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ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

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CITY MANAGER

Heal the Bay's 2017 Beach Report Card: Heal the Bay released its annual Beach Report Card on June 15th, and Portuguese Bend Cove maintained its long run on the Honor Roll with A+ water quality ratings for Summer (dry), Winter (dry) and wet conditions. Unfortunately, Rancho Palos Verdes' other monitored beaches—Long Point and Abalone Cove—received lower grades for wet-weather conditions this year and dropped off the Honor Roll (both beaches maintained A+ ratings during dry-weather conditions). The deterioration in wet-weather grades was observed at beaches statewide this year due to the heavy winter rains. Proposition 64 Trailer Bill Amended: On June 14th, the League of California Cities (League) announced that the League and the California Police Chiefs Association (CPCA) had reached an agreement with the Governor's Office on the Proposition 64 budget trailer bill, which sought to undue past progress towards sensible regulation of medical and non-medical marijuana in California. As the City Council will recall, you approved letters in opposition to this budget trailer bill on May 15th. The League and CPCA supported the amended bill (see attachment), which was incorporated into the approval of the proposed FY17-18 budget by the State legislature on June 15th.

Update on SB 649: On June 19th, the League announced that SB 649 was expected to be heard in the State Assembly's Local Government and Communications and Conveyance committees before the end of the month (the Local Government Committee's hearing is scheduled for June 28th). Therefore, the City Manager sent updated versions of the City Council's April 18th letter in opposition to SB 649 to the chairs of both of these committees (see attachments). Copies of these letters have also been provided to 66th District Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi.

Ring Meet and Greet: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes would like to invite residents to attend a Ring Meet and Greet event on Saturday July 8th, 2017, from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM at Hesse Park, located at 29301 Hawthorne Blvd.

At the event, residents will be able to purchase one Ring camera for a special Rancho Palos Verdes price. The Ring Video Doorbell and Stick Up Cam will be available for \$99 and the Ring Pro will be available for \$75 at the event. Residents can opt to purchase an additional two Ring camera products for \$50 off. An additional Ring Video Doorbell or Stick Up Cam would be \$129 and the Ring Pro would be \$199. Ring will also be offering a discount on select accessories: the Chime Pro and Solar Panel will be available for \$34.

Please note that this discount program is only available to Rancho Palos Verdes residents who show proof of residency, complete a Resident General Release Agreement, and who have not previously purchased devices through the program.



FINANCE

FY17-18 Draft Improvement Authority (IA) Budget: Staff will be introducing the draft FY17-18 IA budget to the Board for its review and consideration at its next scheduled meeting on August 1st. Since the IA is a component unit of the City, its budget is also included with the City's budget. The draft IA budget is segregated into two (2) legally restricted funds: Abalone Cove and Portuguese Bend and provides funding to maintain landslide mitigation resources in both geographic locations.

PUBLIC WORKS

Road Closure on PVDE between Via Subida and La Vista Verde Dr.: SCE will be replacing three power poles near Palos Verdes Drive East and Via Subida. Due to the poles' location and the limited access, a portion of PVDE between La Vista Verde Dr. and Via Subida will be closed on Wednesday, June 28, 2017 from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. to accommodate large cranes to perform the work. Please watch for and obey the traffic control signs and the flagman's direction for your safety, and the safety of the workers. Abalone Cove Sewer Manhole Rehabilitation Project: Ayala Engineering has successfully completed, in a timely manner, the rehabilitation of sixty nine manholes in the Abalone Cove sewer system. The City will file a notice of completion as soon as the final invoice is received and processed.

Maintenance: Maintenance personnel repaired a water leak near the backflow preventer on Aqua Vista Drive. Concrete repairs to remediate damage associated with a traffic collision on Calle Entradero are scheduled to begin in the week of June 26th. Maintenance personnel removed two uplifted sidewalk panels on La Rotonda Dr. A temporary asphalt section was placed so the sidewalk could be opened to pedestrians, pending permanent repairs, which are scheduled for later in the summer.

Coastal Bluff Fencing Phase 1: This project consists removing the existing bluff fence adjacent to PVIC and replacing it with a new colored precast concrete ranch three-rail fencing. A pre-construction meeting was held on Monday June 19th to review and approve project submittals and the project schedule. The contractor is ordering materials and construction is scheduled to commence in August 2017.

SEED Awards Seeking Applications: Staff is promoting the 2017 SoCal Environmental Excellence Development (SEED) awards which targets South Bay groups and organizations promoting environmental excellence, sustainability and stewardship. Applications are open to all local individuals, groups, non-profits, schools and business that have exhibited excellence in helping to improve environmental sustainability and quality of life in the South Bay. Applications are being accepted until June 20, 2017. Public Works thanks the Daily Breeze for promoting the awards by running an announcement on Saturday June 10, 2017. The announcement is “spotlighted” on the City website.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Green Hills Neighborhood Advisory Committee Meeting: City Council Condition No. 17 requires that Green Hills establish a Neighborhood Advisory Committee comprised of representatives from the Peninsula Verde and Rolling Riviera HOAs, City Staff, and Green Hills Staff that is to meet every quarter to review operational and neighborhood concerns. The second quarterly meeting was held on Monday, June 19, 2017 at City Hall and followed an agenda prepared by City Staff based on input from the Committee representatives (see Attachment). A summary of the meeting is attached (see attachment).

Green Hills Administration Building: In 2014, the Planning Commission approved a 3,323ft² single-story addition, covered walkway, and a new/reconfigured parking area at the Administration Building. A building permit was issued for the work in mid-2015 and on June 14th construction was completed and the building permit was finalized.

Maria's Mexican Restaurant Opening in Rancho Palos Verdes: Maria's Mexican Restaurant recently relocated to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes at 28643 S. Western Avenue after years of being in business in the City of Torrance. The restaurant operator is currently seeking an alcohol license from the State's Alcohol Beverage Control Department and is considering up-grading on-site facilities. The restaurant provides a full service menu for sit-down dining or carry-out, and is open daily for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Tesla's Solar Roof May Soon Be Coming to Rancho Palos Verdes: The Building and Safety Division has recently received inquiries on Code requirements for installing Tesla's new solar roof shingles. The City is working with property owners on identifying the

applicable Building Code requirements for this new technology, and will update the Council on when the first permit is issued.

RECREATION & PARKS

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

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Hesse Park: The facilities are rented this week for eleven indoor recreation classes, a four-day outdoor teen sports camp, five non-profit group rentals, two Peninsula Seniors activities, and three private rentals.

Ladera Linda Park: The facilities are rented this week for four indoor recreation classes and one non-profit rental.

Ryan Park: The facilities are rented this week for three outdoor sports recreation classes, a five-day youth sports camp, two youth sports league rentals, and two private rentals.

PVIC and Docents: The Sunset Room will be rented for a non-profit rental on Thursday evening. On Saturday and Sunday, the amphitheater will be rented for wedding ceremonies, and the Sunset Room will be rented for wedding receptions.

The Little Fish Tales by the Sea program was held in the Sunset Room on Thursday, June 15th. 76 children attended the program, which was led by PV Library staff and included books, songs, and movement.

Dear Governor Brown:

On behalf of the California Police Chiefs Association and the League of California Cities, we are pleased to express our support for Assembly Bill 110 and Senate Bill 94.

We acknowledge that arriving at the current language of these trailer bills has been a long and difficult process. We very much appreciate the hard work and responsiveness of the Governor's Administration and his staff to addressing our concerns.

We also want to acknowledge the work of the authors of the Medical Cannabis Regulation and Safety Act (the Act) of 2015 for their staunch advocacy, solidarity and support in addressing our concerns with the initial draft of the Trailer Bill. In addition, the staff in the Senate Pro Tem's office and the Speaker's office, as well as the Budget Committee staff in both houses over the past nine weeks for their receptiveness in listening to and working to resolve our points of concern. We are gratified by the dialogue we have had with various industry stakeholders which has led to a deeper understanding of the core concerns of all parties.

Our objections to the initial draft of the Trailer Bill centered on public safety, local control, including codification of local regulatory and enforcement authority consistent with the model created by the Act, as well as several provisions from the Act not initially carried over that protected the public health, children, fragile neighborhoods, and the environment. We are grateful for the restoration of much of this language, as it is our sincere belief that it is in the public interest. We are particularly appreciative of the codification of local regulatory and enforcement capability along the lines we have suggested. We are pleased to now state publicly that the overwhelming bulk of our concerns have been addressed by the current vehicles, Assembly Bill 110 and Senate Bill 94.

However, in supporting this measure we must also publicly express our support for Assembly Bill 64 (Bonta), which contains important regulatory provisions not addressed in either AB 110 or SB 94. In addition, we remain concerned about two issues in particular which we have raised but have not been addressed by the Trailer Bills.

First, neither vehicle contains sufficient restrictions on cannabis advertising with respect to all business entities, not merely licensees. Second, neither vehicle contains the requested clarification of local governments' eligibility for grant funds under Proposition 64 for regulatory and enforcement purposes, based on the licensing activities that they choose to allow and/or prohibit within their respective jurisdictions. We will continue to seek legislative solutions to these issues.

Dear Assemblymember Aguiar-Curry:

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes understands that SB 649 is scheduled to be heard in the Assembly Local Government Committee on June 28, 2017. As the chair of that committee, we wish to express to you our City's strong opposition to SB 649 and proposed amendments related to the permitting of wireless and small cell telecommunications facilities. This proposal unnecessarily and unconstitutionally strips local authority over public property and shuts out public input and local discretion by eliminating consideration of the aesthetic and environmental impacts of "small cells."

This proposal would prohibit local discretionary review of "small cell" wireless antennas, including equipment collocated on existing structures or located on new "poles, structures, or non-pole structures," including those within the public right-of-way and buildings. The proposal preempts adopted local land use plans by mandating that "small cells" be allowed in all zones as a use-by-right, including all residential zones.

As such, the proposal provides a *de facto* exemption to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the installation of such facilities and precludes consideration by the public of the aesthetic, nuisance, and environmental impacts of these facilities, all of which are of particular importance when the proposed location of facilities is within a residential zone.

SB 649's use of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) definition of a "small cell" includes other "small cell" equipment such as electric meters, concealments, telecom demarcation boxes, ground-based enclosures, battery backup power systems, grounding equipment, power transfer switches, cutoff switches, cables, or conduits. *The proposal allows for an unlimited number of antennas of less than three cubic feet each or six cubic feet for all antennas*, while placing no height restrictions on the pole. While proponents argue that an individual "small cell" has very little impact, the cumulative size specifications of all the small cells and associated equipment far exceed the perceived impacts from a single small cell.

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The proposal also unconstitutionally preempts local authority by requiring local governments to make available sites they own for the installation of a “small cell.” While a city may place “fair and reasonable terms and conditions” on the use of city property, the proposal does not provide a city with any discretion to deny a “small cell” to be located on city property, except for fire department sites. In effect, this measure unconstitutionally gives control of public property to private telecommunications companies, while also precluding local governments from leasing or licensing publicly-owned property.

This bill strips local government of the authority to protect the quality of life of our residents, and to protect public property and the public right-of-way from relatively unconstrained access by small cells. In 2015, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes undertook a comprehensive initiative to develop a new wireless telecommunications permitting process for small cells and other installations in the City’s public rights-of-way, particularly in residential neighborhoods. This initiative, which undertaken as a result of increasing resident concerns about the proliferation of cell sites in the City’s public rights-of-way, involved the participation of City leaders, residents and telecommunications service providers, culminating in the adoption of the City’s Wireless Telecommunications Facilities Ordinance in March 2016. The City is currently processing more than two dozen permit applications under this ordinance.

Local governments typically encourage new technology into their boundaries because of its potential to dramatically improve the quality of life for their residents. **However, SB 649 goes too far by requiring local governments to approve “small cells” in all land use zones, including residential zones, through a ministerial permit, thereby shutting the public out of decisions that could affect the aesthetics of their community and the quality of their environment.** For these reasons, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes **opposes** SB 649.

Summary Report of the June 19, 2017 Quarterly Meeting

Summary of Discussion

I. Introductions and Opening Remarks

Ara Mihranian welcomed the committee members and acknowledged Green Hill's responsiveness and proactive efforts to mitigate impacts to the neighboring properties.

II. Review of noise-related incidents and security report from daily activity

Nick Resich reviewed the past few months of routine and active enforcement by their security team. Bernadette Sabath noted that she only received a single complaint from a resident in the past few months. Vince Reher noted only positive feedback from the Peninsula Verde HOA, especially in regards to the Green Hills' proactive security activity. He further thanked Green Hills for thinning the trees along the north property line, maintaining the unimproved areas of the Inspiration Slope areas and the early noticing of upcoming events and funerals.

III. Status of soil testing in Areas 5 and 6

Tom Frew explained that Green Hills is currently working with a company who conducted a site visit and is familiarizing themselves with the Green Hills' interment process to formulate a soils testing protocol. Ara Mihranian stated that the protocol should be reviewed by City Staff, then discussed with the Committee before it's presented to the City Council for a determination on whether or not soils testing is necessary. The Committee agreed. Glenn Cornell asked if seasons are considered in the protocol as the dirt conditions may vary. Ara requested that the protocol consider the seasons.

IV. Update on the perimeter wall and vegetation screening

Chris Martin stated that the Rolling Riviera HOA has yet to meet and discuss the future perimeter wall and vegetation screening along the south property line. Questions were raised by the Committee on the timing of the wall and vegetation installation. So Kim noted that the wall/vegetation along the south side property line adjacent to Rolling Riviera is to be completed prior to the installation of the adjacent road while the wall/vegetation along the north side property line adjacent to Peninsula Verde is to be completed by January 31, 2018. Vince Reher raised concerns with potential impacts with removing mature foliage along the north perimeter as part of the process for installing the new wall. He acknowledged that progress is pending between the Peninsula Verde HOA and Green Hills. Bernadette Sabath noted that an alternative is to move the location of the wall. Vince Reher asked if the January 31, 2018 deadline could be extended if both parties need more time. Ara Mihranian stated that if both parties are diligently working together and are in agreement to extend the deadline, Staff will recommend that the City Council consider granting an extension as part of the next annual review. Tom Frew asked if the annual review was in November or January. Ara Mihranian confirmed that it's January.

V. Administration building remodel completion and proposed bathroom addition

Nick Resich informed the Committee that the Administration Building completed its remodel and obtained final occupancy from the City recently. He further noted that new applications have been submitted to the City to add another bathroom at the center of the Administration Building measuring less than 120 square feet in size and to expand the information booth by 70 square feet. So Kim explained that these applications are complete and public notifications will be issued next week with a 15 day comment period. Vince Reher asked why public notifications are necessary. So Kim explained that the Conditional Use Permit requires public notifications for all improvements on the property. Bernadette Sabath questioned if there has been an increase in interment services. Tom Frew replied that it's relatively the same with no significant increase. Ara Mihranian requested feedback on Green Hills' mobile application. Tom Frew replied that while some of the Peninsula Verde HOA members signed up for the map, none have in the Rolling Riviera HOA.

VI. New security gate and information booth expansion

Nick Resich reported that a new security gate has been installed at the entrance of the cemetery which is set on a motion timer. The gate automatically closes at 6:30pm allowing the security guards to drive around the premises to inform visitors of the park closure. Bernadette Sabath noted that a resident informed her of a security guard on a megaphone at 7pm encouraging visitors to leave the cemetery. She asked if the security guards can encourage visitors to leave earlier. Tom Frew explained that visitors may enter the cemetery up until the closing time of 6:30pm. He indicated that he is more concerned with the use of the megaphone and will be discussing the matter with his security team. Ara Mihranian questioned the height of the new security gate. Nick Resich replied that it is no taller than 3' in height. So Kim indicated that security gates are allowed up to 3.5' in height. Tom Frew noted that the challenge is restricting visitors from entering the cemetery by foot after hours.

VII. Inspiration Slope Terrace anticipated ground breaking date

Nick Resich explained that approximately 100 niches are designed within the Planning Commission-approved Vista Del Ponte retaining wall with art pieces in-between. He further noted that ground breaking will occur in December at the earliest.

VIII. Alta Vista sales map and Inspiration Slope private garden extension sales map filing

Steve Espolt distributed copies of the maps that were provided to the City at least 30-days prior to recordation. Bernadette Sabath asked if they were the same ones reported in the City's Weekly Administration Report and So Kim confirmed.

IX. Questions and comments

Glenn Cornell asked if Green Hills has a relationship with Highpark development in San Pedro and if they were experiencing any adverse impacts. He indicated that the developer was not communicative. Tom Frew replied that he is also in the dark and is not familiar with the progress of their development. Glenn Cornell noted that a large wall was constructed along the north property line of the Highpark development that doesn't appear necessary. Vince Reher noted that the developer is supposed to synchronize the signals to improve the traffic flow along Western Avenue. Chris Martin reported that at some point the Rolling Riviera HOA experienced changes in water pressure when Highpark development was watering the site during grading activity. Bernadette Sabath noted that the signal near Highpark development is mistimed. Vince Reher questioned if that right-of-way area is part of Rancho Palos Verdes, Los Angeles County, or Cal Trans jurisdiction. Ara Mihranian replied that he will talk to the City's Public Works Department and find out because Western Avenue is divided in terms of jurisdictional boundaries. Tom Frew noted that the second Green Hills quarterly newspaper will be published soon.
