## Torrance Airport Helicopter Route Update/FAA RESPONSE

### *Background*

We reported to you recently that the Torrance City Council adopted improved helicopter routes and altitude flight minimum levels at its February 1, 2011 meeting. This decision should reduce the impact on the City's residents by modifying the existing South Crenshaw Helicopter route and increasing the minimum height to 2,000 feet mean sea level (msl) along the high elevation points along the route.

Although Staff's attempts to eliminate the route entirely proved unsuccessful, we worked to minimize residential impact by modifying the route so it flew over the eastern segment of the Portuguese Bend Nature Preserve rather than fly near Terranea Resort, Abalone Cove Shoreline Park, adjacent neighborhoods and the western segment of the Preserve. The route previously ended near the intersection of Crenshaw Boulevard and Indian Peak. The modification, including the extension from Del Cerro Park to the Pacific Ocean was approved by the Helicopter Committee and the City Council

The adopted South Crenshaw route modification is expected to reduce (but not eliminate) over-flights over more densely-populated Rancho Palos Verdes neighborhoods. Higher altitude levels will also reduce the noise impact on City residents.

Pat Carey, Chair of the Southern California Airspace Users Working Group (SCAUWG), stated at a March 27 meeting that the new Torrance Airport helicopter routes (including the revision of the South Crenshaw route) are expected to be published before the end of the year. It's an important step to guide helicopter pilots, especially non-local pilots, towards following the new routes and altitude minimums.

### *New Information/FAA Response*

Torrance Airport Management contacted the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in a February 24, 2011 letter about these proposed changes and requested that the FAA review and approve modifications to the "Helicopter Letter of Agreement" (LOA). The letter outlined the proposed changes, reviewed the process that the City of Torrance went through, and explained that the changes would be implemented over a six-month trial period to monitor how effective the changes were in providing noise mitigation without impacting safety. The stated intent was to work with the FAA to implement permanent

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modification to the LOA after the six-month trial period,

The Operations Support Group Manager for the FAA responded to Torrance Airport's letter on April 15, 2011. The FAA's letter identified a number of steps beyond Torrance's basic requested review and approval that would need to be completed before a test procedure could be implemented. The letter noted the need for an aeronautical analysis of helicopter and fixed wing traffic which would be performed by the FAA and would take approximately four months. Additionally, the letter called for a noise analysis or Integrated Noise Modeling for the South Crenshaw route to be undertaken and paid for by the proponent. The FAA noted that the portion of the South Crenshaw route extension running from approximately Indian Peak to the Pacific Ocean is outside of Class D airspace which is the typical boundary limit for charting helicopter routes. This proposed extension would also call for a new noise profile analysis. Finally, the FAA requested more information about how Torrance Airport and the Torrance City Council intend to evaluate the testing of the new routes.

I have spoken with Torrance Airport officials and attended an April 21 Helicopter Committee meeting after the FAA's response letter was received by Torrance Airport. The Committee members expressed surprise and frustration at the FAA's reaction. The City's aviation consultant, Tom Kamman of Williams Aviation had a similar reaction. The item will be discussed further at the next meeting of the Helicopter Committee at the Torrance Airport General Aviation Center. While the great majority of Torrance helicopter activity does not encroach upon Peninsula airspace, staff believes it is important to monitor this development and other airspace issue to minimize any potential negative impacts on our residents.

Towards that end, staff has arranged a conference call with Rancho Palos Verdes' aviation consultant, Torrance Airport Facilities Operation Manager Shant Megerdichian, and the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Torrance Helicopter Committee, to discuss this issue further.

### **PVNET/EI Camino College Cooperative GIS Disaster Planning Hazard Map Development**

Palos Verdes on the Net (PVNET) and an EI Camino College Professor are teaming up to teach a three-month-long, intensive class where students will work cooperatively to develop a usable disaster planning hazard map for the local community. Students will have a chance to combine advance technology, real-world application and community service in this unique three-month long class.

PVNET Director Ted Vegvari and Dr. Stephen Koletty, an experienced EI Camino College instructor and cartographer, cooperatively developed the "Introduction to GIS" class. Over 20 students will learn the basics of GIS (geographic information systems) and then refine and use those skills in a real-world situation. By the end of the class, teams of students will gather and organize information about different sections of the local area that could be used during an emergency.

Besides contributing to the local community, the students will be learning invaluable, state-

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of-the-art GIS skills. Prior experience is not required and the class is offered at no cost. The mix of education and professional training is at the heart of the GIS program at PVNET, which is used extensively by the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. The free GIS software training program is made possible by Jack Dangermond, the CEO and founder of ESRI, the developer of the world's leading GIS software company. ## Local tech organization teams up with El Camino

PVNET, El Camino College GIS combine to provide a unique educational experience for college students.

The class, "Introduction to GIS," will be taught by Dr. Stephen Koletty, an experienced GIS (geographic information systems) instructor and professional cartographer, and will focus on the art and theory of communicating through maps. There will be more than 20 students, many with no prior mapmaking experience. Koletty and Palos Verdes on the

NET Director Ted Vegvari worked together to introduce a work-force-development aspect into the class.

For this class, PVNET staff developed a three-month project-based curriculum incorporating community service to local cities to develop a disaster planning hazard map, something every city needs. PVNET's philosophy is to provide education through community service.

Students will commence their GIS training by going through the many problems that come up during performing GIS work, such as when converting a not-quite-sphere into a flat surface. The students will be divided into teams of five to

six students, each assigned to a different region of the South Bay. Each team will collect information that could be relevant in an emergency situation.

PVNET is making this GIS class available at no cost. The GIS program offered by PVNET is made possible by Jack Dangermond, CEO and founder of ESRI, the developer of the number one GIS software and technology company in the world. Dangermond is the key sponsor of the GIS training software program used at PVNET to provide free training and work force experience to students of all ages.

## **UPDATE ON RESIDENTIAL ROADWAY REHAB PROJECT**







## **Road Events are Coming to Town in May!**

### **American Diabetes Association's Tour de Cure: Sunday, May 1**

This Sunday, the American Diabetes Association's annual Tour de Cure bike ride will pass through Rancho Palos Verdes between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and noon. The American Diabetes Association holds the Tour de Cure annually to raise funds for the fight against diabetes. While in past years the ride has started in Long Beach and traveled south, in 2009 the route changed to start in Long Beach and travel north, through the cities of San Pedro, Palos Verdes Estates, and Rancho Palos Verdes.

Approximately 1,000 riders participate. Of those 1,000, 400-500 attempt the longest loop of the bike ride that extends into the City. Riders are assisted by M.A.R.C. (an organization that tracks and assists cyclists) and by safety officers from the Lomita Sheriff's station. No streets closures or traffic delays are anticipated.

### **Palos Verdes Marathon: May 15**

The Rolling Hills Kiwanis Club will conduct its annual Palos Verdes Marathon on city streets to raise funds for local charities. The event (including set up and tear down) will take place on **Saturday, May 14, from 5:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** and approximately 2,500 runners will participate.

The Start/Finish line and shuttle drop-off/pick-up area will be located in the Fisherman's Access parking lot area on Palos Verdes Drive South near the entrance to Terranea Resort, and the Event Expo area will be located on the grounds of Terranea Resort.

The race course will be held within the cities of Rancho Palos Verdes and Palos Verdes Estates. Within the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, the race course will be limited to the coastward side of Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive West, between Narcissa Drive and the City border at Palos Verdes Estates. A portion of the course will pass through the Oceanfront Estates neighborhood on Calle Entradero and Via Vicente.

**Traffic along Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive West between the City's border with Palos Verdes Estates and Narcissa Drive will be limited to one lane going in each direction on the landward side portion of the roadway from 5:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on the day of the race.**

Residential neighborhoods along the course with exclusive access to Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive West between Palos Verdes Estates and Narcissa Drive will have to use specific streets to exit the neighborhood and may experience delays during the event, particularly during the hours of 5:00 a.m. and noon. All streets will be re-opened by 3:00 a.m. Lomita Sheriff representatives will provide traffic safety and control services.

### **Honda Ride for Kids: Sunday, May 15, 2011**

This annual road event raises funds to benefit the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation and the fight against children's brain cancer. Approximately 800 motorcycle riders participate. The route begins and ends in Torrance, but will take riders through the City on Palos Verdes Drive West, and Hawthorne Blvd. Times are approximate, but the ride passes through the City from 10:20 a.m. – 10:40 a.m. Delays at any intersection are not anticipated to last more than 10 minutes.

On Monday, April 25<sup>th</sup> members of the Outreach Committee met to discuss the upcoming strategies and presentation schedules.

### **Docent-led PVIC Tours and Abalone Cove Hikes**

- On Tuesday and Wednesday, docents led 160 students of Ridgecrest Intermediate School on a hike to Forrestral Nature Preserve, where they shared information on geology and local history.
- On Thursday, docents will lead 56 students of Juan de Anza Elementary School on a tour of the Point Vicente Interpretive Center, sharing information on the Pacific gray whale and Native Americans.

**SUBJECT: MRCA PARK RANGER FUEL USE AND COST**

The purpose of this memo is to report on Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) fuel use and fuel costs. At the April 5, 2011 Council Meeting, Mayor Pro-Tem Missetich requested staff to provide the following information.

### **Estimated Fuel Used and Cost**

MRCA Rangers travel an average of 92 miles roundtrip from various ranger stations to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. Once in the City, Rangers travel an average of 15 miles during a daily patrol. Rangers work approximately 5 shifts per week, and their vehicles get an average of 15 miles per gallon (partially due to the fact that vehicles are specially outfitted with equipment including light bars and radios). Using these average figures, Rangers use approximately 35.7 gallons of fuel per week, or **1,855 gallons per year** to patrol the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve. California's average gas price as of April 21, 2011 is \$4.20/gallon, meaning the average, annual cost of fuel for MRCA is **\$7,790.**

### **How City is Charged MRCA Vehicle Costs**

MRCA uses the OMB-A 87 cost accounting method to determine vehicle costs. This is the standard used nationally by governmental agencies. MRCA does not track vehicle costs at an individual level. A \$9 vehicle allotment is added to Rangers' hourly rates per formula derived from OMB-A 87. The \$9 vehicle allotment includes fuel, insurance, maintenance, depreciation, and/or replacement funding costs of a current vehicle. The 2010/2011 MRCA contract was for 2,080 ranger hours per year. If this figure is multiplied by the hourly vehicle allotment of \$9, the total annual vehicle allotment costs for the City for Ranger services in fiscal year 2010/2011 are **\$18,720.**

It should be noted that the City is currently charged for half of the MRCA Rangers' drive time to and from the City. For instance, if the commute is one hour duration, the City is charged for half hour duration. Staff works with MRCA to arrange patrols to minimize drive time and to maximize patrol time.
