

PROPOSITION 26

Proposition 26, "Proposed Constitutional Amendment: State and Local Fees and Charges: Vote Requirements and Limitations", will appear on the November 2nd ballot for all Californians. The initiative would re-categorize some state and local fees as taxes, requiring a 2/3 vote of the public. Proponents of the initiative see Proposition 26 as the next logical step after Propositions 13 and 218 to restrict local governments' ability to raise revenue. Staff is currently assessing the potential impact of this initiative to the City, and is in process of preparing a staff report for the October 19th City Council agenda. The League of California Cities has taken a position to oppose Proposition 26.

CALIFORNIA BUDGET IMPACT TO RPV

On October 8, 2010, 100 days after the start of the fiscal year (FY), the State of California finally passed the budget for FY 2010-2011. In adopting the State's \$87.5 billion spending plan, both Democrats and Republicans were able to come to an agreement on how to solve a \$19.1 billion deficit. The majority of the shortfall was addressed through increased revenues assumptions from taxpayers and the federal government and reductions to prisons, social services, and compensation for certain state workers.

Unlike previous years, this edition of the state's budget does not contain any significant impacts to local municipalities. However, this was almost not the case. Thanks to swift action by municipalities, the League of California Cities, and other parties, including Rancho Palos Verdes, a last minute effort to include legislation with the state's budget package that would have had adverse effects on the City's transient occupancy tax (TOT) revenue, was thwarted. According to the League of California Cities, "SB 848 (Hollingsworth) was a classic end-of-session legislative lowball effort aimed at undercutting local TOT revenue collection to benefit online travel companies (OTC)."

As always, staff will continue to monitor the State's budget situation. For most government entities, the Great Recession has left little room for financial error. Any change in the economy or State's budget assumptions may have direct impacts to the City.

UPDATE – FAA AIRSPACE & TOA HELICOPTER ROUNDTABLE

As you may already know, the City timely filed its Technical Comment letter to the FAA regarding the proposed Class C airspace designation surrounding the Long Beach Airport (“LGB”) late last month. Staff has added the Technical Analysis Report prepared by Williams Aviation Consultants and its Technical Comment letter on the City’s website which can be found using the following link:

On October 5, 2010, the City Council for the City of Manhattan Beach joined the cities of Torrance, Redondo Beach and all four cities of the Palos Verdes Peninsula with their approval of a comment letter that expressed their concerns regarding the unintended consequences that may be caused by the proposed airspace change. Staff will continue to monitor the FAA’s next steps.

Staff of the City of Torrance has conducted helicopter noise roundtable meetings during the last several months regarding its Zamperini Field (TOA) operations. At my request, TOA staff met with Beverly Ackerson and me this week to discuss various TOA helicopter safety issues. Both Ms. Ackerson and I expressed concern regarding the merits of a long-standing (but seldom used) helicopter route that traverses the Crenshaw Road canyon from Pacific Coast Highway near TOA up past Silver Spur near the top of the Peninsula. The route is referred to as the South Crenshaw helicopter route.

Torrance staff expects to make a recommendation to the TOA Airport Commission to form a sub-committee to consider helicopter operations, including local helicopter routes surrounding the Airport. Unless the City Council wishes to agendaize the matter for consideration, I expect to make a request to the sub-committee to abandon the South Crenshaw helicopter route from TOA.



UPDATE ON RESIDENTIAL ROADWAY REHAB PROJECT

Work continued on the asphalt repair work in the residential streets near Palos Verdes Drive East, including tree root removal, curb ramp, and gutter work in these areas. Major asphalt reconstruction work on El Tesoro Place is scheduled to begin next week (October 18-22). In addition, the installation of striping and placement of pavement markings of the recently paved areas in the Whitley Collins/Crest Road residential streets began this week.




Striping and Pavement Markings on Northbay Road







PREPARATIONS BEGIN FOR CAL WATER PIPELINE REALIGNMENT PROJECT ON PALOS VERDES DRIVE EAST

Public Works Department Staff met with engineering and maintenance supervisory staff from the California Water Service Company to discuss plans for the upcoming pipeline project on Palos Verdes Drive East. This project will realign a portion of the 33" wide pipeline that serves as a major line for the water supply for the entire hill. Earth movement has become a problem for its current location, so a portion of the pipe will be realigned so that it follows a path along Palos Verdes Drive East instead, from just north of the intersection with Coral Ridge to the intersection with Via Canada. This project is still in the design phase, with construction anticipated to begin in late January to early February 2011 and completed by mid-June 2011. City Staff met with the California Water Service Company representatives in the field and discussed details of the project including traffic control, coordination with other City projects in the area, and scheduling work around the hours of the nearby Miraleste Intermediate School. California Water Service Company plans to take some initial soil borings along Palos Verdes Drive East in the next couple of weeks as part of the finalization of the design.

EDCO GEARING UP FOR CITYWIDE BRUSH CLEARANCE

This Saturday EDCO begins its free Citywide Fall brush clearing event. For five consecutive Saturday's, residents in different areas of the City are encouraged to trim bushes, shrubs, trees and clear excess vegetation growth from their property, canyon, etc. EDCO's designated green waste trucks will drive by each street and pick up unlimited green waste in carts, cans and bundles. Customers have been notified to leave their green waste at the curb by 7 am to avoid missed pickups. Collection starts at 8 am. EDCO notified their customers by mailing individual postcards, mailing a billing insert and the quarterly Environmental Times. Additionally, Public Works staff has sent press releases to the local papers, list server and Breaking News e-mails, and the PV News published an article in the City Beat section.

1. HEIGHT VARIATION & SITE PLAN REVIEW (CASE NO. ZON2010-00044): 28820 Cedarbluff Drive / Peters Architecture (SK)

Request: A request to construct a 635ft² addition and a balcony to an existing single-story residence. The proposed height of the two-story addition is 24', as measured from the point where the lowest foundation or slab meets finished grade, to the ridgeline or highest point of the structure.

Request: A request to construct a 191 square foot balcony at the front of the existing split-level residence, projecting into the front and north side setbacks, and exceeding the maximum lot coverage allowable.

ACTION: ADOPTED P.C. RESOLUTION NO. 2010-32; THEREBY CONDITIONALLY APPROVING THE VARIANCE, COASTAL PERMIT & SITE PLAN REVIEW, AS PRESENTED BY STAFF (6-0), WITH COMMISSIONER LEWIS RECUSED.

3. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 200, REVISION "B", GRADING PERMIT & COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2009-00442): Lower Point Vicente / Annenberg Foundation (AM)

Request: A request to construct a 50,979 square-foot education building (including an 11,850 sq. ft. enclosed subterranean parking lot and a 3,916 sq. ft. enclosed mechanical area) and a 990 square-foot outpost building, as well as site improvements consisting of an outdoor exhibit area (archaeological dig, dry farming exhibit, and Tongva Village), expanded picnic and viewing areas, enhanced on-site trails, restroom facilities, and approximately 10 acres of new

landscaping. The proposed education building would be two-stories with an approximately 35,000 square foot footprint, and at its highest point, the building would be 16-feet above the existing grade (the "by right" height limit for buildings within the Open Space Recreational zoning district) and 27-feet above the proposed finished grade, as measured from the lowest finished grade (153' – garage entrance) to highest roof ridge line (180' – upper parapet). The Outpost Building would be 16-feet in height as measured from existing grade. The project would be served by 197 parking spaces, including 101 parking spaces previously approved by the Planning Commission under a separate permit for the PVIC expansion project. Site preparation would involve excavation of approximately 39,570 cubic yards of material (soil and rock) and placement of approximately 14,780 cubic yards of fill material. Approximately 24,790 cubic yards of material would be exported from the site (primarily consisting of rock material).

ACTION: OPENED THE PUBLIC HEARING, HEARD PUBLIC TESTIMONY, PROVIDED STAFF WITH FEEDBACK ON THE PROPOSED PROJECT AND CONTINUED THE PUBLIC HEARING TO THE NOVEMBER 9, 2010 MEETING (6-0), WITH COMMISSIONER LEWIS RECUSED.



Council Approves Hesse Park and Ryan Park Athletic Field Improvements

Recreation and Parks and Public Works staff have sought the best configuration of athletic fields at Hesse and Ryan Parks to provide optimum use and to best serve the community for active recreation in accordance with the City Council Tactical Goal of improving opportunities for access and active recreation at City parks. On July 6, 2010, Council approved a Capital Improvement Plan that included \$500,000 for Hesse Park Field Upgrades Phases I and II. The CIP budget included constructing an additional ball diamond and new field amenities. After further analysis of current park athletic field use, and athletic league activity on the Peninsula, staff recommended that Council revise the adopted Capital Improvement Project for Hesse Park. The city faces two major challenges concerning athletic fields: challenging city topography and limited available space. Despite these challenges, the proposed plans maximized athletic field quality and use, and created opportunities for multiple concurrent athletic uses. Because the revised Hesse Park improvements were significantly less expensive than the project described in the adopted FY 10-11 CIP, staff recommended that Council appropriate the remaining funds for improvements and upgrades to the athletic fields at Ryan Park, with a similar goal in mind.

On Tuesday, October 5, the City Council unanimously approved the staff recommendation to revise the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) to improve the existing athletic fields at Hesse Park and Ryan Park to maximize public use of fields and to improve the safety and quality of play.
