MAINTENANCE REQUESTS RESULTING FROM THE SUNDAY STORM

This week Public Works and several City contracting crews have been busy prioritizing and rapidly responding to over 45 emergency calls resulting from the recent rainstorm of Sunday, March 20, 2011. The calls ranged from: power outages, City facility false alarm calls due to power failure, traffic signals not working and requiring temporary stop signs, sand bag requests, asphalt repairs, street name and street traffic signs down, street and private residence trees down and blocking street access, tree limb breaks, debris along roadways, flooded storm drains, and 25th street flooding.

The follow up storm work continues through the rest of this week with a two-phased approach to: 1) get caught up with the maintenance requests, and 2) prepare for the next rains. This includes tree removals and follow up with stump grinding, clearing storm drain and debris basins, resetting sand bags, pot hole repairs, street traffic signs removed from wooden posts and placed on metal posts and reset, 25th street debris basin clean out, gathering all temporary portable traffic signs, cones and delineators.

Cart Placement for Service

To ensure service, please set out containers the evening before your service day, or no later than 7 a.m. on the day of collection.

Seasonal fluctuations in customers waste generation, traffic, weather conditions and other factors all impact collection times. Though your collection team strives to service containers on a

consistent schedule, occasional unannounced route time changes do occur.

Set out waste and recycling containers in an unobstructed area near the street, allowing sufficient space for your mail carrier to maneuver to your mail box. Notice tags are left by EDCO collectors whenever inappropriate materials are found in the trash, recycling or green waste containers, or when a container is set out in an obstructed area. If a tag is placed on your



RPV's Cart Placement and Removal Regulations

Please help keep our community looking beautiful. In accordance with the City of RPV Municipal Codes Sections 8.20.250 and 8.24.060 (A) (2) trash, recycling and green waste carts cannot be placed at the curb for collection earlier than 8 a.m. the day before collection. Empty carts must be removed from the curb no later than 8 p.m. on the day of collection. Carts must be stored so they are substantially screened from view from the street, except when placed at the curb for collection

First Approval of a Moratorium Boundary Line Adjustment

On December 21, 2010, the City Council approved an amendment to the City's Landslide Moratorium Ordinance that created a ministerial process to adjust the Landslide Moratorium Boundary Line, where adjustment of the Line is based upon site-specific geology demonstrating to the satisfaction of the City Geologist that the Moratorium Line is not located in the correct location.

On March 9, 2011, the City received its first request to adjust the moratorium boundary line that traverses the Point View property at 6001 PV Drive South owned by Mr. Jim York. The subject property measures approximately 95 acres in area, where approximately 60 acres of the site are located within the City's Landslide Moratorium Area (LMA), and the remaining ± 35 acres are outside of the LMA. After reviewing all appropriate site specific geotechnical reports, information and data, the City's consulting Geologist has approved the requested Moratorium Boundary Line adjustment. The new location of the Moratorium Boundary Line results in 12.82 acres removed from the moratorium area, increasing the area of the property located outside of the LMA to 46.82 acres, and decreasing the area of the property located within the LMA to 48.18 acres.

The new location of the Moratorium Boundary line traversing the Point View property will be memorialized in the official map in the Community Development Department. Pursuant to the new procedure, decisions on these adjustment requests are ministerial and cannot be appealed.

First City-Offered Night Hike a Stellar Success!

On Saturday night, March 19 at 7:00 p.m., MRCA rangers led 14 members of the public on the City's first night hike, in the Portuguese Bend Nature Reserve. Hikers showed up despite the gloomy weather, and the full moon peaked out, and lit the night hike for 15 minutes, before retreating back behind the clouds. This introductory hike was offered at no fee to registrants. The Park Ranger shared interpretive information with the hikers as well as hiking safety tips. City Council adopted this night hike program in 2010, creating additional recreational opportunities for Rancho Palos Verdes residents and others in Palos Verdes and the South Bay. The next night hike is scheduled for April 16 at 7:00 p.m. Pre-registration required and the fee is \$7.00 per person.
