**ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION & OUTREACH**

The following public outreach and environmental education activities occurred in the City:

- A full page colored used oil and stormwater pollution prevention ad was placed in the September 2010 PV Concours D'Elegance magazine.
- An Enviroscope presentation (stormwater runoff and pollution prevention) on September 24, 2010 for Mira Catalina Elementary School, 5<sup>th</sup> grade science classes (approximately 65-70 students).

The funding source was the used oil block grant from CalRecycle. These activities help the City meet its NPDES and AB 939 public outreach and education requirements. Pictures attached.

**EDCO'S MAILERS AND QUARTERLY INVOICE**

EDCO is mailing a postcard announcing the upcoming Free Citywide- brush clearing event. The informative postcard should reach homes in the next 4-7 days and give residents plenty of time to start preparing for the brush clearance. See attached. Press releases by both the City and EDCO have been sent to local newspapers. EDCO's dedicated website for the City, [www.rpvrecycles.com](http://www.rpvrecycles.com) will also be updated to include this event. Staff will work with Channel 33 to place information on that channel.

Additionally, EDCO is mailing out its 2<sup>nd</sup> quarterly invoice at the end of the week. The invoice covers three months (October to December). The invoice includes a billing insert and the Environmental Times promoting the City's Brush Clearing Event and other recycling activities. Some customers might wonder: "Didn't I just pay my invoice?" The reason is that EDCO's first invoice was held back and mailed in August (instead of July) allowing customers time to change their cart sizes and have the invoice reflect the correct monthly rates. This second quarter invoice is being mailed on time. The invoice and billing inserts will be mailed to every customer. Thus, customers who pre-paid the annual rate and received a 5% rate discount will still receive a statement, but it will reflect a credit amount.

## **UPDATE ON RESIDENTIAL ROADWAY REHAB PROJECT**

The contractor crews have continued work on some of the residential streets near Palos Verdes Drive East, as well as in the Miraleste Plaza area. They have focused on preparatory work for the resurfacing, such as asphalt concrete repair, tree root removal, curb ramp, and gutter work in these areas. Street sweeping of the recently paved areas in the Whitley Collins/Crest Road residential streets also continues to help minimize any loose gravel left behind from the construction work. The resurfacing of the remaining residential streets bordering Crest Road and Crenshaw Boulevard is scheduled to begin the week of October 11<sup>th</sup>, and the streets in the Miraleste/Palos Verdes Drive East residential areas in the week of October 22<sup>nd</sup>.

## **TURFGRASS IMPROVEMENTS AT RYAN & HESSE PARK**

During the fall months, the Public Works maintenance division will be working on improving turf conditions through dethatching and aeration at Robert E. Ryan Park, and Fred Hesse Park.

**Turfgrass dethatching is a distinct cultural management practice used to promote a healthier, more vigorous turf.**

Thatch is a dense mat of roots, stems, and grass clippings that accumulates on turf, blocking the flow of vital nutrients. Dethatching is the removal of the excessive layer of decomposing underlying material.

- Dethatching increases air circulation.
- Promotes healthy cell growth.
- Improves irrigation drainage, and allows water, nutrients and air to pass directly to the root system.
- Assists in reducing or eliminating competing grasses.
- Reseeding with a non-thatch forming grass increases the elimination of thatch.
- Increases the health and vigor, and reduces maintenance requirements.
- Applying these requirements will help reduce maintenance time, improve field aesthetics, and improve playing conditions.

**Turfgrass aeration is the process of using mechanized equipment to puncture the soil with spikes.**

- Providing for greater absorption of irrigation and/or rain.
- Improved air exchange between the soil and atmosphere.
- Enhanced soil water uptake.
- Improved fertilizer uptake and use.
- Reduced water runoff and puddling.
- Improved turf grass rooting.
- Reduced soil compaction.
- Enhanced heat and drought stress tolerance.
- Improved resiliency and cushioning.
- Enhanced thatch breakdown.
- Applying these requirements will help reduce maintenance time, improve field aesthetics, and improve playing conditions.





## There Are Many Ways to Reduce the Amount of Household Trash this Year

From Thanksgiving through the New Year's holiday the average household generates between three and 10 extra bags of trash. However, not all this material is considered waste. Mixed into the trash are many recyclable materials, such as food and packaging. Too often these recyclables end up buried in landfills, taking up valuable space.

### Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Gift Wrapping & Holiday Decorations

Wrapping materials such as ribbon and wrapping paper are one of the largest quantities of materials that end up in the trash during the holiday season.


In fact, each year 38,000 miles of ribbon alone is thrown out nationwide; which is enough to tie a bow around the Earth! Residents can give the gift that keeps on giving by recycling products that can be reused and remade into postconsumer material. Please consider the following ideas that will help reduce, reuse and recycle materials used when wrapping packages:

- Decorate your home with holly, cedar, berries, fruits and nuts, all of which can be composted after use. Use popcorn and cranberries to decorate the tree.
- Create gift tags from last year's holiday cards or wrapping paper.
- If you use traditional gift wrapping or send holiday cards, buy paper products made from recycled paper that can also be recycled.
- Design your own wrapping paper using paper shopping bags: decorate them with paints, crayons or art. You can also use blueprint paper or the Sunday comics.
- Drop off extra packaging materials at local private mailing centers. Call the Plastic Loosefill Council Peanuts Hotline at 1-800-828-2214 for the names of local businesses that reuse packing peanuts.
- Recycle non-metallic wrapping paper and boxes if you do not plan to use them again.
- Save wrapping paper and ribbons to reuse next year. Ribbons made from paper can be recycled. Ribbon made from plastic or fabric is not recyclable but can be reused on other packages.
- Cardboard boxes with clear plastic windows can be recycled.

### Give Gifts That Will Reduce Waste

When selecting gifts to give family friends, and coworkers, consider the following ideas that can help reduce the amount of waste generated:

- Give non-material gifts such as gift certificates for balloon rides, bay/whale watching cruises, music lessons, transit passes and gym or museum memberships. Buy tickets to a local theme park, sporting event, movies or concerts.
- Give two gifts in one by using baskets, fabric bags, scarves or pillowcases to wrap gifts.
- Make home-baked goodies such as cookies, brownies or fudge and place them in a reusable tin box, a kitchen container or a decorated box with minimal packaging.
- Give services such as making dinner or helping with home improvements.
- When selecting your gift please consider how long it will last. Often, a cheaper item will wear out long before its more durable equivalent.
- If you are giving electronics, give rechargeable batteries and a battery charger with it.
- And, always remember to look for items made from recycled content.

- Aluminum pie and baking tins, and foil
- Cardboard and paper packaging
- Gift wrapping
- Plastic juice bottles and soda, plastic milk and water jugs






