**40TH ANNIVERSARY WRAP-UP**

The FY12-13 Budget provided \$40,000 for the City's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. As previously reported to Council, the Anniversary Gala at Terranea on May 5<sup>th</sup> had a total expenditure of \$14,153.88 (which included a \$5,000 donation to two non-profit organizations). The 40th Anniversary enhancements to the City's 2013 Fourth of July Celebration (which had its own \$25,000 budget) had a total expenditure of \$4,232.45. This left a balance of \$21,613.37 for the final 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event – the Founders Reception at Trump National.

The September 7<sup>th</sup> Founders Reception was a great success! Approximately 90 guests, including many City Founders, current and former Council Members, Committee and Commission Members and other honored guests enjoyed a celebration of the City's historic 1973 incorporation. Invitees were free; guests were \$20. Highlights included a lively RPV TV panel discussion with former Mayors Ann Shaw, Ken Dyda and the City's first City Manager, Len Wood; tributes from all five Council members; displays of historical memorabilia; and recognition of three influential City Founders, Betty Field Strauss, Barbara Gleghorn and Dena Friedson.

The expenses related to the Founders Reception are listed below:

Deducting the total cost of the Founders Reception leaves a remaining balance in the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary budget of \$17,134.97. The costs of the three 40<sup>th</sup> events are shown below:

The City was able to offer the community three outstanding event to celebrate the City's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, while staying well under the established budget. The remaining balance will be returned to the General fund at the end of the fiscal year.

### **STATUS OF AB 66 (MURATSUCHI)**

As we reported last week, Assembly Bill No. 66 (AB 66) is now headed for Governor Brown's desk (see attachment), where the action deadline is October 13, 2013. Staff will continue to monitor and report on the status of AB 66 in the future.

In related matter, you are probably aware—perhaps from personal experience—of the major Southern California Edison (SCE) outage that occurred this past Sunday morning, affecting 115,000 residents, mostly in the South Bay. SCE reported that more than 6,200 customers in Rancho Palos Verdes lost power during the outage, some for several hours. Senator Ted Lieu and Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi were each quoted as being highly critical of SCE in articles that subsequently appeared in the *Los Angeles Times* and the *Torrance Daily Breeze* (see attachments). Assemblymember Muratsuchi—who introduced AB 66 with our City's sponsorship—also reportedly announced that he is arranging a meeting between South Bay mayors and the president of the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) on October 11, 2013. Mayor Brooks has been invited to attend this meeting.

### **STATUS OF SB 556 (CORBETT)**

On September 11, 2013, Senate Bill No. 556 (SB 556) was placed in the State Assembly's "inactive file." As a reminder, SB 556 (as most recently amended) would prohibit private contractors providing services "relating to public health or safety" from displaying a public agency logo on vehicles or uniforms without an accompanying disclosure. Previously-proposed language regulating the location and font size of these "conspicuous disclosures" and applying to transit-related service providers has been removed from SB 556 during committee and floor debate in the Assembly.

According to the Office of the Chief Clerk of the State Assembly, the "inactive file" is:

"[the] portion of the Daily File containing legislation that is ready for Floor consideration, but, for a variety of reasons, is dormant. An author may move a bill to the Inactive File if they wish to take it up at a later date. Once a bill is on the Inactive File, it requires one day's public notice to place it back on the daily agenda."

At this point, it does not appear that SB 556 will be taken up again by the Assembly in the current session. Staff will continue to monitor and report on the status of SB 556 in the future.

**FILMING ACTIVITY ON PALOS VERDES DRIVE SOUTH ON SEPTEMBER 24<sup>TH</sup>**

The City has received a film permit application that involves a driving shot on Palos Verdes Drive South on Tuesday, September 24<sup>th</sup> between Schooner Drive and Palos Verdes Drive South. Filming within the roadway will only be permitted between the hours of 9:30 AM and 2:00 PM so as to avoid peak morning and afternoon commute times. The "base camp" for the production will be located on private property at Trump National Golf Club. Intermittent traffic control will be provided by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, and the Public Works Department has confirmed that this filming activity will not conflict with construction activity for the San Ramon Canyon or California Coastal Trail projects. Motorists should expect brief delays on Palos Verdes Drive South during filming hours next Tuesday.

## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

An act to add Section 2774.1 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to electricity.

## LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 66, Muratsuchi. Electricity: system reliability.

Under existing law, the Public Utilities Commission has regulatory authority over public utilities, including electrical corporations, as defined. The Public Utilities Act authorizes the commission to ascertain and fix just and reasonable standards, classifications, regulations, practices, measurements, or service to be furnished, imposed, observed, and followed by specified public utilities, including all electrical corporations. If the commission finds after a hearing that the rules, practices, equipment, appliances, facilities, or service of any public utility, or of the methods of manufacture, distribution, transmission, storage, or supply employed by the public utility, are unjust, unreasonable, unsafe, improper, inadequate, or insufficient, the act requires that the commission determine and, by order or rule, fix the rules, practices, equipment, appliances, facilities, service, or methods to be observed, furnished, constructed, enforced, or employed. Under existing law, a violation of the Public Utilities Act or any order, decision, rule, direction, demand, or requirement of the commission is a crime.

This bill would require the commission to require an electrical corporation to include in annual reliability reports, required by a specified decision of the commission, that are due after July 1, 2014, information on the reliability of service to end use customers that identifies the frequency and duration of interruptions in services and indicates areas with both the most frequent and longest outages, using local areas determined by the commission. The bill would require the commission to use the information to require cost-effective remediation of reliability deficiencies if the report, or more than one report, identifies repeated deficiencies in the same local area and would authorize the commission to suspend this requirement upon specified findings. The bill would require the electrical corporations to conspicuously post their annual

reports on their Internet Web site. Because a violation of any order, decision, rule, direction, demand, or requirement of the commission is a crime, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program by expanding the definition of a crime.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 2774.1 is added to the Public Utilities Code, to read:

2774.1. (a) (1) The commission shall require an electrical corporation to include in an annual reliability report, required pursuant to Decision 96-09-045, as amended, or a decision that supersedes Decision 96-09-045, information on the reliability of service to end use customers that identifies, but is not limited to, the frequency and duration of interruptions in services. This information shall indicate areas with both the most frequent and longest outages, using local areas determined by the commission. The commission, in consultation with the electrical corporation, shall ensure that the geographical boundaries of local areas do not split up circuits for reporting purposes, if the electrical corporation aggregates data by circuits. The information shall be sufficiently aggregated to both maintain electrical system security, and be of use and relevance to affected customers of the electrical corporation.

(2) Before July 1, 2014, the commission shall determine the local areas for the purposes of paragraph (1).

(3) The requirements of paragraph (1) shall apply to annual reports due after July 1, 2014.

(4) The electrical corporation shall conspicuously post on its Internet Web site the annual report required pursuant to Decision 96-09-045, as amended, or a decision that supersedes Decision 96-09-045.

(b) (1) The commission shall use the information contained in an electrical corporation's annual reliability report to require

cost-effective remediation of reliability deficiencies if the report, or more than one report, identifies repeated deficiencies in the same local area as determined by the commission pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (a). In requiring cost-effective remediation, the commission shall consult with the electrical corporation and consider mitigating factors that may impede an electrical corporation from implementing required cost-effective remediation, including, but not limited to, local permitting matters or other events or conditions or public policy considerations that may present higher priority safety or reliability issues.

(2) The commission may suspend the requirements of paragraph (1) if the commission finds that expenditures by the electrical corporation to comply with that paragraph are not justified or that the remediation measures undertaken by the electrical corporation are not effective at improving reliability.

(c) (1) The commission may order an electrical corporation to make more frequent trend analyses of local area service reliability and to make those analyses publicly available.

(2) The information made publicly available shall provide sufficient confidentiality for purposes of protecting electrical system security.

(3) The commission may make those analyses publicly available.

SEC. 2. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature in adding Section 2774.1 to the Public Utilities Code, that the required system reliability information be included in the annual report required by the Public Utilities Commission in Decision 96-09-045 (September 4, 1996), while preserving the discretion of the commission to modify an electrical corporation's reporting requirements.

(b) It is the further intent of the Legislature to require an annual reliability report to include and differentiate both sustained outages and momentary outages, as defined by the Public Utilities Commission.

SEC. 3. No reimbursement is required by this act pursuant to Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution because the only costs that may be incurred by a local agency or school district will be incurred because this act creates a new crime or infraction, eliminates a crime or infraction, or changes the penalty for a crime or infraction, within the meaning of Section 17556 of the Government Code, or changes the definition of a crime within

the meaning of Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution.

## South Bay lawmakers call for better reliability from Edison after weekend power outage

A widespread power outage in the South Bay over the weekend prompted renewed calls Monday for Southern California Edison to improve its reliability.

“Yesterday’s outage was really the tipping point,” said state Sen. Ted Lieu, D-Torrance. “Five years ago Edison had committed to fixing the power outage problem. We realized it was not going to happen overnight, that it would take several years to fix, but five years is more than enough.”

About 115,000 customers were affected by the weekend outage that hit at about 7:05 a.m. Sunday. While many customers had power restored within a couple of hours, others weren’t brought back on line until 4 p.m.

Edison spokesman David Song said an investigation is ongoing into the incident.

The immediate cause was downed lines at 190th Street near Crenshaw Boulevard in Torrance, but officials are still looking into why the lines went down.

“We may not know for days or weeks,” Song said, “and, unfortunately, in some situations we may never know.”

The outage affected customers in Torrance, the Palos Verdes Peninsula and parts of San Pedro, Gardena, Lomita and Redondo Beach.

“We woke up to it,” said Marlea Ramsey, who lives in north Torrance. “The whole neighborhood was out — we had no television, no nothing. My husband had to read the paper in the front yard.”

Due to the ongoing Edison repairs, only two eastbound lanes and one westbound lane of traffic on 190th from Crenshaw to Van Ness Avenue were open on Monday, and officials said traffic would continue to be affected until about 12:30 p.m. Tuesday.

State Assemblyman Al Muratsuchi, D-Torrance, who has targeted Edison in a piece of his legislation, also woke up to no power in his Torrance home on Sunday.

His Assembly Bill 66 — awaiting the governor’s signature due by Oct. 13 — would require electric utilities to report on the frequency and length of power outages, giving the state Public Utilities Commission the authority to require companies to fix problems causing repeated outages.

“This was just the latest in a long string of power outages from Manhattan Beach to Torrance to Palos Verdes,” Muratsuchi said. “This just highlights the need for Edison to upgrade its equipment.”

The freshman lawmaker scheduled an Oct. 11 meeting between the chairman of the PUC and South Bay mayors to discuss the problems.

In a Sept. 15 letter to Theodore F. Craver Jr., chairman and president of Southern California Edison, Lieu

called on the utility to “fix these power outage problems immediately.”

He requested the utility to “provide your plan as to how Edison intends to fix immediately the massive, recurring and unacceptable power outages in the South Bay.”

Edison is “preparing detailed responses to his questions,” said Edison Project Manager Lauren Bartlett in a written statement.

Bartlett cited an ongoing, \$1 billion systemwide infrastructure upgrade now underway, with “numerous infrastructure projects in the South Bay area of Los Angeles planned.”

Muratsuchi said it’s difficult to know whether Edison’s response is sufficient so far.

“This issue was first brought to my attention by the mayor and City Council of Rancho Palos Verdes when they emphasized to me that they’d had over 100 unscheduled outages from 2008 to 2011,” Muratsuchi said. “Ever since then, we’ve seen this pattern of outages from the beach cities to Torrance to the Peninsula. It’s affected businesses at peak hours, it’s obviously affected residents and it’s also affected public safety with traffic lights going out and power going out at police and fire stations.”

According to Muratsuchi’s AB 66, cities on the Palos Verdes Peninsula have been hit with an average of 26 power outages a year.

In Lieu’s letter to the Edison president, he referenced his draft legislation from five years ago that threatened to make utilities liable for monetary damages from power outages if three or more occurred in the same area within a year.

At the time, Lieu said, Edison officials committed to “fix the problem.”

“I trusted Edison’s word and did not introduce legislation ...” he said in the letter to Craver.

“I’m disappointed that they use the same excuses — palm fronds, metallic balloons and weather,” Lieu said in a telephone interview Monday. “Palm trees grow all over Southern California but other cities keep their lights on.”

Lieu said some improvements were made.

“I believe El Segundo is better than it was five years ago,” he said.

But other areas continue to be hit with outages, he said, causing economic loss.

He said the problem is a “failure to invest in equipment and infrastructure. ... They can’t just keep blaming this on acts of nature.”

In June, Manhattan Beach officials demanded answers from Edison after a three-hour outage on June 1 that closed businesses and affected more than 3,000 customers in and around the downtown, along with the City Hall and police and fire buildings.

“I think it’s an unacceptable level of service from a utility provider,” City Manager Dave Carmany said at the time. “They can’t seem to keep the lights on and that’s their business. There’s always a story (like) the

marine salt air” causing the problems.

“I think it comes down to money,” Carmany said. “They haven’t invested in infrastructure.”

Earlier this year, Edison began an upgrade to improve the electrical infrastructure in Rancho Palos Verdes.

“The utility will make about \$50 million in upgrades over five years in Rancho Palos Verdes, Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Hills and Rolling Hills Estates,” Bartlett wrote.

Included are upgrades of a distribution circuit, she said, adding that the utility already has replaced about 150 poles, 57 transformers and nearly three miles of overhead power lines in Rancho Palos Verdes.

## **Senator blasts Edison over latest South Bay blackout**

A state senator is demanding that Southern California Edison come up with a plan to fix advertisement what he calls “massive, recurring and unacceptable power outages” in the South Bay after a widespread weekend blackout left more than 100,000 residents without power.

Residents and city leaders in the region have long complained about what they deem chronic power outages in the South Bay. The weekend blackout was the largest outage in Edison's service area since the devastating 2011 windstorms in San Gabriel Valley.

“In addition to causing disruption in homes, these outages have also hurt numerous businesses,” wrote state Sen. Ted Lieu (D-Torrance) in a letter to the utility.

In his letter, Lieu asked Edison to provide information about infrastructure improvements it has completed in the last five years, as well as a plan to fix ongoing power outages in the South Bay.

Edison officials said they had received Lieu's letter and are preparing a response. They did not say what the response would be.

Lieu told the Times he has fielded complaints about blackouts since 2008, when as an assemblyman he proposed legislation that would have penalized utility companies if three or more outages occurred in the same area within a year.

After a series of meetings with Edison's executives, Lieu said, the energy provider promised to fix the problem, and he dropped the proposed legislation.

“It has now been five years, and the problem has not been fixed,” Lieu wrote. “Edison’s continued denial of the scope of the problem, reliance on outdated excuses and failure to honor its word has been deeply troubling.”

The senator added that his office is reconsidering his 2008 proposal to enact penalties on utility companies and will also look into whether the state’s Public Utilities Commission could use its authority to levy fines directly.

The utility acknowledged the inconvenience of the weekend blackout and had quickly mobilized workers to respond to the incident.

Sunday’s outage, which lasted about seven hours, occurred when downed lines knocked out a power substation in Torrance, affecting the cities of Torrance, Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, South

Redondo Beach, northwest San Pedro and Lomita. The cause is still under investigation, the company said.

Officials with Southern California Edison have attributed past outages to a variety of causes, including metallic balloons, palm fronds and corrosion from the salty sea air in the coastal cities.

“Those excuses have worn thin,” said Manhattan Beach City Manager Dave Carmany, who said other coastal cities with similar conditions don’t seem to have problems keeping the lights on.

“It’s not acceptable to have this number and frequency of unplanned outages,” said Carmany, who added that the city’s fire and police stations have had to run on generator power during outages, and police officers have worked overtime to quell traffic problems because of downed signals.

The company announced a \$2.2-million initiative to replace distribution infrastructure in Rancho Palos Verdes in March and has said it is planning to invest \$1 billion over the next two years to improve the grid’s reliability systemwide.

Another measure to hold power companies accountable was passed last week and is awaiting the governor’s signature.

The measure, authored by South Bay state Assemblyman Al Muratsuchi (D-Torrance) would require utility firms to publish the frequency, size and duration of power outages annually.

The governor has until October to sign the bill into law.

### **SAN RAMON CANYON PROJECT UPDATE**

The contractor continues to work this week on the rib and lag (upper) tunnel. So far, about 100 feet of this tunnel has been excavated. Typical start-up “bugs” are being worked out and the contractor expects to achieve production rates 40 to 50 feet per day after the start-up period. If these rates can be reached, the rib and lag portion should be completed late this year.

Further up the canyon, the contractor is installing the rip rap channel lining onto the restored canyon floor. This channel will serve to direct any flows in the canyon through the fill area while preventing erosion in the streambed. After the rip rap is installed, the bare areas will be hydro-seeded with an approved binder and seed mix. When grown, the plants will further serve to stabilize the canyon walls and prevent erosion.



City Staff hosted a tour of the site for LA City Staff this week. No less than a dozen employees of LA’s Bureau of Engineering, Bureau of Sanitation, the Office of Councilmember Buscaino and the Office of Mayor Garcetti were in attendance. The group spent about an hour walking the site with RPV Staff, learning about the permitting requirements, design features and construction progress of the project.

## **RPV CALIFORNIA COASTAL TRAIL (CCT) PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

The City's contractor has completed placement of Decomposed Granite (DG) over the trail surface and installation of the irrigation system at landscaping areas (parkways). Soil preparation in landscaping areas is underway for plants to be installed in October.


The City's segment of the CCT extends the entire length of the City's coastline between the boundary lines of the City of Palos Verdes Estates and the City of Los Angeles. The total length of the RPV segment of the CCT is approximately 9 miles.

This project will improve 2.5 miles of this segment. The rest of the trail length has either been improved previously or is part of the naturally compacted surface trails which exist in the City's Preserve.



**UPDATE ON ANNUAL SIDEWALK REPAIR PROJECT CONSTRUCTION**

The contractor completed repairs in the northern portion of the City and then moved to the south-western portion of the City this week, performing sidewalk repairs at several locations on Beechgate Dr, Delacroix Rd, Golden Arrow Dr, Rue De La Pierre, and Via Rivera. Some new concrete sidewalk panels have already been poured, and the remaining locations on these streets will be poured at the end of this week. The contractor will continue to perform repairs on Via Rivera next week, as well as on Via Borica.



**Fall Junior Ranger Program**


