**RECRUITMENT FOR THE CITY OF RANCHO PALOS VERDES FINANCE
ADVISORY COMMITTEE, TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMISSION, AND EMERGENCY
PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE**

The City is currently conducting a recruitment to fill five seats on each of the following City Committees and Commissions: Finance Advisory Committee, Traffic Safety Commission, and Emergency Preparedness Committee. These are volunteer, non-paying positions with four-year terms of office. Initially, the term of office will be staggered with three seats with a term of four years and two seats with a term of two years in length.

Finance Advisory Committee

The Finance Advisory Committee provides citizen input to the City Council regarding financial matters of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. The Committee reviews short and long-term financial information of the City and other financial issues as assigned by the City Council. The Committee advises the City Council regarding the City's financial

condition, on economic development matters, and recommends specific areas for review to the City Council. The work plan for the Finance Advisory Committee for 2011-12 will include a review of the 2011 Five-Year Financial Model. Upon completing review assignments, the Committee may provide its comments and recommendations to the City Council. The Committee will also receive a presentation of the City's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) prepared annually, including the annual independent audit report. The Committee meets on an as-needed basis, as determined by the annual work plan.

Traffic Safety Commission

The Traffic Safety Commission advises the City Council on neighborhood traffic issues, special projects as assigned by the City Council, and traffic impacts on neighborhoods caused by development proposals. The Traffic Safety Commission reviews and advises on neighborhood traffic calming guidelines and proposed projects, and collaboratively works with staff to address residents' requests for improving livability and drivability of neighborhood streets in Rancho Palos Verdes. The Traffic Safety Commission meetings are held on a bi-monthly schedule, typically the 4th Monday of the month, with additional meetings held as needed.

Emergency Preparedness Committee

The Emergency Preparedness Committee is charged with making recommendations to the City Council to help ensure that the City of Rancho Palos Verdes develops and maintains a high state of readiness to respond to emergencies and disasters. Committee members advise the City Council on ways to develop and improve programs

to communicate with and educate residents about the importance of emergency preparedness. Committee members are called upon to participate in community outreach events to encourage residents to become prepared and to participate in local volunteer disaster response organizations. Committee members are also encouraged to become trained and registered as Disaster Service Workers, and/or receive other disaster-related training and certifications. The Committee meets on a monthly basis, typically the 3rd Thursday of the month, with authorization to staff to cancel unnecessary monthly meetings after conferring with the Chair.

Those interested in applying must submit an application to the City Clerk's Office by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, December 3, 2010. To be considered for appointment, an applicant must be a resident of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. 

UPDATE - LAX NOISE ROUNDTABLE MEETING ON NOVEMBER 10, 2010

Staff has attached a couple excerpts from a statistical report titled "Statistical Update on LAX Aircraft Operations" that was presented to the LAX Noise Roundtable last night. The ten-year trend of jet and turboprop flyovers across the Palos Verde Peninsula shows about a 300% decrease. The daily rate of flyovers has declined to about twelve (12) per day.

Staff has received very few aircraft noise complaints even with the heightened awareness of aircraft flights resulting from the City's pro-active effort regarding the proposed Long Beach Airport ("LGB") airspace change. Only two (2) complaints were filed by residents of the City with LAX during the first six months of 2010, less than 1/2% of total noise complaints filed.

Notwithstanding our relatively quiet skies (or at least the complaints), Staff made a request to the LAX Noise Roundtable to send a letter to the FAA inquiring when the JEDDD departure procedure would be implemented. Once implemented, the JEDDD departure procedure should further reduce the flyovers of turboprop aircraft. The LAX Noise Roundtable unanimously agreed and directed LAX staff to send the inquiry letter on behalf of the Noise Roundtable.




Prior to the beginning of the meeting, Staff took the opportunity to talk with Steve May, Special Program Integrator, who works in the local Western-Pacific Region offices of the FAA. I asked Mr. May whether the FAA had decided to move forward with the proposed LGB airspace change. He told me that Southern California TRACOM was still evaluating the proposed LGB airspace change.

UPDATE - TOA AIRPORT COMMISSION - HELICOPTER SUBCOMMITTEE



CITYWIDE BRUSH CLEARING SUCCESSFUL



EDCO successfully completed their first Citywide fall brush clearing event, and a total of 71.5 tons of green waste was collected. Their weekly collection breakdown is as follows:

Regular collection Day	Brush Clearing Day	Green Waste Tonnage Collected

Comparatively, Waste Management collected 41 tons during their fall 2008, and 25 tons during their spring 2009 brush clearing events. The green waste collected by EDCO will be recycled as mulch and/or alternative daily cover, resulting with the City receiving diversion credit from the State.

UPDATE ON RESIDENTIAL ROADWAY REHAB PROJECT

Pavement resurfacing work has resumed in the Island View and Sea Crest neighborhoods off of Crest Road. Chip seal was applied on Monday and slurry seal is being applied on various streets the rest of the week. Chip seal is also scheduled to be applied on Middlecrest, Crestridge, Valley View, and Crestwind roads this Friday. Slurry seal will follow on these roads in the next week or so. No work will take place on Thanksgiving or the Friday after Thanksgiving. Staff is very appreciative of the continued patience and cooperation received by the residents in these areas.

UPCOMING CREST ROAD/CRENSHAW BLVD ASPHALT WALKING PATH REHAB PROJECT

Pavement resurfacing work will begin on Monday, November 22nd, on the walking pathway that runs along Crest Road and Crenshaw Boulevard. The work includes removing tree roots and placing root barriers in areas where the tree roots have displaced portions of the walkway. A sealant will then be applied over the entire walkway from just east of Highridge Road to north of Park Place to help preserve and maintain the asphalt. Work is expected to continue through Friday, December 3rd, barring any inclement weather or unforeseen conditions. Public notices have been placed on barricades at various locations along the sidewalk informing the public of this scheduled work.

1. COASTAL PERMIT, VARIANCE, HEIGHT VARIATION, GRADING PERMIT AND SITE PLAN REVIEW (CASE NO. ZON2009-00403): 86 Yacht Harbor Drive / Pesusich (LM)

Request: A request to construct a 356 square foot addition to the existing single-story residence, an 84 square foot balcony, and a 404 square foot addition and roof deck above the existing detached garage. The applicant is also requesting to legalize a 300 square foot carport that was previously converted to habitable space along the northeast portion of the existing residence. The application requires a Height Variation to allow the existing residence to exceed 16'-0" from the highest grade elevation. A Variance is required to allow reduced setbacks, development over an extreme slope (35% or greater), construction of more than 250 square feet within the City's Coastal Setback Zone, an addition over the detached garage exceeding 16'-0" in height, construction of a roof deck over the detached garage, and a non-conforming lot coverage of 65%. The project also includes the construction of three (3) garden walls, one 5'-0" tall retaining wall along the south property line, and one (1) 5'-0" tall retaining wall along the north side of the residence to accommodate a new planter and stairs.

The project also includes a total of 925 cubic yards of grading (616 cubic yards of cut and 309 cubic yards of fill) to accommodate the new garage and storage space, driveway, new pool and additional yard area. In addition to a number of garden walls, a new retaining wall will be constructed at the rear of the new residence ranging in height from 2'-6" to 10'-0".




