Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project Update: Last week, staff submitted a comment letter to the California Coastal Commission objecting to the recommended approval of a Coastal Development Permit for the Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project (see attachment). The letter restated the City’s opposition to the project location because of its proximity to DDT- and PCB-laden sediments and the potential for restored reefs to be buried by silt from the toe of the active Portuguese Bend landslide, noting that the analysis does not adequately address these concerns.

The Coastal Commission will consider the permit at its May 9 meeting in Oxnard. The meeting starts at 9 a.m. and will be live-streamed on the Coastal Commission website: <https://www.coastal.ca.gov/meetings/agenda/#/2019/5>.

PUBLIC WORKS

Palos Verdes Drive South is Moving Again: Following this year’s rains, the landslide movement has accelerated and repairs are once again happening more frequently along Palos Verdes Drive South. Crews are working hard to keep delays to a minimum. This week, PVDS fronting Wayfarers Chapel, moved dramatically lifting the curb and gutter and disrupting the asphalt. Take care when driving through the area as the repairs are scheduled for this week.

Catch Basin Insert Project: The Catch Basin Insert Project has begun in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. The project proposes to install over 1,300 Connector Pipe Screen (CPS) units in existing catch basins draining into Santa Monica Bay, to adhere to the requirements by the State. This is a joint project among the cities in the Peninsula. (See pictures)





Document Shredding Event Tonnage: The April 27, 2019 paper-shredding event was by far the most successful event, attracting more than 900 cars and shredding 36,000 pounds (18 tons) of documents. This was a 50% increase in volume compared to previous events. See comparable numbers below.

Due to the increasing popularity of the event, staff will strictly enforce the 3-box limit for the Fall event that will occur in late October, early November.

In response to a few inquiries/concerns about the shredding process and document destruction, attached is a letter from Shred-it ensuring “site complete document destruction”. This means that as advertised and promoted by the City, all materials are shredded on-site by the certified shredding trucks. No material from the event were transported off-site un-shredded. Staff was on-site, witnessing the shredding until all material were shredded, and then allowing the last shredding truck to leave the premises. (See attached)

The tonnage for the electronic waste and the mulch distributed will be provided next week.

Brush Clearing Event: The winter rainy season resulted in substantial growth in vegetation and brush in the area. As a result of the excess growth and the increase in brush fires in Southern California, RPV households took full advantage of the spring brush clearing event to the get rid of their excess brush and help protect their properties against the possibility of

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brush fire. The volume of brush collected from homes during this event so far is substantially higher than previous years. The event will end Saturday 5/11/19 and final numbers will be provided then. The tons of brush/green waste collected to date are:

Maintenance Activities: This week Public Works maintenance continues its regular maintenance of parks and medians. Several irrigation repairs were made on leaking sprinkler systems on medians located on Palos Verdes Drive South, Calle Entradero and Eastview Park. Public Works also continues to respond to emergency calls. On Lomo Drive and Blackhorse Drive, tree branches broke off and were blocking resident access. Public Works responded and cleared hazards away. Also on Palos Verdes South near Narcissa Road, a major land shift caused the sidewalk and road to deviate. Public Works immediately responded with safety precautions to warn motorists and pedestrians of the deviation. Public Works is currently having the affected areas repaired. In an effort to prevent an issue with the sewers in the area, Public Works contacted Los Angeles Sanitation District to have the exposed pipes along that road inspected for damage. At this time LA Sanitation has not seen any evidence of a compromise to their pipes. Lastly, PW has started its roadside tree trimming efforts along Palos Verdes Drive East this Week. PW will clear trees branches that might affect driving conditions and safety.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

2019 Marymount Graduation Ceremonies: Graduation ceremonies at Marymount California University are scheduled to occur this weekend. A graduation mass is scheduled to take place on Friday, May 10, between 3:00pm and 6:30pm, followed by the commencement ceremony on Saturday May 11, between 10:00am and 3:00pm. In accordance with the City-approved Special Use Permit, measures are in place to ensure

the event occurs with minimal impacts to the surrounding neighborhoods in areas such as traffic and parking, as well as noise. A listserv announcing this weekend's events has been issued to interested parties.

Westmont Plaza Driveway Closure Update: Construction on the new Chase Bank at the corner of Westmont Drive and Western Avenue is nearing completion. The Westmont Drive driveway was closed in October 2018 due to safety reasons and building code requirements (i.e. storm water quality regulations to prevent debris from entering the roadway and storm drains). The contractor originally anticipated this driveway being closed for approximately 4 months, or until February 2019, but this winter's heavy rains and an unforeseen sewer line complication has delayed the opening. The contractor now anticipates opening the driveway by the end of May 2019. Staff has notified the shopping center tenants as well.



South Bay Housing Forum: On Friday, May 10, the SBCCOG will host a half-day conference on housing in the South Bay at the Toyota Meeting Hall in Torrance. The keynote speaker will be California Senator Ben Allen and Larry Kosmot of Kosmot Companies will moderate this 6-member panel. Staff will be attending this conference.

RECREATION & PARKS

Hesse Park: The facilities are rented this week for twelve indoor recreation classes, three non-profit group rentals, one private rental, three Peninsula Seniors activities, one scout meeting, and one City meeting.

Ladera Linda Park: The facilities are being used this week for five recreation classes, four non-profit rentals and three non-profit rentals.

Ryan Park: The facilities are being used this week for five indoor recreation classes.

PVIC/Docents: The Los Serenos docents will be leading four tours at PVIC this week. Los Serenos held their monthly board meeting Tuesday morning. The Sunset room and amphitheater are rented Saturday and Sunday for private events.

REACH: On Monday, REACH met at Hesse Park where they celebrated a belated Cinco de Mayo by preparing Mexican culinary treats followed by playing Spanish Bingo. On Wednesday, REACH travelled to Del Amo mall to shop for Mother's Day gifts and on Saturday, REACH will enjoy an afternoon of bowling after a lunch stop at Chicken Maison.

Palos Verdes Nature Preserve April 2019 Activity Summary

Meetings:

- Monthly Preserve Management Meeting (April 4th): PVPLC staff; Recreation & Parks, Community Development and Public Works Staffs met to discuss maintenance and operational management projects and priorities.
- Volunteer Trail Watch Coordination Meeting (April 24th): Volunteer Trail Watch leaders, City Staff and L. A. Co. Sheriff Deputies met to discuss public use and maintenance observations as well as to coordinate efforts.
- Public Forum (April 17th): PVPLC staff, L. A. Co. Sheriff Deputies and City staff met with members of the public to brief them and answer questions on current projects, recent activities and future opportunities in the Preserve.

Preserve/Open Space Staff Activities:

Public Contacts: The Preserve & Abalone Cove Park Staffs encountered many people while conducting trail patrols in April --

- Public Contacts: **1,782** (hikers – 1,531; dog walkers -- 213; bike users – 32; equestrians - 6)
- Public Use Issues: **63** (dog issues including off leash -- 22; people off trail – 28; drone use – 6; smoking -- 7)
- Sharing Preserve/interpretive Information: **53**
- Public Safety: **1** (patrons having health problems – 1).

Maintenance & Operations: The Preserve & Abalone Cove Park Staffs filled up numerous bags with litter picked up while hiking **156.68** miles of trail. Their activities in April included –

- Abalone Cove Park & Reserve – removed a rusted pipe & lobster trap from Sacred Cove, re-shaped and leveled the bottom of Olmsted Tr. where it meets the beach while removing a piece of protruding rebar, cleaned 10 instances of graffiti,

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installed new rope on the warning fence near the Smugglers Trailhead, removed a cement stump from the ground on Chapel View Tr., trimmed vegetation on Olmsted & Beach School & Abalone Cove Trails, trimmed mustard around 2 sign posts on Chapel View Tr., re-positioned a Falling Rocks sign away from the water line to avoid losing it to the ocean, installed a Falling Rocks sign on Sacred Cove beach by bolting it to cliff rock, reset a loose slat from the bluff fence along Via De Campo Tr., filled an Olmstead Tr. rut with rocks & dirt to allow emergency vehicle access and repaired a 50 foot section of Portuguese Point Loop Tr. by removing deep vehicle ruts

- Alta Vicente Reserve – cleaned graffiti from the trail marker on Alta Vicente Tr.
- Filiorum Reserve – removed unauthorized posters from Rattlesnake Trailhead and applied gel to cover tree carvings on Eucalyptus Tr. as well as remove a cactus pad carved with graffiti
- Forrestal Reserve – reset a downed stake & rope fence on Vista Tr. overlook
- Open Space / Parks outside the Preserve -- removed litter at Del Cerro Park and applied caution tape to a missing bluff fence section at Del Cerro Park while resetting 2 bluff fence rails that were ajar
- Portuguese Bend Reserve – grinded down protruding bolts on a concrete slab along Burma Rd., installed a new battery in the Burma Rd. trail counter, covered graffiti in the portable toilet on Burma Rd., applied gel to cover tree carvings on Ailor Tr. while picking up litter there, trimmed vegetation hiding the large erosion gully on lower Peppertree Tr. while setting delineation cones there, cleaned graffiti on the water pipe along lower Burma Rd., painted over graffiti on a standing pipe along Conqueror Tr. just east of the Klondike Canyon Tr. junction, removed unauthorized posters from Burma Rd. gate and zip-tied the chain back to the pole as a temporary fix for the broken lock on Burma Rd. gate
- San Ramon Reserve – picked up trash along the scenic turnouts on PV Dr. East
- Vicente Bluffs Reserve – applied decomposed granite to erosion ruts in the mid-portion & northern end of Seascape Tr., reset a downed wooden fence rail along Seascape Tr. and filled in the erosion rut on the trail adjacent to Via Vicente.



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Open Space Management regularly checks on closures of the Preserve Trails resulting from storm damage. The lower portion of Rim Tr. is currently closed in the Portuguese Bend Reserve as well as lower Peppertree Tr. and the eastern arm of Ishibashi Farm Tr. In the Abalone Cove Reserve, the following trails are closed: Sea Dahlia, Cave and Sacred Cove View (west).

Preserve/Open Space Management cooperates closely with the Public Works Department to discover, submit and complete work orders to repair problems and improve conditions in the Preserve. In April, Public Works received 3 service requests for repairing downed fence rails in Del Cerro Park, trimming overgrown vegetation blocking portions of Seascape Tr. and repairing a broken lock on the Burma Road gate into the Portuguese Bend Reserve.

The City's graffiti contractor responded to 2 incidents of tagging that was reported by Open Space Management. Thank you Public Works and thank you to the Land Conservancy's Volunteer Trail Watch for being our eyes in the Preserve to help report maintenance issues.

SUBJECT: Objection to Approving Coastal Development Permit for Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project

Dear Chair Bochco and Members of the California Coastal Commission:

On behalf of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, I wish to respectfully express our opposition to the recommended approval of a Coastal Development Permit for the Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project.

While we support the aims of restoring fishing resources that were destroyed by decades of chemical dumping off the coast, we remain opposed to the location of the project just over a quarter-mile offshore from the City's Founders Park and Rancho Palos Verdes Beach.

We greatly appreciate the Commission staff's attention and correspondence regarding issues we have raised with the project, including its proximity to DDT- and PCB-laden sediments in the Santa Catalina Channel, and the potential for restored reefs to be covered by silt from the toe of the active Portuguese Bend Landslide. However, we remain unconvinced that the potential harms of the project are adequately mitigated and note that the special conditions outlined in the staff report do not address our concerns.

We disagree with the determination that because concentrations of contaminants detected in the sediment of the project area are consistent with those throughout Southern California, they pose no harm, and we are not persuaded that modeling the reef modules after reefs that survived past landslides eliminates their potential for future burial altogether.




