On this day, City Hall offices would be closed to the public, but the staff would still report to work and use the uninterrupted time to clean and organize their files and work areas. Clean up days provide an opportunity for the staff to get to those "housekeeping" projects that we never seem to have the time to tackle during our normal workday schedule. Because it is a legal holiday as defined in the Municipal Code and no construction work is allowed to take place; however, the City will still be conducting building inspections on that day. GOVERNOR BROWN'S FY 11-12 BUDGET PROPOSAL

On Monday, January 10, 2011, Governor Jerry Brown released his FY 2011-12 State Budget Proposal. The Governor's budget proposes \$26.4 billion in solutions to cover the \$25.4 billion deficit and allow for a \$1 billion reserve. The proposal includes the elimination of redevelopment agencies (\$1.7 billion savings) and enterprise zones (\$924 million savings), as well as the historical realignment of state services such as fire, court security, community-based corrections, mental health services, foster care and adult protective services to local government.

The budget proposal assumes that voters will approve a five-year extension of taxes sun-setting this year; a 1% sales tax and 0.5% vehicle license fee that they previously rejected. The revenues of these taxes will maintain the current level of funding for K-12 schools and COPS (Citizens' Option for Public Safety)/Booking Fees as well as support the realignment proposal. The City currently receives \$100,000 annually from the COPS program. The Governor believes that after five years the economy will have recovered enough the state can resume funding, but there has been no indication as to how.

The Governor's budget will impact each local agency differently. Based on Staff's understanding, the proposal to eliminate redevelopment agencies will pose the largest potential impact to the City. The City's redevelopment agency indebtedness includes approximately \$7 million of scheduled debt service to the County of Los Angeles and millions more to the City, including accrued interest. However, it appears as though the Governor's plan should not affect tax increment pledged to current debt to the County, and as such the proposal regarding RDAs should not have any significant effects on the City. Both the League of California Cities and the California Redevelopment Association have indicated eliminating redevelopment agencies will have drastically negative impacts on the State's economy and will hurt the underserved and distressed cities and communities in California.

Based upon discussion with the City manager, it appears as though Staff's analysis is consistent with what the City Council heard during its participation in the 44th Annual Sacramento Legislative Orientation Tour hosted by California Contract Cities Association. The Tour included meetings with key local and statewide legislators and the league of California Cities, as well as presentations by key state and local officials familiar with the budget process. Staff will continue to research the Governor's budget proposal and its impact on the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, including the possibility of trickle down affects

(i.e. transit and public safety costs) from the State, County of Los Angeles, and other agencies.

AT&T CLAIM FOR OVERPAYMENT OF UTILITY USERS' TAX

On November 9th, AT&T Mobility made a claim to the City for refund of an overpayment of utility users' tax (UUT). AT&T inadvertently charged UUT on internet access services (data services). AT&T has sent a similar claim to many other cities as well. The claim to RPV is for \$91,065.61 and covers the time period from November 1, 2005 through September 30, 2010. As of October 1, 2010 AT&T discontinued charging and collecting UUT for data services. As outlined in chapter 3.30 of the City's Municipal Code, the service suppliers have a duty to collect and remit UUT. Furthermore, the City's Municipal Code limits tax refunds to one year from the date of payment.

Based upon the advice of the City Attorney, the City Clerk responded on December 16th advising AT&T that the City would not take any action on the portion of the claim occurring prior to November 9, 2009 (one year prior to the claim). Although AT&T provided information about the overpayment of UUT by customer and account, the information is not detailed enough to determine the amount attributable to November 9, 2009 through September 30, 2010. Depending upon the response from AT&T and the amount attributable to the specified time period, the City may need to engage the services of an independent auditor to verify the amount of the claim before proceeding.

Staff awaits the AT&T response and will continue to keep the City Council informed.

Whales showing in large numbers off Southern California

Now that the weather is cooperating, this is prime time to go whale-watching off Southern California, especially when you consider that Pacific gray whales are being spotted in concentrations not seen locally in years. Volunteers with the Gray Whale Census and Behavior Project on the Palos Verdes Peninsula logged daily counts of 38, 25 and 24 gray whales in a three-day span ending Sunday. The overall count of 178 southbound grays, since Dec. 1, places the project's count three times above last season's count through the same period.

This does not imply there are more gray whales than the estimated 18,000-20,000 mammals that trek annually from the Bering Sea to mating and nursing grounds off Baja California. But it seems to imply that more of them are sticking close to the coast. This is great news for landing operators and watchers, who might note that the last half of January is traditionally the peak period for the southbound migration off Southern California.


