PORTUGUESE BEND LANDSLIDE ABATEMENT EFFORT

One of the constants of life in Rancho Palos Verdes, even predating the Fleetwood Mac song mentioned above, is the presence of the Portuguese Bend Landslide. As the largest active landslide in the United States, the Landslide has posed a seemingly intractable challenge to the community since its onset in 1956.

City Staff is now setting up a series of meetings with community leaders to look for a consensus on how best to proceed, with a clear emphasis on establishing a process, not jumping ahead to a conclusion. Meetings started in May and will continue into June and July. The intent is to seek out Federal funding by the end of 2017. In order to effectively request that funding, Staff is looking to identify a clear action plan by the end of the summer. TECHNOLOGY & CRIME PREVENTION

RING.COM SECURITY CAMERA PRODUCTS and CITY INCENTIVE PROGRAM

As part of the City's updated Public Safety Strategic Plan, one of the solutions the City continues to work toward is utilizing technology to make neighborhoods safer. Cameras have proven to be a useful form of technology in the Sheriff's crime prevention and crime solving efforts. The City and Sheriff's Department have negotiated a subsidy with Ring.com to provide RPV residents with a discount on select devices. The device limit is 3 products per household. In addition to the discount, the City Council is offering a limited number of \$50 incentives for residents, allocating \$100,000 for this program. Ring is also offering a discount on select accessories. This program will run until July 31, 2017, or until funding is longer available.

To ensure RPV residents have a seamless experience, residents are asked to complete a Release Agreement, and upon completion and return of the form, a single-use promotion code will be provided. HOAs SECURITY CAMERA SYSTEM GRANT PROGRAM

In response to HOAs expressing difficulty in placing camera systems for public safety purposes in their neighborhoods, the City created a grant program to streamline the process and assist financially and logistically. The City will provide a matching grant of \$3,750 to cover the expense of each security camera system at an approved HOA entrance location(s). To ensure the quality of the camera and constantly monitor that the camera is functioning, HOAs must use the recommended vendor, Obsidian Integration, that was selected through the City's Request for Information process. Additionally, the City will allow encroachments into the public right-of-way for this purpose, and waive encroachment and electrical permit fees related to this work. A total of \$200,000 is budgeted for this grant program.

CITY COUNCIL NOMINATION PERIOD

Rancho Palos Verdes voters will elect two members of the City Council at the City's General Municipal Election to be held on November 7, 2017 for a term of three (3) years. The nomination period for candidates for City Council begins on Monday, July 17, 2017, and closes on Friday, August 11, 2017. During the nomination period, election manuals containing all of the necessary paperwork will be available from the City Clerk's Office during the City's regular office hours. Please contact the City Clerk's Office at 310.544.5208 to make an appointment, if you are interested in becoming a candidate for City Council. To be eligible to run for City Council, a candidate must be a registered voter and a resident of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes.

NEW COUNCIL TERMS

Pursuant to recent legislative changes, General Municipal Elections for the City of Rancho Palos Verdes will be changed from November in odd-numbered years to November in even-numbered years beginning in year 2020 to coincide with statewide election dates. As a result of the change in election date, the City Council Member terms of office that begin in 2017 will expire in November 2020, which is a three-year term instead of the traditional four four-year term.

TIME TO DRONE UP ON RPV'S
DRONE POLICY

**Look, Up in the Sky. It's a Bird!
It's a Plane! Wait, it's a Drone!
Is that allowed?**

The City often receives questions about the recreational and commercial use of drones. Recreational use of drones is permitted on private property with the owner's permission. However, Section 12.16.040 of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code (RPVMC) prohibits the operation of "motorized or radio-controlled models" in City parks. The City interprets this prohibition to include the recreational use of drones at City parks and on other City-owned property.

The City has designated a section of Point Vicente Park/Civic Center for remote controlled model helicopters. Operators must have a permit from the City's Recreation and Parks Department. The City also allows the commercial use of drones for filming purposes on public and private property with the issuance of a City film permit. Commercial drone operators are required to provide proof of Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) approval for commercial use of drones for filming.

SOCIAL HOST ORDINANCE ADOPTED



Underage drinking is directly involved in the deaths of approximately 5,000 youth under the age of 21 every year nationwide. Additionally, underage drinking is linked to two-thirds of all sexual assaults including date rape and contributes to a 10 times higher incidence of physical assault and 12 times higher incidence of unintentional injury.

On April 4, 2017, the City Council adopted the Social Host Liability Ordinance, holding adults who act as "social hosts" liable when they provide alcohol to children who are not their own at their residence or other private property. If the "social host" is a juvenile, then the parents or guardians of that juvenile will be jointly and severally liable for any penalties incurred pursuant to this ordinance.

The ordinance also established a penalty structure should an adult be held liable.

- First Offense \$2,500
- Second Offense \$5,000
- Third and subsequent offenses \$7,500

In addition to the administrative penalties, the responding law enforcement, fire or emergency response providers may issue an order requiring the gathering to be disbanded and may cite and/or arrest any law violators under any other applicable ordinances and State statutes. The social host can also be billed for response costs if additional law enforcement or emergency service providers are required to return.

In order to not dissuade social hosts from calling for help when needed, the penalty will not apply if they are seeking medical attention for an underage person. Additionally, an attendee at the gathering will not be subject to the penalty for reporting underage drinking.

The Palos Verdes Peninsula Council of Parent Teacher Associations (PTA) strongly supports this ordinance and asks all parents and students to do their part to reduce underage drinking.

March 7

Marineland Bubbles Statue

Directed Staff to proceed with hiring a designer to create plan for the installation of the Marineland "Bubbles" statue on the grounds of Lower Point Vicente

Civic Center Master Plan Advisory Committee and Update on Public Outreach Process

Council received an update on the Point Vicente Park/Civic Center Master Plan resident mail survey and public outreach and approved a call for candidates to serve on a Citizen's Advisory Committee for that project.

April 4

Proposed Revisions to RPV Municipal Code-City Manager

The Council approved introducing Ordinance No. 596, which provides direction on the proposed revisions to the City Manager section of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code (Chapter 2.08).

Social Host Liability Ordinance

Ordinance adopted imposing liability on adults for providing alcohol to and/or allowing underage drinking by children who are not their own at their residence or other private property; administrative citation schedule approved.

Barking Dogs Noise Complaints

Council directed Staff to return with possible amendments to the City's code to bring animal control services in-house, including an enforcement process.

April 10

Fiscal Year 17-18 Preliminary Budget

Council received a detailed presentation on the Fiscal Year 16-17 year-end projections and the preliminary Fiscal Year 17-18 budget and provided direction to Staff.

April 18

Lower Point Vicente Park Outdoor Exhibits

Council conceptually approved the inclusion of the outdoor interactive exhibits at Lower Point Vicente Park into the Parks Master Plan, as requested by the Los Serenos de Point Vicente Docents.

Arterial Fences and Wall Program

Directed Planning Commission to review Arterial Fences and Walls Master Plan design options and initiate Code Amendment proceedings to require replacement fences and walls along specified arterial streets.

Vista Verde Homeowners Settlement Agreement

Council agreed to approve the Settlement Agreement with the Vista Verdes Homeowners Association.

May 2

Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) Cameras in Eastview

Approved purchase of two mobile ALPRS to be utilized in the City's Eastview neighborhood adjacent to Western Avenue.

May 16

Update on Del Cerro Parking and Circulation

Council reviewed a variety of options designed to alleviate parking and circulation issues in the Del Cerro neighborhood and provided direction to staff. Options approved included installation of boulders, increased enforcement, restrictions on illegal parking along South side of Crest Road near St. John Fisher, and vacating a portion of the Park Place right-of-way.

Update on the Lower Hesse Park Improvements Project

Council reviewed the final design plans and specifications for the Lower Hesse Park Improvement Project.

Fiscal year 16-17 General Fund Year-End and Fiscal Year 17-18 Preliminary Budget

Council reviewed and approved year-end estimates and provided direction to Staff on the Preliminary Budget.

So much information and communication is now done by email or text, but residents can still reach City staff at City Hall and parks by old fashioned phone. In conjunction with the deployment of the City's new telephone system, the City has added new telephone numbers for a few departments and made a few changes to save on telephone line costs and to make calling the City more convenient. An important change is that staffer's direct line will show on resident's caller ID (rather than the main City phone line) to help you get back quickly to the right person. We have updated the automated assistance to better serve callers in the evening and on weekends, including direct dialing of park sites. Finally we are transitioning numerous analog telephone lines around the City and at park sites into our primary number structure 310.544.5###. The previous telephone numbers will still work during the transition period, but please make note of the changes.

also administered 12 successful elections including runoff elections, two citizen-driven initiatives, and a recount.

Along with my experience, I proudly hold a Master Municipal Clerk (MMC) designation from the International Institute of Municipal Clerks, the highest recognition in the City Clerk profession.

Many of our readers may have seen a City Clerk at a Council Meeting or know that they are involved in elections, but may not know all of what a Clerk does. Can you elaborate on the role of a City Clerk?

The City Clerk administers democratic processes such as elections, access to city records, and all legislative actions, while ensuring public transparency. In addition, the City Clerk acts as a compliance officer for Federal, State, and local statutes including the Political Reform Act, the Brown Act, and the Public Records Act.

What is the most difficult or challenging part of being a City Clerk?

The number of deadlines. The City Clerk's Office works with all City departments to meet different deadlines like agenda preparation and legal postings. It can be challenging, but we always manage to meet our deadlines. I'm pretty impressed with RPV, they have a pretty seamless and timely process for getting the agenda distributed on time. Timeliness is huge in the world of City Clerks.
