notice of the upcoming release of the 2013 League of California Cities Annual Conference Resolutions. There are two (2) resolutions proposed for the consideration of the League General Assembly at the upcoming conference in Sacramento on September 18-20, 2013: one resolution dealing with Water Bond Funds, and the other dealing with Public Safety Realignment. Staff will be analyzing these proposed resolutions and presenting them to the full City Council for consideration at the meeting of August 20, 2013.

ELECTION REPORT NO. 1

Nomination Period

The nomination filing period for the November 5, 2013 General Municipal Election opened on Monday, July 15, 2013 and continues through Friday, August 9, 2013 at 4:30 p.m. If nomination papers for an incumbent officer of the City are not filed by August 9th, the voters have until August 14, 2013 at 5:30 p.m. to nominate other candidates to run for election.

During the first week of the nomination filing period, nomination papers were issued to the following people: Anthony Misetich and Brian Campbell.

CALPERS AND EMPLOYEE PENSIONS

On July 15th, the California Public Employees' Pension System (CalPERS) announced a FY12-13 investment return of 12.5%, which exceeds its 7.5% assumption. The investment return for the 6 months ended June 30, 2013 includes estimates for a portion of the portfolio, and will likely be revised slightly once final numbers are received. Following is a summary of the last 6 fiscal year returns.


FY07-08	-5.1%
FY08-09	-24.8%
FY09-10	13.3%
FY10-11	21.7%
FY11-12	0.1%
FY12-13	12.5%

Due to turnover, 9 of the City's 57 authorized full-time employees will earn a reduced pension benefit formula, compared with other employees that continue to serve the City after the pension reform that was enacted in 2011. The impact is a reduction of the City's employer contribution from 14.66% for 1st Tier employees to an overall employer contribution of 13.62% for FY13-14 (when factoring in the positions with reduced benefit and employer contribution).

ROLLING HILLS SEWER PROJECT

The City of Rolling Hills has built a sanitary sewer line which was connected to Rancho Palos Verdes' system. It is now seeking to expand that line. The section being expanded, or extended, will connect to sewer lines which run through easements in the back yards of properties in Rancho Palos Verdes located along Middlecrest Road then flow is routed through a line on Robinview Lane onto Crenshaw Blvd where it continues to Los Angeles County.

Rancho Palos Verdes is responsible for capacity and content related issues specific to development, so the County of Los Angeles is asking Rancho Palos Verdes to sign improvement plans for the sewer work in Rolling Hills. Staff has been unable to find an agreement which governs the joint use of this sewer line and accordingly are concerned with new State water quality and waste discharge requirements. To this end, Staff is attempting to work with the City of Rolling Hills to develop an agreement (see attached email) which will address issues like sewer overflows and a cost sharing plan for capacity related line upgrades that may be necessary in the future.

COMPLETION OF RYAN PARK RESTROOMS IMPROVEMENTS AND ACCESSIBILITY COMPLIANCE PROJECT.

Construction work at Ryan Park including improvement and ADA compliance of the restrooms, lower parking lot and access ramp is substantially completed. The restrooms will be open for public use starting on Saturday July 27. We thank the residents for their patience with any inconvenience this work may have caused and hope that they will enjoy this beautiful park frequently.

RECYCLERS OF THE MONTH CARDS

In the past three weeks, staff has received approximately 2,100 Recyclers of the Month entry post cards. More are expected in the next few weeks. The new batch of cards will be placed in the recycling drum for the August 6th City Council meeting. The old entry cards will be removed. Last year the City received over 2,650 entry cards hoping for a chance to win \$250. That means close to 20% of the City's single-family households returned their entry cards. There will be 48 lucky winners each year.

Yolanta,

Are you aware of an existing agreement that would govern connections to the existing sewer line in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes? I am not. My concerns with the 3 home project are specific to increased flows through the existing RPV system. As flow is increased through the section of line within RPV and capacity is reduced, through this and other future projects, the requirement within RPV to maintain capacity at acceptable levels is not waived by the State or County, so RPV could potentially be responsible for increasing the size of the existing sewer line in RPV to accommodate sewage which originated in RH. If an agreement exists, it is likely that a discussion about capacity has been addressed, if one does not exist, we should develop one so in the future projects are not delayed while capacity related issues are discussed.

My guess is the County is requiring RPV to sign your plans as an acknowledgement that the capacity is being impacted as indicated in the report so when the system needs to be upsized all agencies acknowledge their financial responsibility. I don't have the authority to authorize even a minimal increase in flow to the system which is generated outside RPV. An agreement between RPV and RH could address these concerns. If you would like to meet to discuss RPV's concerns regarding capacity and brain storm possible solutions, let me know and we will set up a date/time.

Gentlemen, I spoke to Massoud Esfahani from LA County Public Works who has been reviewing this project. We looked at the sewer maps (Operational Maps S-1599 and S-1545) and discussed the route this proposed lines will take. There is practically no residential area that the lines will go through in RPV. The effluent would go through the City's of Rolling Hills lines (Morgan Lane) and then along Crenshaw Blvd to the trunk line. I don't understand what St. Johns Fisher Church or the residential areas of Robinview Lane and Middlecrest have to do with this three lot sewer line. I'm not an engineer, but please let's not blow this out of proportion. We're talking about additional 3 very low density properties.

Ron, please look at the sewer maps and determine what can be done expeditiously. The City of Rolling Hills is anxious for this project to proceed.

At this time I am designing the sewer for three lots, but one person owns two of the lots. However, it was appropriate to show all future lots that could be served in the future. If the City of Rancho Palos Verdes has a sewer area study for its area, then a sewer capacity analysis could be quickly checked. The next quickest way is if the City of RPV has a GIS file that shows the zoning and area of the properties that drain into the system. An expanded sewer area study to encompass all existing and future connections could then be done relatively quickly. The only real flow issue would be St. John Fisher Church, but since they have been doing some expansion, there must be some flow data available from their submittal.

Perhaps there is some way to resolve these issues relatively quickly and inexpensively because already the time and expense for the two homeowners has been significant.



Palos Verdes Nature Preserve – Installation of Preserve Rules Sign

The installation of newly designed Preserve Rules signs has begun! As reported at the March 19th City Council meeting, Preserve Rules signs will be installed at 58 entry points to the Preserve over the coming weeks. The new signs concisely cite the City's regulations to educate visitors on the permitted and prohibited activities in the Preserve (see attachment for actual sign language). Each sign is approximately 30" x 36" in size and will be installed at eye-level to maintain a human scale and to minimize view impacts.

PRESERVE RULES

HOURS: One hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset

PLEASE ABIDE BY THE FOLLOWING:

- Equestrians—stay on designated trails
- Hikers—stay on designated trails and yield to horses
- Cyclists—stay on designated trails and yield to horses and hikers
- Dog walkers—where dogs are permitted, always keep them on leash (maximum of 6 feet) under your command. Clean up after them
- Motorized and non-motorized wheelchairs—allowed
- Place trash and recyclables only in designated containers



THE FOLLOWING IS NOT ALLOWED:

- Creating new trails or damaging existing trails
- Rockets, radio-controlled or motorized models and motorized vehicles
- Smoking, open flames or camping
- Paragliding, hunting or discharge of any weapon(s) including spring/air type
- Nudity
- Removing or damaging any Preserve resources, including animals, plants, rocks, and fossils. Adding any plants or animals
- Defacing or removing signs or barriers
- Reckless use of trails that endangers people or animals

Action Items from June 13, 2013 Meetings

- **Port-o-potty mapping (Emilio/Joel)** – Joel is to receive information from Public Works so that GIS layers can be created.
- **Jim York Permissive Use Agreement (Ara)** - Ara reported the Staff is working out the final details with Mr. York and that this item is now tentatively scheduled for the August 6th Council meeting. The PVPLC will need to receive the Agreement by July 19th for its July 24th Board meeting.
- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up (Ara)** - As previously reported, Ara met with the property owners to discuss a possible License Agreement to allow the public to use the segment of the Peppertree Trail that traverses private property. The property owners indicated an interest in such a License Agreement, but wanted to review it first after the City enters into a similar agreement with Jim York for a trail that traverses his property.
- **Identifying the location of the “walk bikes” signs in the Filiorum Reserve (Danielle)** – The team was informed that the City Attorney has opined that the “walk bike” sign is enforceable per Section 12.16.080 of the RPVMC. Therefore, the City will fabricate new signs unless Andrea confirms whether new signs were already ordered by the PVPLC. The signs will be installed in the areas identified by Danielle, Councilman Knight and Eva Cioria. Ara is going to talk to Ranger Johnson regarding the Sign language.
- **Peppertree area No Trespassing signage (Emilio)** – It was reported that this sign was installed. This item can be removed from the Action Item list.
- **Placement of a “do not proceed onto unpermitted trail” sign at the start of the unauthorized trail that leads down from the overlook area adjacent to Burma Road and a similar sign where the unauthorized trail connects to Burma Road down below (Ara/Emilio)** – This sign has not been installed yet and in light of Emilio leaving the City, City Staff will work with his replacement to have this sign installed as soon as possible.
- **Placement of a “do not proceed onto unpermitted trail” sign at the railing next to the unauthorized trail leading from Del Cerro park (Ara/Emilio)** - This sign has not been installed yet and in light of Emilio leaving the City, City Staff will work with his replacement to have this sign installed as soon as possible.
- **Placement of a “do not proceed into private neighborhood” sign adjacent to Vanderlip Drive (Emilio)** - It was reported that this sign was installed. This item can be removed from the Action Item list.

PVPLC Topics

- **Ongoing trail project update:**
 - **Coastal trail connector with PV Drive (Smuggler’s Cove)** – This project is slated to commence in Fall.
- **Agua Amarga Reserve Encroachments (Danielle/Joel)** – The PVPLC is planning on sending letters to the Preserve adjacent property owners.
- **Preserve Decal Replacement** – The PVPLC has the new decals and will begin the installation process the week of July 15th.
- **Volunteer Trail Watch Update** – Orientation occurred on June 29th and the next training sessions are scheduled for Saturday, July 13th and Saturday, July 20th. There are approximately 25 volunteers for this round that are still going through the training process and completing paperwork, etc.
- **Annual Report Update** – Andrea reported that the 3-year Restoration Plan and the Annual Report is being reviewed by the Wildlife Agencies. Joel will circulate the 3-year Restoration Plan amongst the City Departments for comments.
- **Abalone Cove Restoration Grant(s)** – The team discussed the various grants awarded to the PVPLC for trail and habitat restoration at Abalone Cove including the U.S. Fish and Wildlife grant for \$10,000. The required Landowner Agreement will be reviewed by the Council and the Successor Agency at its August 6th meeting.
- **2012 HCF Grant Approved** – The City and the PVPLC were recently informed that they are the recipients of the 2012 HCF grant for trail and habitat restoration improvements in the Preserve. Ara will update the Council of the grant award in the upcoming Weekly Report.
- **San Ramon Eagle Scout project** – Andrea reported that the project is still in the design phase and more information is pending.

City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison litigation status update (RPV)** – The City and the PVPLC were recently notified that the July 15th case has been vacated. Further information is pending in regards to a new trial date
- **Edison Poles Update** – SCE is in the process of installing avian protection devices on 18 power poles throughout the Preserve. The installation was coordinated with the PVPLC.

Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project Update** – The project staging area is off PVDE at the switchbacks and construction continues to move forward. Ara reported that he will be working with Ron from public works to identify a trail route to hopefully connect San Ramon to Friendship Park. The plant palette for revegetation is being reviewed and provided by the PVPLC.
- **GIS overlays:**
 - **Dewatering wells (Public works)** - this item was tabled until funding can be identified to cover the associated costs of creating a GIS layer with this information.
- **Crenshaw Red Curb Project** – Ara reported that Public works is taking an item to the City Council on July 16th to consider restricting parking on the north side of Crenshaw because of safety concerns raised by the public, especially surrounding property owners. The City is also in the process of designing a new Preserve parking lot off PVDS in the area of Gateway Park
- **Bollard removal at PVIC (Emilio)** - Work is scheduled to be completed in the coming weeks.
- **Fountain grass at Ladera Linda** - The LACC removed the fountain grass located behind the yellow gate along Forrestal Drive as part of the City's fuel modification work. It was suggested that some removal occur in the area of the PVDS and PVDE intersection.
- **Portuguese Bend Reserve Eucalyptus Tree** - The PVPLC previously reported that the burned trees from the 2009 fire near the water tank appear to be unstable and asked for the City Arborist to determine what should be done. Based on the City Arborist's assessment, two trees will be dropped within the coming weeks.
- **Vista del Norte Reserve Fuel Modification** – Staff determined that the recent fuel modification work was conducted by the County with the City's authorization. The team reviewed the Fuel Modification map overlays on the City's GIS system and stressed the importance if City or County crews adhering to the approved fuel modification areas within the Preserve.

Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy's Volunteer Trail Watch

The Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy's (PVPLC) Volunteer Trail Watch Program is progressing successfully. Approximately 25 volunteer candidates completed their third day of training last Saturday, July 20th, and are scheduled to graduate at the PVPLC annual picnic this Saturday, July 27th.

Volunteer Trail Watch members will monitor the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve, focusing on the Portuguese Bend, Forrestal, and Filiorum Reserves. They will observe and report, and their presence will enhance visitors' Preserve experience by providing interpretive information, Preserve rules information, assisting with way finding, and suggesting interesting routes. The volunteers are comprised mostly of hikers, but also include mountain bikers and equestrians.
