

BACKFLOW ASSEMBLY REPLACED AT HESSE PARK


Recently, the Public Works Department had the backflow assembly replaced and retested at Fred Hesse Park. This 4-inch backflow assembly had been in place since the park opened in 1984 and over the years continued to deteriorate and eventually became obsolete.

Because backflow prevention assemblies protect the domestic water supply from being contaminated by water from private properties, it is critical that they are tested after they are installed, relocated, and or repaired, and then annually thereafter, as required by law.

Each year the City has approximately 45 backflow's tested and certified pursuant to; Title 17 of the California Administrative Code (section 7605C) and the California Public Utilities Commission Rule 16C.

UPDATE ON RESIDENTIAL ROADWAY REHAB PROJECT

In order to improve the quality of the product initially applied, an additional coat of slurry seal was laid on San Clemente and remaining portions of Santa Barbara and Ocean Terrace Dr. Staff is very appreciative of the continued patience and cooperation received by the residents in these areas.

In keeping with the City's pruning schedule, on Monday, January 17, 2011, West Coast Arborist will prune the Indian Laurel figs (*Ficus nitida*) trees located within the parkway along Silver Spur Road between Hawthorne Blvd and Dry Bank Drive the pruning will consist of dead wooding and structural pruning.



On Monday, Staff met with members from the Los Serenos Grants Oversight Committee to discuss the status of recent fundraising efforts, including a grant from the Julius Sumner Miller Foundation.

On Monday night, Staff conducted the mid-year inventory of the PVIC gift shop. On Friday and Saturday, Staff will attend the Los Angeles Gift Show, giving them an opportunity to keep abreast of the latest trends and to purchase new items for the PVIC gift shop.

On Tuesday, the Sunset Room was rented for a memorial service.

On Wednesday, Los Serenos docents led 20 cub scouts and adults on an afterschool hike in the hills above Ladera Linda. The special focus of the hike was the local geology.

On Saturday, the first in a series of Junior Ranger programs will be held at the Ladera Linda Community Center. This new program, offered by the City through its contract with the MRCA, is offered free to youth ages 7-12 and focuses on the "Leave No Trace" principles of outdoor use. Two additional "introductory sessions" will be offered, one in February and another in April, to ensure maximum participation.
