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CITY MANAGER

Upcoming Cal Water Construction on Crenshaw Boulevard: As part of the ongoing Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project, California Water Service (Cal Water) is scheduled to begin preparatory work for pipeline installation on a stretch of Crenshaw Boulevard in the City around the **week of June 24**.

Crews will work in small segments starting at Crest Road and moving toward the new pump station site north of Silver Spur Road (along the purple line in the map below), working from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. on weekdays.

Construction schedule:
9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

- Monday – Friday
- At least one lane of traffic open in each direction at all times
- All lanes open during non-work hours

Construction from Crest Road to the pump station location is expected to last approximately five months, but could change depending on unforeseen circumstances. The preparatory work includes surveying and equipment staging and is expected to last approximately two weeks before pipeline installation begins. The estimated duration for all work on Crenshaw Boulevard (from Crest Road to the South Coast Botanic Garden) is approximately seven months.

Crews plan to work in the following stages on Crenshaw Boulevard (see attachments):

- Crest Road to Crestridge Road
- Crestridge Road to Indian Peak Road
- Indian Peak Road to Silver Spur Road
- The intersection of Silver Spur Road and Crenshaw Boulevard
- Silver Spur Road to the new pump station site
- Pump station site to Chadwick Lane
- Chadwick Lane to the South Coast Botanic Garden (Night work from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.)

At least one lane of traffic will be open in each direction at all times and all lanes will be open during non-work hours.

- From Crest Road to Silver Spur Road, the southbound lanes of Crenshaw Boulevard will be shut down in stages and all traffic will be shifted across the median to the northbound lanes, with one lane open in each direction.
- From Silver Spur Road to the pump station site, the northbound lanes of Crenshaw Boulevard will be shut down and all traffic will be shifted across the median to the southbound lanes, with one lane open in each direction.
- From the pump station to about 2,300 feet south of Palos Verdes Drive North, the northbound lanes will be closed and all traffic will be shifted to the southbound lanes, with one lane open in each direction.
- From that point to Palos Verdes Drive North, only one southbound lane will be closed, with all northbound lanes open.

Cal Water has produced a [handout](#) showing what traffic control will look like along each of these stages (see attachments).

Drivers are advised to expect traffic delays, drive slowly and with caution, and to take alternate routes, such as Hawthorne Boulevard, when possible.

Please note that drivers traveling north on Crenshaw Boulevard during working hours will be able to turn left at either Indian Peak Road or Silver Spur Road to head west, meaning one of these roads will be accessible when work reaches this area.

FINANCE

PUBLIC WORKS

CalRecycle Annual Visit: On Thursday, June 6th, a representative from California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery conducted an annual site visit of the City. It included a visit/inspection of the City's residential and multi-family routes, City Yard recycling activities, organic material reduction (through use of goats for fuel modification), and organics recycling at the Canterbury Senior Living. Staff thanks EDCO for their assistance during the visit.

No Infrastructure Management Advisory Committee (IMAC) Meeting in June: This is a reminder that there is no regularly scheduled IMAC meeting in the month of June. The next regularly scheduled IMAC meeting is on Monday, July 15 at 6 pm in the Community Room. Members of the public are welcome and encouraged to attend or send e-mails.

Special Traffic Safety Committee Meeting: There will be a special meeting of the Traffic Safety Committee on Monday, June 24, 2019 at 6:30 pm in the Community Room. The meeting agenda will be published later next week.

Maintenance Activities: This Week Public Works maintenance continued its fuel modification and weed abatement throughout the City with the use of goats and man power. Locations that were cleared this week include: Tarragon Rd., Abalone Cove, Vanderlip Rd., Indian Peak Rd., and Pirate Dr. Public Works was also busy helping with graduation parking in the areas near local schools to help free up parking for attending parents. On Grayslake Rd., PW installed signage restricting parking during busy school hours to help traffic move along onto Hawthorne Blvd. At 3 Cinnamon Lane, Portuguese Bend, a resident's sewer pump failed. PW quickly responded and restored sewer services before the end of the business day.

In the Parks, PW continues its regularly scheduled maintenance. Over the weekend, a vehicle crashed into Hesse Parks ADA ramp railing and the railing was destroyed. PW removed damaged pieces and coned the area off for safety. PW is currently working with the vendor to replace the railing. Along Seascape Trail, PW cleaned up the trail to alleviate some of the overgrown vegetation and allow for a better hiking experience. Lastly, PW helped clean up an area in Eastview Park that is used by Recs and Parks for movie night events at that site.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Green Hills Neighborhood Advisory Committee (NAC) Meeting Summary Report: Pursuant to the City Council-adopted Conditions of Approval, the Green Hills NAC held its quarterly meeting on Wednesday, June 5 at City Hall. Attached is the summary report of the meeting.

A Shipping Container is Temporarily Approved at Trump National: The Director of Community Development approved, with conditions, the Trump Organization's requested Special Use Permit to allow the temporary placement of a shipping container, measuring 8.5' in height and 270ft² in area, at the east end of the driving range. The temporary shipping container will be used as an office for custom golf club fitting and is permitted to be placed onsite for a period of 1-year between September 23, 2019 and September 23, 2020. The City's appeal period ended without an appeal on June 10, after which the Coastal Commission began their 10-day appeal ending on June 20.

Interpretation Determination for Veterinary Uses: On May 23, the Director issued a Notice of Decision determining that a veterinary use is similar to medical offices, which is a “by-right” permitted use in the CP zoning district, but should be considered with the processing of a conditional use permit. The Director’s Notice of Decision was published in the Peninsula News, mailed to affected property owners and homeowner associations, property owners within 500’ radius of CP zoning districts, and interested parties. Additionally, the Notice of Decision was also provided to the City Council and Planning Commission for its consideration. No written protest or opposition was received by the June 8 deadline, therefore the Director’s interpretation is now effective and final. In response, Staff anticipates the applicant who initiated the interpretation determination to submit a conditional use permit within the next few weeks to relocate a veterinary clinic currently in Rolling Hills Estates to an office building at 580 Silver Spur Road, located within the City’s Commercial Professional (CP) zoning district.

Energy Leader Partnership (ELP) Tier Level Report: As an update to the Southern California Edison (SCE) Partnership with the South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG), the City was presented with its Q1 2019 Energy Leader Partnership (ELP) tier level report (Attached). The City achieved the highest level in this program – **PLATINUM** – for energy efficiency at City-owned facilities. As a result of the Platinum designation, the City will receive a \$0.12/kWh reduction in its SCE utility bills for its City-owned facilities. The City also received the Q1 “At a Glance” (Attached) report that shows what gas and electric projects have been completed since the beginning of the program. This report shows where the most energy is being used in the City to help plan future projects for gas and electricity savings.

Summary Report of the June 5, 2019 Quarterly Meeting

II. Maintenance of landscaping along the south perimeter.

So Kim mentioned that Jane Gualeni requested an update on the dying trees that were recently planted along the south perimeter. Nick Resich reported that raccoons chewed through the original drip system so the water was not reaching the trees planted further west. The irrigation/sprinkler system has been replaced and the trees that appeared to be dying are now growing new leaves. Nick Resich stated that he will continue to monitor the trees and replace those that do not survive.

III. Project/construction update at Green Hills Memorial Park.

Nick Resich reported that the south west portion of the approved Arroyo Vista area (Phase I) will be completed by the end of the year. He said that the entire Arroyo Vista will likely be completed in 6 to 8 phases of development over time based on demand. Between phases will be long intervals (i.e. years) of no development.

IV. PowerPoint presentation by Peninsula Verde HOA

Dave Turner presented a PowerPoint focusing on maintenance requests to replace few wall caps that were blown off by the wind along the new wall; trim vegetation within the swale area; and remove trash in the swale area. Nick Resich responded that he will work with the HOA to address these matters. He suggested that for these types of matters, both HOAs contact him directly for immediate response rather than waiting to raise it at quarterly meetings. Dave Turner suggested meeting at Green Hills Memorial Park as its closer for most NAC members. So Kim responded that she is amenable and pose that as an option for future meetings. Dave Turner suggested reducing the number of NAC meetings. So Kim responded that this will need to be raised at the next annual meeting for

the City Council's consideration as it is a change to a Condition of Approval. In the meantime, similar to the March 2019 meeting, if there are no topics to discuss, the meeting may be cancelled based on unanimous agreement by the NAC.
