UPDATE - PROPOSED CLASS C AIRSPACE DESIGNATION SURROUNDING LONG BEACH AIRPORT – POTENTIAL IMPACT ON RANCHO PALOS VERDES

Staff is pleased to inform the City Council and the community that all four Peninsula cities, as well as the cities of Torrance and Redondo Beach, will issue comment letters to the FAA before the end of the comment period that ends on September 21, 2010. The FAA will consider the comments prior to making a decision whether to move forward with the issuance of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, followed by a public comment process prior to a final decision to issue a rule to change the LGB airspace. The process could take up to a couple years before any rulemaking is finalized.

The FAA's proposed LGB Class C airspace would be about 3 times larger than the existing Class D airspace. In its published Potential Impact Statement, Williams Aviation Consultants, expressed concern that if the proposed airspace is established:

- 1) Flight instructional aircraft from schools based at Hawthorne Airport, Compton Airport and Zamperini Field (Torrance) would likely move from the LA/Long Beach harbor "practice and instructional area" (a major portion of which would become restrictive Class C airspace) to the entire Palos Verdes coastline.
- 2) A greater number of general aviation aircraft departing from Zamperini Field (Torrance) or flying over coastal southern California using the Mini-Route and visual flight rules ("VFR") will avoid the Class C airspace and either fly along the Palos Verdes coastline, along the Western Avenue corridor or over the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

Everyone needs to encourage residents to let the FAA know what they think on or before September 21, 2010. Residents of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes may provide comments directly to the City (preferably to the attention of Dennis McLean, Director of Finance & Information Technology) by emailing faairspace@rpv.com. PALOS VERDES DRIVE SOUTH ROADWAY STABILIZATION PROJECT IN THE LANDSLIDE AREA

The latest efforts of roadway stabilization work in the landslide area along PVDS are now complete. The final step was application of the bright green hydroseed slurry that is applied for soil stabilization. The slurry mix combines wood fiber mulch, water, fertilizer, native plant seed and a natural binder to create a protective layer over the soil. It is applied in an effort to contain the disturbed soil by the properties of the dried slurry crust initially and later by the establishment of plant roots. Soil stabilization is required by the Regional Water Board for construction sites of this size to reduce sediment from being transported into receiving waters, in this case the ocean. Although the City's work is finished, the Portuguese Bend Club will continue to do road maintenance work on their property adjacent to the City's project area.



UPDATE ON RESIDENTIAL ROADWAY REHAB PROJECT

The crews are striving to complete most of the work on curb/gutter, sidewalk, ADA ramp, and pavement resurfacing on the remainder of the streets in the Whitley Collins/Scotwood area north of Crest Road this week. Work continues on the residential streets on the south side of Crest Road as well. Favorable weather conditions have helped the work move forward, despite some issues with the construction equipment encountered along the way. The City and Contractor, Sully-Miller Contracting Company, continue to strive to keep the residents updated on how the street parking and access in their area will be impacted as the work schedules are adjusted as needed. Residents are encouraged to visit the Public Works Department's webpage on the City's website for updated maps and notices as they become available. Staff is very appreciative of the continued patience and cooperation received by the residents in these areas.

EDCO'S FIRST CITY-WIDE EXCESS GREEN WASTE COLLECTION EVENT

Staff is working closely with EDCO on organizing the next free City-wide excess/bulk green waste collection and recycling event for the City. Two years ago Waste Management started this program which was very successful and well received. This will be EDCO's first bi-annual event with the goal of assisting homeowners' dispose of (free of charge) excess brush, shrubs, tree branches and bushes in order to comply with the Fire Marshal rules. This is especially helpful for large and/or canyon properties and homes with trees in need of trimming. The green waste can be in tied bundles, in EDCO carts, in WM's old cans and/or other personal cans. EDCO will then recycle the collected green waste. This free event is in addition to the regularly scheduled weekly green waste collection. The tentative plans are to start collection in mid October, for five consecutive Saturdays, concentrating each week on different areas in RPV depending on their regular collection day. Listed below are tentative dates that will be confirmed within a week and then advertized.
