

### **\* MEDIA ADVISORY \* NOVEMBER 8, 2011 LOCAL & MUNICIPAL CONSOLIDATED ELECTIONS SEMI-FINAL ELECTION RESULTS REPORTED**

Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean Logan announced semi-final election results for the November 8, 2011 Local & Municipal Consolidated Elections with 100% of the precincts reporting, 11.71% of eligible registered voters cast ballots in the district.

A total of 192,744 ballots were processed and counted on Election Night. This included 104,655 Vote By Mail ballots and 88,089 polling place ballots cast at the 897 voting precincts throughout the district. As of election night processing, we estimate 16,967 ballots remaining to be processed. This includes Vote By Mail, provisional and withheld ballots.

The Official Election Canvass will take place beginning Thursday, November 10, 2011 through Monday, November 21, 2011. During the Official Canvass all outstanding provisional and Vote By Mail ballots will be verified and tallied. The RR/CC will also conduct the 1% Manual Audit. The next scheduled update will be available Friday, November 11 after 5 p.m. and can be accessed via the RR/CC website [www.lavote.net](http://www.lavote.net). Additional updates will be posted every following Tuesday and Friday with the final official election results posted on Monday, November 21, 2011.

On Monday, November 21, 2011, the RR/CC is tentatively scheduled to certify the election results. On Tuesday, November 22, 2011 the Board of Supervisors is tentatively scheduled to declare the election results official.

## UPDATE ON FAA PUBLIC MEETING REGARDING THE PROPOSED CLASS C AIRSPACE DESIGNATION AT LONG BEACH AIRPORT

### Background

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) conducted two public meetings in late October regarding the revised proposal to create a Class C airspace surrounding Long Beach Airport (LGB). The City's aviation consultant, Williams Aviation Consultants (WAC) reviewed the revised proposal (the "2011 LGB Class C Proposal") and advised Staff that they believe that the City's pro-active effort in 2010, including the submission of the City's Technical Comments letter, as well as the unified comments provided by a number of South Bay cities, concerned residents and businesses, led to the FAA's decision to significantly modify the initial proposal (the "2010 LGB Proposal"). The 2010 LGB Proposal had a number of unintended consequences that would have led to increased air traffic over South Bay and Peninsula cities that would have caused unintended safety and environmental impacts.

City staff held a conference call on September 28, 2011 with staff of Redondo Beach, Rolling Hills, Palos Verdes Estates, Torrance and Tom Kamman, WAC's representative, to discuss the FAA's 2011 LGB Class C Proposal. All cities agreed that the FAA had made substantive changes. Staff of the cities of Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates and Torrance asked if they could be named as co-supporters of a letter to the FAA that would be sent by the City. At its October 4, 2011 meeting, the Rancho Palos Verdes City Council approved a letter to the FAA accompanying the Technical Analysis prepared by WAC. The letter congratulated and thanked the FAA for the airspace revisions contained in the 2011 LGB Class C Proposal, encouraged the FAA to thoroughly analyze any potential issues and impacts that arise or are identified at the October meetings and the subsequent public comment period and requested that the FAA advise the City of any significant changes it considers to the 2011 LGB Class C Proposal. The City Councils of Palos Verdes Estates and Redondo Beach approved and sent comment letters to the FAA.

### Update

Matt Waters, Senior Administrative Analyst, attended both FAA Public Meetings regarding the proposed Class C airspace designation surrounding Long Beach Airport ("LGB") on Tuesday, October 25 and Wednesday October 26. The meetings were well attended with over 120 people on the 25<sup>th</sup> and approximately 80 on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

The FAA moderator, Rick Pfahler, emphasized that the current proposal was a work in progress and could be changed based upon comments received. He stated that the significant changes to the original 2010 version were made in large measure to the over 1400 comments received from cities, residents, pilot groups and other interested parties.

All public speakers were opposed to the 2011 LGB Class C Proposal. Most speakers were either general aviation pilots associated with LGB or Long Beach residents. A number of common viewpoints were expressed, including a strong sentiment among the pilot community to maintain the current Class D status, significant suspicion of the FAA and Long Beach Airport's motivations (especially commercial airline expansion) and a lack of confidence in the safety data and safety claims by Jet Blue that originally prompted the consideration of Class C airspace. Mr. Pfahler encouraged speakers to email or write the FAA with specific concerns and suggestions and assured the audience that their concerns would be taken into account.

Finance and IT Director Dennis McLean attended a meeting of Torrance Airport pilots on October 5 about the 2011 LGB Class C Proposal. Pilots expressed similar sentiments to those heard at the Long Beach meetings, including doubts about the merits of Jet Blue's complaints and whether the 2011 LGB Class C Proposal was justified. Two pilots opined that the proposal was a "good compromise", but most speakers were in favor of LGB maintaining its Class D status.

Staff will continue to monitor the situation and keep the City Council informed of any developments.

### **CALPERS CEO ISSUES STATEMENT ON GOVERNOR'S PENSION REFORM PROPOSAL**

Anne Stausboll, Chief Executive Officer of the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS), recently issued the following statement in response to the Governor's 12-point pension plan.

"CalPERS is closely involved in the pension policy dialogue that will affect our employers and members in the State, schools and local government. We encourage discussion between all parties to ensure that public employee retirement plans are sustainable, secure and cost-effective.

"CalPERS pensions have provided retirement security for California's hard-working State and local public employees for nearly 80 years. Retirees with a dependable income contribute to stimulating our economy. In 2010, CalPERS \$12 billion in monthly pension checks resulted in more than \$26 billion in economic activity throughout the State, including \$14 billion in business revenue and more than 93,000 jobs.

"In today's fragile economy, many employers are facing budgetary challenges and have already made changes to their pension systems. We have observed more than 175 cities, counties and local governments negotiate changes to lower near-term

and future costs by increasing employee contributions, modifying benefits for new hires, or both. Changes in the State plan that have already occurred will result in significant savings of about \$13 billion over the next 30 years. Some of the Governor's proposals may require constitutional changes, while others may require collective bargaining.

"At CalPERS, we believe that defined benefit plans are an important cornerstone to adequate and secure retirement. Pension change dialogue should focus on the critical policy issue of how to provide adequate and secure retirement income for public workers in a cost-effective way, while honoring vested rights for existing employees. We are committed to serving as an honest broker of information and an expert in pension administration as all parties work together on pension solutions. As the pension policy discussion progresses through the Legislative process, CalPERS can assist with information on costs and potential savings over time to facilitate lawmakers in a fully informed discussion."

CalPERS provides retirement benefits to 1.6 million State, public school, and local public agency employees, retirees, and their families, and health benefits to more than 1.3 million members.

### UPDATE ON ARTERIAL ROADS REHAB PROJECT


The Palos Verdes Drive West/Palos Verdes Drive South Arterial Roads Rehabilitation Project is ramping up for construction, which is anticipated to begin within the next week. The pre-construction meeting will be held this Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2011, with the construction contractor, construction management, inspection oversight, materials testing, and local utility company representatives. Notifications of the upcoming construction work have been sent out to residences and businesses fronting the project area as well as project information signs placed at each end of the project area. The project limits extend from Hawthorne Blvd to Conqueror Dr, excluding the landslide area, and will include work performed in the street as well as the adjacent sidewalk. This work is expected to continue through February 2012. Impacts to traffic will be mostly minimal at first, but will increase as the project continues on. The road will remain open to the public throughout the project, but access may be reduced to one lane or controlled by flagging operations for certain phases of the work. Therefore, it may be desirable to use alternate travel routes during the more intensive work periods of the project. ## **CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES ON VIA CANADA STORM DRAIN IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

Construction crews have completed underground work on the new catch basin installation on Via Velardo. Last weekend's rain provided an unscheduled test of the newly installed structures and the system performed without a hitch. Work is progressing on the Via Canada portion of the project. The work on Via Canada involves installation of about 75 linear feet of 18-inch concrete pipe, a new catch basin along the curb and a junction structure in the intersection with Via Velardo where the new pipe joins the existing pipe. The Contractor continues to target completion of work for mid-November. Residents, pedestrians and motorists in the area should exercise caution around active construction sites and adhere to all warnings, flagman and temporary no parking signs.





This Saturday, the public is invited to attend an open house hosted by the City's docent organization, Los Serenos de Point Vicente. The event will take place at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and will be an enjoyable opportunity to learn about the role of the docents and junior docents, and the many projects in which they are involved. Los Serenos is a vibrant organization, boasting approximately 135 adult members and 25 teen members.



Highlights of the event will be the newest exhibit, the hanging whale skeleton named Serena; tours of the museum and native plant garden; introduction of the W.O.W. (Whales on Wheels) Program and other educational programs; and historical early California costumed characters; and free souvenirs and refreshments.

## **Abalone Cove**

This Saturday, the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy (PVPLC) is offering a challenging docent-led hike to Sacred Cove and the tide pools at Abalone Cove. The parking fee will be waived for hikers. Rain will cancel this hike. The City sponsors these walks as part of its ongoing partnership with the PVPLC.

## **Point Vicente Interpretive Center**

On Monday, staff met with eight members of the Public Relations Committee to discuss the upcoming PVIC Open House this Saturday.

On Tuesday, staff assisted members of the new docent class as they hiked the trails of Abalone Cove.

On Wednesday, members of the new docent class learned about the weather patterns of the Peninsula. Afterward, they explored the native plant garden with a local naturalist, and reviewed the uses of the various plants by Native Americans.

On Wednesday evening, PVIC hosted the Montrose Settlement Restoration Program (MSRP) presentation on "Restoring Natural Resources Harmed by DDT and PCBs within the Southern California Marine Environment."

MSRP is a program of the National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration that develops and implements restoration projects aimed at restoring natural resources that were directly harmed by DDT and PCB contamination. Members of the public are invited to attend this open meeting and learn about the restoration efforts particular to the Peninsula.

## **Docent-led Hike Report**

On Monday morning, docents led 13 Cub Scouts and 6 leaders on a tour through the museum's marine life exhibits. During this tour, docents highlighted the complex relationship between whales and humans with discussion of early whaling practices and changing attitudes towards whales and their preservation.

On Saturday morning, 25 students from Hollywood Senior High School will participate in a docent-led tour through the museum, focusing on the local area and the Peninsula's original inhabitants. Afterward, docents will lead the group on a hike to the tide pools at Abalone Cove, where they will learn about tide pool creatures and local wildlife.

On Saturday afternoon, docents will lead 30 students from Berendo Middle School on a tour through the museum, sharing information on the Pacific gray whale and its extraordinary migration. Next, docents will take the group on a hike at Abalone Cove, where they will discuss the habitat of tide pool animals and the effects of pollution on local wildlife.
