Deputies to increase enforcement aimed at dangerous riders and careless motorists

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Risk Management Bureau/Traffic Services Detail will be conducting a specialized Motorcycle Safety Enforcement Operation on Sunday, August 14, 2011 in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes.

Extra deputies will be on duty patrolling areas frequented by motorcyclists and where crashes occur. Deputies will be cracking down on traffic violations made by motorcyclists as well as other vehicle drivers that can lead to motorcycle collisions, injuries, and fatalities.

Motorcycle fatalities have been on the rise in California, increasing 175 percent in the last decade, from 204 killed in 1998 to 560 killed in 2008.

Factors contributing to motorcycle crashes very often include speeding and impairment due to alcohol and other drugs by motorcyclists. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is also reminding all motorists to always be alert and watch out for motorcycles, especially when turning and changing lanes.

Another major factor leading to motorcycle crashes is inexperience. Riders, young and old, are encouraged to seek training and safety information. Many people are riding motorcycles without the proper motorcycle license endorsement and without the skills necessary to ride safely.

Riders can get training through the California Motorcyclist Safety Program. Information and training locations are available at www.CA-msp.org or 1-877 RIDE 411 or 1-877-743-3411.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.



Los Serenos Docents Add New Component to Program Partnership with PVPUSD

Los Serenos is launching a new educational program designed to highlight the California history standards for fourth graders during docent-led tours at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center. Coordination with Staff and PVPUSD is already underway to provide local fourth grade students in the Peninsula public school system the opportunity to participate in the upcoming year. This program complements the existing sixth grade program for PVPUSD students focusing on the geology, flora, and fauna of the Peninsula during docent-led tours at the Forrester Nature Reserve. The City Council approved \$7,000 in this year's budget for the sixth grade program. The docents' long range goal is to add a third component to this partnership that would include docent-led tours of Abalone Cove as part of PVPUSD life science studies, thereby ensuring that PVPUSD students have the opportunity to experience three docent-led tours, leading to a better understanding of the natural and cultural history of the Peninsula while meeting broader educational goals.



\$13 million building seen as Lawndale's future focal point

There it stands, a tower of concrete and steel rising three stories above the ground below. Once finished, the Lawndale Community Center is expected to become the centerpiece of the small city's civic center, transforming the area into a vibrant gathering place, city officials say.

The 29,000-square-foot, \$13 million building is on the corner of 147th Street and Burin Avenue, across the street from City Hall. The community center is scheduled to be completed by mid-December.

Today, it remains enclosed in scaffolding, standing more than two-thirds complete. Construction crews are installing drywall, electrical wiring and laying concrete.

"We hope we'll have a much more lively civic center when it's finished," Deputy City Manager Otis Ginoza said.

The community center project was authorized by 76 percent of voters in 2008 and officially approved by the City Council a year later. First approved with a construction cost of around \$9million, funding for the project was allocated through federal and county grants. The city also received funding by selling municipal bonds in 2009.

Voters in Lawndale must provide authorization anytime more than \$1million in city funds is to be spent on a single project.

"Anybody who has been around long enough knows this is the biggest project the city of Lawndale has ever undertaken," Mayor Harold Hofmann said during a groundbreaking ceremony in July 2010.

Built on a former parking

lot for city vehicles and what was once the site of the city's first commercial businesses - a neighborhood market - the new facility will house classrooms, computer labs, a large multipurpose room and a full-service kitchen.

Designed by Robert R. Coffee Architect and Associates, the building will feature outdoor patios and verandas with sweeping views of the South Bay and Santa Monica Mountains.

Pink trumpet trees will rise from planters on the sidewalk below. Retractable bollards - steel poles - will be installed below the concrete on 147th Street and Burin Avenue, allowing portions of the streets to be temporarily closed, creating an outdoor plaza for farmers markets and city events.

"It's definitely something that has been absent from the area," said Councilman Jim Osborne, who is helping select historical photographs of Lawndale that will hang in the building's lobby.



The city's former community center was torn down in 2006 to make way for the new 17,000-square-foot county library next to City Hall, across the street from the new complex. The \$7.3million library opened in March 2009.

Ginoza said Lawndale's new community center will reshape the city's town center.

"Whatever the community wants - whether it's dance or pottery classes or a meeting place, this new facility will be able to accommodate it all," he said. "With the dynamic of the new community center and library, there will be a lot for the community to do in our civic center."
