**SUBJECT: ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT NO. 18-19**

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## **CITY MANAGER**

Senate Bill No. 1302 regarding Cannabis Delivery Services: Staff has recently learned of pending State legislation (attached) that could force the City to allow the operation of cannabis delivery services. Currently, Ordinance No. 601U prohibits all commercial cannabis activities in the City, including delivery services. Staff will be presenting a letter in opposition to this legislation (SB 1302) for the City Council's consideration on the May 15th agenda.

Public Safety Update and Ring Incentive Program: The Ring incentive program ended on April 30, 2018. Over 1,400 RPV residents participated and purchased Ring security camera devices! This public safety program was offered to residents during the Spring and Fall of 2017 and in the Spring of 2018. Residents had the opportunity to purchase select devices at a discounted price. City Staff will send an online survey to residents who purchased a device in 2018 to collect their feedback.

## **FINANCE**

FY 18-19 Preliminary Budget: Finance will be presenting the City's FY18-19 Preliminary Budget to the City Council on May 15th. The presentation will include all assumptions presented as well as Council directions and decisions at the two (2) budget workshops in April. General Fund and all other City funds will also be introduced at this time. Upon conclusion of this meeting, Staff will incorporate any revisions to the preliminary budget based on direction from the City Council. These changes will be reflected in the draft FY 18-19 budget that will be presented at the public hearing on June 5th with the final budget being considered for adoption at the June 19st meeting.

Professional Auditing Services Contract: In February 2018, the Finance Department issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for professional independent auditing services. Based on the RFP results, the Finance Department will be requesting for the City Council's approval to authorize the award of contract to White Nelson Diehl Evans, LLP (WNDE) at the May 15th meeting.

WNDE is a California certified public accounting (CPA) and consulting firm with offices in Irvine and Carlsbad. Over the past year, WNDE has provided services to approximately 100 governmental organizations, and on an annual basis, WNDE issues over 150 reports on audits of local governmental agencies, including cities, the successor agency to redevelopment agencies, special districts, and joint power authorities. WNDE recent clients include City of Palos Verdes Estates, City Irvine, City of Torrance, City of Costa Mesa, City of Newport Beach, City of Beverly Hills, City of Lakewood, and City of Monterey Park.

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Brush Clearing Event Continues:** On Saturday April 28th, EDCO collected approximately 3.34 tons of excess brush from their Tuesday Route. The Wednesday through Friday routes will be serviced on Saturdays, 5/5, 5/12 and 5/19 respectively. Staff thanks EDCO for providing this timely opportunity to residents free of charge.

**PVDE Traffic & Equestrian Safety Project from Bronco Dr. to Headland Dr.:** There will be a second meeting on Wednesday, May 16th at 6:30 p.m. in the City Hall Community Room to discuss the updates of the proposed traffic and equestrian improvements along PVDE from Bronco Dr. to Headland Dr. A notice of the meeting has been sent out to all the affected residents along that portion of the road.

**Annual Sidewalk Repair Program FY 17-18:** This project is currently being advertised; bids will be opened on May 31st. Staff anticipates bringing the results of the bids received to the City Council in June for a possible construction contract award. The scope of work includes replacement of sidewalk, driveway aprons, and curb & gutter at various locations throughout the City (concentrating in Areas No. 1 and 3).

**Maintenance Activities:** The Public Works Maintenance division is working on restoring the grassy area across from the Community Development building at the Civic Center. An aggressive reseeding program along with a temporary irrigation system has been set up to reestablish the lawn.



EDCO's Rate Adjustment Request: EDCO's FY 18-19 rate adjustment request of 4.12% will be presented to the City Council on 5/15/18. This item was previously presented to the Solid Waste Subcommittee for review.

IMAC Meeting Cancelled: The May 10th IMAC meeting is cancelled due to scheduling conflicts. The next meeting will be the regular meeting on June 14, 2018. Notices of this cancellation have been sent out.

Residential Street rehabilitation Project Area 8, Phase 1: This project consists of curb, gutter, sidewalk and street repairs in public, residential neighborhoods adjacent to Palos Verdes Drive East and Miraleste Drive. There was a bid opening on Wednesday May 9th 2018 and staff is currently reviewing the bids for possible recommendation to consider to award a project.

## **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

Marymount Neighborhood Advisory Committee: Pursuant to Condition No. 138, a Neighborhood Advisory Committee (NAC) comprised of members from the surrounding five homeowners associations and two at-large representatives who live within 3,000 feet of the campus meet once during the fall term and once during the spring term to review any campus operational and neighborhood concerns. The Spring 2018 NAC meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 14th at 10 a.m. Attached is the agenda for next week's meeting (see attachment). Staff will provide the Council with a summary report in next week's Administrative Report.

LA-RICS Proposed Land Mobile Radio (LMR) Network: On April 23, 2018, the Planning Division received notice from the Los Angeles Regional Interoperable Communications System (LA-RICS) Authority that a LMR network is proposed at the Los Angeles County-owned "Antenna Farm" located at 5741 Crestridge Road. The project consists of installing a LMR antenna on a new 150-foot lattice tower and constructing a 400ft<sup>2</sup> equipment structure. Pursuant to State Government Code Section 65402, the Planning Commission, at its June 12th meeting, will consider the project's consistency with the General Plan. A notice will be sent to property owners within a 500' radius of the project site announcing the Planning Commission meeting. Cal Water (5837 Crest Road Facility) Landscape Update: On May 8, 2018, Staff visited the project site to inspect the recently installed earthen berm, landscaping, and fencing pursuant to the Planning Commission-adopted Conditional Use Permit (CUP) No. 172 Revision "C". Based on this site inspection Staff determined that the landscaping and fencing have been installed pursuant to the Commission-adopted Conditions of Approval (see attached photos). Staff also took photos (attached) of sound attenuating structures and blankets around the water pumps and on the control valves on the southern end of the site that were recently installed pursuant to Condition No. 34. Staff continues to work with Cal Water Staff and the neighbors to ensure compliance with the upcoming deadlines related to the Conditions of Approval which include the Director's review of the adequacy of the landscaping, the landscaping maintenance plan, and a noise study of the spoils pickup.

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May 9th LAX Community Noise Roundtable Meeting: The next LAX Community Noise Roundtable public meeting is scheduled for this evening (Wednesday, May 9, 2018) at 7 p.m. in the Clifton A. Moore Administration Building located at 1 World Way, Los Angeles, CA 90045. Attached is the meeting agenda (see attachment). As a participant of the Roundtable, which was created to mitigate adverse jet and turbo propeller noise impacts on nearby cities, Staff expects to receive a report from the LAX Metroplex/Wide Area Ad Hoc Committee, as well as a statistical update from the Los Angeles World Airports on jet and turbo propeller overflights of the Palos Verdes Peninsula. The public is encouraged to attend this meeting, and Staff will provide the Council with summary report in next week's Administrative Report.

May 22, 2018 Cancelled Planning Commission Meeting: The Planning Commission at its May 8th meeting unanimously agreed to cancel the May 22nd meeting and adjourned to the June 12, 2018 meeting.

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An act to amend Section 26200 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to cannabis.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1302, as amended, Lara. Cannabis: local jurisdiction: prohibitions on delivery.

The Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act of 2016 (AUMA), an initiative measure approved as Proposition 64 at the November 8, 2016, statewide general election, authorizes a person who obtains a state license under AUMA to engage in commercial adult-use cannabis activity pursuant to that license and applicable local ordinances. The Medicinal and Adult-Use Cannabis Regulation and Safety Act (MAUCRSA), among other things, consolidates the licensure and regulation of commercial medicinal and adult-use cannabis activities. MAUCRSA authorizes a licensee who obtains a retailer, microbusiness, or a specified type of nonprofit to deliver cannabis or cannabis products, and imposes requirements on the delivery of cannabis or cannabis products. MAUCRSA prohibits a local jurisdiction from preventing the delivery of cannabis or cannabis products on public roads by a licensee who is acting in compliance with MAUCRSA as well as any local law adopted pursuant to MAUCRSA. MAUCRSA generally authorizes a

local jurisdiction to adopt and enforce local ordinances to regulate licensed businesses located within the local jurisdiction.

This bill would prohibit a local government from adopting or enforcing any ordinance that would prohibit a licensee from delivering cannabis within or outside of the jurisdictional boundaries of the local jurisdiction.

The bill would include findings that the changes proposed by this bill address a matter of statewide concern, rather than a municipal affair and, therefore, apply to all cities, including charter cities.

The Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act, an initiative measure, authorizes the Legislature to amend the act to further the purposes and intent of the act with a 2/3 vote of the membership of both houses of the Legislature.

This bill would declare that its provisions further specified purposes and intent of the Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act.

Vote: 2/3. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 26200 of the Business and Professions  
2 Code is amended to read:

3 26200. (a) (1) This division shall not be interpreted to  
4 supersede or limit the authority of a local jurisdiction to adopt and  
5 enforce local ordinances to regulate businesses licensed under this  
6 division, including, but not limited to, local zoning and land use

4 is restricted to persons 21 years of age and older.

5 (2) Cannabis consumption is not visible from any public place  
6 or nonage-restricted area.

7 (3) Sale or consumption of alcohol or tobacco is not allowed  
8 on the premises.

9 (h) A local jurisdiction shall not adopt or enforce any ordinance  
10 that would prohibit a licensee from delivering cannabis within or  
11 outside of the jurisdictional boundaries of that local jurisdiction.
