CITY MANAGER

Cal Water Update: As part of the ongoing Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project, this week, Cal Water crews began construction at **the intersection of Crenshaw Boulevard and Silver Spur Road**. Work is taking place from **Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.** and is expected to last **approximately two weeks**.

While work is underway, downhill traffic will be diverted to the southbound lane of Crenshaw Boulevard starting approximately 200 feet south of the intersection, with one lane of traffic open in each direction. The signal lights in the intersection will be flashing red and all left-hand turns will be available. Once work in this intersection is complete, traffic control will be removed, and traffic lights will return to their normal, timed cycles.

Traffic control officers will be stationed in the intersection from **Monday to Sunday, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Please expect delays while work takes place and use alternate routes, such as Hawthorne Boulevard, where possible.** When driving in construction zones, please remember to slow down and obey all traffic control personnel and signage for the safety of residents and crews.

As a reminder, 24/7 traffic control will remain in place along Crenshaw Boulevard from Silver Spur Road to south of Chadwick Lane until **approximately early March**. Ring Subsidy Match Program Kickoff Event February 22: In a continued effort to enhance neighborhood safety, the City is offering residents another round of its Ring security device subsidy match program!

The program begins with a kickoff event at **Fred Hesse, Jr. Community Park this Saturday, February 22, from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.** The program begins with this live event, and then will continue until Monday, April 6, 2020, or until allocated discount codes run out. If you cannot attend the event, you may still participate in the program.

The subsidy is a \$100 discount for select Ring security devices. The devices and their pricing can be found on the City website at: <https://www.rpvca.gov/CivicAlerts.aspx?AID=1508>.

Additional discounts will be available for live event attendees only. A second security device can be purchased with an additional \$30 off. A third security device will receive a \$20 discount. To recap, one device will be \$100 off, two devices will be a total of \$130 off, and three devices will be a total of \$150 off.

Please note that **this opportunity is only available for RPV residents who are first-time participants in the incentive program.** To qualify for this program, residents must provide proof of residency (there is no longer a general release form requirement).

At the event, residents can bring a valid driver license indicating RPV residency or a utility bill with photo identification. If you cannot attend the event and will be participating afterward, please wait until the following Monday, February 24. The City will have a form provided by Ring available on Nextdoor and the City website, as Ring will verify your proof of residency. Once you fill out the form providing proof of residency, please allow Ring 24-48 hours (business days) to send you a special discount code.

Alert SouthBay Coming Soon: On March 2, Rancho Palos Verdes and 12 other South Bay cities will launch Alert SouthBay, a regional emergency public notification system using the Everbridge software application (see attachment).



Alert SouthBay will be similar to Nixle systems used by individual cities and police departments, but it will have the capability of sending alerts to subscribers across the region in addition to within individual cities, depending on the nature of the incident.

The City intends to use Alert SouthBay for a range of public safety-related messaging, from road closures due to water main breaks or police activity, to critical emergency communications, such as shelter-in-place or evacuation notifications.

Alert SouthBay is an opt-in service that users can sign up for and subscribe to in order to receive alerts. Users can register by:

- Texting “alertsb” to 888-777, which returns a link to register for Everbridge
- Downloading the free Everbridge app on an iOS or Android device from the App Store or Google Play
- Registering online at <https://alertsouthbay.com/>, where residents will have the option to sign up for alerts from multiple jurisdictions

Staff will encourage signups in coming weeks on the City’s social media pages, the City website, and the Breaking News and Public Safety Alerts listservs.

latest information along with reminders for good public health hygiene, and has shared this information to residents through Nextdoor.

As of February 19, there is only one confirmed case of the coronavirus in Los Angeles County. The individual is a non-resident who presented themselves at the Los Angeles International Airport upon arrival from Wuhan City, China, was screened, isolated and taken to a hospital for medical treatment. There is no immediate threat to the general public and no special precautions are required. Residents, workers, and visitors are encouraged to engage in regular activities, not excluding anyone based on race, country of origin, or recent travel, and to practice good public health hygiene, especially as it is the height of the flu season. Peninsula Regional Law Enforcement Committee and Regional Emergency Preparedness Committee: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes continues to work alongside the other Peninsula cities to coordinate and improve regional law enforcement and emergency preparedness. All meetings are open to the public, and are held at the City of Rolling Hills City Hall. At the meetings, the committees review crime statistics and trends, law enforcement and emergency preparedness programs, and other public safety related topics. The next meeting date is set for Thursday, May 14 at 7:30 AM for the Regional Emergency Preparedness Committee, with the Regional Law Enforcement Committee meeting beginning afterwards.

Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) Training Classes: The Los Angeles County Fire Department continues to provide training for the public to develop community response to emergencies. Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) training classes start in April, and will be provided in three training courses. The sessions will be provided on Saturdays, April 4, 18, & 25 from 9:00 AM to 4:30 PM at Rolling Hills Estates City Hall (4045 Palos Verdes Dr. North, Rolling Hills Estates, CA 90274). These CERT classes are FREE and are crucial for improving the safety of communities through emergency preparedness. PUBLIC WORKS

Maintenance Activities: This week Public Works (PW) Maintenance continues its regularly scheduled maintenance in City parks, right-of-ways, medians, and beaches. In the parks and beach areas, PW repaired replaced several damaged decomposed granite (DG) paths at Hesse Park, Point Vicente Park, and Eastview Park. Irrigation technicians inspected controllers at Hesse Park and made several sprinkler repairs along Calle Entradero, as well as repaired irrigation at Del Cero Park, Lower Hesse Park, Ryan Park, and Vanderlip Park.

In the medians and right-of-ways, PW repaired and replaced several damaged signs throughout the City. Median crews also completed work along Palos Verdes Drive West from City limit to Hawthorne Blvd. Crews also trimmed bushes blocking traffic view at Miraleste Drive & Via Colinita. Crews are continuing work along Palos Verdes Drive South right-of-way and median. Right-of-way crew started working along Crenshaw Blvd. from Crest Rd. to Indian Peak Rd. and will continue as lane closures permit. Crews completed cleaning the right-of-way along Crest Road between Hawthorne Blvd. and Crenshaw Blvd., and are now working along Montemalaga Dr. On Conqueror Drive, a tree was identified as a safety concern and was removed by Public Works.

Lastly, the PW Department continues to respond to emergency calls during regular business hours and after hours. During this past Monday, Presidents' Day holiday, PW responded to several emergencies. On Hawthorne Blvd. and Palos Verdes Drive West, a vehicle collision slowed traffic down. PW responded and helped Lomita Sheriff perform traffic control and removed debris. On Barkentine Rd., a resident reported a sewer overflow issue. PW responded, inspected the area, and made sure sewer mainlines were free of issues. On Palos Verdes Drive East, a large portion of guardrails was taken out by a vehicle. PW temporarily installed barricades and safety cones, while the vendor will be scheduled to come out and remove and replace the whole damaged section.

Roadway Work on Residential Streets Continues: Some of the roadways in areas 3 & 4 of the City are having a treatment called "Slurry Seal" applied this month. This helps prolong the life of the street surface. The process includes two asphalt based coats of material which are applied to the roadways on different dates. Affected residents were notified of the dates the treatments were to be applied. The final layer of slurry seal is projected to be completed by Wednesday, February 26, 2020, weather pending. Road striping, curb address painting and manhole adjustment are projected to be completed by the end of March 2020.

South Bay emergency notification is changing. Here's what you need to do

Individual city Nixle alerts will no longer work after March 2 when Alert SouthBay takes effect

A new system to alert South Bay residents about various public safety issues, from severe storms to major emergencies, will launch next month, providing a unified way for local agencies to communicate with folks across city lines.

Alert SouthBay, which goes live March 2, will replace the Nixle service individual cities use. Inglewood, El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, Palos Verdes Estates, Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills Estates, Rolling Hills, Torrance, Gardena, Hawthorne and Lomita will all participate.

Some of those cities have already conducted a soft launch for the first-of-its-kind system, said Soraya Sutherlin, the regional emergency communications manager with Alert SouthBay. Carson is not yet part of the new system, but is talking about it, Sutherlin added.

Alert SouthBay will allow public safety agencies to send notifications across the region via text, email, and cell and landline phones about police activity, gas leaks or other emergencies.

“We can all get on the same page to equal one voice,” Sutherlin said, “and all the research is showing, we all need to be standardized in our language, we need to be consistent in what we’re saying and we really need joint branding.”

Local public safety agencies have also welcomed the consolidated alert system, saying centralizing the information helps officers focus on their jobs.

“We will be able to make notifications, not only to our city, but to every city in the region if necessary,” said Gardena Police Lt. Vicente Osorio. “This will help cut down on the time it takes to make these critical notifications and time is one of our most important resources.”

Most South Bay cities, Sutherlin said, previously used Nixle, which doesn’t notify residents based on their current location, nor does it allow for alerts across multiple platforms.

The new system, meanwhile, will let all the cities participating to access the Integrated Public Alert and Warning System, with which agencies can issue wireless emergency alerts that will send messages directly to cell phone users in the area of an imminent emergency.

How to sign up

If you already receive TorranceAlerts or the NixleWire for Rolling Hills Estates, you do not need to re-register, though Sutherlin recommended logging in to check your preferences.

All other South Bay residents need to register to start receiving the alerts.

The easiest way to register is via your smartphone: Text “ALERTSB” to 888777 to receive a link that takes you to the registration page. You can also go to alertsouthbay.com.


