## **CITY MANAGER**

LA County Commission on Disabilities 26th Access Awards: October is National Disability Month and the Los Angeles County Commission's goal is "Disabled...Does not mean unable". On Monday, October 16th, 2017, the Commission held their 26th annual Access Awards. This year, wheelchair-bound sports reporter Maria Serrao was honored for her outstanding contributions covering professional sports in Southern California. Her sports show, "Playing the Field" airs on RPVtv in Rancho Palos Verdes. The show features Serrao as the host/reporter interviewing the biggest names in professional sports including Mike Trout, Jared Goff, and legends such as Magic Johnson and Vin Scully. Her show has also won 4 National Telly Awards.

Legislative Update: The City Council took positions on several bills in the State Legislature this year. With the governor's deadline to take action this past Sunday, October 15th, the status of the two (2) remaining bills followed by the City is as follows:

- AB 1408 (Crimes: Supervised Release): The City Council supported this bill, which would tighten regulations for monitoring ex-offenders on supervised release. AB 1408 was passed in the Senate Appropriations Committee on September 1st. The Assembly concurred with the Senate amendments on September 13th and the bill was forwarded to Governor Brown for his signature. Unfortunately, the governor vetoed AB 1408 on October 15th (see attached veto message)
- SB 649 (Wireless Telecommunications Facilities): The City Council opposed this bill, which would strip the City of land use authority and future revenue for so-called "small cell" sites in the public right-of-way and on other City property. SB 649 was passed in the Senate Appropriations Committee on September 1st. The Senate concurred with the Assembly amendments on September 14th and the bill was forwarded to Governor Brown for his signature. Thankfully, the governor vetoed SB 649 on October 15th (see attached veto message).

Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project Meeting Follow-Up: On October 11th, Staff attended the public meeting regarding the proposed Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project that was held at the Malaga Cove Branch Library in Palos Verdes Estates. Staff from the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) gave a detailed presentation of the proposed project, something that was notably lacking from meeting held at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center earlier this year. The presentation provided the background and rationale for the proposed project, and also attempted to address the issues of concern that had been raised by the community. Although some attendees appeared to remain skeptical about the suitability and purported benefits of the proposed project, others seemed to appreciate receiving answers to the basic questions that they had about the proposal.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Staff met briefly with State Lands Commission Staff who were in attendance. They again acknowledged receipt of the City's October 9th request for an alternate or remote venue for the upcoming November 29th Commission meeting. Furthermore, Staff was assured that, in all likelihood, this matter would not appear on the

Commission’s November 29th agenda, and would probably not be heard by the Commission until February 2018.

**FINANCE**

Comparison of Current Median Sale Price to Peak Price before the Great Recession: In 1978 California voters approved Proposition 8 that requires county assessors to reduce the value of properties below their Proposition 13 taxable values when the real estate market declines. These reductions are to be restored as the real estate market improves. One of the gauges of the values to be restored is the progress each community is seeing in the growth of the median sale prices of single family homes.

The graph below provides a comparison of the detached home (excluding Condos and Townhomes) median peak price experienced at the height of the real estate bubble in Rancho Palos Verdes and Los Angeles County well as several other counties in this region. Considering these trends, we expect to see continued restoration of values reduced per Proposition 8. The annual restoration of Prop 8 reduced values has diminished over the past couple of years in most of the counties reviewed. More counties have neared a 90-100% restoration level after our review of the 2017-18 data in this segment of residential properties. As we begin the 2017-18 fiscal year, 62.5% of properties in Rancho Palos Verdes awaiting restoration of value since 2012-13 have been FULLY restored.

Night Work along Hawthorne Blvd, from Silver Spur Rd. to Blackhorse Dr.: Pending upon approval and submission of all required documents to obtain an encroachment permit, Hotline Construction, SCE's contractor, will be conducting night work to replace two power poles along Hawthorne Blvd. southbound and northbound on October 19, 2017 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. There will be one lane opened at all times. Please watch for and obey the traffic control signs and the flagman's direction for your safety, and the safety of the workers. For more information, please contact the Public Works Department at (310) 544-5252.

Lower Hesse Park, Park Improvements: This project consists of various improvements to Lower Hesse Park including landscaping, trail improvements and new picnic nodes. This project is currently in the construction phase. Work this week consisted of measuring and grading the new gravel parking lot and placing rocks. Construction is on schedule to be completed in February 2018.



ADA Access Improvements Fred Hesse Park Project: This project includes installing ADA ramps and sidewalk to create ADA-compliant pedestrian linkage from the parking lot to the Community Building entrance. Additional ADA-specific modifications will include correcting the elevations at the brick paving fronting the building and numerous interior building modifications, such as relocating light switches, modifying interior doors and addressing

access barriers to ADA-approved standards. Work this week included prepping exterior for new ADA concrete walkways. Construction is scheduled to last through December 2017.



Eastview Park, Park Improvement and Dog Park Project: DG trail within the Dog Park is complete, benches have been placed, and picnic tables are on location. This week will consist of installation of gates, fine grading, irrigation adjustment, and tree planting. Coming activities include final grading, and park restoration for the opening. Maintenance: The maintenance division is proceeding with the installation of a heavy duty grating system in order to secure the open drainage pipe at Altamira Canyon. This week mounting points are being surveyed and installed for post that will hold the system in place.

Document Shredding Event Very Busy: On Saturday Oct. 14th a steady stream of over 700 cars, attended the Fall season shredding event. This has been one of the largest

number of attendees for this bi-annual event and there seems to be no slowing down in the number of participants. Three industrial sized-certified shredding trucks shredded material on-site and were filled with shredded paper to full capacity by end of the event. Cars were patiently lined up as early as 7:30 am for the 8 am event start time. A special event day traffic control was set up to help with the ingress/egress to City Hall too. A big “THANK YOU” to the 25-30 EDCO employees who helped make the event a huge success and EDCO management for sponsoring the event. Staff received many positive comments from attendees. The tonnage of the papers shredded, the electronic waste collected, and the free mulch given away will be provided next week. In the public outreach for the next event, in order to try to reduce the congestion created by the long lines of cars waiting for the 8 am start time, staff will encourage folks to come after 8:30 when the wait time is reduced significantly.



Citywide Brush Clearing Continues: On Saturday October 14<sup>th</sup>, EDCO collected a total of 5.9 tons of excess brush from homes in the regular Tuesday route. The event continues for another three weeks. Staff will continue to promote this event for the next few weeks. CalRecycle Form 303 Household Hazardous Waste Collection Annual Report: Staff submitted the FY 16-17 annual Form 303 to CalRecycle and Department of Toxic Substances Control prior to the annual deadline.

Public Works Encroachment Permit Report – September 2017: The Public Works Department is responsible for control of work performed within the City Public “Rights of Way”. An Encroachment Permit is required to insure that any applicant working in our streets or parkways is properly licensed, insured and in compliance with the NPDES requirements. **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

Marymount Fall 2017 Student Enrollment Report: Pursuant to Council-adopted Condition No. 146, Marymount is required to submit to the City an enrollment report for the “Traditional” and “Non-Traditional” degree programs for each term. On October 16, 2017, Marymount submitted the enrollment report for the Fall 2017 term (see attachment). Based on the enrollment information submitted to the City, Marymount was notified that the student enrollment for the Fall 2017 term is within the scope of the Conditions of Approval (see attachment).

2950 Crownview Drive - Retaining Walls and Driveway Update: On August 15, 2017, the City Council approved a revision to the Major Grading permit previously approved for the property, a Minor Exception Permit and a Fence/Wall permit for new and replacement retaining walls and guardrails, which were designed to minimize impacts to the upslope neighbor. The applicant submitted the plans to Building & Safety on September 11, 2017, and are close obtaining a construction permit for said improvements and a retaining wall to expand the private driveway access.

Emissions Reduction Action Plan: Over the last several months, the Planning Division has worked closely with staff from the South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG) on the preparation of the City's Emissions Reduction Action Plan (ERAP). With funding from California Edison and the Southern California Gas Company, the SBCCOG has worked with member Cities in the preparation of action plans for each City in the South Bay. The purpose of the ERAP is to increase sustainability and emission reductions through waste, greening power generation/ storage, land use transportation measures that are feasible and in-line with the goals and policies of the City's General Plan. City Staff will present a draft version of the ERAP to the City Council for their consideration on November 8, 2017.

Noise Concerns at the Golden Cove Shopping Center: The Planning Division recently received a noise complaint from the Villa Capri HOA regarding the Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE) System located at the southeast corner of the shopping center. The SVE system was installed to remediate historic subsurface chemical impacts at the site and is contained within a temporary trailer that is enclosed by a 6' tall fenced area. City Staff is currently working with the project applicant to identify additional attenuation measures to mitigate noise impacts and will report back once these measures have been implemented.

To the Members of the California State Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 1408 without my signature.

This bill—among other requirements placed on both the local and state correctional systems—would limit local probation departments' ability to use intermediate sanctions for individuals under post release community supervision.

This bill was introduced as a response to the senseless and horrifying murder of a Whittier police officer, an event that shocked and saddened our entire state. Unfortunately—as history has taught us repeatedly—legislative responses to specific individual crimes often do not produce the intended results, and more often than not are found to be counterproductive once they are implemented.

I believe this is such a bill, and while I appreciate the author's sincere attempt to respond to a truly terrible crime, I do not agree that a three-strikes and you're out approach is the correct solution. This measure would undermine the sound discretion of local probation authorities who, by training and sworn responsibility, are in the best position to make determinations on what type of sanctions or punishment should be imposed.



Thank you for providing the City with certification of the student enrollment for the Fall 2017 term. As you are aware, the Conditions of Approval adopted by the City Council on June 1, 2010 under Resolution No. 2010-42 which approved Revision "E" of Conditional Use Permit No. 9 now applies to the operations of the University.

According to Condition No. 146 of Conditional Use Permit No. 9 Revision "E," Marymount shall submit to the City an enrollment report for each Term within an academic year for all Traditional and Non-Traditional Degree Programs and Summer Educational Programs no later than 30-days after a term has commenced. Based on the enrollment information received by the City on October 16, 2017 and the student enrollment limits established under Condition No. 145, the student enrollment for the Fall 2017 term is within the scope of the Conditions of Approval as described below:

- 686 students are enrolled in the "traditional" degree program for Fall 2017 (793 maximum students allowed)
- 43 students are enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts (upper division) degree program for Fall 2017 (250 maximum students allowed out of the total 793 maximum student enrollment)
- 64 students are enrolled in the "non-traditional" degree program for Fall 2017 (150 maximum students allowed)

In addition to the above, Condition No. 144 states that Marymount shall provide all of its incoming students a driver's training course regarding local roadway conditions. The total number of students receiving the required driver training course shall be included in the enrollment report for each term as described in Condition No. 146. Based on the enrollment information provided by Marymount, there were 307 students who participated in the driver safety program for the Fall 2017 term.
