Cal Water Presentation at June 21, 2018 EPC Meeting: On June 21, 2018, the Rancho Palos Verdes Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) members are holding their regular monthly meeting at 7:00 PM in the Rancho Palos Verdes Hesse Park Community Center McTaggart Hall (29301 Hawthorne Blvd., Rancho Palos Verdes, CA 90275). The main topic of the meeting is a presentation by Mr. Korey Bradbury, Operations Manager of California Water Company (Cal Water), along with technical support staff from Cal Water. This presentation is prompted by our Peninsula's unique topography, power and gravity fed water supply and possible limited water resources for our communities during an extreme emergency and/or disaster. Cal Water has been asked to explain how their company intends to keep water supplied to the Peninsula should there be a significant power failure or broken main water lines.

Community Open House for Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project: CalWater will host another community open house for this project at Palos Verdes High School on Thursday, June 21st. Construction along Palos Verdes Dr. N. in Rolling Hills Estates—including a one-month closure of the eastbound lane between the Dapplegray Elementary School driveway and Dapplegray Ln.—is expected to start on Monday, July 9th. Proposition 69: As the City Council may recall, you adopted a resolution in support of Proposition 69 at your meeting on March 6th. Proposition 69 proposed to prohibit the State legislature from raiding SB 1 transportation funds for non-transportation purposes. In last week's statewide primary election, Proposition 69 was approved by 80.39% of voters.

Heal the Bay's 2018 Beach Report Card: Heal the Bay released its annual Beach Report Card on June 7th, and Abalone Cove and Portuguese Bend Cove maintained their long run on the Honor Roll with A+ water quality ratings for Summer (dry), Winter (dry) and wet conditions. Rancho Palos Verdes' other monitored beach—Long Point—received slightly lower A ratings for dry-weather conditions this year, and just missed inclusion on the Honor Roll (it achieved an A+ rating during wet-weather conditions).

Los Angeles Commercial Cannabis Signage Ordinance: On June 5th, the Los Angeles City Council was scheduled to consider the Commercial Cannabis Signage Ordinance. The City Council adopted the Ordinance and Mayor Eric Garcetti now has until June 19th to take final action on it. This is a matter that Staff has been monitoring as a part of the Border Issues Status Report. Assuming that Mayor Garcetti approves the Ordinance, Staff will remove this matter from future Border Issues Status Reports.

PUBLIC WORKS

PV Drive South Roadway Repairs in the Landslide Area: The roadway through the landslide is continuing to move and repairs are once again needed. Next week (June 18 through 22) several area along the stretch of roadway through the landslide will be repaired in an effort to create a smoother driving surface and to increase safety for all users of the road through the landslide. Repairs to the roadway include a process called "skin patching". Depressions, uplifted areas and stretched asphalt areas are leveled through this process without grinding or digging out the existing asphalt. These repairs are able to be completed quickly and the resulting road surface is smoother and safer for all users of this roadway. Some sections of the roadway will require grinding and removal of subsoils to allow base rock to be placed (to aid in the control of ground water) prior to rebuilding the roadway with asphalt. These repairs are extensive and take time which will result in traffic delays.

PLEASE NOTE: Residents and the traveling public are advised that delays during repairs, could be significant approaching 20 minutes, during the repairs. Accordingly, motorists are encouraged to use another route next week during the repairs to avoid being delayed.

Storm Drain Deficiency Improvement Project at Montemalaga St.: Major storm drain installation work has been completed. Additional storm drain lining of existing pipe, curb and gutter restoration, and clean-up is scheduled to be completed by late June.

Storm Drain Deficiency Improvement Project at Western Ave. at Caddington Dr.: Storm drain replacement work is scheduled to begin this week and scheduled to be completed in June with clean-up efforts after. Work will include removal and replacement of existing storm drain pipe as well as the installation of new pipe to address surface flooding issues.

Storm Water Quality News: The City's storm water quality consultant has provided an updated short newsletter to update the City on relevant storm water regulatory issues. (See attached)

MS4 Permit: The Palos Verdes Peninsula Watershed Management Group, consisting of the Cities and a portion of Los Angeles County within the Palos Verdes Peninsula, submitted a Time Schedule Order (TSO) this week to the State Water Quality Control Board. This TSO, which was a recommended course of action by the State Board, was requested to extend the deadline of the requirement of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit. The deadline for this requirement is set for September 11, 2018. The TSO sent to the State Board requests a 5-year extension and details the efforts made by the Group and its plan to pursue alternative regional projects, control measures, and conduct special studies.

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Public Works Institute (PWI): A few PW staff members attended the PWI “Module 4, Advanced Public Works Management” training offered by the Southern California Chapter of American Public Works Association (AWPA) to enhance the professional and customer service education and development of the department staff. This is a four (4) Module, two-year training program. Current PWI graduates include Nadia Carrasco, Charles Eder, Gonzalo Garnica, and Lauren Ramezani.

Infrastructure Management Advisory Committee (IMAC): The regular monthly meeting will held at Hesse Park at 6 pm this Thursday June 14, 2018 and members of the public are welcome and encouraged to attend. Public Works welcomes new IMAC member Tina Vargas. The agenda includes a discussion of the responses prepared by the City consultant to the public comments on the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex feasibility Study. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Green Hills Memorial Park Neighborhood Newsletter: Green Hills recently released its May Newsletter that is distributed to Peninsula Verde and Rolling Riviera HOA residents (see attached). This newsletter includes information on pending park projects and events.

Elkmont Canyon Geologic Investigation Permit (GIP) Update: It was last reported that the April 24th geologic investigation work related to the City-issued GIP at the Elkmont Canyon site (APN 7576-026-028) was temporarily postponed due to additional information requested by the City. The Applicant provided the City with the requested information and a new GIP was issued (attached). The GIP work is now scheduled to occur on Tuesday June 19, 2018, and Wednesday June 20, 2018. The City Geologist will inspect the site on Wednesday June 20, 2018. A listserv message has been sent with this update.

Marymount California University: Pursuant to City Council-adopted Condition No. 13, Marymount recently submitted its annual Special Use Permit to allow a series of outdoor special events with amplified sound for the 2018-2019 academic year. At this time, a total of 26 specific dates and times are proposed. Staff is currently reviewing the application for completeness. Once deemed complete, a public notice will be issued to property owners within a 500’ radius of the campus, interested parties, and listserv subscribers.

Huntington Beach Air Traffic Noise Workshop: On June 8, 2018, the Daily Pilot published an article on a community workshop to address aircraft noise linked to Long Beach Airport that is impacting Huntington Beach (see attachment). The article describes how this community is addressing aircraft noise impacts.





LOCAL INSPECTIONS

Construction Inspections:
 NPDES inspections are required to be conducted monthly for active construction sites over one acre. Rancho Palos Verdes has three (3) active construction sites that are currently subject to these inspections. Good housekeeping practices are necessary to keep sediment on-site and out of storm drains.



Location: Construction on Crestridge Road.
Non-compliance (2/23/18): Sawdust was observed in the street, indicating that proper housekeeping practices and material controls were not being implemented.
Follow-up inspection (3/23/18): No sawdust or discharges were observed. Wood-cutting activities appeared to have been completed.

STATE AUDITOR'S REPORT

In March of 2018, the California State Auditor released its report on the implementation of the stormwater program by the State Water Board and three Regional Water Boards, including the Los Angeles Regional Board. The audit identified administrative deficiencies, including:

- The regional boards did not adequately consider the overall costs that local agencies would incur to implement stormwater requirements
- The State Water Board and regional boards have established some stormwater requirements using outdated or insufficient information
- The Statewide Trash Amendment has forced local agencies to direct resources to reduce trash rather than other pollutants of greater concern

To address these issues, the State Auditor offered an array of recommendations. For the Los Angeles Regional Water Board specifically, these included the suggestions that it remove outdated information from its website and that it correct its pollutant control plan in which it miscalculated pollutant limits.

HARBOR TOXICS TMDL

Under the Harbor Toxics TMDL, the City is required to monitor for heavy metals, toxicity, organic pollutants, and legacy chemicals like DDTs. To share the cost of monitoring, the City joined the Downstream Harbor Toxics Monitoring Program with 7 other cities, the Port of Long Beach, the Port of Los Angeles, and Los Angeles County Flood Control District (LACFCD). Invoices for the 2018-2019 costs of the Monitoring Program will be distributed soon.

MACHADO LAKE NUTRIENT TMDL

The northern portion of the City drains to Machado Lake and is thus subject to the Machado Lake Nutrient TMDL. A major milestone occurs in September 2018, when the final TMDL limits must be attained. Plans are underway for potential regional projects, but these will not be constructed for several years. The option of a Time Schedule Order (TSO), essentially an extension of the TMDL deadline, is currently under discussion with the Regional Board.

The Safe, Clean Water Program is a proposed ballot measure that would levy a tax upon parcels to fund stormwater programs and projects. Stakeholders from multiple groups are meeting monthly to develop the ballot measure, which is intended to appear on the November 2018 ballot and will require approval from $\frac{2}{3}$ of voters to pass. The Board of Supervisors is expected to vote on the precise wording of the Safe, Clean Water Program ballot measure on June 26, 2018. Key points currently in discussion include:

- A revenue sharing arrangement of 50/40/10 percent for: regional projects, municipal programs, and administration, respectively
- The tax rate for an average residential parcel will likely be between \$73-\$98
- Schools and municipal facilities will be exempted from the tax

NEXT MS4 PERMIT STATUS

The 2012 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Permit Order (MS4 Permit) expired on December 28, 2017, though its requirements will continue until a new MS4 Permit is in effect. On May 10, 2018 the Regional Board held its first workshop regarding the next MS4 Permit. The Regional Board's staff opened with a summary of monitoring results and generally (and somewhat cautiously) indicated that pollutant levels may be trending downwards. This was followed by presentations from 18 watershed groups and individual cities throughout the Los Angeles and San Gabriel River watershed areas. The presentations summarized accomplishments over the past five years, often noting the obstacles (primarily the costs) on implementation of the program. The Board did not provide any previews of the next permit or a timetable other than the oft mentioned target of early next year. The remaining watersheds, including Dominguez Channel and the Palos Verdes Peninsula, are scheduled to make their presentations in a July workshop.

The GIP map shall be prepared by a professional engineer and submitted at least 7 days before any testing so that the City geologist may comment on the proposed locations in advance of sampling testing. 2. Applicant shall place a flag or otherwise visibly mark in the canyon the proposed locations of soil sampling at least three days prior to any testing. 3. Applicant shall excavate and/or drill the number of soil samples depicted on the GIP map and shall excavate and/or drill them as close as reasonably possible to the locations depicted on the GIP application map, in a manner consistent with standard practices. However, if field conditions dictate, additional samples may be required to be drilled and/or excavated in accordance with standard practices. 4. 

12. All reasonable efforts shall be made to avoid impacts to plant and animal life on the site, particularly any sensitive biological resources such as coastal sage scrub or wetlands.

Huntington Beach workshop will address aircraft noise

Community members are invited to attend a workshop at the Senior Center in Huntington Beach Wednesday to learn about efforts to provide some relief for residents who say jet noise has damaged their quality of life.

The 12-member Air Traffic Noise Working Group, which includes council members Patrick Brenden and Barbara Delgleize, will share potential political, legislative and legal paths to address increased airplane noise in the community.

Huntington Beach residents have complained about noise since the Federal Aviation Administration implemented flight path alterations in 2017.

The changes are part of the FAA's Southern California Metroplex project covering the region's airports, including Long Beach and John Wayne. The agency said the changes would shore up inefficiencies, save fuel and reduce carbon emissions and flight delays.

Group members have held meetings with residents and city officials to discuss potential solutions to air traffic noise since the panel's creation in January. The group is also tasked with establishing a working relationship with federal aviation and local airport officials and assessing opportunities for lawsuits.

The group has made some progress.

In April Mayor Mike Posey asked county and federal representatives to address aviation noise related to the FAA's regional air traffic system, describing Huntington as an "epicenter" for "heavily concentrated new landing and flyover patterns."

That same month Rep. Dana Rohrabacher (R-Costa Mesa) asked JetBlue to retrofit some of its planes to help minimize noise.

JetBlue spokesman Philip Stewart confirmed the airline received and is reviewing the letter. Rohrabacher also proposed four amendments to the FAA's annual reauthorization bill that he said would ease aircraft noise in Orange County. The amendments failed on a 375-37 vote in the House of Representatives.

Other House amendments calling on the federal government to take steps to reduce the noise and health effects of commercial air traffic passed.
