Weekly Activity Report of April 3 - April 9, 2005

CRIME SUMMARY

Crimes reported during this time period in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes included one commercial burglary, two residential burglaries, three vehicle burglaries, two other structure burglaries, one grand theft, two petty thefts, one mail theft and five acts of vandalism.

ARRESTS

Narcotics Laws - 1 Vehicle Laws - 1

April 3

Vehicle Burglary (daytime) - Person(s) unknown reached in a partially open window, unlocked a door, and stole a man's purse from a car in the 1800 block of Caddington Drive.

Vehicle Burglary (evening) - Person(s) unknown punched a door lock and stole U.S. currency and several other items from a vehicle in a parking lot in the 28900 block of Western Avenue.

April 4

Commercial Burglary (overnight) - Person(s) unknown stole two laptop computers from an office of a business on Ocean Trails Drive. There was no sign of forced entry.

Residential Burglary (daytime) - Person(s) unknown cut a screen and opened a window, setting off an alarm, at a home in the 26900 block of Basswood Avenue. It was unknown at the time of this report whether anything was taken.

Grand Theft (daytime) - Person(s) unknown stole a wallet from a woman's purse in an open business in the 28900 block of Western Avenue.

Residential Burglary - A victim reported that between April 2nd - 5th, person(s) unknown stole jewelry from her apartment in the 28100 block of Highridge Road. There was no sign of forced entry.

Other Structure Burglary (overnight) - Person(s) unknown stole U.S. currency from a locked vehicle in the underground parking area of a complex in the 6500 block of Oceancrest Drive. There was no sign of forced entry into the vehicle.

Vehicle Burglary (overnight) - Person(s) unknown stole a G.P.S. unit from a locked car in the parking area of a complex in the 29700 block of Island View Drive. There was no sign of forced entry.

Other Structure Burglary (overnight) - Person(s) unknown stole a pair of sunglasses from a car in the underground parking area of a complex in the 6500 block of Oceancrest Drive. There was no sign of forced entry into the vehicle.
