TORRANCE CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS TOA HELICOPTER ROUTE RECOMMENDATIONS AT FEBRUARY 1, 2011 MEETING

I'm pleased to advise you that the Torrance City Council adopted improved helicopter routes and altitude flight levels at its February 1 meeting. This decision will reduce the impact on the City's residents by modifying the existing South Crenshaw Helicopter route and increasing the minimum height to 2,000 feet mean sea level (msl) along the high elevation points along the route.

We previously reported to you that a Helicopter Committee consisting of Torrance residents, aviation experts and government officials was formed to study the issue of helicopter noise generated along established routes out of Torrance Airport. After extensive research the Helicopter Committee recommended route modifications and increased flying altitudes from 600 feet msl to at least 1,200 feet msl along 3 primary routes from the Airport. Its recommendation was forwarded to the Torrance Airport Commission which accepted the route modifications, but rejected the flight altitude increase claiming it posed a safety risk by placing helicopters and light aircraft in too close a proximity. Torrance City staff disagreed with the Airport Commission's conclusions and recommended that the City Council endorse the Helicopter Committee's recommendations.

City staff had worked closely with Airport staff and the Helicopter Committee to consider the elimination of the South Crenshaw helicopter route which flies from the Torrance Airport towards Del Cerro Park. While only ten percent of Torrance Airport helicopter traffic follows this route, staff believed it was important to eliminate or minimize the noise impact on residents. When attempts to eliminate the route proved unsuccessful, staff then worked to minimize residential impact by modifying the route so it flew over the Portuguese Bend Nature Preserve rather than fly near Terranea Resort, Abalone Cove Shoreline Park and adjacent neighborhoods. The route previously ended near the intersection of Crenshaw Boulevard and Indian Peak. The modification, including the extension from Del Cerro Park to the Pacific Ocean was approved by the Helicopter Committee.

The Torrance City Council approved the Helicopter Committee's proposed route modifications and increased altitude flight levels at its February 1, 2011 meeting. I attended the City Council meeting and spoke in favor of the recommendations. City Manager Carolyn Lehr sent a letter to the Torrance City Council expressing the City's support for the adoption of staff's recommendations.

The adopted South Crenshaw route modification is expected to reduce over-flights over more densely-populated Rancho Palos Verdes neighborhoods. Higher altitude levels will also reduce the noise impact on City residents. The modified new helicopter routes, including the South Crenshaw route, will be published in official helicopter aviation charts later in 2011.



PUBLIC HEARINGS:

1. HEIGHT VARIATION PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2010-00331): 6530 La Garita Drive / Magalnic (LM)

Request: A request to construct a 131 square foot first floor addition and 1,467 square foot second floor addition to the existing 1,807 square foot residence (garage included). The overall height of the residence will measure 25'-0" as measured from the highest ridgeline to the lowest finished grade adjacent to the foundation/slab.

Action Deadline: February 14, 2011

Recommendation: Adopt P.C. Resolution No. 2011 - __, thereby denying, without prejudice, Height Variation and Site Plan Review (Case No. ZON2010-00331) for the property located at 6530 La Garita Drive.

2. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT, VARIANCE AND GRADING PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2010-00296): 5504 Crestridge Road / Palos Verdes Art Center (LM)

Request: A request to construct a number of interior and exterior improvements to the existing Palos Verdes Arts Center (PVAC) including:

- An interior remodel of portions of the existing facility including an expansion of the existing kitchen (69 square feet) and gift shop (16 square feet);
- Relocation of the front entrance from the current location along the north side of Building A (Mildred Walker Gallery) to the eastern side of Building A (facing Crenshaw Blvd.);
- Construction of a new 1,652 square foot storage area to Building B (Stewart Gallery), whereby 826 square feet will be subterranean;
- A new 526 square foot kiln located north of Building C (Ceramics Studio) and east of Building A;
- A new 78 square foot trash enclosure located adjacent to the proposed, new kiln;
- A new exterior façade with anodized aluminum panels and a new hipped roof with parapets on Buildings A, B and C;
- A maximum of 227 cubic yards of grading for the new subterranean storage area and new, ancillary retaining walls around the facility;
- Three (3) illuminated, exterior identification signs located on Building A (2 signs) and Building B (1 sign);
- Replacement of the existing wood posts, wood latticework and canvas awning above the patio behind Building A with a new barrel vaulted fabric/canvas awning to encroach 16'-6" into the required 20'-0" rear yard setback (Variance required);

Action Deadline: February 21, 2011

Recommendation: Adopt P.C. Resolution No. 2011-___, thereby approving a Conditional Use permit, Variance and Grading Permit (Case No. ZON2010-00293) for the property located at 5504 Crestridge Road.

3. GRADING PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2010-00413): 30148 Cartier Drive / Chan (KF)

Request: A request to allow 3,640 cubic yards of grading for the construction of a new, 4,477-square-foot 2-story single family residence on an upslope lot with an average slope in excess of 35 percent steepness.

Action Deadline: March 12, 2011

Recommendation: Adopt P.C. Resolution No. 2011-___, thereby conditionally approving the requested Grading Permit (Case No. ZON2010-00413).

4. CODE AMENDMENT FOR TEMPORARY SIGN PERMITS (CASE NO. ZON2011-00007): Citywide / City (AH)
