Open Space Subcommittee's Trails Planning Issues

At the November 4, 2010, City Council meeting, Sunshine presented to the City Council (under "Audience Comments") a list of eleven (11) issues that she asked to be addressed in the City's future trails plans (see attachment). These issues were originally presented to the Open Space Planning, Recreation and Parks Task Force in May 2004 by its Open Space Subcommittee. At the time that the Task Force's final recommendations were presented to the City Council, the Council did not give direction to implement these recommendations. Staff has reviewed the Subcommittee's list and believes that many of these issues are relevant to and warrant further consideration as a part of the upcoming Trails Master Plan project. As such, Staff will keep these issues in mind as the Trails Master Plan "kicks off" in early 2011.

Applications of Note

The Open Space Subcommittee of the RPV OSP and R&P Task Force recommends that the Task Force approve or disapprove of each of the following proposed substantive changes to the City's Trails Network Plan (TNP) prior to the updating of the specific text:

1. Since the Conceptual Trails Plan (CTP) and the Conceptual Bikeways Plan (CBP) were generated as Phase 1 of the TNP update, they should not appear to be "stand alone" documents. The Introductions, Implementation Policies, Existing Trails/Bikeways Inventories, Conceptual Trails/Bikeways and Appendices should be inserted into the appropriate sections of the primary document.
2. Since the policies which determine which type of trail users are precluded from using portions of specific trails at any given time are more flexible than the TNP and since enforcement of said policies is not addressed, said use determinations should be left unrestricted until established by deed restriction, emergency closure or City Council action.
3. Since the Plan includes directives to the Planning Dept., the Recreation & Parks Dept., the Public Works Dept., and the Finance Dept., the "Definitions" section should be expanded to include the esoteric terms of each of these professions that are used and called: A GLOSSARY OF TERMS.
4. Since many of the trail and other landmark names used in the document have been selected arbitrarily for purely communication purposes, a policy for establishing names of trails should be included for use when a trail is implemented.
5. Since the California Coastal Trail (CCT), the Palos Verdes Loop Trail (PVL) and bikeways in major transportation corridors extend beyond the City's jurisdiction and plans for their implementation are being addressed by other bodies, direction should be included to coordinate improvements and signage with the more global concepts.
6. Since the "safety" of any given trail is determined more by the users' capabilities than the physical infrastructure improvements, the "TYPE" of improvements (see proposed Guidelines Matrix) should be established based on the best user opportunities available and a direction included so that they can be adjusted according to demand. For instance, narrow prisms should be provided in native habitats with routine inspections so that they can be widened, rerouted or more turnouts provided should a particular section start to become crowded ... without having to modify the TNP.

7. Since miscommunications have occurred about reference points, GPS points should be included.

8. Since the recommendations in the "Categories" in the Status: factor of the specific trail descriptions have not been implemented by Staff, language should be added to make them more specific directives. (Proposed language has been submitted to General Plan Update Steering Committee since this portion of the CTP was added to the General Plan as Amendment 22.)

9. Since Category VI in the Status: factor of the specific trail descriptions does not provide the same type of information and directives as the other categories, it should be eliminated. The "special circumstances" presently described here should be described in the text of the status of the specific trails that have them.

10. Since the development of certain trails have been made conditions of proposed projects without the destinations that make the trail appropriate, an Objectives: factor should be added to each trail description.

11. Since the change in the Status: of any given trail is not circulated "in house" a section should be added where such changes can be posted on an ongoing basis. (See the proposed TABLE OF CONTENTS.)

1. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT – TIME EXTENSION (CASE NO. ZON2009-00107):
3960 Crest Road / CalWater-Verizon (KF)

Request: A request to extend the approval of a Conditional Use Permit for a Verizon Wireless telecommunications facility for one (1) year.

Action Deadline: None.

Recommendation: Grant a 1-year extension of the approval of the Conditional Use Permit for the property at 3960 Crest Road (Planning Case No. ZON2009-00107) via Minute Order, thereby setting the final expiration date as December 8, 2011, with all conditions of approval remaining in full force and effect.

2. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 200, REVISION “B”, GRADING PERMIT & COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2009-00442): Lower Point Vicente / Annenberg Foundation (AM)

Request: A request to construct a 50,979 square-foot education building (including an 11,850 sq. ft. enclosed subterranean parking lot and a 3,916 sq. ft. enclosed mechanical area) and a 990 square-foot outpost building, as well as site improvements consisting of an outdoor exhibit area (archaeological dig, dry farming exhibit, and Tongva Village), expanded picnic and viewing areas, enhanced on-site trails, restroom facilities, and approximately 10 acres of new landscaping. The proposed education building would be two-stories with an approximately 35,000 square foot footprint, and at its highest point, the building would be 16-feet above the existing grade (the “by right” height limit for buildings within the Open Space Recreational zoning district) and 27-feet above the proposed finished grade, as measured from the lowest finished grade (153’ – garage entrance) to highest roof ridge line (180’ – upper parapet). The Outpost Building would be 16-feet in height as measured from existing grade. The project would be served by 197 parking spaces, including 101 parking spaces previously approved by the Planning Commission under a separate permit for the PVIC expansion project. Site preparation would involve excavation of approximately 39,570 cubic yards of material (soil and rock) and placement of approximately 14,780 cubic yards of fill material. Approximately 24,790 cubic yards of material would be exported from the site (primarily consisting of rock material).

Action Deadline: One year from the date the EIR is certified

Recommendation: Continue the public hearing, without discussion, on the proposed planning applications to the January 25, 2011 Planning Commission meeting.

3. COASTAL PERMIT, VARIANCE, HEIGHT VARIATION, GRADING PERMIT AND SITE PLAN REVIEW (CASE NO. ZON2009-00403): 86 Yacht Harbor Drive / Pesusich (LM)

Request: A request to construct an 941 square foot addition to the existing residence. The overall height of the residence would be 35’-6” in height as measured from the lowest finished

grade adjacent to the structure to the highest ridgeline. The additions would connect the detached garage to the primary residence. The applicant is also requesting to legalize a 300 square foot carport that was previously converted to habitable space along the northeast portion of the existing residence. The application requires a Height Variation to allow the existing residence to exceed 16'-0" from the highest grade elevation. A Variance is required to allow construction over an extreme slope, the overall height to exceed 26'-0", and construction of more than 250 square feet within the City's Coastal Setback Zone. The project also includes the construction of retaining walls.

4. HEIGHT VARIATION, GRADING PERMIT AND EXTREME SLOPE PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2009-00170): 54 Rockinghorse Road / Colaruotolo (LM)

Request: A request to construct an after-the-fact 71 square foot addition to the first floor and a 2,343 square foot basement beneath the existing 3,478 square foot residence. The overall height of the residence will measure 24'-0" as measured from the highest existing ridgeline (elev. 217.93') to the lowest finished grade adjacent to the foundation/slab (elev. 193.93'). The project also includes a new deck in the rear yard that will extend a maximum of 6'-0" beyond the top of a previously existing extreme slope. Additional after-the-fact grading approval for a new retaining wall with a maximum height of 20'-0" along the south property line and 1,799 cubic yards of cut and fill is required for the construction of the basement and fill in the rear yard.

Request: A request to modify the Director's approval of City Tree Review Permit Case No. CTRP2008-00031, to allow for the trimming and adoption of ten (10) trees whereas the Director's decision currently requires the removal of three (3) City-owned Canary Island Pine trees per Municipal Code Section 17.76.100.F.1.c.iv, and allows for the potential adoption of seven (7) City-owned Canary Island Pine trees in the public right-of-way, which significantly impair the view from the properties located at 7306, 7315, 7284 and 7333 Berry Hill Drive.






Dear Jim,

I appreciate your recent comments in your e-mail to me. Of course you know that when someone writes to me and copies the other councilmembers I cannot respond privately if I wish to address all councilmembers and so I must respond publicly. By copy of this to staff I am asking that this response (not your letter which I am omitting) be placed in a Friday report. The gist of your thought is that individual members of the public should not be identified by city officials in discussion of controversial issues. I agree that is usually the best approach. However, here serious and exceptional concerns caused me to name the individual.

The individual I singled out has taken a very public role in the discussion of a number of issues in this city. The individual has (notwithstanding his or her denials) attempted to pressure me into dropping a Freedom of Information Act request designed to make information that may be important public. Far from being intimidated by me, this individual is a powerful and influential person who is attempting to intimidate me and has successfully intimidated others in the past. The individual has also misrepresented important facts in my view and improperly (and repeatedly and publicly) accused some of us of acting "illegally." My efforts to encourage better conduct by this individual through private communications with him or her were not successful. Naming the individual was a last resort and is important to providing an effective deterrent to and accountability for what I feel is serious misconduct that endangers the process of fair decision-making in the city. Allowing the individual to continue speaking and acting with anonymity also allows the individual to act with impunity--knowing his or her conduct will never be directly called into question.

I recognize the importance of respecting every member of the public. But fair decision-making is also important. A person who clearly and voluntarily becomes a prominent spokesperson on a controversial issue is no longer a private person, but rather is a "public figure" and is legally recognized as such. It is not intimidating anyone to recognize this reality and to hold such public figures accountable for misconduct that unfairly manipulates the decision-making process. And here in particular it is clear that the individual involved was and is in no way intimidated.
