CalWater Pipeline Project Update: As we reported previously on February 28th, the Rolling Hills Estates (RHE) Planning Commission adopted a resolution recommending approval of the Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project (PVPWRP) on February 5th, including direction to explore the feasibility of shifting construction on Crenshaw Blvd. to overnight hours (rather than 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM weekdays). Several nearby Rancho Palos Verdes residents have expressed opposition to overnight construction on Crenshaw Blvd. (see attached petition).

On February 20th, RHE Planning Staff convened a meeting with our City Staff, CalWater and County Public Works to assess the issue of modified construction hours on Crenshaw Blvd. Recognizing the desire to minimize both construction noise impacts on nearby residents and peak-hour traffic impacts on a large percentage of Peninsula residents, all parties agreed that the best approach would be to shift the construction hours on Crenshaw Blvd. to 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM. This solution would avoid overnight construction noise and reduce traffic congestion during the morning commute.

The RHE City Council will be considering this project at its meeting on Tuesday, March 27th (see attached public hearing notice). The meeting agenda and Staff report should be posted on the [RHE website](#) by Friday, March 23rd. The RHE City Council meets at 7:00 PM in the Council Chambers at RHE City Hall, located at 4045 Palos Verdes Dr. N., Rolling Hills Estates, CA 90274. This matter is set for hearing at 7:30 PM.

EIR Release Date for West Basin Ocean Water Desalination Project: On March 16th, the City received notice that the environmental impact report (EIR) for West Basin Municipal Water District's Ocean Water Desalination Project in El Segundo will be released on Tuesday, March 27th for a 60-day public comment period (see attached notice). Public comments will be due by Friday, May 25th. West Basin has also offered to make a presentation of the project and EIR process to any city council in its service area that would like to receive one. If the City Council is interested in receiving such a presentation, please let Staff know so that we can try to identify a suitable meeting date. Ring Incentive Program: This is the third and final opportunity for RPV residents who would like to purchase select Ring security camera devices at a discount. A "kick off" event is scheduled for Sunday, March 25, 2018, at Hesse Park from 12 p.m. – 4 p.m. At this event, residents may attend an optional 30-minute presentation by Ring staff, scheduled for 12:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m., and/or purchase select devices. Residents unable to attend this event may request a promotion code to complete an online purchase at Ring.com. The program will run until April 30, 2018, or until allocated funds are expended, whichever occurs first. FINANCE

Franchise Tax Background and Allocation: In FY 2017-18, approximately 7 percent of General Fund operating revenues are expected to come from Franchise Tax. This is the City's fourth largest revenue source after Property Tax, Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) and Sales tax. Franchise tax is levied on the providers of utility, refuse and cable service in exchange for use of the City's right-of-way. The tax rate for cable, video and commercial refuse providers is five percent, while the rate for residential refuse providers gets adjusted annually.

PUBLIC WORKS

Traffic Safety Committee: The next Traffic Safety Committee meeting is on Monday, March 26, 2018 at 7 pm in the Community Room at RPV City Hall/Civic Center. The agenda will be on posted on the website on Friday, March 23, 2018.

Maintenance Activities: Public Works Maintenance Crew have arranged for the permanent roof repair of the Hesse Park Community Building. This repair is part of a phased program for the entire roof rehabilitation to occur. These repairs are expected to be completed in the next two-three weeks by a California-licensed roofing contractor.





COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Green Hills Memorial Park – Emerald Gardens Map Recordation: Pursuant to Condition No. 31 of City Council-approved Resolution No. 2018-07, Green Hills is required to submit maps to the Director at least 30-days prior to recordation with the Los Angeles County Recorder’s Office. On March 15th, Green Hills submitted the attached maps for the Emerald Gardens that will be submitted to the County for recordation in mid- to late-April 2018.

Cal Water Completes First Required Spoils Test: On March 12, 2018, pursuant to Condition No. 40 of P.C. Resolution No. 2018-02, City Staff received results of the first

spoils (soil) test at the Cal Water site on Crest Road. These tests found no chemicals over the acceptable limits specified by the EPA and the results of these tests were distributed to all interested parties via listserv on March 14, 2018. Cal Water will now schedule a noise study, which will occur in concert with the spoils pickup. A new listserv message will be sent at least 24 hours prior to the spoils pickup and noise study.

LAX Community Noise Roundtable Meeting: On March 14, 2018, Councilman Cruikshank, Staff, and more than a dozen members of the public attended the LAX Roundtable meeting. At this meeting, RPV resident, Jeff Calvagna, presented the members with an informative presentation on jet flights over the Peninsula since the implementation of Metroplex (see attached PowerPoint presentation). Staff, as a member of the Roundtable, made the following motion that was unanimously accepted:

- 1) Air traffic controllers in San Diego (SolCal TRACON) follow the OSHNN flight path for jets around the Peninsula;
- 2) When necessary for spacing, SolCal TRACON vector jets from the OSHNN flight path beginning east of the HOLTZ waypoint, which will direct jets over the ocean; and,
- 3) SolCal TRACON raise the altitude for Mokulele Airlines turbo propeller aircraft over the Peninsula.

The next step in the process will be for the LAX Roundtable Ad-Hoc Committee to send a letter to key FAA personnel.

Fence/Wall Permit Appeal: On March 13, 2018, the Planning Commission denied an appeal for a Fence/Wall Permit (ZON2016-00377) as a result of a 2-2 tie vote (Commissioners Perestam and Saadatnejadi abstaining), thereby upholding the Director's approval of the Fence/Wall Permit for a 3.5' to 4' tall fence at the top of the slope along the east property line at 32 Via Del Cielo. This decision may be appealed to the City Council by 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 28, 2018. At this time, Staff anticipates an appeal to be filed by both the Applicant and the Appellants. Notwithstanding, Staff continues to work with both parties to achieve an acceptable agreement.

RECREATION & PARKS

Little Fish Tales by the Sea met March 15th at PVIC. 66 children and adults were in attendance. Participants celebrated whales and traveled under the sea with stories, finger plays and movement. Counting activities were also included. After story time, the children were invited to participate in a jelly fish themed craft and coloring. Books and music were also provided for parents and kids to enjoy together.



Tuesday afternoon, a meeting was hosted in the Sunset Room. Saturday morning, the Junior Docent class will meet for a hike at Ocean Trails to learn about Palos Verdes Natural History.

Volunteer Program: Sunday, March 18th, volunteers arrived at the Native Plant Garden to weed, prune, and care for the plants. This Friday, March 23rd, a work group of 13-20 has

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offered to clean up our Abalone Cove beach. After cleanup, the group will enjoy a docent-guided tour through the trails and the tide pools. Sunday, March 25th, volunteers will work at pruning, raking and cleaning a section of Abalone Cove Shoreline Park.

REACH: On Wednesday, REACH travelled to Torrance to dine at Subway followed by an evening at the Wilson Park batting cages. On Saturday, REACH will travel to Loyola Marymount to participate in their Special Games.

West Basin Municipal Water District (West Basin) announces the completion and availability of the draft environmental impact report (EIR) for the proposed ocean water desalination facility in El Segundo, California.

In pursuing the District's mission to provide a safe and reliable supply of high-quality water to the community it serves, West Basin is examining ocean water desalination as a drinking supply. Ocean water desalination could further diversify West Basin's water supply portfolio, to help offset imported water use.

The proposed West Basin Ocean Water Desalination Project (Project) would produce between 20 to 60 million gallons per day (MGD) of drinking water from the ocean. The proposed Project site would be at an existing 33-acre location within the El Segundo Generating Station (ESGS) at 301 Vista Del Mar in the City of El Segundo, California. The Project consists of a desalination facility with membrane filtration and reverse osmosis technology; an ocean water intake system to deliver ocean water to the facility; a brine discharge system to return concentrated seawater back to the ocean; and a drinking water delivery system to distribute the drinking water produced to the local and regional water supply systems.

West Basin is committed to a thorough and transparent environmental review process that will fully disclose and address possible impacts and mitigation measures of a potential ocean water desalination facility to produce drinking water.

The draft EIR is available for public review and comment for a 60-day period beginning Tuesday, March 27, 2018. The review period, extended by the West Basin Board of Directors beyond the required 45 days as stated by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), allows for the community to learn facts about the proposed facility and ask questions regarding the potential impacts detailed in the draft EIR. **Public comment will be accepted through May 25, 2018 at 5 p.m.**

West Basin encourages participation in the CEQA process. Input during the public comment period is a critical component of the CEQA process, as it helps to inform and refine the proposed project. To encourage this participation, West Basin would like to **offer our cities the opportunity for a council presentation or meeting** to discuss the CEQA process and what will take place over the next few months.






LAWN PROPERTY LOCATION



- In truth, the actual root cause is that the FAA is ignoring their own documented standard instrument departure procedure (OSHNN8 SID)
 - OSHNN was designed for noise abatement, it keeps aircraft offshore longer and makes landfall over an unpopulated area
 - Yet over 70% of the time, SoCal TRACON vectors low flying departures off the SID and over Palos Verdes and San Pedro neighborhoods
 - How can a “standard” departure “require” so much shortcutting?
- Studying flight patterns and Air Traffic Control communications makes clear this is happening for ATC and pilot convenience (not “required”)
- The FAA wants it both ways. OSHNN8 looks good on paper for noise abatement, but the de-facto SID is over Palos Verdes and San Pedro homes
- The FAA must follow its own documented procedures

OSHNN8 Standard Instrument Departure (SID) Source of Most Palos Verdes and San Pedro Overflights




OSHNN SID designed for noise abatement yet ATC routinely shortcuts noisy departures over PV and San Pedro Residential Neighborhoods

During this evening period, not a single flight correctly flew the SID, all shortcut over or near Palos Verdes


During peak OSHNN usage aircraft can overfly PV every 2-3 minutes

Case Study – Southwest 1283 (LAX → LAS, 9:23 PM Departure)



Out of 12 flights, 8 overflowed Palos Verdes/San Pedro (67%)
2 flew the SID (green), 2 HOLTZ shortcut (yellow), 8 PEVEE shortcut (red)

Case Study – Delta 1404 (LAX → SLC, 6:00 AM Departure)



Out of 12 flights, 8 overflowed Palos Verdes/San Pedro (67%)

3 flew the SID (green), 1 HOLTZ shortcut (yellow), 8 PEVEE shortcut (red)

Why is This Happening? (ATC Vector “Direct to CAHIL”)

Regarding PV overflights, the July 2017 LAX Noise Roundtable report stated:

“FAA determines whether aircraft remain on RNAV procedure (OSHNN 7) or they vector them to another waypoint (e.g., CAHIL) when required for spacing”

Evaluation of flight patterns and monitoring SoCal TRACON communications with aircraft shows this is not “required” but being done for convenience

- If OSHNN truly “requires” deviation over 70% of the time then frankly it isn’t safe
- Yet the Metroplex report didn’t even mention these deviations and recommended no changes to the OSHNN SID

The Metroplex technical report hints at what is really going on:

“Another major issued raised by both ATC and industry stakeholders is the inefficiency of using the OSHNN SID between 2100 and 0700, which adds between 14 NM to 23 NM to the route compared to the LOOP SID.”

ATC and pilots don’t like OSHNN because it’s inconvenient. “Direct to CAHIL” is a free pass at Palos Verdes and San Pedro resident’s expense

Why is This Happening? (ATC Vector “Direct to CAHIL”)

Why would ATC and pilots want to shortcut the OSHNN SID?


- OSHNN is longer and takes more time – particularly if the aircraft had originally filed for the ORCKA (loop) departure
- OSHNN is complex and slower – three turns, at PEVEE, HOLTZ, and OSHNN
- OSHNN is busy – PEVEE to OSNNH leg shared with the DOTSS departure
 - More ATC intervention needed to de-conflict with DOTSS traffic
 - Speed restrictions often needed to maintain separation
 - Altitude restrictions due to Long Beach (LGB) southern departures
- OSHNN delays ATC hand-off from SoCal TRACON to LA Center (ZLA)

Since there is no PV air traffic, “Direct to CAHIL” is a free pass SoCal TRACON uses to make these concerns go away, rarely is it “required for spacing”


“Direct to CAHIL” allows the FAA to have its cake and eat it too

- OSHNN SID looks good on paper and meets noise abatement requirements
- In reality, ATC routinely ignores it and the de-facto SID is over my house and thousands of others. The FAA isn’t following its own procedures.


Metroplex Analysis Predicted a Noise Decrease for South PV and San Pedro

Difference between Pre- and Post-Metroplex

South Palos Verdes and San Pedro predicted to see a small noise decrease. Instead, the opposite has happened.

Noise Model didn't consider that the OSHNN SID is ignored >70% of the time

We Need Action NOW, Not More Studies!

The noise over Palos Verdes and San Pedro has increased dramatically and the FAA owes us some answers:

- Why isn't the FAA following its own documented OSHNN8 procedure?
- How can the OSHNN SID be a "standard" departure when it is ignored over 70% of the time? (definition of "standard": *used or accepted as normal*)
- Why does SoCal TRACON think it's acceptable to routinely vector noisy low-altitude jet departures over thousands of residential homes?
- Why did the Metroplex analysis predict a decrease in Palos Verdes Peninsula noise levels when the opposite has happened?
- Why did the July 2017 report characterize these OSHNN deviations as "required for spacing" when the overwhelming majority clearly aren't?

We don't need another year of studies! We need the FAA to follow its own documented procedures now.

No more "Direct to CAHIL" vectoring, particularly before the HOLTZ waypoint!

No deviations from the OSHNN SID unless there is a clear and compelling requirement to do so for safety.
