CITY MANAGER

Recent Demonstration: On Saturday, May 30, the City was made aware of a demonstration in response to the killing of George Floyd that was planned for the following afternoon on Palos Verdes Drive South at Trump National Drive. Staff began coordinating with the Lomita Sheriff's Station and Trump National Golf Club to ensure protesters could safely exercise their first amendment right to free speech, and residents were notified of the event. According to the Sheriff's Department, about 300 people participated in a peaceful demonstration, and no incidents were reported. The City thanks the Sheriff's Department for ensuring public safety.

The City continues to monitor activity in the greater Los Angeles area, as well as demonstrations in the South Bay and continues to notify residents of any curfews issued by the County of Los Angeles. For updates, subscribe to the Breaking News listserv at: rpvca.gov/notify.

Rule 20 Allocation: On June 1, the City received a letter from Southern California Edison (SCE) regarding the City's 2020 Rule 20 allocation (see attachments). Under the Rule 20 program, every year, SCE allocates ratepayer funding to cities to use for qualifying projects to put overhead electric equipment underground. According to SCE, the City's 2020 allocation is \$71,098, and the City's current work credit balance is \$190,577.

Ponte Vista Update: Tonight, June 3, the Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council Planning and Land Use Committee will receive an update on the Ponte Vista (aka Highpark) housing development that is under construction on the site of former U.S. Navy housing on Western Avenue on the border of RPV and San Pedro. Staff will attend the virtual meeting and report back on the project in the upcoming June 2020 Border Issues Status Report.

Dinner Donations to Grocery Workers: On May 27, the City expressed its gratitude to RPV's grocery workers and supported one of our restaurants by donating dinner to the staff of Smart & Final and Ralphs markets.



Councilman Dave Bradley, Councilwoman Barbara Ferraro, her grandson, Bryce, and City Manager Ara Mihranian delivered sandwiches from Bird Talk Chicken on Western Avenue to thank these frontline workers, who are playing a vital role in getting our community through this

pandemic. Thank you to these hardworking personnel, who should always be treated with kindness.

COVID-19 Cases:

As of June 2, there were 57,118 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across Los Angeles County, including the South Bay, so the public should not think one location is safer than another and everyone should be aware and practice physical distancing. The total includes 96 cases in Rancho Palos Verdes, 42 in Palos Verdes Estates, 14 in Rolling Hills Estates, and two in Rolling Hills. Countywide, 2,443 people have died.


According to the Department of Public Health, 11 deaths have been reported in Rancho Palos Verdes. The City extends its deepest condolences to the families of these residents.

As of June 1, Rancho Palos Verdes has a 74.3% self-response rate, 12.7% higher than the state's average self-response rate, and 13.8% higher than the national average. RPV has the second-highest response rate of the Peninsula cities behind Palos Verdes Estates.

Safety Tips and Precautions: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is dedicated to the safety and well-being of its residents and community members. The City encourages residents to participate in neighborhood safety and remain vigilant in protecting personal property. There are many ways individuals can reduce the chance of becoming a victim and contribute to community safety. Please see below for crime prevention tips for you and your loved ones:

Tips to Avoid Vehicle Burglaries:

- Always lock your vehicles whenever not in use
- Close and lock all windows
- Keep your valuables, such as your purse, wallet, or bag, with you or secure them out of sight and stored away
- Do not display items of value in your vehicle: place them in your trunk or keep them covered
- Remove valuables, packages, garage openers, mail, or other devices from sight

Tips to Prevent Residential Burglaries:

- Lock all windows and doors, including backyard, side, and garage doors
- Keep all curtains closed at night or when no one is home
- If you are away and you are capable, leave house lights on or set them to turn on at intervals
- Set up a security camera system with video and audio
- Notify trusted neighbors if you will be away for an extended period of time

If you see something, say something! We encourage you to call the Lomita Sheriff's Station at 310-539-1661 if you see any suspicious persons or activities.

Vacation Security Camera Loaner: The City encourages the use of video/audio recording devices with security footage capabilities as an additional measure of home protection. For RPV residents who may be away from home for an extended period, the City offers a Vacation Security Camera Loaner program. This program allows residents to borrow a Ring Spotlight Camera for short-term use. Emergency Preparedness Tip: When a disaster strikes, your family might not be together, and communication channels might be down. The City encourages residents to create a plan on how you will contact one another and how you will communicate in different disaster situations.

When creating a family communications plan, keep the following tips in mind:

- Have a list of emergency contacts (fire, police, ambulance, etc.) on your cell phone and near your home phone.
- Agree on a family meeting place, both in your neighborhood and out of town, in case you cannot get in touch or are unable to go home.
- Prepare a family contact sheet with the names, addresses, and phone numbers of important contacts. Include an out-of-town contact for family members to get in touch with when they are unable to contact other family members. Often, during disasters, it's easier to make long-distance calls than local calls.
- Be sure every family member has emergency phone numbers and a cell phone.
- Teach children how and when to call 911 for help.
- Make sure everyone in your family knows how to send a text message. Texts can often get around network disruptions when phone calls cannot.
- For non-emergency communication, use text messages, email, and social media instead of making phone calls. Too many phone calls can cause network congestion, meaning people in real, life-threatening emergencies cannot get help.


Small Business Financial Assistance Plan Update: On April 8, 2020, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes implemented the Small Business Financial Assistance Plan in an effort to provide relief and promote the general welfare of the City's small business community experiencing negative financial impacts stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. The Small Business Financial Assistance Plan provides a one-time refund of the 2020 business license.

Since the implementation on April 8:

- the City has received 17 requests for business license tax refunds.
- 11 of the 17 requests were not eligible for the program.
- 6 refunds totaling \$2,155 have been issued to date.
- 0 requests are currently pending approval.


We encourage businesses in need of assistance to visit <http://www.rpvca.gov/1284/Financial-Assistance> for information on the program and to submit a request. Businesses that apply will receive a confirmation email from the staff. If an application is approved, a check will be mailed directly to the business at the address on file.

OpenGov Visitor Data: Over the past 90 days, there have been 45 visitors to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes' OpenGov site. On average, these visitors browsed for approximately two minutes and thirty-three seconds.



Based on the analytical data provided by OpenGov, 80% of users were visiting the OpenGov site for the very first time with the remaining 20% made up of returning users.

Taxpayers Have Until July 15 to File and Pay Their Taxes: The federal income tax filing deadline has been extended to July 15. Taxpayers also have until July 15 to make any federal income tax payments that were originally due on April 15, without penalties and interest, regardless of the amount they owe. This extension applies to all taxpayers. There is no need to file any additional forms to qualify for this automatic federal tax filing and payment relief.

Taxpayers expecting a refund should file electronically. Many taxpayers used [Free File](#) last year. The benefits of filing electronically include:

- **It's available online and can be done from home.**
Taxpayers can file using [tax software](#) from their home computer if they do not qualify for Free File. The bottom line is that filing electronically is much more convenient than filling out and mailing paper tax forms.
- **It's safe and secure.**
Electronic filing is safe and secure. It uses modern encryption technology to protect tax returns. The IRS continues to [work with states and tax industry](#) leaders to protect tax returns from [tax-related identity theft](#). This effort has helped put safeguards in place to make electronic tax filing a safe and secure option.
- **It's accurate and easy.**
Filing electronically helps taxpayers file a complete and accurate tax return. Taxpayers who file electronically will receive an acknowledgement from the IRS telling them their return is accepted. If a return is rejected, the acknowledgement says why the IRS rejected the tax return.
- **File electronically for free.**
[Free File](#) is available for eligible taxpayers where they can use online software to file electronically for free. This program is available only on IRS.gov and is for taxpayers who earned less than \$69,000 in 2019. Another option, [Free File Fillable Forms](#), is available to all taxpayers regardless of income.
- **People who file electronically get their refunds faster.**
When taxpayers file electronically and choose [direct deposit](#) for their refund, in most cases they can get their money in less than 21 days. If they mail a paper tax return, the refund can take six weeks or longer.

Taxpayers who owe, should file by the due date, and pay as soon as possible. They can schedule their [payment electronically](#) online, by phone or using their mobile device and the [IRS2Go app](#). It is always good to pay as much as possible to minimize interest and penalties. The IRS offers a variety of electronic [payment options](#) to help taxpayers schedule electronic payments.

PUBLIC WORKS

Prop A Transit Improvement Project: Using Prop A funds, this transit improvement project consists of installing bus shelters and improving the pavement adjacent to the transit stop. The prefabricated bus shelters, that match existing bus shelters, will be constructed at unimproved transit stops along Crest Road, Highridge Road, Silver Spur Road, Hawthorne Boulevard, Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive East. Project construction will commence next week and will continue through mid-October. Each location will require approximately 4 days to complete and will require the temporarily closure of a travel lane. As always, please exercise caution when driving through a construction zone. Please feel free to contact the City's Project Inspector, Joe Van Der Linden, at 310-612-6573 or Excel Project Superintendent, Chris Flores, at 562-599-5841, if you encounter any issue with this work.

Hawthorne Boulevard Median Beautification Project: Construction on the much-awaited Hawthorne Boulevard Median Beautification project is scheduled to begin next week and continue through October. The project consists of removing the green asphalt to accommodate landscaping, Palos Verdes Stone hardscape, and bio-swales between Palos Verdes Drive West and Crest Road. The bio-swale is designed to naturally filter rain runoff prior to entering the ocean. Traffic control measures including temporary lane closures will be in place from time-to-time. Listserv and social media posts will be used to notify the public of any scheduled traffic delays.

Measure W Project Funding: The South Santa Monica Bay (SSMB) Watershed Area Steering Committee (WASC) met on May 19, 2020, and recommended the Eastview Park project to be included in the final Stormwater Investment Plan (SIP), to be funded by Measure W. WASC reviews all projects for Measure W funding. The SIP will be further considered on June 18, 2020, when the Board of Supervisors of the Regional Oversight Committee meet. A Measure W application is also being created for the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project. The due date for applications has been tentatively pushed back to mid-October 2020.

Coming Soon, PVDS & PVDE Intersection Traffic Signal: On May 20, the City opened bids for the construction of a traffic signal at the Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive East intersection. The City Council is tentatively scheduled to consider the contract to install this new traffic signal at its July 7, 2020 meeting.

Hawthorne Blvd & Via Rivera Traffic Signal Update: The City's design engineers continue to complete the engineering plans for a traffic signal at intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and Via Rivera. The City received quotes for the traffic signal poles and mast arms, which can take up to 22 weeks for delivery. The purchase for these items is scheduled for consideration at the July 7, 2020 City Council Meeting. The purchase will allow the City to initiate the process of obtaining these poles while the final engineering plans are being prepared.

SBCCOG Transportation Committee Meeting: Public Works is scheduled to attend the South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG) Transportation Committee Meeting on June 8, 2020. Recommended projects, which include the Western Avenue Beautification project and funding allocations for FY20-21 for Measure M and Measure R Metro Budget requests, will be reviewed at this meeting. The three-month look ahead of South Bay Measure R/Measure M Highway Programs will also be reviewed.

Environmental Times Summer 2020 Issue: Attached is EDCO's Summer 2020 issue of the Environmental Times. A copy of this quarterly newsletter will be sent to customers with information on opportunities to recycle, reuse, and reduce waste, City events, and other helpful seasonal information.

Weekly Maintenance Activities: This week, Public Works continues its regularly scheduled maintenance in City parks, medians, and beaches, removing trash, debris, and tending to the landscape throughout the City. The landscape crew continued to work along Palos Verdes Drive South and Palos Verdes Drive East switchbacks. Crews completed applying mulch along the Silver Spur Road median after trimming. Crenshaw Boulevard median, near Del Cerro Park, received a similar treatment. The landscape crew also worked along Western Avenue on median weed abatement.

As the City moves to reopen all of its facilities in response to the COVID-19 restrictions, Public Works continues to install safety measures including sneeze guards and sanitizing stations. In the right-of-way, City's graffiti abatement team has addressed fifteen cases of graffiti in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and continues to patrol the City for unauthorized signs and stickers in the right-of-way.

The following emergency service requests were reported to the Public Works Department:

- On Sunday, May 31, at Abalone Shore Park, the men and women's public restrooms were temporarily closed due to a plumbing stoppage. Public Works was able to clear the mainline stoppage allowing the restrooms to reopen the same day.
- Public Works also responded to several tree emergencies and downed tree limbs. Arterials that experienced tree limbs in the roadway or right-of-way included Montemalaga Drive, Trudie Drive, Crestwind Drive, and Indian Peak Road.

- North corner at Aqua Vista Drive and Forrestal Drive

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) Update on Service Response for Contract Cities: On June 1, 2020, LA County Department of Animal Control informed staff that it was experiencing limited response times for service calls due to recent protests countywide. DACC directed field officers to limit field service calls and only respond to emergency calls during the established curfew hours provided by the County. Additional information will be provided as it becomes available.

Community Development Department (CDD) Workload Analysis: The Community Development Department continues to monitor staff workload to quickly adapt to the changing conditions. Attached are four charts – one for each of the Department’s four Divisions (Building & Safety, Planning, Code and View). These charts show some of the key measures of workload for each group by month starting in January 2020. The two largest Divisions (Building & Safety and Planning) reflect a significant drop in the submittal of cases at the time the City Hall was temporarily closed to the public (March 15). In the instance of Planning, the case numbers and fees appear to begin rebounding in May, which was due mainly to the increased submittal activity that was experienced since City Hall reopened on May 18. For the Building & Safety Division, cases and fees have not rebounded as of yet. It is likely too early to draw any conclusions on the recovery of the total cases or fees from these two Divisions as we only have two weeks of post-opening data. For the View and Code Enforcement Divisions, the total numbers are nominal for each month that while this data is helpful it is not easy to draw any conclusions even during the City Hall Closure period. Staff will continue to monitor and update this report monthly and respond to maintain service levels.

Change & Save Home Improvement Program: The West Basin Municipal Water District is currently offering free water-saving devices and up to \$500 rebate towards qualifying high-efficiency washer through its Change & Save Home Improvement Plan. The program aimed at saving money, lowering energy bills, and promoting water conservation. Please see the attached program bulletin for additional details and program eligibility.

Planning Division Monthly Activity Report: Attached is the Planning Division's Monthly Activity Report for May 2020. The report contains a summary of the Division's activities during this last month regarding, 1) New applications received and 2) Staff, Director, Planning Commission, and City Council decisions rendered. As indicated in the report, the Division received 39 new applications and rendered decisions on 25 applications for May 2020.

Building and Safety Division Monthly Activity: Attached is the Building and Safety Division’s Monthly Activity Report for May 2020 reporting on 1) A summary of the new cases received broken down by application type; 2) The number of permits issued; 3) The amount of fees collected; 4) The number of inspections performed and; 5) The number of new plan checks submitted. As indicated in the report, the Division issued 143 permits and performed a total of 348 inspections for May 2020.

View Restoration Division Monthly Activity: Attached is the View Restoration Division’s Monthly Activity Report for May 2020 and year-to-date information on 1) New view cases; 2) Pre-application meetings, and 3) Cases resolved by mediation. The Division received six new cases in May 2020.

Curfew Closures: Following LA County curfew orders, City parks and open space areas officially closed at 6 pm on June 1 and June 2. Signs were posted, and park visitors were informed of the curfew orders so they can plan their departure accordingly. New signs were posted to reflect the today's 9 pm to 5 am curfew.



Abalone Cove Parking Lot Revenue: Since re-opening, the Abalone Cove parking lot has generated \$35,042 in revenue between May 13 and May 31.

Parks and Preserve Weekend Report: Beaches, parks and trails, including the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve have been open since May 13 with physical distancing in accordance with guidance from the County of Los Angeles.

3. Six feet (or more) of physical distancing will be required between individuals outside of the same household.
4. No sunbathing, chairs, canopies, coolers, picnicking, sitting or lying on the sand.
5. No group sports (such as volleyball), gatherings or events.
6. If you or people you live with are sick, stay home!
7. Those violating beach rules may be fined or penalized.

SUBJECT: City of Rancho Palos Verdes 2020 Rule 20A Work Credit Balance

Dear Ara Mihranian:

Southern California Edison (SCE) has filed with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) its annual report of SCE's 2020 budget for capital spending under Tariff Rule 20A, Replacement of Overhead with Underground Electric Facilities. For calendar year 2020, the budget is \$20,501,809.

Pursuant to the formula set out in Tariff Rule 20A, the portion of this amount allocated to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes is \$ 71,098. Under the tariff, allocated work credits not committed to a qualifying project in a given year are carried over to the next year. As of this writing, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes' work credit balance is \$190,577.

In addition to the work credit balance, CPUC Decision 01-12-009 codified the opportunity for local governments to "mortgage" or borrow up to an additional five years of work credits in order to be able to undertake a qualifying Rule 20A project sooner than they otherwise could.

In accordance with the Decision, and when requested by you, SCE will meet with you and community residents at least once every six months when projects are in queue, and at least once every other month once a conversion project is underway. The decision requires local government to give notice of the meetings and provide the venue. Please feel free to call me any time to schedule such a community meeting or, if you have any questions about Rule 20A or any other matters affecting SCE's service to you.

Collection Day Safety Tips

Kids love trucks and are most familiar with the trucks that visit their house every week – the trash and recycling trucks. With distance learning in place due to the COVID-19 pandemic and summer break on the horizon, kids are out playing more than usual and their interest and curiosity can draw them dangerously close to operating collection vehicles. EDCO’s professional team of collectors watch out for pedestrians, pets and cars, but small children and pets can easily go unnoticed around a large truck.



It is important that parents make sure children play safely when collection vehicles are in your neighborhood. Here are some safety tips to help you ensure your outside activities are free of accidents and injuries.

- Trash and recycling trucks make frequent stops. Talk to your children about keeping a safe distance when riding bikes, skateboarding or skating.
- It takes large trucks about twice as long to stop as a passenger car, you should never stop suddenly or cut in front of a moving truck.
- Make sure children know never to play or stand in or around trash carts or dumpsters. On your service day, be sure to move toys or cars away from your collection area.
- Keep your children and pets at a safe distance from the truck whether it is parked or operating.
- Do not allow children to stand too close to watch the driver service carts. In addition to moving truck parts, debris can come out of the truck when it is compressed.




