PENINSULA REGIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT CRIME STATISTICS

Attached for the Council's information are pertinent excerpts from the statistics presented at the Peninsula Regional Law Enforcement Committee meeting held on November 10, 2011. Unless noted otherwise, the data presented is for the third quarter of 2011 (July through September).

Part 1 Crime – Year to Date Comparison for 2010 and 2009

Law enforcement agencies across the county use the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) system to collect and report crime statistics. Part 1 crimes consist of the eight most serious offenses including homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny theft, motor vehicle theft and arson.

Part 2 Crime – Year to Date Comparison for 2010, 2009 and 2008

Part 2 crimes include 22 categories of offenses ranging from simple assaults to vagrancy.

Traffic Statistics

Please note that the "Traffic Enforcement Index" is a ratio of the number of hazardous traffic citations issued to the number of injury collisions. An index higher than 20 is considered to be good.

Sheriff Response Time Performance

The Sheriff's goals for response times are under 7 minutes for Emergency Calls, under 20 minutes for Immediate Calls and under 1 hour for Routine Calls.

Ambulance Response Statistics

The ambulance company's goal for response times is 90% under 9 minutes.





CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES ON VIA CANADA STORM DRAIN IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Construction crews continue work on the Via Canada portion of the project. The junction structure, and about 70 linear feet of 18-inch concrete pipe have been installed and work is beginning on the project's second catch basin. Final items to be completed this week or early next week include paving and restorative landscaping. Weather delays and breakage of an unmarked 1-inch water service line have caused short delays to the schedule. Water service was repaired the same day by CalWater who took responsibility for failing to mark the service line. The Contractor continues to target completion of work by Thanksgiving. Residents, pedestrians and motorists in the area should exercise caution around active construction sites and adhere to all warnings, flagman and temporary no parking signs.



CAL WATER FILES ADVICE LETTER 2053 WITH PUC

Cal Water filed Advice Letter 2053 with the California Public Utilities Commission on November 15, 2011 which has a proposed effective date of January 1, 2012. The Advice Letter 2053 requests an increase in rates (0.9% increase for the Palos Verdes metered district) that has already been noticed to customers in connection with general rate case application number 09-07-001. A copy of the Advice Letter 2053 is available for review and is on file with the City's Department of Public Works.

FALL BRUSH CLEARING EVENT COMPLETED

The Fall season's five-week brush clearing event is complete and EDCO collected a total of 42 tons of green waste. The weekly tonnages varied depending on the route. Some routes service homes with larger yards and/or canyon properties, which generate more brush.



Little Critter Afternoon Tales a big success!

Twenty seven people attended the first Little Critters story time program on Wednesday, November 9th from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Hesse Park. This new program is a joint partnership between the



City's Recreation and Parks Department and the Palos Verdes Library District. Marissa Perley, Assistant Manager in the Young Reader's Department, read stories and led the children and parents in songs and craft activities, based on the theme for the month. This free program is geared to youngsters ages 2 to 5 and their parents, but children of any age are welcome. The next Little Critter program will be held on Wednesday afternoon, December 14.

Point Vicente Interpretive Center

Despite the cloudy skies, Los Serenos members declared their Saturday, November 12th Open House a success. Through posters and video, handouts and word of mouth, the members of Los Serenos highlighted the various opportunities and programs they support. There were several sign-ups for the upcoming Junior Docent class and several leads for future docent members.

On Monday, staff met with the Los Serenos Membership Committee to discuss the results of the recent docent survey; the special meeting with other board members, the strategic plan for membership and docent mentoring.

On Monday, staff met with members of the Fourth Grade Committee to refine the details of the new program for all PVPUSD 4th grade students. Discussion included review of a new staff and docent designed booklet that will be used as a teaching tool and as a keepsake for students. Other topics included the logistics of museum tours for large groups of students, and the educational material to be covered with the students. The field trips will commence in March 2012 and will provide tours for all 800+ school district 4th grade students.

On Tuesday afternoon, eight Cub Scouts participated in a docent-led tour through the Interpretive Center's museum, focusing on the marine life exhibits and the Pacific gray whale's extraordinary migration.

On Tuesday, staff met with members of the Exhibit Design Committee to reassess the priorities and strategies for phase II and III. Topics included a review of the original outdoor history museum concept with an eye on updating and incorporating design elements identified since the Center reopened. Also discussed was the success of Serena's installation, the possibility of adding the dolphin skeleton, and the need to document the strategic plan for the interior and exterior exhibits.

On Wednesday morning, members of the California Native Plant Society met to perform monthly maintenance in the native plant garden.

On Wednesday, staff met with members of the Nominating Committee to discuss potential nominees for next year's Los Serenos Docent Board.

On Wednesday, members of the new docent class attended their weekly training at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center. Topics covered included the unique geological features of the Palos Verdes Peninsula as well as some of the local fossils.

Consent Calendar:

Item E- Renewal of Animal Control Services Contract. This contract was due for renewal in 2009 and has been extended pending further review and discussion with neighboring cities. There are several issues of concern regarding the poor implementation of certain existing County contracted services and the need to include prior services such as trapping and pick-up of wild animals; so much so, that it is becoming a public safety issue. I am requesting this matter to continued

Public Hearings:

Item 3.- Employee Incentive Program. This concept was introduced by Mayor-Pro Tem Missetich who is not even present to participate the in the discussion. Authorizing the City Manager to distribute up to \$131,100 at her discretion at this time, places Mrs. Lehr and staff in an awkward position with both the residents and the new Council.

Item 4- IT Services Agreement. There are several unanswered questions in the community regarding this minimum outlay of \$282,000 (and likely more) for PV on the Net. One question I would ask have is "When was the last time the City went out to bid on this item?" Also, the lack of specificity of services to be provided and that no performance metrics are defined makes this agreement problematical.

Item 6- Conservation Easements for the Land Conservancy. Discussion and questions have arisen regarding public safety issues. Many of these concerns were made known during the recent City Council campaign. They **will undoubtedly** be addressed with the new Council.
