### PHASE 2 RESTORATION PLAN FOR THE MONTROSE SETTLEMENTS RESTORATION PROGRAM

From the late 1940s until the early 1970s, Los Angeles-area industries discharged approximately 2,000 metric tons of DDTs and PCBs into the ocean waters off the Palos Verdes Peninsula. Almost all of the DDTs originated from the Montrose Chemical Corporation manufacturing plant in Torrance via the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (LACSD) White Point sewer outfall. Wastewater treatment methods employed at that time did not capture the DDTs prior to their discharge. Montrose also dumped DDT-contaminated waste from barges into deep ocean waters between the Peninsula and Santa Catalina Island. In addition, large quantities of PCBs from numerous sources throughout the Los Angeles Basin were released into ocean waters through the LACSD and City of Los Angeles wastewater outfalls and the regional storm drain systems during this period.

In October 2000, after ten (10) years of litigation, the Federal and State governments and the remaining defendants signed the last of a series of settlements in the Montrose case. The court approved the final settlement in March 2001. Under the terms of the four separate settlement agreements, Montrose and the other defendants agreed to pay \$140.2 million plus interest to the Federal and State governments. The Trustees for the Montrose Settlements Restoration Program (MSRP) received \$63.95 million. The MSRP Trustees have used \$35 million to reimburse past damage assessment costs and are using the remainder plus the accumulated interest to plan and implement the actions necessary to restore the natural resources and their services that were injured by the DDTs and PCBs that were discharged into the waters off the Peninsula.

The primary goals of the MSRP are to:

- Restore, replace, rehabilitate, or acquire the equivalent of the injured natural resources and the services those resources provide; and,
- Provide compensatory restoration for the interim lost services of the injured natural resource.

Specific MSRP restoration objectives have included the restoration of fishing services, fish and fish habitats, bald eagles, peregrine falcons and seabirds along the Southern California coastline, extending from Point Concepcion in Santa Barbara County to the

Mexican border. The first phase of restoration efforts began in 2005. The MSRP Trustees now propose the second and final phase of MSRP restoration efforts. The Phase 2 Restoration Plan (P2RP) includes both the plan itself and the related Federal and State environmental analysis required under NEPA and CEQA, respectively. Among a variety of restoration initiatives within the target area, the MSRP Trustees' preferred alternative for the P2RP includes two (2) fish habitat restoration projects with the potential for direct effects upon segments of the City's coastline: Kelp Forest Restoration and Subtidal Reef Restoration.

#### *Kelp Forest Restoration*

The P2RP describes how the historically-extensive kelp forests along the shoreline of the Palos Verdes Peninsula have been degraded, largely due to so-called "urchin barrens" that have formed in these areas. "Urchin barrens" are the result of uncontrolled sea urchin populations, which overtake rocky tidal areas where kelp plants could otherwise anchor to the sea floor.

The P2RP identifies seven (7) potential restoration sites, six (6) of which are located adjacent to Rancho Palos Verdes. The affected coastline would extend from the boundary with the City of Palos Verdes Estates to Abalone Cove. The MSRP Trustees' preferred alternative would restore the kelp forest through "urchin control" by SCUBA divers. Divers would access the affected coastline areas by boat to remove sea urchins in phases over a 3-year period. The MSRP Trustees' proposed budget for Kelp Forest Restoration is \$2.5 million.

#### *Subtidal Reef Restoration*

The P2RP describes how subtidal rocky reefs along the southerly shoreline of the Palos Verdes Peninsula have been degraded by sedimentation. In the past, much of this sediment was attributable to the active Portuguese Bend Landslide. More recently, the 1999 landslide at the 18<sup>th</sup> hole of the Trump National Golf Club covered more near-shore reefs with sediment.

The P2RP identifies eighty (80) acres of degraded reef at three (3) potential restoration sites, two (2) of which are located wholly or partially adjacent to Rancho Palos Verdes. These would include a 56-acre area off Rancho Palos Verdes Beach below the Trump National Golf Club, and a 12-acre area off Shoreline Park at the boundary with the City of Los Angeles. According to the P2RP, the construction of artificial reefs at these

locations could "impact various human uses," including recreation and navigation. The project would be expected to take seven (7) years to complete, including permitting. The MSRP Trustees' proposed budget for Subtidal Reef Restoration is \$6.49 million.

On Wednesday, November 9, 2011, the MSRP Trustees will hold one of two (2) public meetings on the P2RP at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. Copies of the meeting flyer and the MSRP fact sheet are attached. The 45-day public comment period for the P2RP will end on December 12, 2011. Staff plans to attend the public meeting and to submit written comments on the proposal.






## Program History

From the late 1940s to the early 1970s, millions of pounds of DDTs and PCBs were discharged from industrial sources through a wastewater outfall into the ocean near Los Angeles. Large quantities of these chemicals remain in the marine environment and continue to harm birds and impair fishing in the Southern California Bight (see map).

Throughout the U.S., DDTs in the food of bald eagles and peregrine falcons have caused these birds to lay thin-shelled eggs that desiccate or break during incubation. Bald eagles reintroduced to Catalina Island have had difficulty hatching their eggs without human assistance. In addition, some species of seabirds in the Bight exhibited high levels of DDTs. For certain species of fish contaminated with high levels of DDTs and PCBs near Los Angeles, the State of California has issued fish consumption advisories. The State has also banned commercial fishing for white croaker near the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

The State and Federal governments initiated action against Montrose Chemical Corporation and the other polluters responsible for the injuries. In December 2001, a final settlement was signed, ending ten years of litigation.

## Cleanup and Restoration

Following Superfund law, the funds are being used for two different kinds of activities:


1. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the California Department of Toxic Substances Control will use a share of the funds to reduce the exposure of people and wildlife to DDTs and PCBs. For example, these agencies are considering several remediation, or "cleanup," options, and are conducting additional efforts to prevent commercial catch of and reduce public consumption of contaminated fish. 2. The Natural Resource Trustees, through the Montrose Settlements Restoration Program (MSRP), will use approximately \$38 million to restore natural resources harmed by the DDTs and PCBs.

### Who are the Natural Resource Trustees?

The Natural Resource Trustees are a group of six federal and state resource agencies that together administer the Montrose Settlements Restoration Program. These agencies are:

- National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration;
- National Park Service;
- U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service;
- California Department of Fish and Game;
- California Department of Parks and Recreation; and
- California State Lands Commission.

*MSRP Phase 1 restoration projects are in various stages of implementation. The following are highlights for each project that was proposed in the Phase 1 Restoration Plan.*

## **Restore Nesting Habitat for Seabirds**

**on the Channel Islands** MSRP is restoring nesting seabird habitat on the Channel Islands, specifically on **Scorpion** and **Orizaba Rocks, Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, and San Nicolas Islands**. Seabird restoration projects include non-native plant and animal removal, revegetation of native plants, and social attraction. Since 2007, MSRP planted **20,000+ native plants** with help from volunteers, installed 50+ artificial nests, removed feral cats from San Nicolas Island, and completed several years of seabird and oceanographic monitoring surveys among the islands. In 2011, biologists discovered nine Cassin's Auklets seabirds nesting in newly restored habitat on Santa Barbara Island. Seabird nesting habitat restoration work will begin on several Baja California Pacific Islands in 2012.

## **Restore Bald Eagles to the Channel Islands**

MSRP implemented a feasibility study to determine whether the northern Channel Islands could support a self-sustaining population of Bald Eagles. Institute for Wildlife Studies biologists successfully released 61 eagles on Santa Cruz Island and initiated a comprehensive monitoring program. The first natural hatching of a Bald Eagle in 2006 on Santa Cruz Island was a milestone for the study. Since the first natural hatchling, biologists have continued to observe a high nesting success rate among the Channel Island Bald Eagles with breeding occurring on four of eight Channel Islands. Approximately **65 eagles live among the Channel Islands** and new pairs are expected to establish breeding territories across the Channel Islands.

## **Outreach Focus: MSRP Gets High-Tech**

Experience California native wildlife in 3-D by visiting an MSRP kiosk at three different science centers and aquaria. Watch the underwater world of the wetlands in Huntington Beach by logging onto the MSRP fish webcam located at the Wetland & Wildlife Care Center. View Bald Eagles and their chicks live in their nests on the Channel Islands Live Bald Eagle webcam broadcasting from Santa Cruz Island. In recent years, MSRP has been incorporating technology into public outreach activities to engage the public in important restoration projects taking place throughout Southern California.

# MSRP PHASE 1 RESTORATION HIGHLIGHTS



## Restore Recreational Fishing in Southern California

MSRP is restoring recreational fishing by providing information to the public about fish contamination and by improving access to a diversity of healthy fish species. MSRP, along with partners, created several popular outreach products including a "Common Subsistence and Sport Fish of Southern California" identification card with safe fishing tips and the "What's the Catch?" comic book, both in three different languages, which are distributed to the public every year. Outreach mini-grants awarded to youth fishing organizations by MSRP are spreading the word about safe fishing and how to avoid "Do Not Consume" fish species. In 2012, MSRP hopes to build artificial reef modules along the Belmont Pier in Long Beach, California, that will attract a greater diversity of fish species that are available for consumption.

## Restore Fish Habitat in Southern California

MSRP focused on two major areas of fish habitat restoration for Phase 1 restoration, wetlands and Marine Protected Areas (MPA). Partial funding for Huntington Beach Wetlands was used to restore Talbert and Brookhurst Marshes in this complex and opened up approximately **140 acres of wetland habitat** to full-tidal flow. MSRP funding for Bolsa Chica Wetlands allowed dredging of the ocean inlet maintaining full tidal exchange. MPA funding went to the National Park Service and to the Partnership for Interdisciplinary Studies of Coastal Oceans to collect data on the effective management of these areas.


## Monitor Peregrine Falcons on the Channel Islands

In 2007, a comprehensive Peregrine Falcon monitoring effort across all eight of the Channel Islands was completed. Field rangers found 25 active territories and 16 pairs successfully hatched eggs that produced 35 young. One of the highlights of the 2007 survey was the documentation of a successful breeding pair on Santa Barbara Island. This event was the first documented breeding on the island in over 50 years! MSRP is planning to conduct a second monitoring survey in 2013.



Aerial view of Huntington Beach Wetlands restoration. (Earthcam, NOAA)




### **Restore Subtidal Reef and Kelp Forest Habitat on the Palos Verdes Shelf**

MSRP proposes to restore critical fish habitat on the Palos Verdes Shelf. Kelp forests and rocky reefs are known to produce more fish than other habitat types and fish that have lower levels of DDT and PCB concentrations in their tissues. MSRP is proposing to build artificial reef modules in areas that have been impacted by sediment erosion along the coast. Kelp forests in this area have been impacted by the loss of urchin predators which resulted in an increase in urchins essentially wiping out kelp forests. For this project MSRP would partner with commercial urchin divers and local non-profit organizations to perform urchin barren control allowing for natural kelp recruitment and growth.

### **Monitor Bald Eagles on the Channel Islands**

MSRP proposes to monitor Bald Eagles on the Channel Islands to determine if a self-sustaining population is feasible. The proposed monitoring program would continue to focus on breeding activities, investigation of diet, survival and contaminant analysis. The program would shift from extensive year-round monitoring to a more directed focus of understanding the eagle's annual population status.

### **Monitor the Recovery of Peregrine Falcons on the Channel Islands**

MSRP proposes to conduct two additional comprehensive monitoring efforts on the Channel Islands during Phase 2. Biologists would monitor active Peregrine Falcon territories to determine their reproductive success and levels of DDT and PCBs will be measured from egg and blood samples.

### **Restore Seabirds to Santa Barbara Island and Scorpion Rock**


MSRP proposes to continue and expand the restoration work on Santa Barbara Island and Scorpion Rock. On Santa Barbara Island, biologists would expand existing restoration sites and add new sites. If this project moved forward, MSRP would continue removal of non-native vegetation and planting of native plants on Scorpion Rock until native plants can fully establish and outcompete non-native plants. Biologists would also install nest boxes and social attraction devices on Santa Barbara Island and continue monitoring of seabirds at both areas.

### **Restore Ashy Storm-Petrels on the Channel Islands**

MSRP identified projects on Anacapa and Santa Cruz Islands in Phase 1 but was unable to complete this work. If this project moved forward, biologists would continue to work on these projects in Phase 2 but also may expand to include restoration projects throughout the Channel Islands as appropriate. MSRP proposes to improve nesting habitat, install social attraction devices, install artificial nesting boxes, perform annual monitoring at nest sites, and perform contaminant analysis.

### **Reduce Seabird Disturbance on the Channel Islands**

This proposed project will build upon on-going seabird disturbance reduction efforts that have been developed by other groups. Primarily this project would focus on developing and enforcing appropriate seabird colony protective measures, educating the public and specific user groups about protective measures, and evaluating program effectiveness for integration into statewide seabird management programs.

## LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE FOR THE NOVEMBER 8TH LOCAL & MUNICIPAL CONSOLIDATED ELECTIONS

Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean Logan today reminded eligible Los Angeles County residents that Monday, October 24, 2011 is the last day to register to vote in the upcoming Local & Municipal Consolidated Elections on November 8, 2011.

Individuals who wish to register must be at least 18 years of age by Election Day, a U.S. citizen and resident of Los Angeles County and not in prison or on parole for conviction of a felony.

If you are an active registered voter you do not need to re-register. However, voters should re-register to vote if they have recently moved, made a legal name change, or wish to change political party affiliation.

Voter Registration forms must be submitted to the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk by the October 24 deadline. Postmarked forms will be accepted.

The November 8, 2011 Local & Municipal Consolidated Elections are being held for the purpose of filling vacancies and for presenting measures which affect municipal and local jurisdictions in Los Angeles County. Contests to appear on the ballot include 19 cities, 42 School Districts (of which 28 are Unified School Districts), 4 High School Districts, 6 Community College Districts, 5 Water Districts, 5 County Water Districts, 8 City Measures, and 3 School District measures. The number of offices to be elected is 195.

**Construction of Phase II of the Donor Recognition Site at Del Cerro Park**

In 2008, at the request of the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy (PVPLC), the City Council approved the construction of a donor recognition site on a small portion of Del Cerro Park overlooking the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve to recognize major donors related to the acquisition of Preserve properties. The donor recognition site was approved to be constructed in two phases with all construction and maintenance costs paid for by the PVPLC.

In 2009, the PVPLC constructed Phase 1 of the recognition site which focused on contributions leading to the successful purchase of 463 acres of open space from Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Holdings (Barry Hon) in 2005. The construction included the following elements:

- An overlook at the southern edge of the park consisting of a low profile donor recognition wall with bench seating that utilizes local stone and respects the surrounding terrain by maintaining views and minimizing grading.
- A decomposed granite pedestrian trail (ADA compliant) connecting the existing parking area with the overlook.
- An "entry welcome" sign

The dedication ceremony for the Phase 1 overlook took place in July 2009.

The PVPLC is planning to begin construction this week of the Phase 2 overlook. The Phase 2 overlook will be adjacent to the Phase I overlook and will focus on contributions leading to the successful purchase of 193 acres of open space from York Long Point Associates in 2009. Similar to Phase I, a courtesy notice has been sent to property owners in the surrounding neighborhood advising them of the construction (see attachment). Construction of the final phase of the recognition site is anticipated to be completed in mid-November. An unveiling dedication ceremony will then be scheduled. City Staff and the PVPLC will notify the City Council on the scheduled date of the dedication ceremony.

**Did anyone see a church drive by...?**

On November 11, 2008, the Planning Commission approved a CUP Revision to Green Hills Cemetery's Master Plan which allowed the transfer of the abandoned St. Peter's church building from Harbor View Memorial Park in San Pedro to the Green Hills cemetery property. Because the church building is a Los Angeles Historic-Cultural Monument, the City of Los Angeles had to authorize and finalize the sale of the original St. Peter's building to Green Hills, which will be solely responsible for relocating, repairing and restoring the church building.

Now that Green Hills has obtained all of the necessary permits to relocate the church building, including permits from CalTrans, the physical relocation is scheduled to begin at 12:01am on Tuesday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, and should be completed in several hours. The church building will be moved by Cen-Cal Heavy Moving, which has conducted numerous moves throughout California, including several local moves such as the rectory building at Holy Trinity Catholic Church in San Pedro and the Bixby Ranch building in Long Beach.

The St. Peter's church building will be moved in two sections, and will take the following route from its current location at 24<sup>th</sup> Street and Grand Avenue:

- North on Grand
- West on 19<sup>th</sup> Street
- North on Western Avenue to Green Hills Cemetery

The final resting place for the church will be at the southern portion of the Green Hills site, which has already been graded and prepared for the structure. Per the requirements of the agencies involved with the church, the church will be restored to its original architectural elements and will be utilized for funeral services only. Although the steeple contains a bell tower, the bells will not be functional.

**Coastal Commission Hearing regarding 24 Sea Cove Drive**

As the Council may recall, back in December 2009, the Council upheld the Planning Commission's decision to conditionally approve a Variance and Coastal Permit to allow an after-the-fact pool, spa and outdoor chimney barbecue within the Coastal Structure Setback Zone on property owned by Mr. Brian Conroy at 24 Sea Cove Drive. The Council's approval was appealed to the California Coastal Commission by neighbors of the subject property and by two Coastal Commissioners. In June 2011, the Coastal Commission determined that the appeal raised a substantial issue regarding whether the City-approved development conforms with the City's certified Local Coastal Plan (i.e., the City's Coastal Specific Plan) thus requiring a de novo hearing on the item. On October 5, 2011, after holding a de novo hearing on the appeal, the Coastal Commission conditionally approved the Coastal Permit thus upholding the basis of the City Council's decision.

Staff is still awaiting the official Notice of Decision from the Coastal Commission to determine if the conditions imposed by the Coastal Commission are consistent with the City's conditions of approval. If additional conditions were imposed by the Coastal Commission, then Staff will need to bring the Coastal Permit back to the City Council for concurrence with the additional conditions imposed by the Coastal Commission.

### **Del Cerro Donor Recognition Site Improvements – Phase II Construction to Begin on or around Thursday, October 20, 2011**

On September 16, 2008, the City Council approved and authorized the construction of a donor recognition site at Del Cerro Park, as identified in the Council adopted Vision Plan document. Phase I of the Donor Recognition Site was completed in 2009. The donor recognition site was conceptually approved by the City Council at its January 24, 2005 meeting with the intent to recognize private donors who assisted in the City's acquisition efforts for the creation of the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve. The recognition site at Del Cerro Park is sponsored by the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy and consists of the following improvements:

- The construction of two overlooks (one of overlook was completed in 2009) at the southern edge of the park consisting of low profile donor recognition signs, bench seating. The design of the recognition site utilizes natural materials consisting of local stone and respects the surrounding terrain by maintaining views and minimizing grading.
- The construction of a decomposed granite pedestrian trail (ADA compliant) connecting the existing parking area with the overlooks.
- The installation of an "entry welcome" sign (completed in 2009).

Construction of Phase II (the final phase) is scheduled to begin on or around **Thursday, October 20, 2011** and is anticipated to be completed mid-November. For safety reasons, portions of Del Cerro Park will be closed off to the public to accommodate the construction.



## 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Paddle Tennis Tournament Wrap Up






### Point Vicente Interpretive Center




