## **CITY MANAGER**

Hands Only CPR Training: On January 24, 2019, Roberto Luna from the LA County Department of Public Health taught a Hands only CPR training. The class was held at Hesse Park at 7 p.m.

Sandbags: If you are a resident of RPV and need sandbags to protect your property against runoff during the rainy season, please come to RPV City Hall located at 30940 Hawthorne Blvd. City Hall is open Monday-Thursday from 7:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. and Friday 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

The City of RPV provides empty sandbags and sand for residents to fill and make as needed. Unfilled sandbags are located at the City Hall info desk. There is a limit of 10 sandbags per household with valid ID or proof of residency. If you need additional bags, they can be purchased at local hardware stores. Fill sand is located at City Hall in a designated area for residents to use. Please bring your shovels and tools as they are not provided.

Report Broken Coastal Fencing: Should you see a section of fencing in need of repair while walking along the coast of RPV, please call Public Works at 310-544-5252 or email [publicworks@rpvca.gov](mailto:publicworks@rpvca.gov). Feel free to email pictures!

Bureau of Cannabis Control and Cannabis Regulations: As of January 15, 2019, the Bureau of Cannabis Control (BCC) incorporated the addendum to the final rulemaking package. The regulations included in the addendum strip away local authority to regulate cannabis. The League issued a press release (see attachment) on January 16<sup>th</sup> which emphasized that the BCC regulations ignore Proposition 64.

The City sent an opposition letter in October 2018 to the BCC.

## **FINANCE**

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

**Maintenance Activities:** This week Public Works Maintenance Division closed down a section of the sidewalk on Western Ave. A retaining wall fell into the right-of-way and Public Works responded quickly to secure it for public safety. Once repairs were made the sidewalk was reopened. In the landslide area, Public Works installed new signage warning bicyclists of uneven and potentially hazardous road conditions. Public Works also set up message boards in the landslide area warning motorists of delays during road repair efforts. In preparation for the next round of storms, Public Works continues to clean out catch basins and flood control channels. Finally, in an effort to help RPV residents protect their property during rain events, Public Works has re-posted on social media, how to acquire sand bags at City Hall.

## **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

**Admiral Risty is Closing:** On January 27, 2019, a press release was issued informing the public that the Admiral Risty, after 52 years of operation, will be closing its doors (see attachment).

**Green Hills – Landscaping along the New Southern Perimeter Wall:** Over the past few years, concerns with the visibility of the vaults and earth material in the permitted stockpile area of the cemetery have been raised by residents along the southern boundary line of Green Hills. In order to help screen the cemetery from the properties along Avenida Feliciano, Green Hills constructed a new perimeter wall which was completed in October 2018. Although not required until the road is constructed, this week, Green Hills will begin installing trees (see bottom left photo) along the wall to provide additional screening. The landscape work is anticipated to be completed in the next couple weeks.



**2950 Crownview Drive Update:** Staff had received comments from adjacent neighbors that the security fence around the site had been damaged by exposure to wind and rain over the last several months. In response to neighbor concerns regarding this deterioration and concerns that the site was being accessed by trespassers, the property owner recently repaired the fence and secured the property. The property owner is preparing to begin

construction/repair of the onsite retaining walls and the driveway, which is required to obtain final occupancy on the new residence.

Cal Water Conditional Use Permit Update: On January 29, 2019, in preparation for the upcoming annual compliance review, City Staff held a meeting with Cal Water Staff and the adjacent neighbors to review the Planning Commission-adopted Conditions of Approval. Overall, Cal Water was acknowledged for the drastic improvements of the site and operations. However, concerns were raised regarding the maintenance of the reservoir lawn and tree trimming onsite. These concerns are under review and follow-up meetings will be held to resolve these concerns prior to the annual compliance review with the Planning Commission which is tentatively scheduled for February 26, 2019.

LA County Animal Control's Barking Dog Complaint Procedures: As of December 1, 2017, L.A. County Animal Control began implementing a new streamlined process regarding barking dog complaints. Attached is a summary of the County's previous and new procedures regarding barking dog complaints (see attached). 
Volunteer Program: Two volunteer events in the upcoming weeks have already been filled with eager volunteers! We have also had to cancel two events in our Preserve due to wet

## **L.A. COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL BARKING DOG COMPLAINT PROCEDURES**

### **Previous Procedures**

For comparative purposes, the following outlines the steps the County implemented up until December 1, 2017 regarding barking dog complaints:

#### **Step 1:**

- Complaint reported to Animal Control.
- A letter would then be mailed to the dog owner notifying them of the complaint and measures to resolve the situation.
- No site visit would occur by Animal Control.

#### **Step 2:**

- If the problem persisted, the complaining party would update Animal Control, in writing, that the barking is continuing.
- Animal Control would then dispatch an officer to the dog owner's address to make contact with the owner, check the condition of the dog, and serve the owner with a Notice to Abate.

#### **Step 3:**

- Should the problem persist, mediation would be provided to resolve the complaint.
- If mediation was unsuccessful, Animal Control would provide the complaining party with a public nuisance petition requiring at least six signatures from individuals willing to testify at any proceeding the District Attorney's office feels is appropriate.
- The signed petition is forwarded to the District Attorney's office for consideration. The decision regarding the appropriate next steps would solely be up to the District Attorney.

### **New Procedures**

As of December 1, 2017, the following new streamlined barking dog complaint procedures are now being implemented by Animal Control:

#### **Step 1:**

- Compliant filed.

- Animal Control will send an affidavit to the complaining party to document in writing the alleged complaint.
- A letter is sent to the dog owner regarding the barking nuisance.
- Animal Control will contact the complaining party 2 weeks after the letter is sent to determine if the barking has been abated.

Step 2:

- If the barking continues, Animal Control goes to the site, assesses the situation, and issues a Nuisance Warning, which states the barking must be abated within 10 days or a citation will be issued.
- The dog owner has 10 days to correct the problem or a citation is issued.

Step 3:

- After the 10 days, if the barking persists, a citation is issued. The fine begins at approximately \$300 and increases based on frequency of occurrences. A second citation can be issued after 10 days.
