MEETING WITH CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION PRESIDENT

As Staff reported in last week’s Weekly Administrative Report, 66th District Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi, Mayor Susan Brooks and other South Bay officials from Manhattan Beach, Torrance, Hermosa Beach and SBCCOG met with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) President Michael Peevey on Friday, October 11, 2013. Assemblymember Muratsuchi, Mayor Brooks and the other South Bay officials expressed their concerns and frustrations with the safety and reliability of Southern California Edison (SCE) electrical service in the South Bay.

Assemblymember Muratsuchi noted that Governor Brown had signed his Assembly Bill No. 66 (AB 66) earlier this month, thereby increasing reporting and monitoring requirements for outages by electrical utility providers starting in July 2014. He also pointed out that, from 2008 to 2010, SCE had spent substantially less than it was authorized to spend on the maintenance of overhead distribution lines and poles.

President Peevey—a Southern California resident and former president of SCE—expressed his empathy with the concerns of the South Bay communities. He was also very interested in learning if the trend in SCE operating and maintenance expenditures had continued since 2010. CPUC Executive Director Paul Clanon and Energy Division Director Ed Randolph (participating from San Francisco via teleconference) indicated that they would work with President Peevey and SBCCOG to help “escalate” the South Bay’s issues to the attention of higher levels of management at SCE. A follow-up meeting is anticipated in a month or so.

NORTHWEST SAN PEDRO NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL PLANNING & LAND USE COMMITTEE MEETING REGARDING *PONTE VISTA* PROJECT THIS WEEKEND

WEEKLY UPDATE REGARDING CONVERSION FOR AGRICULTURAL USE AT POINT VICENTE PARK

With the Federal government shutdown still in effect, Staff has been unable to consult further with the National Park Service's (NPS) David Siegenthaler about the next steps in the conversion process. In the meantime, however, Staff is moving forward on the following related issues:

- Under the City Attorney's direction, the City's appraiser is beginning the process of preparing an appraisal of the 5.5-acre farm site at Point Vicente Park; and,
- Staff is working to identify potential replacement property for acquisition, using as a starting point an open space acquisition "wish list" developed in conjunction with the draft 2004 Parks, Recreation and Open Space Strategic Plan (which was not adopted by the City Council).

CITY HALL CLEAN UP DAY – NOVEMBER 11TH

There are a few holidays throughout the year when most government offices are closed, but that are not paid holidays for our City staff. One such holiday is Veterans Day, which falls on Monday, November 11th. This holiday tends to be very quiet, because most people expect City Hall to be closed. In the past, we have used this holiday as a City Hall Clean-Up Day and I am proposing to do the same this year. On this day, City Hall offices would be closed to the public, but the staff would still report to work and use the uninterrupted time to clean and organize their files and work areas. Clean up days provide an opportunity for the staff to get to those "housekeeping" projects that we never seem to have the time to tackle during our normal workday schedule. Because it is a legal holiday as defined in the Municipal Code and no construction work is allowed to take place; however, the City will still be conducting building inspections. If any Council member has an objection to Veterans Day being used as Clean-Up Day, please let me know by Monday, October 28th.

South Bay officials huddle with PUC chief over frequent power outages

Assemblyman Al Muratsuchi, D-Torrance, and a group of city officials met with the president of the California Public Utilities Commission on Friday to discuss the frequent power outages in the South Bay and how the problems might be solved.

Muratsuchi's Assembly Bill 66, signed by the governor last week, gives the PUC authority to direct utilities to remediate persistent outages and to publicly report those outages based on frequency and duration.

There have been numerous outages in the area — the latest Thursday evening in west Torrance — which have prompted Southern California Edison to make infrastructure improvements.

Attending the meeting with Muratsuchi and PUC President Michael Peevey were Rancho Palos Verdes Mayor Susan Brooks, Manhattan Beach Mayor David Lesser, Hermosa Beach Councilman Peter Tucker, Torrance Public Works Director Rob Beste, Hermosa Beach City Manager Tom Bakaly and South Bay Cities Council of Governments Executive Director Jacki Bacharach.

NEW MAINTENANCE SUPERINTENDANT

Public Works is pleased to announce that Chris Ortiz has joined the City as RPV's Maintenance Superintendent. Previously, Chris worked for over 29 years at the City of Bell Gardens. Chris started his work with that City as a part-time maintenance worker, and steadily moved up the ranks to full-time worker, lead worker, and finally to various maintenance related supervisory positions. He has significant experience with parks maintenance (landscaping, irrigation), facilities, streets and right of way maintenance (including weed, graffiti and litter abatement, pothole repairs), tree trimming/removal/replacement, special event setup, contract administration and much more. Chris hopes to be a vital member of the team and be the new "go to person". He is looking forward to this new and exciting chapter in his professional life. If you see Chris, please stop, say "hi" and welcome him to the City.

UWS'S BUNDLED GREEN WASTE COLLECTION

At the 10/1/513 City Council meeting, during discussions on item 2, the City's current regulations for trash container placement, Councilman Knight raised the question of bundled green waste collection. Staff checked the City's agreement with Universal Waste Systems (UWS) regarding the placement of tied bundles in the Portuguese Bend area that has exclusively manual backyard collection services. Under Section 4.4.2, (attached), tied bundles and bundled green waste can be placed in the backyard. Staff also contacted the UWS senior management. They confirmed that UWS does collect bundles from both the backyard and curbside, depending on where their customers place the material. However, they do not restrict where the bundles can be placed. Furthermore, for further clarification purposes, UWS will prepare an article for quarterly newsletter informing/reminding their customers of the backyard collection.

Contractor shall only be obligated to Collect Green Waste set out for Collection in bundles if it is tied and bundled and a maximum of four (4) feet long and eighteen (18) inches in diameter. Contractor may request Customer to call in unusually large Green Waste loads in advance, and shall promote brush clearing in accordance with events held per Section 4.4.4, but will Collect all material properly set out for Collection.

Customers may request one additional Cart at no additional charge. Residents with carts beyond two per dwelling unit may be charged in accordance with the Rate Schedule.

Customers may select a 35 or 96-gallon cart. The 96-gallon cart shall be the default in the event that a size is not selected. See Section 4.6.4.1 for Cart selection procedures.



4.4.2 Green Waste Collection for Manual Collection Customers

Contractor shall Collect Green Waste from Contractor-provided 32-gallon wheeled Containers with unattached lids, as well as unlimited Green Waste tied and bundled as set forth in Section 4.4.1 above, placed at the same Collection location as Customer-provided Refuse Containers, once per week from Manual Collection Customers. Contractor shall provide a sufficient number of Containers to each Customer to meet each Customer's individual needs.

4.4.3 Holiday Tree Collection Program

At no additional charge, Contractor shall operate an annual holiday tree Collection program from December 26 through January 22. During this period all holiday trees placed out for Collection by Cart and Bin Customers, and Manual Collection Customers, on Customer's regular Collection Days, at Customer's Collection location for Refuse Container Collection, shall be Collected by Contractor. After this period, trees will be Collected as Bulky Items under Section 1.5. Trees up to seven (7) feet in length will be Collected and diverted without Customers needing to cut them. Contractor may request that Customers with larger trees cut the trees to pieces no longer than seven (7) feet. Contractor will divert all holiday trees from landfilling.

Upon request of the Owner or property manager, provided Customer's property has sufficient space, Contractor shall place a Roll-Off Box at Multi-Family complexes for the Collection of holiday trees to be diverted.

**PVPLC/RPV Preserve Management Team
October 3, 2013 Meeting Minutes**

Attendance

Ara Mhrianian, Joel Rojas, Cory Linder,Carolynn Petru, Danielle LeFer, Andrea Vona, Juan Pintor, and Bindu Vaish.

Action Items from August 2013 Meeting

- **Port-o-potty mapping (Juan)** - Joel reported that he received the location information from Juan and will be forwarding the information to the City's GIS consultant so that a GIS layer can be created.
- **Jim York Permissive Use Agreement (Ara)** – It was reported that City and PVPLC Staff met with Mr. York and the Mayor at the site to tour the trail in question and to address Mr. York's concerns with the text of the Agreement. At this time, there appears to be an impasse regarding the Agreement that may be addressed with a realignment of the trail proposed by the PVPLC to minimize the steepness of the trail. Another site visit with Mr. York is planned for later this month.
- **Peppertree area Trail Easement follow-up (Ara)** - As previously reported, the property owners have indicated an interest in entering into a License Agreement to allow a portion of the Peppertree Trail to traverse their private property but this item remains on hold until the outcome of the trail use agreement with Jim York is resolved.
- **Installation of "Walk bikes" signs at Filiorum Reserve (Ara)** - The City is fabricating new signs that establish a "walk bike only zone" across the three canyon crossings noted in the Council adopted PTP and identified by Danielle, Councilman Knight and Eva Cicoria. The signs will include the Code sections and will likely be installed at the end of the month.
- **Packsaddle trail "No Trespassing Sign"** – The sign has been ordered and installation is pending.

PVPLC Topics

- **Ongoing trail project update:**
 - **Coastal trail connector with PV Drive (Smuggler's Cove)** - This project is slated to commence on October 21st with the assistance of the LACC along with the restoration work at AbaloneCove.
- **Coastal Cleanup Day Follow-up** – The event was well attended and reported to be quite successful.
- **Preserve Rules Sign**
 - **Coolheights Trail (Forrestal)** – Ara reported that the City received a complaint from a neighbor that the sign was in his dining-room window's view, so the sign was relocated further downslope as suggested by the neighbor.
 - **Intrepid (Forrestal)** – The PVPLC requested an additional sign be installed adjacent to the Intrepid Trail. Additional signs need to be ordered.
 - **Calle Entradero (Vicente Bluffs)** – The team agreed that the sign located on Calle Entradero off the PVDS intersection should be relocated to the parking lot area after the Coastal Trails Map sign is installed. This is to become an action item.
- **Preserve Decal Replacement** – The PVPLC will be replacing the decals at Abalone Cove this month.
- **Volunteer Trail Watch Update** – The program continues to move forward. It was reported that a new manual on how to operate the web portal is being prepared.
- **Annual Report Update** – This item was originally scheduled for the October 15th City Council meeting, but since the Wildlife Agencies were not able to provide the PVPLC with their comments before the federal government shut down, this item is now tentatively schedule for the November 6th City Council meeting. Ara requested 9 electronic copies and 1 hard copy as he would like to transmit the Annual Report to the Council and the public at least 15 days in advance of the City Council meeting.
- **Abalone Cove Restoration Project** – It was reported that work will first occur at Alta Vicente and Portuguese Bend Reserves before moving to Abalone Cove, which is likely to occur in the coming week.
- **Abalone Cove Trail and Trail Signs** – It was reported that a portion of the Smugglers Cove Trail leading to the ocean is washed out and needs to be repaired. Additionally, some trail markers need to be replaced and carsonite signs installed.
- **Grant Contracts / Agreements To Be Provided to City Clerk:**
 - **HCF 2012** – Ara will provide the City Clerk with a copy of the fully executed grant contract.
 - **Coastal Program Grant** – Danielle will provide the City Clerk with a fully executed copy of the grant contract once she receives a copy from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service noting that the agency is currently closed due to the federal government shut-down.
- **Volunteer Trail Crew Cave Trail Repair** – It was reported that drainage work commenced on the trail and will be completed within the next few weeks.
- **Squirrel traps at Abalone Cove** – It was requested that the City explore other options for trapping squirrels and to ensure that adequate "do not feed the wildlife" signs exist at Abalone Cove.

City Manager Topics

- **2009 Edison litigation status update (RPV)** - No new information has been received and the City and the PVPLC are still waiting for the new trial date.
- **Edison Poles update** – It was reported that Marvin Jackmon attended the October 1st City Council meeting to update the Council on matters pertaining to SCE, but didn't talk much on the Preserve. It was agreed that Matt would ask Mr. Jackmon if he can provide a map identifying the 18 poles that were modified with the avian devices and to ask how many poles exist in the Preserve.

Public Works Topics

- **San Ramon Stabilization Project Update** – Bindu reported that tunnel drilling was complete. The team also discussed that the plant palette for the re-vegetation is different than what the PVPLC reviewed and approved. Bindu and Danielle will consult with Ron and Andy.
- **GIS overlays:**
 - **Dewatering wells (Public works)** - It was agreed to table this item until funding can be identified to cover the associated costs of creating a GIS layer with this information
- **Bollard removal at PVIC (Juan)** – This project was completed.
- **Portuguese Bend Reserve Eucalyptus Tree** – The work is scheduled to occur the second week in October and will be coordinated with the PVPLC.
- **Cave Trail: remove railing for trail access** – The team requested that Juan look at creating an opening in the split-rail fence to allow access to the Cave Trail. It was also requested that the railing removed be repurposed to create a barrier closing off an unauthorized trail leading to PVDS.
- **Calwater trail damage on Burma road** - The PVPLC requested that Public Works engage Calwater to cover costs associated with the trail damage caused by discharge from one of their pipes. This is now an Action Item.
- **Irrigation Leakage at North Spur Trail** – This issue was repaired.
- **Trail signage at City Hall for Alta Vicente/Nike Trail** – Vegetation was removed by the City improving the visibility of the Preserve trails from the civic center grounds.
- **PVDS Road Realignment Project Update** – As previously reported, Ara updated the team on this Council funded CIP project. He pointed out how the parking lot project is part of the scope of work and that Public Works will be conducting a public workshop. At this time, the meeting will likely occur towards the end of October or beginning of November. Public notification will be given.

RPV Planning Topics

- **RPV / PVPLC Public Forum November 20th Meeting** - The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 20th and Ara has posted the date on the City's website and issued a notice to interested parties. The agenda will be posted on the City's website in advance of the meeting.
- **NCCP/IA (Joel)** – Joel reported that there will be slight delays due to the federal government shut-down. He indicated that the City continues to explore removing the 40-acre parcel formally owned by the RDA which contains the archery club from the Preserve for various reasons and adding more of the Gateway Park area into the Preserve. He added that the Planning Commission is currently reviewing the proposed General Plan designation for Gateway Park and will discuss this next at its October 22nd meeting.
- **Conservation Easement Update** - The final language is still under review by the City, PVPLC, and Wildlife Agencies.
- **Malaga and Windport Canyon Purchase Agreement Update** – Joel reported that the Council approved the Purchase Agreement at its October 1st meeting for Malaga Canyon and affirmed that this property is not eligible as a conversion property for purposes of allowing the Hatano farming to continue at Alta Vicente Reserve. Acquisition of the Windport Canyon property is not being pursued because the City did not receive a response from the property owners.
- **Abalone Cove Park Improvement Grant** – Ara reported that the construction bids will go out towards the end of the month.
- **California Coastal Trail Update** – Construction continues with planting scheduled to occur within the coming week. Ara continues to work on the trails maps and the interpretive panels.
- **City wide Park Signage Inventory Update** – The team continues to work on the City Park and Preserve Sign Master Plan. The next meeting is scheduled for this morning and will focus on the signs at Abalone Cove.
- **Geologic Investigation at Filiorum** – Joel reported that there is a proposed geologic investigation drilling on the Filiorum Reserve related to the development on the adjacent Plumtree Property. The PVPLC reported that they have approved the project with conditions.
- **Agua Amarga Reserve Encroachments (Danielle/Joel)** - A letter is being drafted to property owners adjacent to the Preserve who have improvements that encroach onto city property.
- **GIS overlays:**

- **Archaeology site** – This will be an intern project to create a GIS layer.
- **Water Department habitat impact at Portuguese Bend follow-up** - Joel intends to send a letter out by the end of the month.
- **“No Access” signs along PVDS at Archery Club** – As previously reported, the Portuguese Bend Club HOA is requesting that the City install no trespassing signs along PVDS. The team agreed to install signs similar to other areas of the Preserve that are closed and to direct the public to the coastal access at the archery club.

Recreation and Parks Topics

- **Park Ranger Update** – Updated logs were provided to the team.

Discovery Room Open House

The City is celebrating the re-opening of our local treasure, the Discovery Room, this Sunday, October 20, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Ladera Linda Community Center.

Highlights of this free event will include Los Serenos Docent discussions about the expanded educational exhibits, a petting zoo, arts and crafts for kids, the Grilled Cheese Food Truck, a nature walk in the Preserve, information about the Los Serenos Docent and Junior Docent Programs, the MRCA Park Ranger and Junior Ranger Programs, and Ladera Linda classes!

Los Serenos Docents will share information about the local plants, animals, and geology of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, offering a sneak peek of what you might see on a hike in the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve. This is a wonderful opportunity for youth groups and nature lovers to learn about this local resource and to learn about the docent volunteer programs and ranger programs.

Junior Ranger Program: Wild Fires and Ecology



Last Saturday, October 12th, Junior Rangers attended their first educational session. Wild land firefighters joined the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority to teach Junior Rangers about the role of wildfires in open spaces, including its benefits and dangers, and the role weather plays in wild fires. Firefighters demonstrated their firefighting equipment and gear, including uniforms, hose packs, backpacks, instructional manuals, fire truck, and fire hose. They emphasized the importance of one of the Junior Ranger core principles: Think before you go, and be prepared! After, Junior Rangers got to spray a real fire hose and completed a craft that helps identify weather patterns.

Curating: What is it, and what does it have to do with the City?

Cities, museums, and other institutions are often given or loaned items (artifacts). The recipient then must acknowledge the gift (donation) or loan and then care for the artifact. That is the curating process. Some are put on display and others are stored for research or future display. The person responsible for the care, tracking, and storage of these artifacts is the curator.

With the opening of the Point Vicente Interpretive Center in 1984, the cataloging of items was initially done by hand, then with the more common use of computers, recorded on various spreadsheets. Two summers ago, an intern put all this information in order for the City, using Microsoft Word. In May of 2013, the City purchased the computer program "Past Perfect for Museums." The former intern returned to the City this past summer as an employee and completed the monumental task of entering all the basic data into the new software program.

The types of artifacts the City has received over the years are pictures, photographs, books, wooden water pipes, fossils, preserved animals, historic papers, World War II equipment, Japanese farming equipment, Marineland of the Pacific items, skeletons and models of whales, cabinets, rock collections, Native American artifacts and many other items that relate to the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

There is still much more information to be entered, such as a photos and measurements. Each item must be numbered and stored in a safe place so it can be located in the future. Since some of the items the City receives are from protected species, permits from different agencies must be on file to keep the items. The Past Perfect for Museums software program also has a Library section, so the Point Vicente Interpretive Center Library collection will soon be indexed in digital form.
