CITY MANAGER

- Site Visit for CCHE Grant for PVIC: On March 24th, Staff met with representatives of the California Cultural and Historical Endowment (CCHE) to review the City's application for grant funding for interior exhibits at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center (PVIC). Our CCHE grant application requests \$144,320 in funding for the "Point Vicente Lighthouse Lens" and "Hunting the Whale" exhibits at PVIC (see attached grant fact sheet), with the City providing a \$149,860 match from in-kind contributions and the "PVIC Exhibits Donor Restricted Fund." The City Council authorized Staff to pursue this grant in August 2015. CCHE expects to notify successful grant recipients by late-May 2016.

FINANCE

- New Check Register: Staff is excited to announce the enhanced "Register of Demands Report" presented at the regular City Council meetings! For additional transparency, the report will now include check numbers. The additional information is a standard best practice for local governments and the Finance Department will use the enhanced format starting on the April 5th City Council agenda packet.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Maintenance: Staff responded to a report of a grinder pump issue at 4 Thyme. The pump was found to be clogged with rags. Our grinder pump contractor cleared the clog and reinstalled the pump. Staff responded to a reported sewer leak on PVDS across from the Wayfarers chapel. Staff exposed the pipe which was ruptured. The damaged section of pipe was replaced by our plumbing contractor. Staff and contract personnel provided logistical support for the Easter egg hunt at Ladera Linda. Mowing at lower Hesse Park was completed by the City's Park landscaping contractor.
- Water Conservation Update: Staff receives updates on the Palos Verdes District's (RPV is included) water conservation measures. In February the PV District reduced its water consumption by 11.5% when compared to February 2013. The State Water

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Resources Control Board (State) set a cumulative water reduction goal of 36%. The PV District reduced its water use by 27.6% when compared to the same nine-month period in 2013. Meanwhile the State extended the emergency drought regulations through October. The same prohibitions – for example, using potable water to wash sidewalks and driveways, using potable water during and 48 hours after measurable precipitation, and using potable water to irrigate ornamental turf on public street medians – still apply. Staff will continue its public education and outreach efforts.

- Earth Month Activities: Staff has scheduled several recycling, reducing and re-using activities to celebrate Earth Day and is busy promoting them! Composting Workshop on April 2nd at Hesse Park, Citywide Brush Clearing Event starting April 16th, Earth Day Celebration at the Promenade on April 20th, and Document Shredding Event on April 23rd at the Civic Center/City Hall. Meanwhile several elementary schools will have an Earth Month related presentation with cooperation from Waste Management.
- ADA Access and Sidewalk Improvements on PVDW: This project is located on PVDW between Hawthorne Blvd and Rue Beaupre. The work includes installation of a new sidewalk, new retaining wall and new bus shelter. Construction was completed last week on Friday. Staff will coordinate with LACDC to close out the project.



- Grayslake Road Drainage Improvements: This Project is located at the end of the Grayslake Road cul-de-sac. The scope includes installing new storm drain structures. Construction was completed this week. Staff is in the process of closing out the project.



- Portuguese Bend Landslide Dewatering Wells Project: This Project is located in the Del Cerro Preserve Area close to Burma Road. The scope includes drilling dewatering wells and installing pump equipment if ground water is found. Staff had a pre-construction meeting on March 24th with the contractor and PVPLC.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- Peafowl Trapping Program Update: On March 22nd, the City issued a list-serve message updating subscribers on the status of the trapping program. In summary, the message indicated that trapping for 2015 concluded in February because the cap of 150 birds was reached, and that a census survey will be conducted the first two weeks in April to assess the current peafowl population within the five surveyed neighborhoods. The message requested the public's assistance in identifying the tree locations where the birds roost overnight. The City received a robust and positive response from the public. Thus, as reported, the census survey is scheduled to begin on April 1st for approximately a two week period. The results of the census survey will be presented to the City Council in May.
- RPV ISO Rating: It was earlier reported that the Insurance Services Office (ISO) was performing a review of the building codes adopted by the City and the efforts put forth to properly enforce these codes. In summary, ISO is an independent statistical, rating, and advisory organization that serves the property/casualty insurance industry. ISO collects information on a community's building-code adoption and enforcement services, analyzes the data, and then assigns a Building Code Effectiveness Grading Classification (BCEGC) from 1 to 10. Class 1 represents exemplary commitment to building-code enforcement. The concept behind BCEGC is simple, municipalities with well-enforced, up-to-date codes demonstrate better loss experience, and their citizens' insurance rates can reflect that. The prospect of minimizing catastrophe-related damage and ultimately lowering insurance costs gives communities an incentive to enforce their building codes rigorously. The survey has resulted in a **class 2** for one- and two-family dwellings, and a **class 2** for all other non-residential construction (see attached ISO Letter). A chart is attached showing a comparison with County, State, and National averages (see attachment).
- View Restoration Permit (VRP) No. 203 Update: Over the past several weeks, Staff and the City Council have been receiving weekly emails from Mrs. Ginette Aelony regarding the trimming compliance associated with VRP No. 203. As previously reported, City Staff has been trying to coordinate a mediation meeting requested by Mrs. Ginette Aelony's (VRP Applicant) legal counsel and the foliage owner. At this time, the foliage owner has agreed to participate in mediation. Thus, Mrs. Aelony's attorney, Mr. Jeff Lewis, has been apprised of the foliage owner's willingness to participate in the requested meditation and has been requested to deposit funds into a City-held trust account to fund the mediation service. A date for the mediation meeting has not been identified at

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this time.

RECREATION & PARKS

- Egg Hunt Eggstravaganza: Last Saturday's annual Egg Hunt Eggstravaganza at Ladera Linda Community Center sold out! Over 100 youngsters participated in the egg hunt led by the Big Bunny, while parents and grandparents 'egg-ed' them on! All participants traded in their 'eggs' for candy and prizes, and parents had many opportunities to take pictures of their children posing with the Big Bunny, too!



- Toyon Trail Remediation Project: The Toyon Remediation Project is now complete. Over five Saturdays in March and April, Recreation and Parks and Public Works teamed up to repair and improve Toyon Trail in the popular Portuguese Bend Nature Reserve. Volunteers and community groups (including Boy Scout Troops #128 and #257, an Eagle Scout, PVPLC's Trail Crew, and CORBA) came together to define the trail, eliminate blind corners, create a traffic slowing mechanism and seating area, and plant native habitat. A special thank you to the PVPLC's Volunteer Trail Crew for their guidance, Palos Verdes CORBA for coming out in force for some heavy lifting, and all the energetic volunteers (361 hours!) who came out to help their community.



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- Free Yoga in the Park: Two free yoga classes were offered to the public this week. Seven people attended the Monday noon class at the Civic Center location and 5 people attended the Tuesday 8:30 AM Hesse Park class.
- Hesse Park: The facilities are rented this week for thirteen indoor recreation classes, two outdoor recreation classes, two non-profit meetings, three Peninsula Seniors activities, and four private rentals. The upcoming Saturday morning's Composting Workshop will be held in the Fireside Room. The playing field areas are now open for drop-in public use and youth sport league field rentals following a three-month field closure to allow re-seeding and growth of the grass.
- Ladera Linda Park: The facilities are rented this week for four indoor recreation classes and two private rentals.
- PVIC and Docents: On Wednesday evening, the Junior Docents in training will be feted at a graduation ceremony. This week, Los Serenos docents will lead museum tours on Thursday morning and Saturday afternoon.
- Ryan Park: The facilities are rented this week for three indoor recreation classes, four outdoor recreation classes, four youth sports league practices, and one private rental.
- REACH Therapeutic Recreation Program: On Monday night, REACH participants met at Hesse Park and celebrated all things egg-related. Participants prepared and dined on quiche served with salad and a custard dessert, followed by some 'egg-stra' fun games.

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes Point Vicente Interpretive Center (PVIC) proposes to design, construct, and install two new permanent exhibitions (as part of a larger project) that explore the remarkable human and natural history of the Palos Verdes Peninsula. The exhibits will focus on shore whalers of the 1860s and the lighthouse lens that guided mariners since 1926.

At-a-Glance

- **FACILITY.** The PVIC opened in 1984 and is owned and operated by the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. Admission to the PVIC is free to the public. The Center operates from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. Some special programs and events may occur in the evening with a general ending time of 10:00 p.m.
- **CAPITAL ASSET PROJECT.** The proposed project is to construct and install two new permanent exhibits that focus on the regional shore whalers of the 1860s and the lighthouse lens that guided mariners since 1926. The exhibits are named "Hunting the Whale" and "Lighthouse Lens," and are part of a larger exhibition project that will be implemented in phases. These two exhibits can be developed independently of the other exhibits.
- **MUSEUM AUDIENCE.** The PVIC attracts over 60,000 visitors each year. This number represents a mix of residents, national and international visitors (many from the neighboring Terranea Resort), and school children. The Center historically reaches over 1,000 school-aged children from the Los Angeles Unified School District South, which borders the Peninsula, and serves 75,000 students in 97 schools with 72% of the schools classified as Title I schools.
- **PROJECT IMPACT.** The exhibits will share new and interesting details of California history mixed with science and engineering. The project meets the legislative objective of "Services to the Public" by raising the Center's professional interpretive standards, and it also creates a deeper sense of place and illuminates how people through time have used their surroundings to their advantage, as well as adapted to the surroundings for survival. These exhibits are clear representations of the PVIC's objective to explore stories that support a single "Big Idea," namely: ***By exploring the stories of the people who have made Palos Verdes their home, we can appreciate the great forces that attracted them, the impact of cultures meeting, the way in which they changed the land and were, in turn, changed by the land.***
- **PROJECT TEAM.** The project team is composed of a group of experienced staff, outside consultants, scholars/experts and volunteers who were assembled over the past nine months specifically for the proposed Project.





Figure 1. Example of a Fresnel Lens.

Final elements for completion of the project are anticipated to take place June 2017 – October 2017. The project is Categorically Exempt from CEQA.

We wish to thank you for the cooperation given to our representative, Timothy J Perella, during our recent survey. We have completed our analysis of the building codes adopted by your community and the efforts put forth to properly enforce those codes. The resulting Building Code Effectiveness Grading Classification is 2 for 1 and 2 family residential property and 2 for commercial and industrial property.

The Insurance Services Office, Inc. (ISO) is an insurer-supported organization with the primary mission of providing advisory insurance underwriting and rating information to insurers. There is no requirement that insurers use our advisory material. Insurers may have adopted, or may be in the process of adopting, an ISO insurance rating program that will provide rating credits to individual property insurance policies in recognition of community efforts to mitigate property damage due to natural disasters. These insurers may use the Building Code Effectiveness Grading Classification we have recently developed for your community as a basis for the credits used. While individual insurers may use different credits or different effective dates, the ISO program will apply credits to new construction within Rancho Palos Verdes that has been issued a Certificate of Occupancy in the year 2016 and forward.

We will email our report which provides additional information about our classification process and how we have graded various aspects of your community's building codes and their enforcement.

We want to highlight the fact that the Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule is an insurance underwriting and information tool; it is not intended to analyze all aspects of a comprehensive building code enforcement program nor is it for purposes of determining compliance with any state or local law or for making property/casualty loss prevention and life safety recommendations.

If you have any questions about the Classification that was developed, please let us know. Additionally, if you are planning on any future changes in your building codes or their enforcement, please advise us as these changes may affect our analysis and your community's grading classification.

Chart 6-1 Comparison of Commercial Points Scored





Chart 6-2 Comparison of Residential Points Scored
